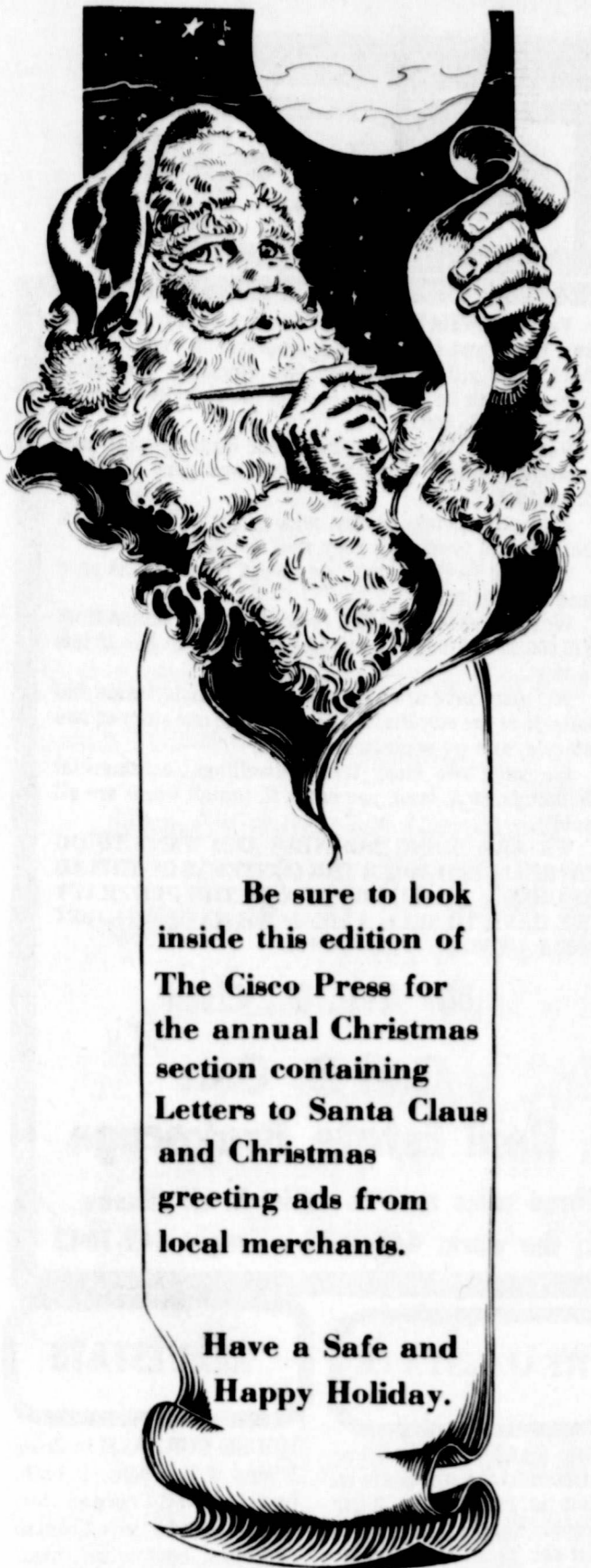

Coach Parchman & Four Lobo Players Honored At Banquet

Coach John Parchman and four members of his 1983 Lobo football team were among honorees at an All-Central Texas football banquet at the Traveler's Steak House in Early last Thursday night. Some 600 persons attended the event, a project of the Early Bank.

Mr. Parchman, along with Coach Lane Jackson of Highland and Randy Allen of Ballinger, were named All-

Central Texas Coaches of the Year.

Quarterback Joe Perry and Defensive Tackle Johnny Seabourn were named to the Central Texas football first team. Second team

players included Johnny Ramirez and Sean Manire of the Lobos.

Quarterback Aaron Keese of Ballinger was named "Player of the Year"

by the All-Central Texas selection committee. Program speakers included Coach Gordon Woods of the Brownwood Lions.

A special service honored seven players on Central Texas teams who lost their lives during the season, mostly in accidents not related to football. This group included three Junction players who died in an auto accident, and their coach was among the speakers.

"The dinner was a fine affair that all of us sincerely appreciated," Coach Parchman said. He and the four Lobo players honored attended the event.

Ramirez of Cisco, and Kael Joiner of Eastland. The players were selected to the All-Cen Tex Team and Parchman tied for "Coach of the Year".

Council Votes In Favor Of Alternate Waste Water Site

The City Council voted unanimously in favor of a motion to authorize Mayor Eris Ritchie to execute a land purchase option for an alternate site for a proposed new Cisco waste-water treatment facility at the semi-monthly meeting Tuesday night at City Hall.

The alternate site action was taken after the Council signed by 46 persons, asking that the site not be considered because it would (1) create a public nuisance, (2) hurt property values, and (3) cause a detrimental environmental impact to the area.

Mrs. Jo Andrews, who lives on the Breckenridge Highway presented the petition to the Council. She said that most of the signers lived in the area of the proposed new facility site.

City Manager Mike Moore told the Council that engineering studies indicate that the site, which is composed of 44.26 acres and owned by Frank Wilcoxon, would be much more cost effective than the site optioned several months ago. It will be necessary to have the new site under option before the Texas Resources Board will inspect and approve it, he added.

A committee of Councilmen, including Ivan Webb, Brad Kimbrough and Linton Batteas and Mr. Moore, worked out an agreement with Mr. Wilcoxon to buy the site for \$44,260 with \$2,000 for an option that would count toward the purchase price.

Mayor Pro Tem Webb, who presided, observed that "any site we select will probably be opposed and we are under court order to act." Councilmen agreed that "we feel an obligation to select the most cost effective site for this project" as they approved Site II.

Financing for a new waste-water treatment facility was approved in recent elections.

In other action, the Council took under advisement a request by the Westbound Water Supply Corporation for an adjustment in new water rates approved by the city last month. The new rates of \$1.27 per thousand gallons replaces a 50 cent rate in effect since the water district began operations some four years ago.

J.C. McDaniel, Westbound executive officer, and Jack Bishop of Austin, representing the Texas Rural Water Association, and the Westbound board appeared at a work session prior to the regular Council meeting. They expressed the opinion that a contract signed with the city when the district began operating would still be binding and indicated that a court test might be sought. The Council voted to take Westbound's request under advisement for study and

possible action at a later date.

An ordinance providing that Glendale Avenue in the Webbwood Heights Addition, Section 1, be vacated, abandoned and closed was passed on second and final reading.

The Council gave final approval to an ordinance updating the city's plumbing standards to include standards to meet state requirements. The new ordinance also increases inspection fees.

A request by out-of-town city water customers not on Westbound lines for free use of the city landfill was taken under advisement. City Manager Moore said the city has 77 water customers who live outside the city limits who must pay for using the landfill although they pay a \$10 monthly surcharge for water. The matter will be considered again at the next

meeting, it was decided.

A request by Billy C. Cozart, Stephen R. Gillentine and Bobby Green to close Avenue A between East 20th Street and East 21st Street was approved and City Attorney Bill Wright was asked to prepare an ordinance to that effect. The city manager said the three men own all property in the area and that a street has never been opened there.

The Cisco Livestock Show Association's contract on ground occupied by a building formerly used for stock shows and now leased to a salt water disposal firm was modified at the request of the association.

Financial statements for the months of October and November were presented by City Accountant Pablo Rodriguez. The October

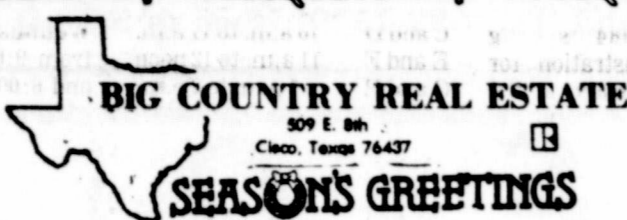

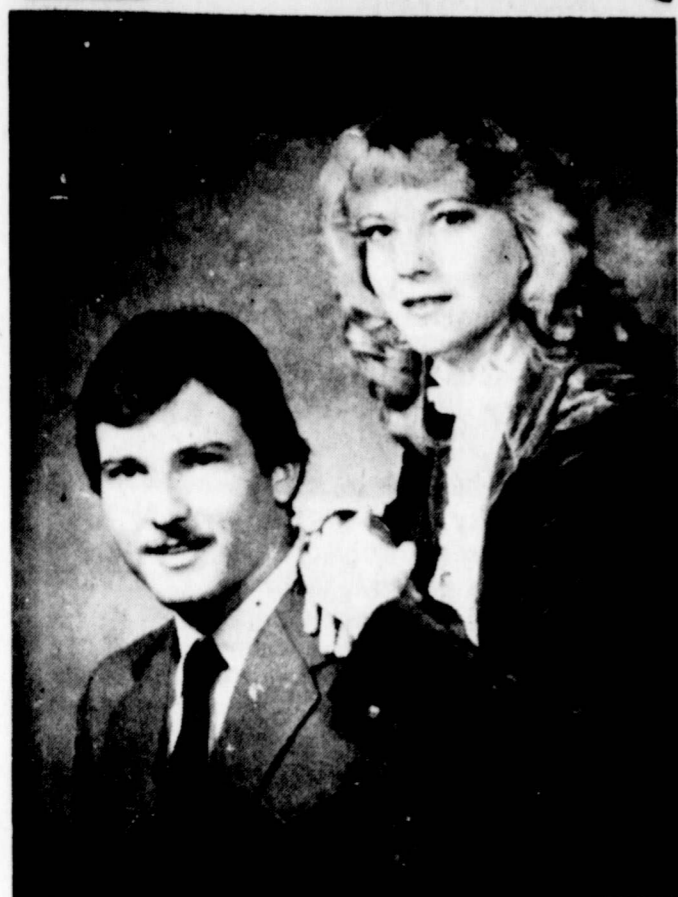

Hero may be the most motivating device used in Gate's course, but he is only one of many pieces of equipment utilized at the Abilene campus.

Electronics technology is one of several technical-vocational courses offered by CJC in Abilene. And, according to Gates, CJC is the only school in Abilene which teaches electronics technology. Currently, about 80 students are enrolled in CJC's night classes and 14 are enrolled full-time in day classes.

CJC offers an associate degree in electronics technology, which focuses mainly on electronics repair, especially computers. Gates said that although more people are now entering the field, it still offers good job opportunities at above-average salaries.

To enter the program, a student must have a high school degree or its equivalent. Upon completion of the course of study, students can expect to earn \$8 an hour at the entry level, Gates said. And, the possibilities for jobs are good.

"For every 100 jobs, there are 95 people to fill them," Gates said. Students can expect to advance on the pay scale quickly, Gates said, and reach a top salary of about \$28,000 a year.

CJC started its electronics technology course in 1976 and fully implemented it in 1979, Gates said. Most of the students are from Abilene and surrounding towns. The average is mid-20s, and the students come from all backgrounds.

"They've been involved in just about everything under the sun," Gates said.

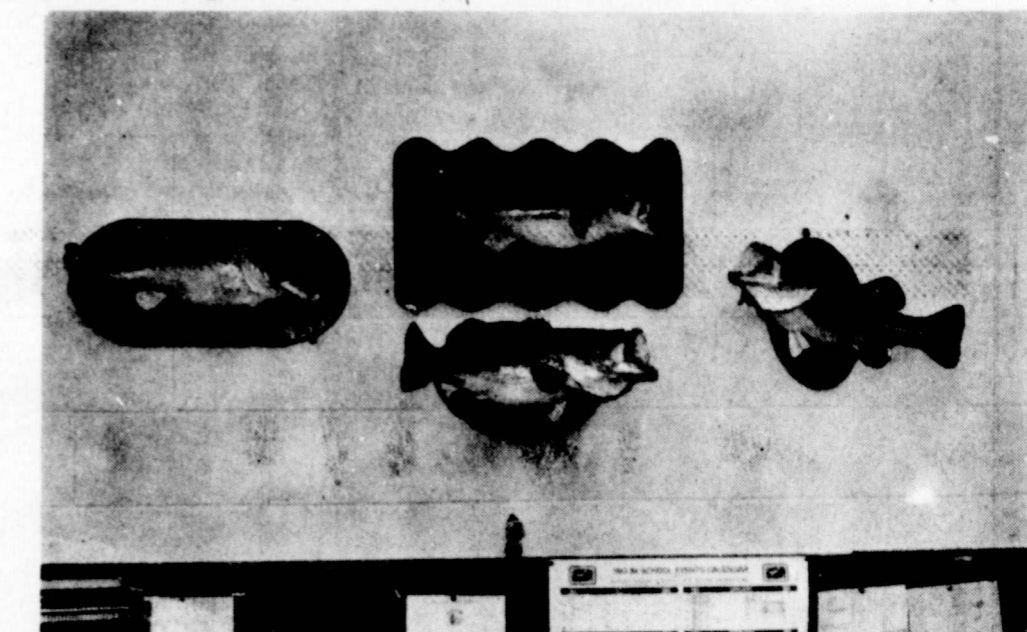
The damage consisted largely of fence posts, Mr. Webb said.

Texas Law Makes Jail Term Mandatory For DWI

A minimum jail term is mandatory for any person convicted two or more times for DWI under a stricter Texas law effective January 1, 1984.

Colonel Jim Adams, DPS director and chairman of the task force which recommended tougher DWI legislation, said the new law should close the back door in the criminal justice system for repeat offenders.

"Deferred adjudication, which allowed repeat violators to wipe the slate clean after each DWI arrest, will be eliminated under this new statute," Adams pointed out. "Even if probation is given, a conviction record will be established for the offender and this record can be used in subsequent prosecution of any additional drunk driving charges. Jail time is mandatory as a con-

dition of probation beginning with the second DWI conviction."

The new law provides increased penalties for DWI conviction. Conviction on first offense DWI carries a fine of \$100 to \$2,000 with jail term ranging from 72 hours to two years. A second offense conviction is punishable by jail time ranging from a minimum of 15 days up to two years with a fine of \$300 to \$2,000. Convic-

tion for third and subsequent DWI offenses carry a fine of \$500 to \$2,000 and confinement in jail for a minimum of 30 days to two years or in the state penitentiary for 60 days to five years.

Minimum terms of confinement are increased by 60 days and fine limits are raised by \$500 if the DWI offense results in serious bodily injury to another person. If a drunk driver is found to be responsible for a traffic

fatality, the law prescribes a mandatory term for the violator.

Admas said the revised DWI statute will aid in the prosecution of drunk drivers.

"Under the present law, a person is only presumed to be intoxicated if tests reveal a blood alcohol concentra-

tion of .10 per cent or more," Admas said. "The new law establishes that a driver is definitely too drunk to drive at the .10 per cent level."

The revised statute also contains provisions for automatic 90-day suspension of driving privileges for refusal to submit to an alcohol chemical test. The refusal also will be admissible evidence in the driver's trial. The drunk driver's vehicle may be confiscated and sold upon the fourth DWI conviction.

The DPS director predicted that the statute will help deter DWI violation and provide the means to identify repeat offenders.

"Despite increased DWI arrests and enhanced public awareness about this problem, far too many people still believe that there are no unfavorable consequences to drunk driving," Adams said. "Texas law enforcement agencies do not have enough resources to adequately police all streets and highways. However, when

these changes in the DWI law take effect, drunk drivers who are detected can count on being punished in

a meaningful fashion. This should help discourage drunk driving," concluded Adams.

Drilling Bits

Iclver Inc. of San Angelo has revealed plans to drill a 2,900-ft. developmental well in the Eastland Regular Field. The operator has 100 acres leased, with drillsite in Eastland County's George Glick Survey, Sec. 14, and has designated the venture as the No. 1 Tony Winfrey. Drillsite is two miles north of Pioneer.

A Dallas-based operator has staked location for the No. 2 Jackson, a wildcat well to be located two miles south of Carbon. With projected total depth of 3,400 feet, the well is in a 412-acre lease in Eastland County's IG&NRR Survey, A-680. The operator is Carla Petroleum Inc.

At a location two miles southeast of Romeny, TLC Development Corp. of Fort Worth has finished three new oil producers in Eastland County's Hawkeye (Adams Branch) Field. Location is in a 20-acre lease in the H&TCRR Survey, Sec. 76, Blk. 3.

The wells are designated as the Nos. 7-1, 7-2, & 7-3 Betwell-Eisenbach, pumping oil at the rate of seven,

eight, & nine barrels per day, respectively.

Bottomed at 1,244, 1,222, & 1,222 feet respectively the wells will produce from perforations ranging from 1,174 to 1,183 feet into the hole.

Richey Inc. of Ft. Worth has filed for permit to drill two 4,200-ft. developmental wells in Eastland County's REB Field. Drillsite is four miles north of Eastland in a 40-acre lease.

The No. 1 TexFel-West is located in the H&TCRR Survey, A-302, Sec. 15, Blk. 4.

The No. 1 P.C. Vines is located in the H&TCRR Survey, A-300, Sec. 11, Blk. 4.

Conservation Oil and Gas Inc. of Graham has driven stake for a 4,450-ft. developmental try in the Palo Pinto Regular Field three miles southwest of Graford. It will be called the No. 1 Dickerson. The location is in a 320-acre lease in the TE&L Survey.

A wildcat gas well has been finished in Palo Pinto County eight miles southwest of Palo Pinto with

Walter G. Carpenter of Kerrville as the operator.

The well is designated as the 3-B Barron.

It flowed at the rate of 170,000 CF gas daily on an .825-in. choke and was assigned a rating of 225,000-CFD on absolute open flow.

The operation was in a 125-acre lease in the T&PRR Survey. Carpenter took the hole to 2,384-ft. bottom and plugged back to 1,615. It will produce from a set of perforations 1,649 to 1,660 feet into the hole.

At a location three miles west of the Brazos community, International Oil and Gas Consultant of Graham are preparing to drill the No. 2 Chestnut. It is a projected 4,200-ft. developmental well in the Palo Pinto Regular Field. It will be spudded in a 320-acre lease in the T&PRR Survey, Palo Pinto County.

A successful natural gas wildcat has been completed in Palo Pinto County eight miles south of Mineral Wells.

It is the No. 1-B Wells, flowing at the rate of 375,000 CF per day on a .75-inch choke. The absolute open flow came in at 470,000 CFD rating.

With Western Energy

Resources of Fort Worth as the operator, the well bottomed at 4,334 feet. It will produce from a perforated interval 4,332 to 4,334 feet into the hole. Location is in a 160-acre unit, T&PRR Survey.

Three new producers have been brought on line in the East Carter Field, Palo Pinto County, with combined potential to pump 129 barrels of oil and 250,000 CF gas per day. W.G. Arnot Jr. of Breckenridge is the operator.

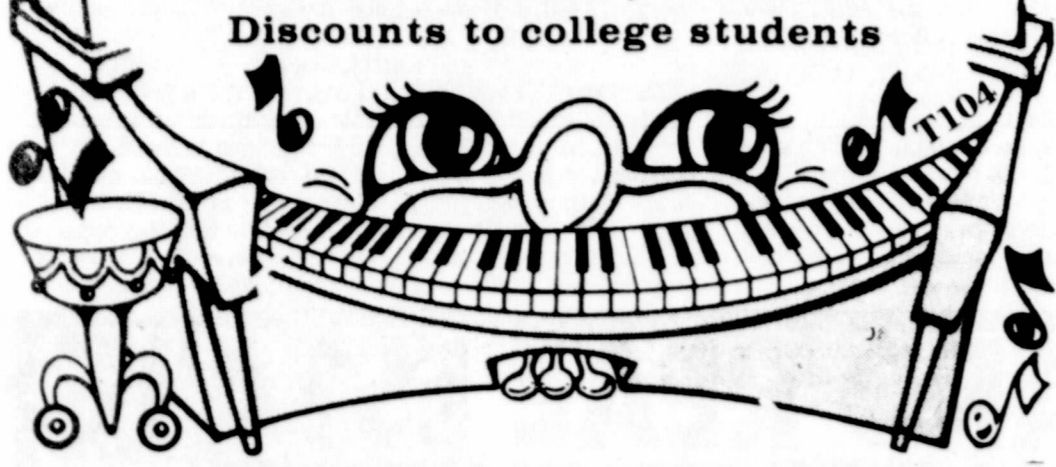

I would like to say "Thank You" to the many people who helped with the county pecan show. We had lots of good help from the time we began setting up on Thursday until all the tables were put away Saturday at noon. Many pecan growers, Eastland Chamber of Commerce members, and others helped in some part of the pecan show.

The process was repeated at Stephenville last Tuesday as pecans were shelled and prepared for the regional pecan show. There were 528 entries in the regional show. Lin Bock, Gordon Woolam, John Blair and I assisted with the processing. Pecans were judged at Stephenville and then taken to the Red Bird Mall in Dallas for display. We do not have results of that show at this time.

Trees are an important part of any home landscape, and homeowners need to be aware of the many varieties and uses of trees before making their selections.

Select trees to perform specific jobs or solve certain problems in the landscape.

For example, they can be used as shade, as a wind-break or as a buffer against traffic or other noises. They can have aesthetic qualities—enhancing a view, serving as a background or screening an objectionable sight. Limbs and foliage provide pattern and texture while a variety of flowers, fruit and foliage provide color and beauty.

Giving a little thought and consideration to selecting landscape trees can provide much satisfaction in the finished landscaping plan. It can also prevent costly maintenance or even replacement at a later date.

Consider the different characteristics of trees, such as shape, ultimate size, foliage texture and color, and growth rate, when making your selection.

Be cautious in selecting fast-growing trees, since many of these are also soft and brittle, easily damaged by wind or ice, or have a relatively short life.

At the same time, many slow-growing trees, including live oak and red oaks will grow rather rapidly if watered and fertilized properly.

When selecting a young tree, remember that the biggest size is not always the best. A young tree with a 1-to-2 inch trunk diameter will usually become reestablished faster and surpass a much larger tree planted at the same time. We have a list of adapted shade trees for Eastland County. Call or come by the County Extension office for this list.

On November 15, we conducted a demonstration by injecting coastal bermuda hay and aorghum hybrid hay with anhydrous ammonia to improve the protein content. Sixty pounds of the fertilizer was applied to one ton of hay which was covered with plastic. After three weeks the hay was tested again for protein. The coastal hay's protein was increased from 8.5% to 14.3% and the sorghum hay's protein was increased from 9.4% to 21%. This process not only improves the protein, but improves digestibility and forage intake resulting in significant improvement in annual performance. The value of this ton of hay was increased by \$60.90 at a cost of \$21.40.

The Cisco Junior College Agriculture Department assisted with this demonstration. I think we will be seeing this practice a lot in the years to come.

statement showed that ad valorem taxes amounting to \$136,660 were collected that month - the most ever collected in one month. Total income for the month amounted to \$178,537 and this included \$8,996 in sales tax, \$7,892 in franchise taxes, \$6,773 in sanitation charges, \$3,007 in oil and gas income, and \$3,366 in miscellaneous revenue.

Expenses for October, first month of the new fiscal year, amounted to \$33,855 for the general fund. The working fund began the both with

\$11,850 and ended with \$62,346. Items taken out of the general fund for the month include purchasing certificates of deposit.

The November statement showed ad valorem tax collections to \$23,900 to bring the fiscal year's total to \$160,561. The city received a sales tax check for \$30,560 during the month. November expenditures totalled \$73,004, including some \$18,000 for police department equipment and \$19,909 for street department equipment.

Water sales amounted to \$35,252 with \$31,607 in expenses. Bills paid during the

month included \$28,743 as the final payment on Front Street improvements. The working fund totaled \$138,900 to begin the month and \$60,727 at the end. A \$50,000 CD was purchased during the month.

The Council approved the payment of regular accounts and statements for the two months.

During the Citizen-Council discussion, a committee composed of Ronnie Ledbetter, O.L. (Robbie) Robinson and Charles Graham appeared to discuss the water charges at the Cisco Country Club. They said the club would not be able to operate

under the new water rates. Councilmen agreed with the group that the golf course, like the airport, was a community asset that the golf course provides recreational opportunities that are needed. A committee com-

posed of Councilmen Ingram, Dennis, Kimbrough and City Manager Moore was appointed to meet with the country club group to seek a solution.

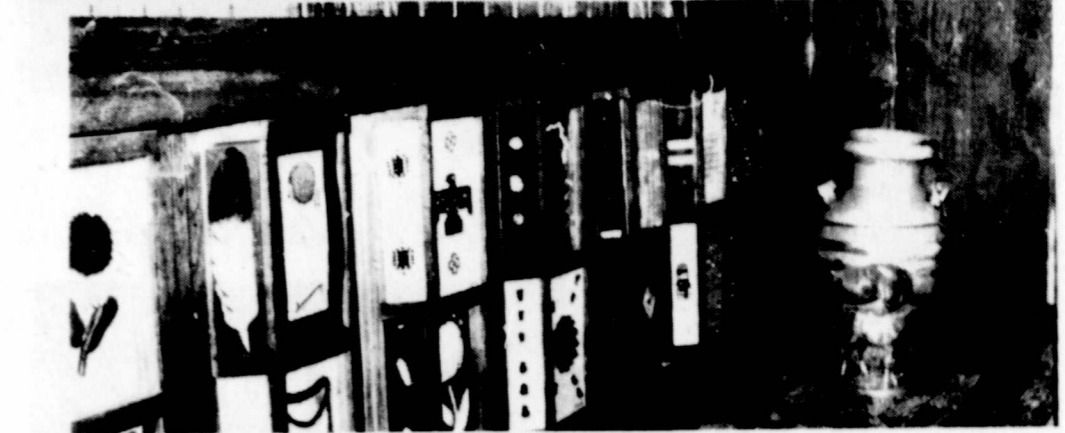
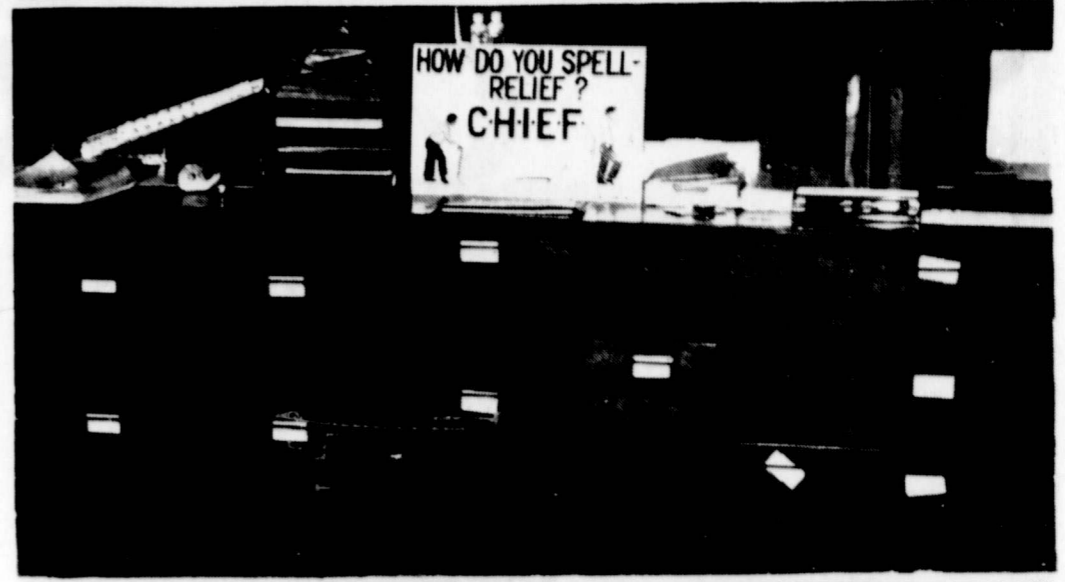

We hope this Christmas will be especially wonderful and that it will usher in a new year of peace and prosperity.

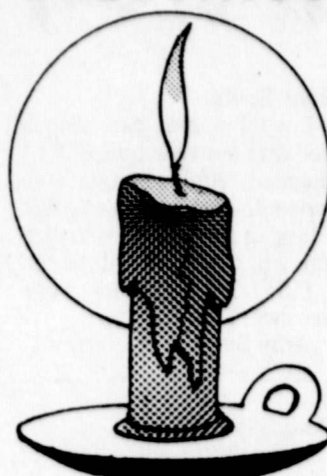

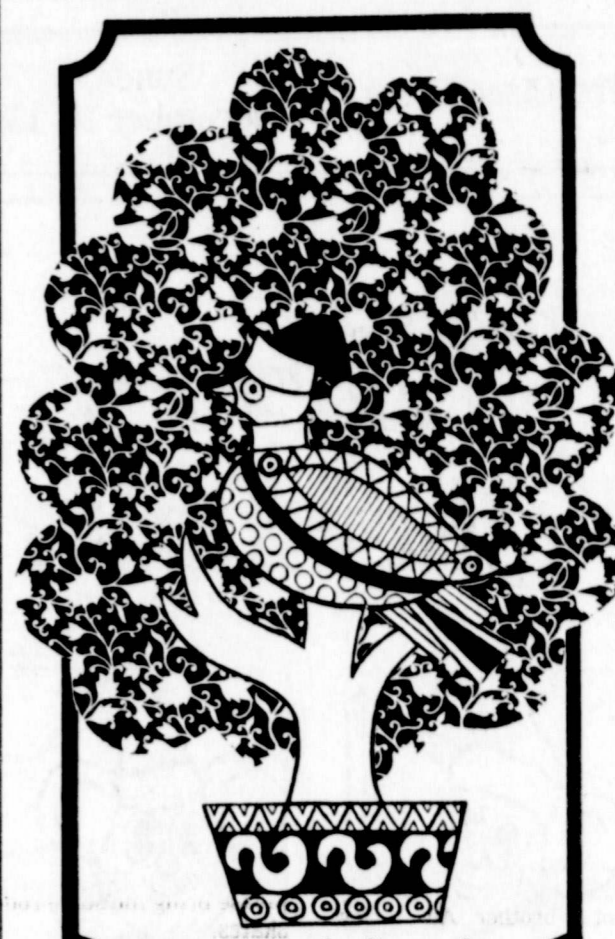

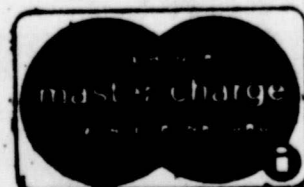
