Greatest Demand For Farm Products Expected In 1943

Citing a recent statement by the War Relocation Authority, it is expected that the greatest demand for farm products will be known next year. The statement states that the production difficulties will be tremendous. Jack Williams, acting rehabilitation supervisor of War Relocation Administration, week urged farmers to be planning their program of production immediately.

Shortage of man power already a critical problem in many areas, Williams said, and will be much more critical next year. As the nation increases our production and steps up our industrial production, it is inevitable that the problems will face agriculture in Bailey county and throughout the United States. Williams said, should fore-see any hardships and dis-appointments by developing their own plans during the next year.

BAILEY COUNTY BOY GETS COMMISSION IN ARMY

At the Infantry school, the local officer took a three months course to fit him for his new responsibilities. The course covers the technique of handling all the varied modern infantry weapons and the tactics of leading small infantry units in combat.

Cotton Marketing Quotas Continued For Next Year

Eighty-four percent of the Texas cotton farmers voting in the marketing quota referendum favored continuing quotas on the 1943 crop. George Slaughter, state AAA committee chairman, has announced. Virtually complete returns indicate that 89,654 farmers voted "yes" and 16,121 voted "no," Slaughter said.

Since quotas were approved nationally, they will be in effect during 1943. Loans at 90 percent of parity also will be applicable on next year's crop.

By limiting the number of acres which they can plant to cotton in 1943, farmers are making certain that all available land, labor, equipment and fertilizer will be used to the greatest advantage in the production of more essential war-crops, he said.

URGE OWNERS TO HAVE TIRES INSPECTED AT ONCE

Owners of commercial motor vehicles were reminded today that their first tire inspections under certificates of war necessity must be made within the next thirty days. The ODT office urged operators today to not wait until the last minute for a rush on approved inspectors, but begin now to get the inspection.

A commercial motor vehicle may not lawfully be operated after January 15 without a certificate of war necessity and an endorsement by an approved tire inspector on the certificate. After the first inspection, vehicles must be presented for inspection every 60 days or every 5,000 miles, whichever occurs first.

If an inspector finds that a tire needs repairing to insure maximum service, he will withhold endorsement of the certificate of war necessity or record form covering operations of the vehicle on which the tire is mounted until the repairing has been done.

Merchants Allowed Two Deliveries On Christmas Eve

Santa Claus will be permitted two deliveries on Christmas eve in lieu of customary one under ODT regulations, said Richard E. Wood, district ODT motor transport manager, today.

To enable merchants to handle their last minute Christmas delivery rush, a general permit has been issued by ODT allowing carriers engaged in local delivery service to make one additional delivery on December 24, 1942.

However, carriers who make this extra delivery are forbidden by the permit to make a delivery on Dec. 25. Thus, the permit enables a carrier to consolidate his one-day deliveries for December 24 and 25 into two deliveries on Christmas eve and none on Christmas day without increasing the number of deliveries previously allowed for two days, Mr. Wood said.

AAA Wants Full Production Of War Time Feed Crops

Maximum production from America's wartime agricultural plant is the basis of the 1943 AAA program announced this week.

The program places emphasis on the production of war crops and provides stiff payment deductions on farms failing to meet war production goals, George Slaughter, Texas AAA Committee chairman, pointed out.

Payments are designed to help get full production of the kinds and in the amounts needed, and all crop payments are to be contingent on the degree to which the farmer meets his goals, the AAA official pointed out. Deductions will be made from the farm's maximum production adjustment payments, or allowed, for failure to meet specified goals of both allotment crops and special war-crops.

Every farmer in the state cooperating with the program must sign a farm plan outlining his part in wartime production. In the plan the farmer will list the wartime crop adjustments he will make to help him meet his war production goals and the conservation practices he will undertake to help get increased yields in 1943.

Failure to plant at least 90 percent of special crop allotments for cotton, wheat and rice will result in payment deductions at the rate of five times the compliance rate, which means that a farmer's crop payment would be wiped out entirely should he plant only 70 percent of his allotment. Under certain conditions, however, farmers will be allowed to substitute food crops for their allotment crops and still remain in compliance.

Failure to achieve 90 percent of warcrop goals for a farm will incur crop payment deductions at the rate of \$15 per acre, Slaughter said.

The 1943 program is aimed entirely at getting the maximum production of needed products from the American farm," he declared.

"I am certain that Texas farmers will accept and achieve their goals and will contribute their full share towards the agricultural production we need.

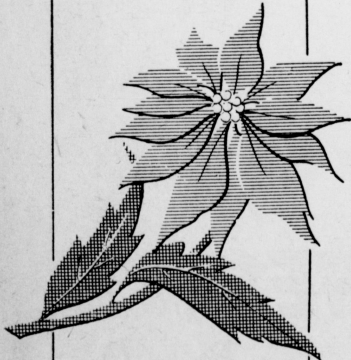

For 11 years, since the invasion of Manchuria on Sept. 18, 1931, they have stubbornly resisted Japan. The front where they are now fighting here is in Suiyuan Province in Inner Mongolia. In spite of 11 years' fighting, their morale is still high.

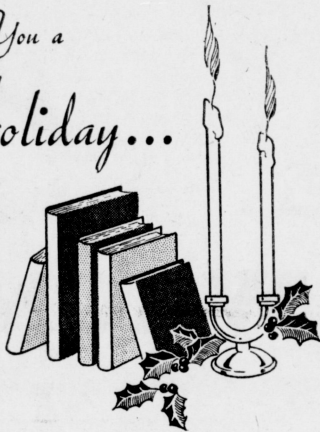

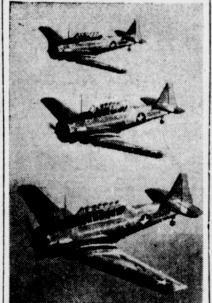
