Skycrane Helicopters

Land At Cisco Airport

(Skycrane) CH54A nelicopters landed Municipal Airport.

The helicopters and crew, a Mississippi National Guard Unit, were part of an army exercise in the California Mojave Desert. They acted as training support for

an army airborne unit. The two CH54A's and their crews were returning to thei home base in Meridian, Mississippi, when a technical problem developed and caused them to set down

According to one crew member the CH54A. Skycrane, was the helicopter that put the Goddess of Liberty on the dome of the state capital in Austin. He also stated that two members of that particular crew were also with this group. CWO 3, Cecil Culpepper and CWO 3 Ralph Jan-

nuzzello. CWO 3 Culpepper stated that the crew took only two trys at placing Liberty atop the capital dome. On the first attempt, a Texas flag that copter was raised a little and then they lowered the statue for a second time and she settled down as she was supposed to.

CWO 3 Culpepper and Jannuzzello, both stated that they were pleased to be able to help the Texas National Guard with their problem. Just a few weeks before the Mississippi National Guard had experienced a problem with a Skycrane in Houston, and the Texas National Guard unit at Hobby Field helped them and made what could have been a long delay, a very short one.

\$2,675,869 Budget

Board Approves New 86 - 87 Budget

A budget calling for expen-ditures of \$2,675,869 during the 1986-87 school year was approved by the board of trustees of the Cisco Independent School District at their regular monthly

meeting Monday night. The new budget, while some \$33,000 more than the 1985-86 budget, actually represents a small decrease in spending, Business Manager Martha Davis reported, since a state mandated raise of \$1,140 has been approved for all faculty members. The 1985-86

budget total was \$2,642,408. Supt. Ray Saunders told the meeting that the school board would not be able to set a tax rate for 1986-87 until the Eastland County Tax Appraisal Board completes its





Mail-Order Sales Tax Could Bring Millions To Texas

By Bob Bullock State Comptroller

This year, large out-ofstate mail-order companies will legally avoid collecting Texas sales tax on \$3 billion worth of merchandise.

The purchases are available to the tune of \$100 million, but Texas has no effective way to get to the money.

State efforts to collect the tax are stymied by the 1967 United States Supreme Court Ruling.

In that ruling, the court held that, while states can impose a tax on mail-order sales made by out-of-state companies, they cannot make the companies collect and remit the tax.

That 19-year-old ruling hobbles states like Texas which are trying to keep their tax structures in line with their changing economies.

The ruling also hurts local merchants-who must collect the tax-by giving an advantage in price to out-of-state mail-order companies. In Texas that works out to a four-and-an-eighth percent advantage. And that's before you even talk about local sales taxes or MTA taxes.

Americans shop. Mail-order sales are booming nationwide and in Texas. According to mail-order

industry analyst Arnold Fishman, national sales surged 10 to 14 percent between 1983 and 1984 to reach \$82.3 billion.

Texas sales in 1985 accounted for about seven percent of the national total

The typical American spends between \$186 and \$228 each year buying mail-order goods. Most frequently purchased through the mail are clothing and footwear, magazines, gifts and books.

This boom in mail-order sales is expected to continue, fueled by technological advances such as electronic fund transfers, "800" tollfree telephone numbers and the looming potential of shopping by home computer.

The Marketing Science Institute expects mail-order sales of consumer goods to increase by nine percent a year until 1990.

The state's potential tax loss increases as the volume of mail-order sales grows.

The state's inability to collect sales tax on mail-order sales results from a 1967 Supreme Court decision in National Bellas Hess v. Illinois Department of

The court, citing the commerce clause of the U.S. Constitution, held that states are prohibited from imposing the duty of use-tax collection andd payment upon a seller whose only connection with customers in the state is by common carrier or by mail."

Simply put, states can tax sales, but they cannot make the retailers collect or remit the tax

Except for a few narrowly defined exceptions, the court has not wavered from that decision, leaving states in a quandary as to how to collect sales tax on these transac-

To remedy this situation, Brooks in June introduced a bill in Congress--H.R. 5021--that would require large, out-of-state mailorder companies to collect

sactions made in state that have such a tax. Tax would be collected on-

and remit sales tax on tran-

ly by firms with national sales exceeding \$12.5 million or sales in a single state exceeding \$500,000. The bill would not require out-ofstate mail-order firms to collect Texas local or MTA sales taxes.

National mail-order firms claim this would impose a harsh administrative burden on them, but several big companies who both own stores in Texas and conduct mail-order operations have been collecting the tax for years. There is no more burden on these mail-order operations than there is on any other multi-state

Passage of the bill would enable Texas to get the \$100 million in sales tax that goes uncollected each year...that Texas has to get them from someone else each year.

Representative Brooks' bill is before the House Judiciary Committee. Efforts to support the bill are being mounted by several Texas business, civic and trade groups.

Prescription For Parents

By Joyce Herron (ED. NOTE: This series of articles is by a private school, parent-oriented educator in Lubbock and coordinated here by Eastlander Claudia Bulgerin, to whom comments and inquiries may be directed at 1800 West Plummer St., Eastland, Tx. 76448.)

Parents often seek help for a child who cries easily and seemingly about every little thing. When problems arise that cause your child to cry, here are some basic steps to take:

1. Listen carefully for what the child is saying but it is more important to seek insight into what the child is

2. Respond to the child's feelings. Let your child know you care about how he feels. It is better to show empathy than sympathy.

3. Touch your child. This communicates understanding. This, sometimes, is of greater comfort that words.

4. Look for alternatives to the problem. Helping him solve his problem is far more effective than solving it for

5. Give the child a choice. After looking at all the acceptable alternatives, let the child choose. Don't make the choice for him.

6. Never accept excuses.

When you accept excuses, you are tempting him to point his finger in some other direction than himself and find fault elsewhere.

7. See your child's mistakes, not as defeats, but as building blocks. He can learn from mistakes and so can you.

8. Encourage him. If you are working through a problem with him, get him to commit to solve the problem through his own will to change and pray with him that the Lord will guide him

in making right choices. 9. Evaluate the problem after the child tries to pick out a solution. Don't let the child flounder in failure. Stand by him.

10. Is. 40:8 states "the grass withers the flower fades, but the Word of God stands forever". The above steps are immediate steps to be taken with a crying child. We, however, must teach our children sensitivity to God's Word - to stand on His pro-
