## 125 Candidates For Wrangler Football

Some 125 candidates for the 1986 Wrangler football team, including 35 lettermen, are expected to report as Cisco Junior College begins preparations for the new season, according to a report by Coach Rick Frazier.

A few of the players, including eight from out of state and some who live in the Rio Grande Valley were expected to arrive Thursday afternoon. The players will be assigned rooms in the athletic dormitory.

Plans call for members of the squad to take the regular academic test for freshmen at 1 p.m. Friday in the Science Building. The first meal will be served at 5 p.m. Friday at the cafeteria.

There will be a meeting of all players at 7 p.m. when equipment will be issued and plans for fall practice will be discussed, Mr. Frazier said.

At 6:30 a.m. Saturday, a "wake-up" call will be sounded with breakfast at 7 a.m. The first workout will begin at the practice field at 8:30 a.m. and again at 2:30 p.m. This schedule will be in effect until classes begin, the coach said.

There will be an intersquad scrimmage at the practice field on Wednesday, Aug. 27. McMurry College will bring a squad here on Saturday, Aug. 30, for a 9 a.m. controlled scrimmage program, according to Mr. Frazier.

Mr. Frazier will have a

staff of Chuck Lawrence, defense coordinator; Rick Hoffman, offense coordinator; David Johnson, line backers; and Tony Therault, running back. Mr. Therault will be a student assistant as he will be attending graduate school classes at Tarleton State University. ## Loboes To Scrimmage Baird Friday There

Cisco High School's 1986 football team will try out their offense and defense weapons for the first time in a controlled scrimmage with the Bears of Baird High School at 6 p.m. Friday at Baird stadium.

Coach Doyle Walker reported that all members of the 41-man squad would go to Baird and everybody was expected to see some action. In a controlled scrimmage, the coaches are on the field with their teams and call the plays and discuss execution procedures. Each team will have both offense and defense drills.

The Loboes have been coming along nicely despite the heat in their two-day workout program. Mr.

Walker reported. He believes the squad is considerably further along than at the same time last year and he expects the 1986 team to be stronger than last year's.

The players worked out in shorts the first week and put on pads last Friday for scrimmage work. They will wear pads the remainder of the pre-season workout period.

Lobo coaches have been putting probable starting lineups together. The backfield includes Shelby Nixon at quarterback, Bryan Wagnon and Roy Boykin at halfbacks and Billy White at fullback. Ends are Kody Wallace and Pete DeLeon with Gordon Davis and

Robert Rains at the tackle positions. Running at guard posts are Tim Rains and Teddy Patton with Lonnie Pevey at center.

The defensive lineup is expected to include Steve Abbott and Tim Rains at middle linebacker positions with Curtis Taylor and Lonnie Pevey at tackles. Defensive ends are Gordon Davis and Robert Rains with Bryan Wagnon and Ronnie Schuren at cornerback, Joe Flores and Roy Boykin at halfback positions, and Shelby Nixon at safety.

The defensive team is expected to weigh about 180 pounds per man with the offense a bit lighter at around 165 pounds. Coach Walker said the Loboes will be weak

in reserve strength. One player who was expected to be a starter was lost probably for the season due to a knee injury last week. He is Del Page, center, who was a member of last year's squad. He underwent knee surgery during the winter and reinjured the same knee.

The players are reported to be in good physical condition and the hot weather has not affected them too much, Mr. Walker reported. Assisting Mr. Walker with the fall drills are Coaches Russell McLeskey, Brian McCullough and Terry Bean. The Loboes will open the season at home on Sept. 5th with the Anson Tigers.

David was chosen as one of the outstanding young men of America in 1982.

David's public school program has been endorsed by Nancy Reagan, and the Governors of Texas, Oklahoma, and Arkansas, plus representatives and congressmen of the states. He has spoken to almost 500,000 young people in over 350 schools in eleven states.

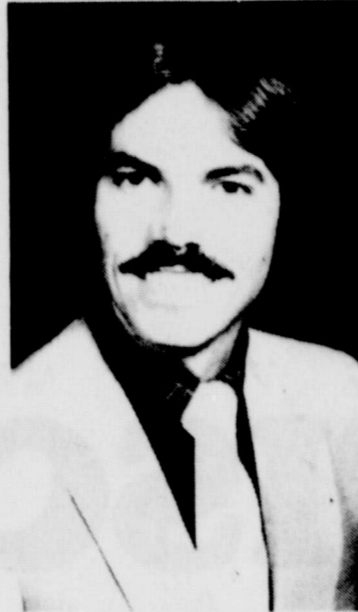

The shopping and Fast food centres Staffs was overwhelming.


My college education has been greatly influenced by my stay in Texas.

Frost put it in "form", which I forgot, but I took the words to heart and I have remembered them.  
They were very comforting at times when Budgeting was one of my major concerns.

However, I reached the point where I cashed my check and put the proportioned amounts in property labeled little envelopes.  
What did I do in was "Miscellaneous."  
Every time.  
The sneaky suspicion has entered my mind at various moments that "Miscellaneous" is what does in our duly elected representatives when it comes to budgetary concerns. State and national.

The soundest money-management advice I've been offered over the years came from my father-in-law.  
"Julia, if you make a dollar and spend ninety-five cents, you don't have a problem. If you spend a dollar and a nickel, trouble is on the way."  
Poppie was right. As long as I could keep "Miscellaneous" under control, we made it fine.  
Why can't the government department heads keep

their spending to monies allotted to them?  
If I foul up, why shouldn't they? Not the same.  
I was led to suppose by super intellects, and I can't rid myself of this notion, no matter what proof to the contrary is offered. They are responsible for the public welfare.  
"Responsible" is the key word here, and they asked for this responsibility.  
I didn't.  
I feel I do well to manage my family responsibility. Besides that, even if I did make "A's" in math, I never really liked it.  
But I cannot agree with a recently-read editorial that stated, "Budget making has become a continuing year-around task with constant adjustments."  
Not when it comes to state monies. Not even when it comes to my own budget. "Constant adjustments" translates to "Miscellaneous" in my book.

My main concern is why our state government has so much "Misc." We've had four special sessions in a row to "adjust" such varied items as brucellosis, state highways, unemployment compensation, Texas Southern University, indigent care, and now a "fiscal crisis."  
Of all the above I'd guess that brucellosis may not have cast much of a warning shadow, though it's bound to have an incubation period. The rest of those topics are not exactly spur-of-the-moment developments. A "fiscal crisis" of \$3.5 billion must have given someone an inkling that it was on the way before it got here.

My own problems with miscellaneous are insignificant in the presence of a \$3.5 billion miscellaneous. It

must be "Misc." If all the departments, committees and whatnots had kept within their budgets, it means to me that there would be no deficit.

But arithmetic is not my strongpoint. I am inclined to the Frost-y view of budgets, but I have not sought nor accepted fiscal responsibilities for public monies.  
I don't know how long it will take our Austin solons to figure it out, but I'll give odds I already know who'll foot the bills.

## Prescription For Parents

By Joyce Herron

How do I deal with my child who is so very easily discouraged?

Answer:  
Is. 41:10 "Fear thou not; for I am with thee. Be not dismayed; for I am thy God; I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness"

When we, as adults are discouraged, we do not need someone to tell us to "perk up and get busy". We need a spark of recognition. The same is true with a child.

In addition to recognition, a child needs to see where he is going. Someone must help him to set some short range goals. It may be possible that the adults in his life have set long range goals that he cannot feel he will ever achieve them. The discouraged child is almost always afraid of failure.

Help the discouraged child achieve a short goal perhaps with a benefit at the completion. Discouraged children become hopeful through:

1. Recognition of their honest efforts
  2. A plan of a short range goal
  3. Elimination of fear of failure
  4. A possibility of achieving something of value or significance to him.
- You may wish to use the following suggestions to help build self confidence:
1. Point out the child's strengths or accomplishments. (Avoid put-downs, sarcasm or lack of acceptance). Give him opportunities to use them.
  2. Allow the child to help another younger child with a task.
  3. Display projects he has completed for others to see.
  4. Counsel with the child

concerning his fears. Help him list these. Discuss each fear.

5. Pray with him about his goals. Ask God to help him deal with his fears.

6. Help him to memorize one or more of the following Scriptures:  
Is. 41:10; Is. 43:1b-2; Ps. 118:6; II Tim. 1:7.

7. Encourage him to keep a journal (weekly or daily) listing goals, prayer needs and accomplishments.

8. As God answers prayers and short range goals are accomplished, have him check them off or place a gold star by the answered prayers. This will build his confidence as well as teach him that God honors his efforts and also answers prayers.

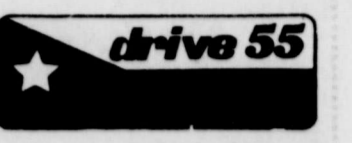
