



Watch Out For Home Repair Ripoffs

Sensible home repairs and improvements can protect and enhance your home in-

Unfortunately, Americans are bilked out of millions of dollars annually by dishonest repairmen. Prudence can protect you from such a loss.

Before starting any project, have several bids prepared by local contractors with good references. Never rely on verbal agreements. A contract should be prepared listing a complete description of the job to be done.

Before you sign any contract, make sure you understand it or have it checked by an attorney. Finally, never deal with anyone who shows up at your door uninvited and offers you a "special deal" on leftover materials or offers to perform a free inspection of anything in your

PROPERTY OWNERS HAVE LEGAL LIABILITY As a property, are you aware of the legal liabilities to which you may be expos-

ed? If someone slips on the steps of your house, you may be liable for more than just medical expenses. If you have an "attractive nuisance" on your property, such as machinery, a pile of

logs or a fish pond, you may have an additional obligation to protect children from injuring themselves on these objects.

Since the doctrine of an attractive nuisance applies to those who cannot appreciate the dangerof the object, a "no trespassing" sign or even a woven wire fence probably will not eliminate liability

You should keep such objects out of sight or in a location where children are not likely to trespass. Your attorney or insurance agent can give you additional insight into the various types of liability property owners are exposed to.

Air conditioning is the greatest energy consumer in most Texas homes. And when your old air conditioning unit wears out, you might consider replacing it with a new unit that has a high energy efficiency rating-or

SAVE TAXES ON OLD BUILDINGS

If you own a commercial building that is more than 20 years old, you may consider rehabilitating it in order to reap significant tax benefits.

The Revenue Act of 1978 provides for a tax investment credit to renovate commercial buildings. To receive the maximum credit of 10 percent, a building must have a useful lift to seven years or more.

For expenditures to be eligible, a building must retain 75 percent or more of the original exterior walls after the rehabilitation is complete. The cost of acquiring the building and enlarging it do not qualify.

The tax benefits are limited to commercial uses. Even apartments do not qualify under the act. For more information, contact someone who can give you sound legal and tax advice.
