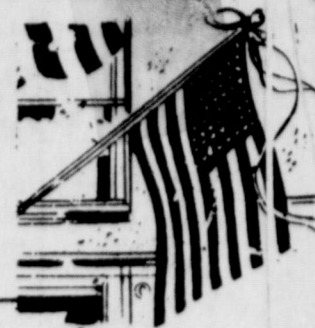

Thursday Is Deadline For Disaster Relief

Thursday, Dec. 24, 1981, is the filing deadline for persons seeking disaster assistance from the Small Business Administration's program for the flooding and severe storms in this area in October, and those interested in applying are urged to make application as soon as possible so that SBA can process the forms.

Residents of Stephens, Palo Pinto, Jack, Eastland, and Shackelford Counties should contact the SBA Disaster Office located at 1904 West Walker, Suite 1, in Breckenridge 76024. The telephone numbers are (817) 559-2036 or 559-2229. Office hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Individuals or business owners can visit the offices or call to discuss application procedures with loan officers on duty. No documentation is needed on the first visit.

Loans to home and business owners are based on a "credit elsewhere" test. Home applicants unable to obtain credit elsewhere will be charged an interest rate of 8 per cent. Those who can obtain credit will be charged 16 per cent. A disaster home loan is limited to a maximum of \$50,000 to restore a residence; \$10,000 to restore residential contents, or \$55,000 for both. The maximum allowable term is 30 years; however, terms are set in accordance with an applicant's ability to repay.

Business applicants unable to obtain credit elsewhere will be charged an interest rate of 8 per cent with a maximum allowable term of 30 years. Those who can obtain credit elsewhere will be charged 18 1/2 per cent for a three-year term. All business loans are limited to 85 per cent of the uninsured loss and must not exceed \$500,000. SBA may limit any disaster loan that can be repaid; it can approve a loan only when there is reasonable assurance that the loan will be repaid.

Preparations Appear Complete For Merry Christmas In Area

Preparations appeared complete Tuesday for the community to enjoy a Merry Christmas.

A four-day holiday weekend will be the highlight of the observance for many residents of the area. A number of non-retail businesses, plants and offices reported that they will close Thursday, Dec. 24, for the weekend.

The City of Cisco and Eastland County offices will be among those observing Christmas Eve as an extra

holiday. City offices will close after business Wednesday until Monday, Dec. 28. Sanitation crews, however, will make their rounds as usual Saturday, Dec. 26.

The Cisco Public Library will be closed December 24 and 26.

County Judge Scott Bailey reported that county offices would be closed Thursday to give employees an extra holiday.

Most retail outlets will be open for business as usual Thursday and Saturday,

closing only on Christmas Day. Shopping has been good throughout the business district and most stores are having a good year, Chamber of Commerce Manager Gene Abbott reported.

Redeemer Lutheran Church has announced plans for observing the birth of Christ with a worship service at 10 a.m. Friday, Dec. 25th. The Rev. Dell Crockett, pastor, will speak on "The Hopes and Fears of All the Years" during the service. The public was invited to attend.

Many of the city's churches enjoyed Christmas parties and choir specials during the past week and Sunday night.

The long weekend was expected to inspire considerable travel throughout the area and state. The Department of Transportation has urged extra caution on the highways, forecasting that some 80 Texans will lose their lives in motor accidents during the holiday period.

Possibilities of light rain were in the forecast for the long weekend. Forecasters, however, held little hope for snow and a white Christmas.

Redeemer Lutheran To Have Special Service

Redeemer Lutheran Church of Cisco will observe the Savior's birth with a special worship service on Friday, Dec. 25, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The Rev. Dell J. Crockett, pastor of the congregation, announced that the message is entitled "The Hopes and Fears of All the Years!" based on Isaiah 52:7-10. Pastor Crockett also noted that "real peace and solidarity, whether in

Poland or in America, come only through God's Son, Jesus Christ, who is Lord of both our hopes and our fears." Special intercessions through prayer will be made for the oppressed millions in Poland.

The public is cordially invited by the membership to honor the Savior in worship on this anniversary of His birth.

Drainage Ditches Will Be Repaired

With streets in near normal condition after several weeks of concentrated work necessitated by heavy rains, city street department workers expect to spend the next month cleaning drainage ditches. City Manager Mike Moore reported this week.

A small bulldozer owned by the city was due out of the repair shop within a few days and it will be used in the drainage ditch project, the city manager said. Drainage ditches, along with gravel streets, had extensive damages during the heavy rains.

Mr. Moore said plans call for three water main lines and one sewer main to be replaced in the next month. This project will relieve troublesome conditions, he added.

The city street department maintains some 60 miles of gravel and dirt thoroughfares and virtually all needed extensive repairs after the record rainfall.

Brit Ferguson pledged \$50 to the fund bringing the total to \$5,200. Mayor Ritchie is coordinating efforts to provide a suitable award for help in finding the murderer of the Cisco grocery store worker.

Police officers have appealed to the public to report anything that they might consider any kind of a lead in the case. Mrs. Garcia was found dead from a bullet wound in a roadside ditch west of town on Dec. 1st. She had disappeared Nov. 29th from a local store.

Drugs pose risks for older adults

COLLEGE STATION--Coping with special risks that drugs pose for older adults takes care and understanding, cautions Judith Warren, a family life education specialist-aging. Older people themselves need to assume greater

responsibility in their own health care and drug management, the specialist urges. Warren is on the home economics staff of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

To help older people cope with their special risks, the National Institute on Drug Abuse has recommended several steps they can take: **TALK TO YOUR DOCTOR**. Give clear information to your doctor.

Tell your doctor(s) about all the medicines you are taking. Also, alert him or her to any allergies or known drug sensitivity you have.

Consider making a written list of your medicines before you visit the doctor.

ASK YOUR DOCTOR. Get clear information from your doctor.

It is your right to ask for -- and your doctor's responsibility to give you -- information about prescribed medications.

Make a list of any questions you have -- such as those below -- and ask them. The information you get could save you "headaches" and dollars.

- 1) What is the drug's name?
- 2) Why am I taking it? What's it for?
- 3) When and how often should I take it?
- 4) Under what conditions and why should I take it? At meals, with certain foods or drinks?
- 5) Should I avoid certain things, such as driving? We can usually carry out instructions better when we know why.
- 6) How long should I take

the medicine?
7) What are the possible side effects?

8) When should I report any problems?

For example, one side effect may be a headache, but if the headache is a very bad one, the doctor probably needs to know.

9) How should the drug be stored? In the refrigerator or away from heat, for example.

STOP: FINISH NOTES

If you don't get all the information written down while you're with the doctor, STOP in the waiting room and finish up the answers before you leave.

That way, they will be fresh in your mind.

OTHER SAFETY STEPS
Other safety steps to take are just as important as giving and getting clear information, Warren reminds.

Don't stop taking a drug without asking your doctor -- even if you feel OK.

Don't take drugs prescribed for anyone else, and don't share your medications with others.

Keep your medicines in their original bottles.

Throw out old or expired medicines.

PLAY IT SAFE

Finally, remember these "musts" above all: follow the doctor's instructions and alert your doctor to any problems you have. When in doubt, ASK.

With medicines, it's better to play it safe, Warren stresses.

'82 peanut crop needs planning

COLLEGE STATION--Peanut farmers must give careful attention to production costs, marketing and financing as they look to the 1982 crop.

Dr. Ashley, Lovell, an agricultural economist, suggests a "post game" evaluation of previous peanut crops to help growers mold a successful game plan for next season.

"Look at your operation field by field or use some other measure, such as dryland versus irrigated, in your post game analysis," suggests Lovell, who is with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M

University System. "Determine which fields or systems are profitable and eliminate those that are losers year in and year out."

When projecting production costs, remember that lower than average yields or significant increases in input prices will raise the breakeven price, adds the economist.

"If the peanut market is depressed in 1982, plan on growing peanuts in the short run as long as the price covers variable costs and no better alternative is available for the resources devoted to peanuts," Lovell advises growers.

Variable costs include expenses for items such as seed, fertilizer, insecticides, herbicides, machinery and labor.

Fixed costs are influenced by annual usage of tractors and equipment. This depends on the total acres of cropland over which the machinery is spread. Land rental agreements also influence fixed costs, the economist says.

As far as financing is concerned, lenders will look closely at the peanut section of the final legislation under which the 1982 peanut crop is produced, notes Lovell.

Assuming an increase in market price risk and continuous high production costs and interest rates, producers may want to share risks with landlords, he adds. This would reduce the operating capital requirement, interest expenses and price and yield risks.

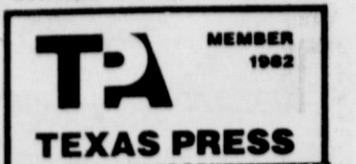
Of course, what the peanut market outlook is should be a major factor in deciding whether or not to grow peanuts in 1982, says Lovell. Again, a lot hinges on the final provisions of the anticipated new farm bill.

However, marketing strategies might include forward contracting a portion

of the crop to cover variable costs, studying crop reports and other supply and demand indicators, maintaining close contact with the market and what local buyers are willing to offer, and using farm or association storage for more orderly marketing.

With careful planning in developing a sound "game plan," peanut growers can take considerable uncertainty out of their '82 crop, believes the economist.

Planning & organization a must for effective volunteer recruitment

COLLEGE STATION--Effective recruitment of volunteers includes planning and organization.

"Basically, recruiting should be aimed at individuals or groups that are willing to help a program in some way," points out C.R. Salmon of Bryan, A-H and youth specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. (Volunteers play a vital part in the 4-H program conducted by the Extension Service.)

"Successful volunteer recruitment is linked to successful public relations," says Salmon. "Volunteers must know about the pro-

gram, understand and value it, and see a place for themselves in it."

Salmon suggests three preliminaries that should be worked out before asking for volunteer help: a clear definition of the roles of the volunteer, an understanding of why volunteers are needed, and a job description that clarifies assignments but does not stifle individual initiative.

The 4-H specialist outlines a number of proven methods for volunteer recruitment:

1. Use a personal phone call to make a date to see a possible volunteer.
2. Use hand-written notes for increased effectiveness.
3. Have a personal friend or acquaintance of the prospective volunteer approach him on a one-to-one basis about volunteering.

4. Sign up the volunteer immediately to make him feel wanted.

5. Try to get the group needing volunteers to recruit them directly.

6. Know the right time to ask people to volunteer.

7. Involve the potential volunteer in the activity without mentioning commitment.

8. Use a personal follow-up when volunteer work is over. This is crucial in attracting and keeping the volunteer.

9. Encourage volunteers to express their needs, interests and expectations.

10. Give volunteers a variety of jobs to choose from.

11. Provide an orientation to help volunteers get used to the job.

"Making sure that volunteers feel wanted and being flexible to meet their needs are two important considerations in dealing with volunteers," notes Salmon.

Teen Help Available At Houston Center

HOUSTON--Remember when you were a teenager, and the problems in your life centered around homework, parents, pimples, crushes and growing up? It was a devastating time.

But what if your life was made even more complicated by disease? What if you were a teenager with cancer?

Those adolescent problems might seem even larger. And you'd need lots of support - especially from your peers - to deal with them.

At The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute, a new wing for teenagers has been in operation since April. The wing offers support to teens with cancer by surrounding them with their peers, and with health professionals who care as much about

their problems as adolescents as they do about their problems as cancer patients.

"Here, the disease is the norm. Adolescence is what's frightening," explains Dr. Jan van Eys, head of both the adolescent and pediatric units of the hospital.

"Adolescence is a time when you want to grow up, but you backslide. The tension and pull are almost unbearable. It's difficult enough to have to deal with these things when you're healthy, but when you're not healthy, the problems are enormous," he says.

The adolescent unit provides beds for 25 adolescents between the ages of 14 and 21. Many of these patients were bedded in the pediatric unit before the adolescent unit was established. Others were and still are spread throughout the hospital. Placement in the adolescent unit is voluntary.

"In the adolescent unit, the emphasis is largely on the nursing service," D. van Eys points out. "The nurses understand the adolescents. They provide a support system for them."

Nurses hired for the adolescent unit have not necessarily received special training, Sue Potter, Assistant Director of Nursing Services - Pediatrics and Adolescents, says.

"However, many of them are young - in the 20 to 30 age group - and they're selected to be there because they want to work with adolescents. It's a very popular place," she says.

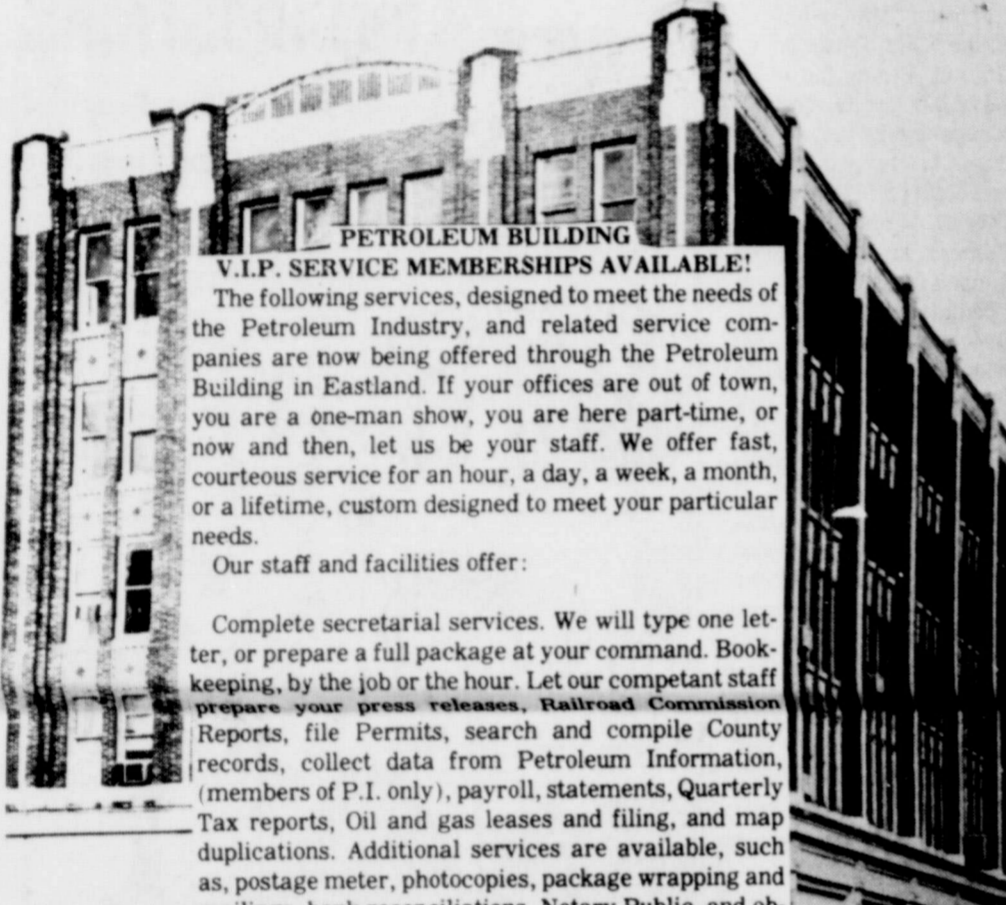

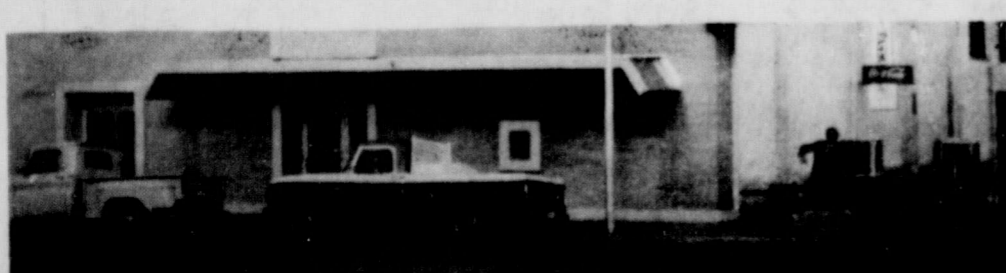

**The Christmas
Poinsettia**

The Poinsettia (Euphorbia Pulcherrima) is a native plant of the Republic of Mexico. This plant was brought to the United States many years ago by our Ambassador Poinsettia, and thus bears his name.

This plant is suitable for cultivating for winter display in the deep south, but it requires quite a bit of care for the northern climates. In the South it may be grown out doors and it will grow into large shapely bushes and/or trees, which produce very handsome bracts of red, pink, or creamy white. There are single and double-flowered poinsettias. In the double-flowered poinsettia you will find the bracts to be more numerous and remain attractive much longer.

We here in this area are more familiar with the single stem plant in a six inch pot with a single head of bracts, which are in full bloom at Christmas time. Some plants are grown with more than one branch, but the flower head (bracts) is usually smaller than a single stem specimen. After flowering the plant should be cut back and kept dry in a temperature of 50 to 55 degrees for several weeks. In May they should be pruned to within six to eight inches of the soil and started into growth again by watering and keeping in a sunny, warm location.

After new growth has started, a minimum temperature of 65 to 70 degrees should be maintained. If you want additional poinsettia plants, cuttings can be taken from this new growth and rooted at that time. The soil should consist of fibrous loam, three parts, and one part of equal proportions of dried cow manure, leaf mold and sand. These plants need to be ventilated more freely and the atmosphere should be kept drier than at any other time during the growth season.

Weekly fertilizing with a dilute liquid fertilizer with a reading of 20/20/20 is required for maximum growth and beauty. You must remember that the red (pink or white) bracts is not the flower. The tiny yellow center cluster is the flower of the poinsettia.

Poinsettias resent drafts and are easily damaged by spraying of insecticide. They need short days and long nights to bloom. Light at night prevents flowering and the formation of the bracts. The old myth that poinsettias are poisonous has been recently disproved. If you like plants and enjoy working with them, you may want to pick up some poinsettias after Christmas and try to make them bloom for the next year.

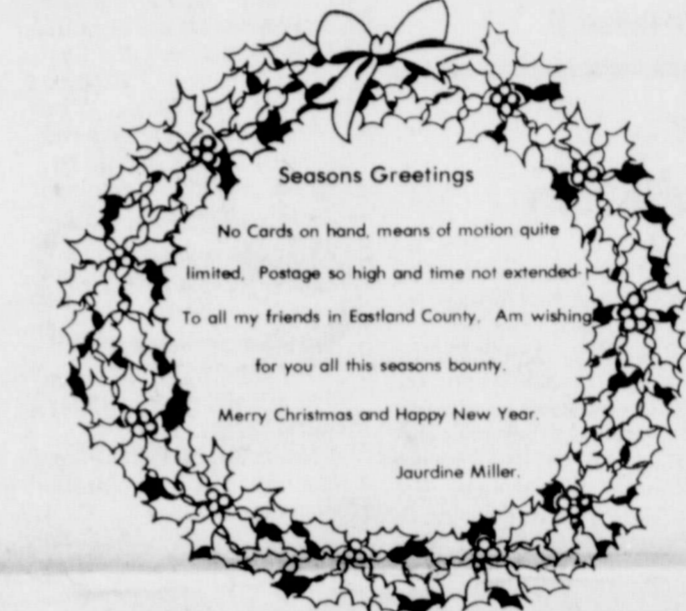
