## Philip Shackelford Nominated For American FFA Degree

Philip Shackelford of Cisco has been nominated to receive the highest degree awarded by the National FFA Organization, the American FFA Degree. This honor is based on outstanding achievements in agricultural production, processing and service programs and on demonstrated leadership abilities. Philip will be one of the 1,056 members receiving the award at the 63rd National FFA Convention in Kansas City, Mo., November 8-10.

Only one in 400 of the 386,832 FFA members have advanced through Chapter and State FFA Degrees to earn this national award. Philip, the son of Ronnie and Celia Shackelford, is a 1989 graduate of Cisco High School, where he was very active in FFA. His advisors were Tommy Claborn and Jimmie Cearley. He is currently attending Cisco Junior College and has a farming operation of dairy heifers and hay production. He is a member of the CJC Ag Club, and his advisor is Herman Glueck. Philip is 2nd Vice President of the local club, as well as

holding the office of 2nd Vice President in the Texas Junior College Ag Club Association. More than 20,000 FFA members and their advisors are expected to attend the 63rd National FFA Convention, which is the largest annual youth convention in the nation.

## David Tunmire Is New Eastland County Agent

Eastland County Commissioners Monday approved the hiring of David L. Tunmire as the new Extension Agent/Agriculture of Eastland County. His term will begin here Oct. 1.

Tunmire, age 33, is presently the County Agent in Comanche County, here he will fill the position being vacated by Extension Agent DeMarquis Gordon, who is retiring August 31 after 24 years of service to Eastland County.

David Tunmire was accompanied to Commissioner's Court by Dr. Ronald Woolley, District Extension Service Director, Martha Hale, the new District Extension Service Director/Home Economics, and Janet Thomas, Eastland County Agent/Home Economics.

Woolley told the Commissioners that he strongly recommended Tunmire for the Eastland County Agent/Agriculture position.

He said that Tunmire had been a full County Agent in both Knox County and now Comanche, where he has served for the past two years. "He's one of the best Agents in the District," Woolley stated. "He is known for strong results in agricultural demonstrations, and is also noted as a good team player - a person who works well with others."

Woolley mentioned that Tunmire was married, and that his wife is a teacher at De Leon. The couple has a daughter.

Woolley also said there had been a number of applicants for the County Agent position in Eastland County - this County is considered a good place to work in. But, as District Supervisor, he considered that Tunmire had the best background for the job.

A resume was passed around to the Commissioners, listing Tunmire's education and achievements. He has a B.S. in Animal Science from

Angelo State University, and a M.S. in Animal Nutrition from Texas Tech University. Since June, 1981, he has been employed by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Among his accomplishments are the conducting of numerous tours, clinics, seminars and short courses and demonstrations in peanuts, pecans, beef cattle, dairies, watermelons and forage crops. Tunmire is also a strong supporter of 4-H work, and initiated and developed a 4-H Youth Fair.

After the Commissioners approved his position here, the new County Agent stated that he looked forward to moving here and working with the people of Eastland County.

Working with him here in the Extension Service office will be Janet Thomas, County Agent/Home Economics, Scott Hodges, Assistant County Agent/Agriculture and 4-H Coordinator, and Brenda Dabbs, Secretary.

## Emergency Ambulance Service Will Continue In Cisco Area

Cisco Emergency Medical Service will continue operations in the Cisco area after the closing of E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital in Cisco.

The announcement of the hospital's closing has prompted some concern regarding the availability of emergency ambulance service in the Cisco area.

Cisco EMS Supervisor Kerry Craig said that work is underway to secure office and garage space for the ambulance service and that there will be no interruption in the service with regard to the closing of the hospital.

The Cisco ambulance service began just over a year ago as a joint effort of Eastland County, the City of Cisco, and the Cisco hospital. After consultation with both city and county officials, follow-

ing the Wednesday closing announcement at the hospital, it was determined that immediate steps would be taken to secure facilities to house the ambulance service and to insure that emergency medical ambulance service would continue to be available.

Cisco EMS ambulance will continue to be dispatched through Eastland County Dispatch at 629-1728. A new address and telephone number for the Cisco ambulance service will be announced as soon as they are obtained.

## Rural Fire Departments Budgeted More Money

The County Commissioners worked long and hard on the Budget Monday, discussing various items that needed to be included.

One of the big items was aid for the Rural Fire Departments, which all the Commissioners stated did a great job for the County - sometimes on very little money. They talked of the policy of mutual aid - how all the Departments were good about helping each other. Statistics were quoted showing that the greatest number of fires in Eastland County were rural fires.

The final decision on subsidies was: \$400 per month for each Rural Fire Department in Pcts. 1, 3, and 4, double the amount each now receives. Ranger will receive \$600 per month, and Desdemona and Olden will each get \$300 per month.

Commissioner Norman Christian said the Ranger Fire Department had more equipment and was more active than the other Departments in Pct. 2, therefore needed more assistance.

The Commissioners discussed the matter of an ambulance subsidy in Pct. 4 (Cisco) now that the Cisco Hospital has closed. Commissioner Billy Bacon and Cisco Ambulance personnel stated that

local ambulance services were even more necessary, due to the distance now to emergency care.

Bacon made the motion to subsidize the Pct. 4 Ambulance Service \$25,000 annually, with Richard Robinson giving a second to the motion. There was a tie vote on the measure, with Bacon and Robinson 'Yes' and Owen and Christian 'No.' County Judge Scott Bailey broke the tie, voting 'Yes.' The measure passed.

On another matter, the Commissioners refused to sign a Resolution supporting the State Highway Department's appeal to receive a larger part of the state 15-cent per gallon gasoline tax. The Commissioners said they were not pleased with some of the ways the Highway Department was spending money. They also mentioned the lack of upgrading of Farm-To-Market roads.

The Commissioners also refused a request by Sheriff Dee Hogan to purchase uniform type jackets so law enforcement personnel can be identified.

Commissioner Billy Bacon reported that 10 prisoners were currently in the County

## Rattan Named To Honor Team

Jason Rattan, a senior and quarterback, at Texas Tech was among 20 student-athletes named by the Southwest Conference to the 1990 GTE/SWC Football Academic Honor Team. The primary purpose of the honor team is to recognize those student-athletes who represent outstanding scholarship while also contributing to their institutions through leadership and example.

Jason, son of Mr. and Mrs. Cleatus Rattan of Cisco, has been named to the President's List at Texas Tech three times and Dean's List once. He has

played in 10 of team's 12 games last year. He completed 15-of-25 passes for 170 yards and one TD last year. He started against Oklahoma State in 31-15 victory. He conducts grade school seminars about drug and alcohol abuse. He is a pre-veterinary medicine major.

To be selected to the honor team, the athletes must meet four criteria: (1) meet the institution's definition of an outstanding student-athlete; (2) must be a letterwinner; (3) must have been in a residence at least three semesters or in the final season of eligibility; and (4) must have a 3.0 or higher GPA. Field of study as well as academic, athletic, extracurricular and community accomplishments and/or involvements are also taken into consideration.

## Plan Ahead For A Safe Labor Day Holiday

The Texas Department of Public Safety has estimated that as many as 40 persons could be killed in traffic accidents across the state during the 78-hour Labor Day holiday period.

"Last year during this end-of-summer holiday, 48 persons died in traffic accidents, with another four persons dying later of injuries received during that time," said DPS Director Col. Joe E. Milner. "Our estimate for this year is below that final count of 52, and we hope the actual number of deaths this year will be much lower than this estimate."

The holiday counting period begins at 6 p.m. Friday, August 31 and continues until midnight on Monday, September 3. As it does each Labor Day, and on certain other major holidays, the DPS will have all available Troopers on the highways to ensure that motorists have as safe a holiday as possible.

"Since drinking and driving, along with speeding, are the leading causes of traffic fatalities, we hope we can hold the Labor Day deaths down by our increased presence on the highways," Milner said. "We certainly don't want to discourage people from having a good time during the Labor Day holiday, we just want motorists to drive safely."

Last year's Labor Day statistics support the Department's concern over drinking and driving and excessive speed. In 1989, 62 percent of those killed in Labor Day holiday traffic accidents died in mishaps connected either to alcohol or driving too fast.

"Something else our Troopers will be watching for during the Labor Day holiday period is whether motorists are wearing their seat belts," said Dudley Thomas, chief of the DPS Traffic Law Enforcement Division. "Last Labor Day, 77 percent of those victims who were occupants of cars or light trucks had not been wearing restraints when

they were killed. The message is obvious: Seat belts save lives."

"Helmet use by motorcycle riders has definitely increased since the helmet law took effect in September of last year," Thomas said. "However, there will be some riders who will disregard the statute and wear helmets that do not meet federal safety standards. The Troopers also will be watching for this violation."

As in past years, the DPS will issue periodic reports on traffic fatalities throughout the Labor Day weekend.

...NEW GENEALOGICAL BOOK AVAILABLE: EVIDENCE OF BIRTHS, DEATHS, AND MARRIAGES IN LOWNDENS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, 1830-1912, compiled by Webb and Logan.

This 400 page, softback book reports information from private sources, primarily funeral home records, diaries, and journals, that is otherwise not readily available to the general public, particularly to visiting researchers whose time is limited. This information is helpful because the State of Mississippi did not start keeping births and deaths until 1912, and marriages in 1926. Not all of the persons who died before 1912 have tombstones, and the inventories of ceme-

teries are sometimes not current.

This book gives information about many hundreds of the individuals listed in it, including the names of their parents, spouse, children, and brothers and sisters with their place of residence at the time of the listing.

Since Columbus, the county seat, is located near the Alabama state line, many Alabamians are included. And in addition to showing sites of cemeteries in Lowndes County Mississippi, the enclosed maps also show the cemetery sites in Lamar and Pickens County, Alabama since residents in these counties used services in Columbus Mississippi.

Because these were mostly alternate records, it is important that the user search alternate spellings of a surname.

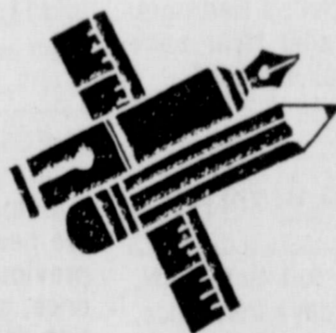

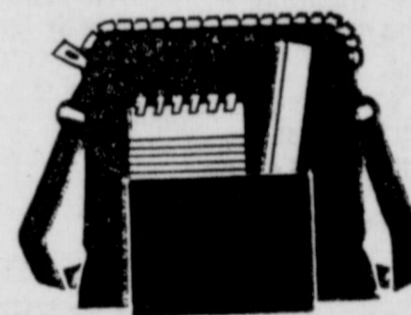

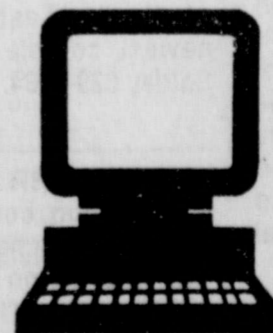

Can stress make you sick? Doctors at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine measured the activity of "natural killer cells" that fight infection. They found those in high-stress situations had lower NK cell activity and more colds and flu.

One good side effect of dental braces: they may reduce gum disease that's already started, according to the chairman of orthodontics at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine.

Scientists at the University of Florida in Gainesville have developed a procedure to "cleanse" the bone marrow of children with advanced cancers. Special antibodies and microscopic magnetic beads attach to the cancer cells, which are then pulled out in a magnetic chamber.

People with high calcium intake have a lower incidence of colon cancer, researchers at the M. D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston found. Now they're getting good results giving supplements to patients with precancerous polyps.

## Texas Crude Oil Production Preliminary Figures Compared

Texas crude oil production averaged 1,702,633 barrels daily in June, according to preliminary figures released by Railroad Commission Chairman Kent Hance. June 1989 preliminary production was 1,765,657 barrels daily.

This figure compares with preliminary May production of 1,716,420 barrels daily. Final production reports for May indicated average production at 1,735,770 barrels daily.

The preliminary Texas oil production figure for June is 51,078,980 barrels, down from 51,633,679 barrels in April. June 1989 preliminary Texas oil production figure was 52,969,721 barrels.

Hance said that state's top producing counties, rank ordered by preliminary June production were: Gaines,

3,453,382 barrels; Andrews, 3,077,955 barrels; Ector, 2,941,106 barrels; Yoakum, 2,683,995 barrels; Hockley, 2,532,182 barrels; Gregg, 2,329,489 barrels; Pecos, 1,905,190 barrels; Crane, 1,414,655 barrels; Scurry, 1,146,038 barrels; and Kent, 940,878 barrels.

Crude oil production in Eastland County for June was 75,483, somewhat down from previous months.

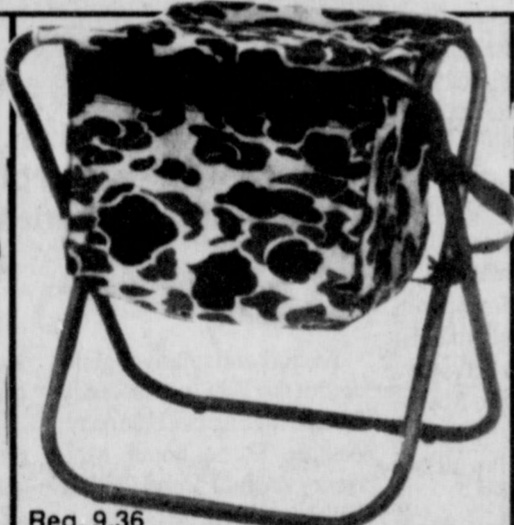

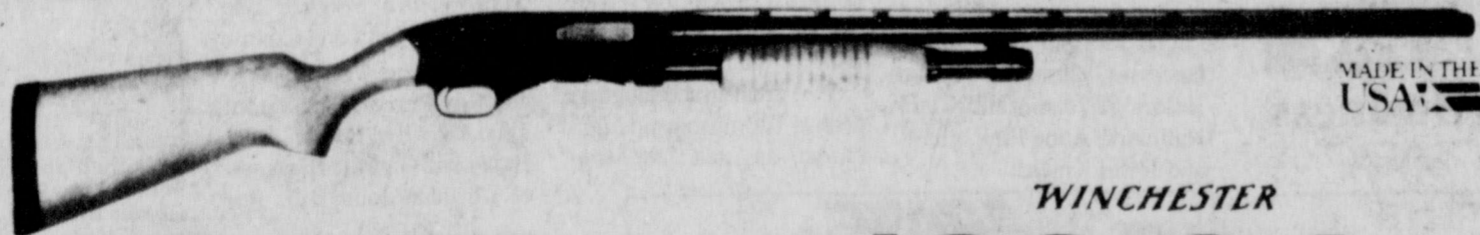

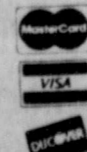
