## Superintendent James Couch Turns In Resignation To School Board Tuesday

James Couch, superintendent of the Cisco Public School system for the past eight years, submitted his resignation to the board of trustees at a special meeting Tuesday night at the high school library.

The resignation will be considered by the board at their May meeting as no action could be taken Tuesday night since the matter was not on the meeting agenda, according to Dr. Allen McGinness, the new board president.

Mr. Couch said he would like to be relieved of his

duties June 30th. He told The Press that his plans for the future were not complete at this time.

Mr. Couch, a native of Levelland, has been a member of the faculty of the Cisco Public Schools for 24 years. He served 11 years as a principal here before being named superintendent eight years ago. He has been in the teaching profession for 31 years. He is 52 years of age.

Mr. Couch came to Cisco Junior College out of high school on a football scholarship. After graduating from

CJC, he went to H-SU in Abilene and graduated with a BA Degree. He holds a MA degree in school administration from Howard Payne University. He and his wife Joy are the parents of two children.

The contract of Mr. Couch as superintendent was extended a few months ago through 1987.

"I have enjoyed my work and living in Cisco," Mr. Couch told The Press.

Dr. McGinness, who was named board president to succeed Howard Worley at the Tuesday meeting, said

that Mr. Couch would assist the board in their search for his replacement. Applications will be received for some six weeks, Dr. McGinness said. From resumes, the board will select as many

as 10 prospects who will be invited to Cisco for interviews, he added.

"I think James Couch has done a fantastic job for Cisco and the school system," Dr. McGinness said. "His work and leadership have provided us with a substantial fund with which to upgrade our school facilities without asking for a tax bond issue.

"When Mr. Couch completes his work with us, he will certainly leave with our sincere thanks for a job well done and for our best wishes in a direction his career might take."

Dr. McGinness noted that the school board will be calling for bids soon for a substantial addition and improvement program at Intermediate School.

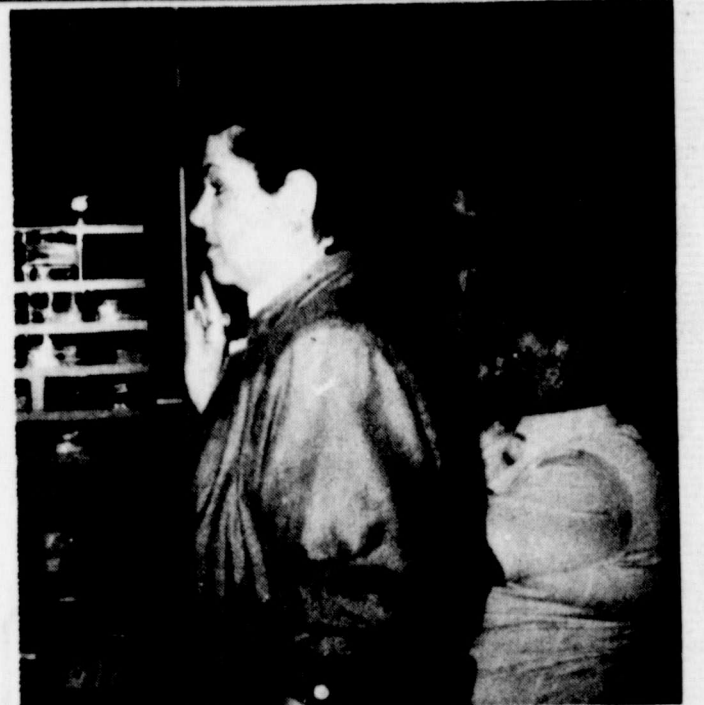
Howard Worley, who served as board president last year, was elected vice presi-

Mrs. Sue Covert was sworn in as a new member of the board, having been elected to Place 6 at the April 6th election. County Judge Scott Bailey administered the oath of office for her.

Mr. Couch reported that work was progressing nicely on removing the debris from the windstorm damaged Intermediate School gymnasium and that the walls should be down within a few days.

Several members of the board, including Mr. Smith, Ralph Berry, Dr. McGinness, and Mr. Worley, agreed to attend a seminary for trustees and school officials at Tarleton State University in Stephenville on April 23rd.

## Roy Dennis and Bill Roberts Are Sworn In At City Council Meeting

Incumbent Roy Dennis and newly elected council member Bill Roberts were sworn in at Tuesday night's regular scheduled City Council meeting by Cisco Mayor Eris Ritchie. Both men ran unopposed in the elections held April 6.

Dennis retains his position at place 3 and Roberts replaces Bobby Rains at place 4 on the council. Mr. Rains was commended by Mayor Ritchie for his years of service on the council.

Before the swearing in of the members, Election Judge M.L. (Top) Bailey gave a report on the canvassing of the election.

Linton Bateas was elected as Mayor Pro-Tem of the council by acclamation since no other candidates were named. Brad Kimbrough had been nominated, but he declined since he might have to leave during the middle of a meeting.

The council approved a resolution revising the street paving policy and procedures for the city. In the new resolution, the city will require curb and gutter on any streets which are contracted out for paving. The old policy said curb and gutter would be placed on the streets only if 80 percent of the landowners agreed.

Under the new policy, it states that "paving projects in which the adjoining property owners refused to participate by providing curb and gutter shall not be considered for funding." However, it was stressed that those streets could still be paved with the seal coating method used by the city's own crews.

As justification for the policy changes, City Manager Mike Moore informed the council of the numerous complaints he receives about West 17th Street paving project contracted out last year by the city. The street was paved

without curb and gutters, since the required amount of landowners would not agree to pay for their share.

Council member Brad Kimbrough was the only member to vote against the new paving policy.

In other business, the council heard a report from Municipal Court Judge Doug Fry for the quarter of January, February and March of 1985. The total revenue of the court was \$6,337 of which \$5,133 was paid to the city and \$1,204 to the state.

The council gave approval for the authorization for city engineers to prepare and submit a pre-application for EPA Wastewater Treatment Plant construction grant for the fiscal year of 1985. In a worksession held from 6 until 7 p.m. before the regular part of the council meeting, the city manager had reviewed and discussed with the council the funding potential and pre-application process for the grant.

The city probably has no better than a 33 1/3 chance of being funded this year, but they would stand a much better chance of getting the funding in 1986. In order to still be considered in 1986, they need to file an application for this year also. City Manager

Moore said he had been told there would be essentially no charge for the pre-applications.

A request by Weldon Harris of Cisco was granted by the council for the closing of Foose Avenue one-half block north and south of East 10th Street. The council stressed that the vacation of an avenue or street by the city still gives the city an easement for utility lines, etc.

The council discusses an annual Lone Star Gas Company cost-of-service adjustment for the city of Cisco in which the company informed the council it will be raising gas bills by the amount of 24 cents a bill, or \$2.79 a year. City Manager Moore stated this is just an advisory from Lone Star Gas and does not need the city's approval. Council members requested that Lone Star officials appear before the council to discuss the matter more in detail.

Council members did not approve an ordinance increasing the franchise fee for Lone Star Gas Company since the gas company said the increase would simply be a "hidden tax" by the city.

A resolution was approved by the council authorizing the city to enter into an interlocal contract with the

Texas Department of Parks and Wildlife for the repair and improvement of the city's boat dock. The contract calls for the repair of the floating boat dock to include five ten foot sections, redwood floor decking and styrofoam flotation devices, at a cost of \$2,560. The total cost will be paid by the state department.

Council member Bobby Ingram requested that the installation of the ramps be included in the project. He stated that a professionally built dock should be installed by professionals. The city manager said he would check on installation costs and see what avenues could be pursued.

Two public hearings were held by the city on the purposes and development of a community development grant application and for an economic development grant application.

In the community development area, the city discussed applying for such a grant to revitalize an area of the city north of the railroad tracks and east of Conrad Hilton Avenue. The project would call for housing rehabilitation, demolitions, and water, street, sewer, and drainage improvements.

The economic development grant application would be for money to loan to an individual who plans to re-open the old tile plant east of Cisco. The funds would be repaid to the city with a low rate of interest. The project would help "stimulate the economy and provide more jobs."

An uncollectable delinquent tax roll for the city was approved by the council. City Manager Moore stated the tax roll would include personal property which cannot be collected on for any of several reasons. He said the books would still be maintained but no delinquent notices would have to be mailed, since it is known those particular ones would be uncollectable anyway. He stressed that real property will not go in this new roll, only personal property which is uncollectable since the property or owners can no longer be found.

A permit was approved by the council for the operation of Kenny's Funland Carnival on April 29 through May 4 in the 100 block of East 3rd and 4th Streets. The carnival is sponsored by the Cisco Volunteer Fire Department and will be held the week after Cisco's Folklife Festival.



# Oil Belt News

Drillsite has been staked for the No. 7 McCall, a 1,500-ft. developmental well in the Eastland Regular Field. The operation will be located one mile southwest of Romney. Drillsite is in a 30-acre lease in the G.A. McCall Survey. The operator is Nimrod Operation of Cisco.

The No. 1 Rice, a developmental well, is scheduled to be drilled in the Eastland Regular Field at a location five miles east-northeast of Cisco. Monarch Energy has filed first production figures on a new oil well in Eastland Regular Field. The No. 5-A T.U.I. Hall showed potential to pump 14 barrels of oil. 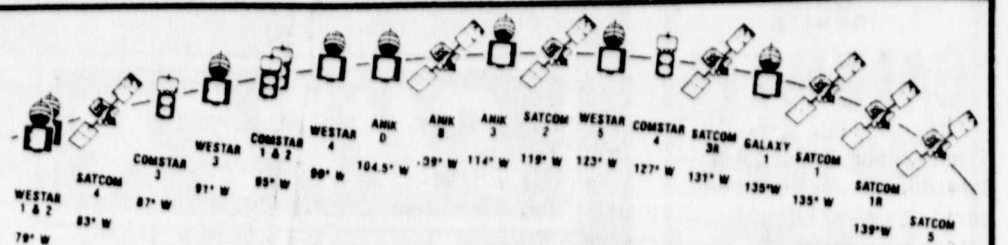

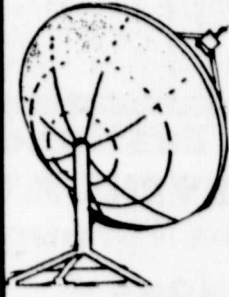

You are liable for filing a declaration of estimated tax if you have income not subject to withholding of more than \$500 and you expect to owe at least \$400 on next year's return. The IRS states that you are also liable if you expect to owe at least \$400 and your gross income is more than:

\$20,000 if you file as single, head of household, or qualifying widow or widower.

\$10,000 if you are married, can file a joint declaration, and both of you have received wages for 1985.

\$5,000 if you are married and cannot file a joint declaration.

Just like withholding by employers, the IRS says, estimated taxes are paid in advance of the actual tax return, Form 1040, due for the year. Estimated taxes are normally paid in four installments, and there is a substantial penalty for underpayment of estimated taxes.

For 1985 returns, the three other estimated tax installment dates are: June 17, 1985; September 16, 1985; and January 15, 1986.

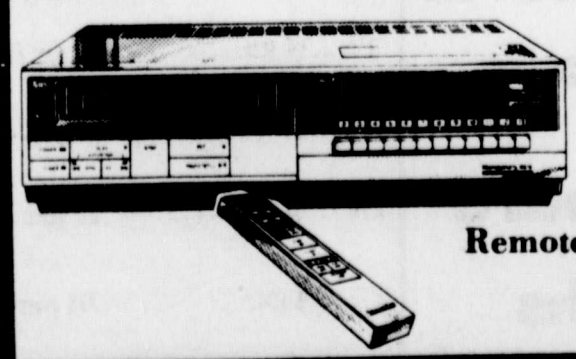

## 40 Years Later

### Milan/Milano

The LaScala (world famous opera house) is in this city. The full name is Teatro alla Scala (Theater of the Stairs). The historic structure was built in 1778 on the site of a church. A monument honors Leonardo de Vinci, who worked in Milan. The auditorium holds more than 3,000 persons. Inside the building is one of the most splendid and perfect eighteenth century halls, with our types of boxes and two galleries, exquisitely decorated. The Theatre Museum, the Little Scala, the State Design Laboratory and the Dancing School, make up the complexity of La Scala.

A Famous Fresco, the Last Supper, by Leonardo Da Vinci (1452-1519) is located in the Cenacolo di Santa Maria della Grazie in Milan. The fresco was miraculously saved in the bombing of 1943 which destroyed almost all of the refectory, where it was displayed.

It is said of the famous artist that "nothing he touched was not transformed into eternal beauty".

The Arcade. Many fine shops and buildings are located in the Arcade, which is a glass enclosed walkway.

"It was a great shame that Giuseppe Meoni fell down from the top of a scaffolding place in front of the eve of inauguration first, because the Bolognese architecture lost his life in the fall, and second, because he lost the opportunity, even for a short time, of feeling proud of the extraordinary success, which the Milanese decreed at once, of his creation of stone, cement, iron and glass, to which he had dedicated great meticulous care for twelve long and weary years, from 1865-1877.

There is not other place in Milan, in fact which the Milanese fell more pride than in the Arcades.

The ideal meeting place, of rest, of pleasant idling, to contract business and discuss politics, art and literature, and to shop and to relax at the elegant restaurants and side walk cafes.

The Ancient church of San Gattardo has the most beautiful steeple in Milan, and is visible from many points in the city. Its octagonal framework is bick, with many small interlacing

Gothic arches and long stone piliasters. The church was erected around 1336, and the interior has only one nave with a vestibule.

The Courtyard of Palazzo Marino, or the Palace which was started in 1553-1558, was built for the rich Genoese Tomasso Marino and completed in 1888-90. Today the Palace houses the Milanese Council.

The Lazzaretto was started in 1488 and finished in 1629 and is a very old building and was used as a hospital during the most famous plague of all times, which horribly decreased the population of Milan and the surrounding countryside.

There werehuts and barracks, carts and people and

those that did have the plague were brought here to die.

Other great buildings and church are the Santa Maria Delle Grazie and was built between 1466 and 1490 and is one of the great monuments to the Lombardian Renaissance.

The Park and the Arch of Peace.

The Park was once a part of the Sforza family estate and the arch of peace was started in 1807 and completed in 1838, complete with a six horse chariot, winged victories and allegorical reliefs.

In 1859, Victor Emanuele II and Napoleon II, Emporor of the French, passed under it in triumph.

The Columns of San Lorenzo are sixteen isolated columns and were brought to Milan and placed all in a line in the IV century to make the front of the Basilica of San Lorenzo.

They were taken from the palace of the Emperor Massimiano Eruelo, in Rome, and were built during the II-II century. The Arches of Porta Nuova were started in 1171 as part of a wall to protect Milan from the invasion of the Barborossans.

They were constructed in blocks of black and white marble. At one time, there were many canals in Milan, but the business people thought the land more valuable, so the canals were filled in and most of them are very sorry now, that they

have lost "the romantic face of Milan" with the disappearance of the circle of the Naviglio canal. There is only one reminder left and that is the Basin of the Porta Ticinese.

On each side, the basin is thick with cement, surrounded by large houses all alike, meanwhile the big green carriages of the trams which rattle along the narrow shore make and effect of running on a Venetian foundation.

Milan is by far the most modern and progressive of the cities in Italy.

The skyscrapers already are one of the many motives for pride on the Milanese of today. They have no fear of rivals, at least in Italy. This Milan which does not lack

seaplane stations, swimming pools, places and sports arenas, ice rinks, cycle racing tracks, hippodromes, arena and stadiums.

The great industries like Motto and Alemagna, the principal Milanese industries (Montecantini-Edison, Pirelli, Sian-Viscoa, Falk, Marelli Group) give work to

around 57,000 people in Milan alone, and outside Milan, in the rest of Italy, to another \$178,000. The great Trade Fair is also here, one of the greatest in Europe and the world.

The pavilions and floors have 638,771 square meters. Exhibits from all over the world are shown here.



The Texas Wheat Producers Board 105 day countdown toward a Board member election and state-wide territory referendum reached two milestones last week, according to Otis Harman, Tulsa, Chairman. Sixteen area meetings held through the state in cooperation with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service to explain the program were completed. Also, the March 23 deadline for requesting producer names to be placed on the ballot ended.

In the 34-county area of the established TWPB, three Board seats were available with current members eligible to stand for re-election. District III member, Wiley Tabor of Quanah, and District II member, Leo Witkowski of Hereford, chose to submit their names for re-election. Robert Graves, Board member from District I Perryton headed the list of ten producers requesting that the name of Scott McGarraugh be placed on the ballot. One-third of the 9-man Board seats are open for election each biennium for a six-year term. The established area three district election will not be effected by the outcome of the referendum and six Board seat election that will be held on the same ballot in the remainder of the state, however "write-in-candidate" provisions are available in both areas, Harman indicated.

The Commissioner of Agriculture authorized the new territory referendum to determine of producers in the rest of the state wheat producing area including Eastland County want to join with the 1971 established Panhandle-North Texas area in a 1/2 cent per bushel self-assessment at the first point of the sale to support

programs of research, education and market development for wheat. In case they do, the TWPD has established six new Board seats at-large from the new area, which now produces 45% of all Texas wheat.

Wheat producers from the new territory, each of whom have been endorsed to have their names placed on the ballot by ten other producers from their area include: Bob Beakley, Ennis, Ellis County; Jerry Campbell, Arthur City, Lamar County; Randy Justiss, Lancaster, Dallas County; Ralph Meuth, Corpus Christi, Bee County; Jack Norman, Howe, Grayson County; Dennis Rabbe, Crawford, Coryell County; Ben Scholz, Wylie, Collin County; and Billy Vinson, Abilene, Jones County. The town indicates where each producer lives, the county, where he farms which may not be the same. All producers in the area may vote for 6 Board members or write-in candidates. Those six receiving the largest number of votes will be elected.

"Appreciation is especially extended to the individual farmers in both the 'established' and the 'new territory' areas who have volunteered, at their neighbors request, to have their names placed on the ballot for service to their fellow growers", Harman said. Now it is up to the wheat producers to vote by returning ballots determining the future of what in Texas by the referendum and election deadline, April 22. Producers are expected to receive their mail ballots by April 8. Additional supplies are available in the Eastland County Extension Service Office.

# Fishing Outdoors

## "Calm Water or Windy"

How often have you been fishing during a windy day and had little success? Quite often this happens, not because fishing is poor, but more likely you were fishing for ease and convenience, by staying out of the wind. When the wind has been quite gusty from one direction for a number of days this tends to create a smorgous board of food supply. Number one, the

Sorghum, and Peanuts in Eastland County, Texas, according to Ardell Kalmbach, a representative of the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation (FCIC).

Crop Insurance covers unavoidable loss of production resulting from adverse weather conditions, wildlife, earthquake, or fire.

"Three coverage levels (50, 65, or 75 percent) are available for insurance protection. Additionally, FCIC offers three optional price elections for valuing production lost or damaged."

A new Crop Insurance plan, called Actual Production History (APH), is available this year to producers of corn, grain sorghum, peanuts, cotton, and rice. Producers of these crops may now qualify for higher yield guarantees by proving their yield history. Rates have been developed to offer reduced premium for producers with above-average yields. "This change could sharply reduce the cost of carrying Crop Insurance," says Kalmbach.

To find out more about the APH plan, producers should contact a local, authorized agent. To select an agent, producers may check the list of agents at their local ASCS office. April 15 is the final deadline for applications.

wave action creates a wash down from bank of microscopic materials which are important in the food chain. This food will be accepted by minnows and small bait fish. These small forage fish will also be blown to some extent to the shore. But are able to withstand some wind action. Basically they will be drawn by the available food supply. This in turn does attract larger fish again for feeding reasons.

As we've told you in the past these are only our opi-

nion of some possible methods to improve your fishing. They do not always hold true, but this particular pattern has produced well in past outings.

With fishing wind patterns in mind what baits seem to work best? We have found a variety of lures will produce. As always there seems to be one particular type preferred on any given day. Not to say others will not produce, some just seem more productive. Our favorite are spinners, white or chartreuse, black hair jigs with assorted trailer colors, crankbaits in crowded pattern if crawdads are available in this impoundment. Each bait choice should be applied in line with the time of year and severity of wave action. Next time out try this method if safety allows, but remember the No. 1 rule be "versatile".

## NEW EAST TEXAS LAKE BEGINNING TO PRODUCE

Brandy Branch Reservoir near Marshall is a new power plant lake which is beginning to develop as a fishing spot, according to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Biologist Joe Toole of Marshall said the 1,300-acre lake was constructed by Southwestern Electric Power Co. in 1982, and it was stocked in 1983 with Florida-strain largemouth bass, channel catfish, green and reard sunfish and copper-nose bluegills.

"Early spring fishing was sporadic, but some fishermen have caught the five-bass limit," said Toole. He reminded prospective fishermen that the lake has a special 14-inch minimum length limit for bass.

"The lake currently has a large number of bass under

the minimum length," said Toole, "so fishermen are encouraged to use care in releasing the undersized fish."

Although most of the reservoir basin was cleared prior to impoundment, Toole said about 400 acres of timbered areas remain in coves. "Bottom topography is very good, and three tire reefs have been placed and marked with buoys," he said.

Access is limited to one boat ramp and parking area. There are no camping, picnic or restroom facilities. The lake is located west of Marshall, and can be located by taking the FM 3251 exit south off Interstate Highway 20.

In order to complete a project, it must contain at least six learning experiences of from thirty minutes to one hour each. There is much information available through the County Extension Office and is available just for the asking. Should a child be interested in learning about something that has no literature available in the Extension Office, we need people to work with us who would be willing to research to help these children learn this skill.

One of our next major county-wide competitions will be the Fashion Review. Yes, the Fashion Review is sewing, but I did not say 4-Hers don't learn sewing skills, this is one of many

skills available for them to learn, with your help and mine.

The 4-H motto is "TO MAKE THE BEST BETTER". Will you help us to help them achieve this?

# 'Choo-Choo' Is Definitely Coming To Town In 1986

"We are going to bring a choo-choo to this town," stated Dan Catania Wednesday afternoon to a gathering of citizens at the Community Room of the First National Bank in Cisco. Mr. Catania, along with Andy Briscoe and Jeffery King, were in Cisco to tell about the Sesquicentennial event, tentatively scheduled to arrive in Cisco next February.

The "Texas Independence Express" will be a steam-engine pulled train which will travel some 5,000 miles throughout the state of Texas in 1986. It will visit over 150 Texas towns and will consist of two antique steam engines, five Texas History exhibit cars and 20 vintage passenger cars carrying 500 people.

Mr. Briscoe is president of the "Texas Independence Express" project, while Mr. Catania is executive director. Mr. King is a representative of Governor Mark White's Sesquicentennial State Commission.

There are two tours planned for the "Express" with one being in the spring and one in the fall. Exact time schedules will not be known until later this year, according to Mr. Briscoe. He stated the amount of time the train can spend stopped in each town will depend upon train schedules along

the railroad.

The project will be spending an estimated \$50,000-\$100,000 to bring the T&P-610 engine back up to federal standards allowing it to be placed on a railroad track. The "Texas Independence Express" is one of two major Sesquicentennial events planned for Texas. The other is a wagon train which will be passing through Albany, Texas in 1986.

The two "trains" will meet in San Angelo for a once-in-a-lifetime event. It was stated at the meeting here Wednesday, that the 1986 tour of the T&P-610 might conceivably be the last time a steam engine is allowed on a railroad.

When the train is in Cisco, citizens will be allowed to tour the steam engine and the cars behind the train. Mr. Briscoe said the train will be parked on the tracks and essentially "loaned to the city" during the time it is here. Train rides will be offered, if seating is available.

Naturally, a major undertaking such as the restoration of the T&P-610, will cost a huge amount of money. Texans are being asked to help out with the expense by purchasing commemorative

stock certificates in the "Texas Independence Express."

They are available in two denominations: \$150 or \$15. The \$150 certificate entitles the bearer (and up to 10 members of his immediate family) a twenty percent discount on the cost of passenger tickets; and, the bearer will be given first selection of the tickets when they become available. The

\$15 certificate registers the bearer on the reservation list for tickets.

Checks may be made payable to the Dallas Sesquicentennial Committee, for the Texas Independent Express, if contributors want a tax exemption. Checks may be sent to: 1986 Texas Independence Express, c/o Dallas Sesquicentennial Committee, P.O. Box 101986, Fair Park, Dallas, Texas, 75210-1986.
