## Book Criticizes Famed Explorer

LONDON (AP) — A new book to be published today says the legendary Antarctic explorer, Robert Falcon Scott, was one of the worst polar explorers whose incompetence resulted in his own death and four companions.

But Sir Peter Scott, 70-year-old son of the British hero, says the book "Scott and Amundsen" by Roland Huntford "despicably maligns" his famous father.

The five men died in blizzards in 1912 following a race with Norwegian explorer Roald Amundsen to be the first men to reach the South Pole. Amundsen won, reaching the pole on Dec. 14, 1911, 35 days ahead of Scott.

The dead men were hailed as heroes, but Huntford claims that Scott had failed to prepare adequately for the mission, was ill-equipped and provided insufficient food.

## Arkoff Defends 'B' Movies

NEW YORK (AP) — Movie mogul Samuel Z. Arkoff says he doesn't mind being called "King of the 'B' movies" but doesn't think much of the label "Schlockmeister of Wilshire Boulevard."

"Schlock" bothers me," Arkoff said in an interview. "It's an offensive word that means the merchandise is cheap. It's unfair and utter nonsense."

But the 61-year-old producer of more than 500 feature films said the "B" in B movies stood for low budget and that was all right.

"A lot of classics were made as 'B's,' like early Cagney, Bogart and Edward G. Robinson movies," he said. "They were turned out in a hurry. It's a credit to us, in a sense; we made pictures the public liked, for a price."

## Ex-Bolshevik Dancers To Perform

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Former Bolshevik dancers Leonid Kozlov and Valentina Kozlova, who defected to the United States last month, are to appear here Friday and Saturday with a touring company called Ballet Galaxie '79.

The performance is being billed as the "first U.S. guest appearance" for the couple since they sought political asylum in Los Angeles on Sept. 16.

Nella Ludwig, president of the New Orleans Opera Guild, said the Ballet Galaxie '79 consists of leading dancers from three permanent troupes and a corps de ballet from Miami.

Critics have said Kozlov, 32, and his 25-year-old wife

were not major Bolshoi performers, but were "well thought of."

The Kozlovs say they defected in order to broaden themselves professionally in a freer social and political environment. He had been with the Bolshoi for 14 years, and she for six years.

## Ruby Begonia Prevails

CUERO (AP) — A strutting Minnesota turkey named Paycheck trotted to an easy second-heat victory in the Great Gobbler Gallop here. But Ruby Begonia — the poultry pacing pride of Cuero — captured the Traveling Turkey Trophy of Tumultuous Triumph.

The fleet-footed Worthington, Minn., bird scrambled through the course in 1:39 Sunday, defeating Ruby Begonia by 40 seconds.

However, Ruby Begonia won by a minute and a half during the running of the first heat at the King Turkey Day Celebration last month in Worthington.

The Minnesota margin of victory was enough to send the traveling trophy back to Cuero for the first time since 1975.

## SBA Offers Loans To Oil Dealers

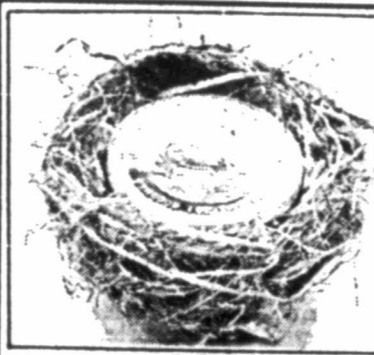
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Small Business Administration has declared fuel oil dealers and jobbers in all 50 states eligible for special low-interest SBA loans, saying they are caught in a crunch between high wholesale oil prices on the one hand and a lack of credit on the other.

"Primary fuel oil storage reports indicate sufficient supplies of home heating oil for the winter," said SBA Administrator A. Vernon Weaver.

"However, due to rapid and unexpected price increases and the inability of small business to obtain sufficient credit to procure their normal supplies of home heating oil, a crisis is building that will result in pervasive business failure in this industry and the prospect of homes without heat during the winter unless some assistance is made available."

The so-called economic dislocation

loans are issued up to \$100,000 and are made directly by the SBA or through bank guarantees. Direct loans carry an interest rate of 7% percent.

# Federal Programs Listed For Elderly Job Seekers

Unable to make ends meet and unwilling to stop working, a growing number of older Americans are turning back to the workplace and the government is trying to help them find jobs.

A recently updated fact sheet from the federal Administration on Aging in the Department of Health, Education and Welfare lists more than a dozen government programs which offer opportunities to the elderly.

Here are some highlights:

### Foster Grandparents

Foster Grandparents are low-income men and women, 60 and over, who are in good health and can provide love and attention to physically, emotionally and mentally handicapped children in institutions and in private settings. They generally serve four hours a day, five days a week, devoting two hours a day to each of two children. Tasks may include feeding and dressing the children, playing games with them and helping with speech and physical therapy. Volunteers get a stipend of \$36 a week, plus a transportation allowance and accident and liability insurance. ### Senior Volunteers

The RSVP program encourages retired and semi-retired men and women to serve at Volunteer Stations in community agencies like courts, schools, libraries, scout offices and day-care centers. Participants are reimbursed for transportation, meals and other expenses associated with their assignments.

### Peace Corps

Although many people think of the Peace Corps as a group of young volunteers, the agency actively recruits older participants as well. As of May, there were 287 Peace Corps members age 50 and over. Volunteers serve approximately 27 months in overseas assignments, helping developing nations with programs like agriculture, science, teacher training, health, nutrition and home economics. There is an orientation program of from four weeks to 14 weeks, usually in the country where the volunteer will serve. During training and service, volunteers get a monthly allowance for food, travel, rent, medical needs and vacation. A readjustment allowance of \$125 a month is set aside for each volunteer and is paid on completion of service.

### SCORE

The Service Corps of Retired Executives is a volunteer program run by the Small Business Administration. # Severe Drop In Membership Could Damage ACLU

NEW YORK (AP) — The American Civil Liberties Union says it no longer is reeling from its legal support of a neo-Nazi group in Skokie, Ill., but Executive Director Ira Glasser of the ACLU concedes that an anticipated \$500,000 of red ink could ruin his organization.

Describing the plunge in ACLU membership in the wake of the Skokie case as "a knockout punch," Glasser said in an interview that the ACLU has made up those losses and would announce in January a "very, very ambitious" five-year campaign to raise an extra \$11 million.

"I have no doubt that that program will work," he said in offices that the ACLU soon will vacate for smaller ones. "The question is how much and how soon and what we're going to do in the meantime."

Glasser, who moved from the New York affiliate to the top job last October, said the ACLU had taken for granted a 10 percent to 15 percent membership gain every year from the 1960s until the mid-1970s.

Memberships — which cost \$20 a person or \$30 a couple — are by far the major source of the ACLU's income.

Glasser attributed their decline from a peak of perhaps 230,000 in 1973 to a low of 170,000 by 1978, when the Skokie furor raged, to more than the ACLU's defense of the right of the Nazis to march in suburban Chicago.

Membership had already started to drop, Glasser said, because a period of social activism was on the wane. Also, there was more competition for the same potential members from the rise in

single-interest groups. And finally, people found it harder in an inflationary period to join.

In the course of its 59-year history, the ACLU has often taken stands that offended one segment of the population or another. In its fight against what it sees as infringements of constitutional guarantees, the ACLU has sued over the separation of church and state, for example.

It even defended Nazis in the first year of its existence, but its defense of the Skokie group's right of assembly and free speech cost the ACLU a large proportion of the 60,000 members lost, Glasser said.

The case started in 1977 and ended last spring, when the small band of Nazis finally was allowed to march in Chicago. The march itself, ironically, caused less uproar when it occurred than the ACLU's defense of it precipitated among the many Jewish members of the ACLU.

"It's not really possible to say with any precision how much membership was lost because of Skokie," Glasser said. "But it hurt us so badly that our survival was threatened."

He said the organization cut back its personnel by 25 to 30 percent, leaving some state affiliates with only a director, who had to answer telephones and mail in addition to doing legal work.

"We've squeezed everything, and we really haven't restored much," Glasser continued. "Any further cutbacks will really threaten the viability of the organization."

The ACLU, including its state affiliates, has a \$10 million annual budget but plans to spend \$250,000 more than it has this year and next. Glasser chalks up another \$250,000 to inflation, which is "eating us alive."

And while membership has climbed back up to about 200,000, the director said it seems to have peaked without

compensating for the losses that provoked the decline prior to Skokie.

It was a letter from the ACLU lawyer who represented the Nazis that stemmed the losses. In it, David Goldberg declared his abhorrence for the beliefs of the Nazis, outlined the free speech arguments and said that the ACLU's survival was at stake.

The letter brought in \$550,000, almost triple that of any previous ACLU direct-mail appeals. The response was "just incredible," Glasser said.

Subsequent versions of it continue to be part of the four million letters that the ACLU mails annually to recruit members.

He said the special fund-raising campaign will concentrate on areas hitherto ignored — bequests and donations from wealthy individuals and corporations.

Glasser said he believed this would cure the organization's financial ills after about five years, but observed, "What I'm worried about is the next two."

## Analyst Expects Gas Shortage In October

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The oil industry analyst who accurately predicted last spring's gas shortage says "the days of line and hoses" may return this month — and this time they could last a lot longer.

Dan Lundberg, publisher of the Lundberg Letter, said Sunday in an interview that October gas supplies could fall as much as 5 percent below demand.

His prediction last March of an 8.9 percent gap between supply and demand for that month was exactly right, the Department of Energy later said, and ushered in last spring's gas crisis.

Lundberg added, however, that a new shortage could extend well into the winter and cause worse hardships.

The petroleum marketing expert explained that the Energy Department has been pushing oil companies to increase stockpiles of diesel fuel and home heating oil for this winter. As a result, he said, available gasoline supplies have fallen while demand is rising.

"The present delivery schedules raise the possibility of long lines and station closings again," said Lundberg. "I'd

hate ... to be in line, pushing my car through the frozen slough, with the engine and therefore the heater turned off."

Lundberg said the severity of the shortage depends on how government officials respond. A U.S. gas shortage could also prompt the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries to increase crude prices again at its December meeting in Venezuela.

Lundberg urged federal energy officials to warn motorists of the impending shortage.

"Last time they didn't say anything. They left the whole nation to be caught entirely by surprise," he said. "This time, the department should speak up with the strongest possible message to the whole country to curb unnecessary driving. Otherwise, we may find ourselves waiting in the snow."

Rising gasoline prices have reduced consumption somewhat, Lundberg said, but he warned against believing that higher prices will mean continued conservation. A 50 percent increase in prices, from \$1 to \$1.50 a gallon, would cut consumption only 5 percent, he said.

## Suspected Sniper's Past Shows Mental Problems

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The gunman who held a secretary hostage for 23 hours and sprayed downtown streets with rifle fire has a history of mental treatment and a drug arrest, according to police and acquaintances.

A former girlfriend of Wayne E. Cullinane, the alleged sniper, said the 23-year-old suspect is "really a sweet person" who told her after his arrest that he had been on a "bad trip" during the siege that sent rush-hour crowds diving for cover when the first hail of bullets came from a 16-story office building Friday afternoon.

"I'm pretty sure it was acid (LSD), but it must have been very bad stuff," said the Berkeley woman who calls herself Injun Tomlinson.

Cullinane, who was captured by police after he and his 55-year-old female hostage fell asleep Saturday, was being held in lieu of \$500,000 bail after being

booked for investigation of several felony charges. They include kidnapping, robbery, assault on a peace officer, assault with a deadly weapon, possession of a deadly weapon and false imprisonment.

Although San Francisco police refused to confirm it, Providence, R.I., police said Cullinane spent "most of his juvenile" life at a state mental hospital in Cranston, R.I.

San Francisco's public defender, Jeff Brown, said he will represent Cullinane. No court appearance had been set by Sunday.

The hostage, Chiyo Tashiro, 55, was recuperating at her home Sunday from her ordeal. She was exhausted but not harmed.

In 1974, Cullinane was arrested in Providence, where his family resides, on charges of possession of the drug THC with intent to sell, possession of a blank gun and possession of a knife.

Providence police said the charges were still pending in court.

## PBS Plans To Air 'Most Happy Fella'

DETROIT (AP) — "The Most Happy Fella" will be televised for the first time next year by the Public Broadcasting Service network in its "Great Performances" series.

The first major revival in 23 years of the show — which won the Drama Circle Award for best musical of 1956 — opened the 1979-80 season of the Michigan Opera Theatre here, and one performance was filmed in its entirety for the PBS special.

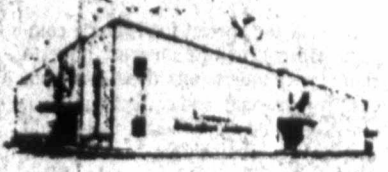

Farewell To Local School Rule

WASHINGTON—The act creating a new U.S. Department of Education contains a couple of pretty passages. Let me quote them to you: "It is the intention of the Congress to protect the rights of state and local governments and public and private educational institutions in the areas of educational policies and administration of programs, and to strengthen and improve the control of such governments and institutions over their own educational programs and policies."

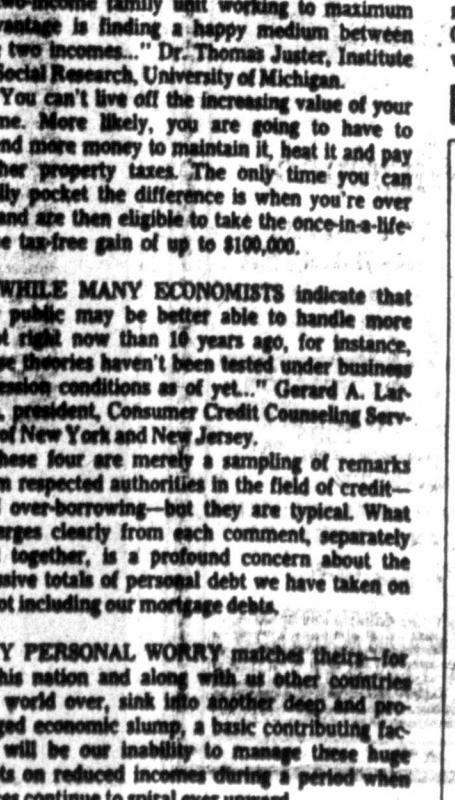

## Syria Destroys Israeli Plane

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP) — Syrian jets shot down an unmanned Israeli spy plane as Defense Minister Lt. Gen. Mustafa Tlass declared Syria was ready for a war of attrition with the Jewish state and Israel's air force chief accused Syria of mounting a massive buildup of Soviet arms.

In Tel Aviv, Israeli Gen. David Ivri, acknowledging the loss over Syria Sunday of the U.S.-built Firebee drone, told Israel Radio the camera-equipped reconnaissance plane was sent to investigate "a massive buildup of Soviet military equipment near the city of Homs," in western Syria about 130 miles north of the Israeli frontier.

An Israeli military command spokesman said it was not common for Israel to send unmanned planes over Syria, but "it has been going on." Ivri said Israel has been using the subsonic Firebees since before the 1973 war and he said it was not the first time one of them had disappeared.

The Syrian defense chief said Syria was "ready to carry on a war of attrition with Israel similar to the one that we fought in the Golan Heights in the spring of 1974."

Tlass urged his soldiers to be "ever ready for any battle with Israel."

His remarks were reported Sunday by official sources, who said he was addressing Syrian units of the Arab League peacekeeping force in Lebanon.

At the same time, the Syrian government announced that President Hafez Assad will visit Moscow later this month as a guest of the Soviet Union, Syria's main arms supplier. Assad is expected to seek more sophisticated weapons from the Soviets to match arms the United States is selling to Israel.

## Vietnam Criticizes U.S. Interference

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) — Vietnam accused the United States today of distorting recent events in Cambodia and said talk in Washington about normalized American-Vietnamese relations was "just a farce."

The Communist Party newspaper Nhan Dan also claimed the United States and China were working hand-in-hand against Vietnam and that Washington was spreading word about a Vietnamese threat in order to increase its military aid to Thailand and other non-communist Southeast Asian countries.

Senior Carter administration officials are making a "frantic call" for emergency aid to Cambodia to "cover the Sino-American scheme of creating the the Pol Pot-Ieng Sary clique to oppose the Cambodian people," Nhan Dan wrote.

The newspaper quoted a recent editorial in The Washington Post which called on the U.S. government to disassociate itself from the regime of former Premier Pol Pot and his deputy, Ieng Sary, ousted by Vietnamese invaders in January.

The United States never recognized the Pol Pot regime, which brutalized Cambodia for four years, but recently it voted in favor of Pol Pot's continued representation in the world body. It argued that the new government of President Heng Samrin was not legitimate since it was installed by the Vietnamese invasion force.

"The United States is escalating its hostility to Vietnam. The presence of the 7th Fleet in the Eastern Sea (South China Sea) is intended not only to encourage illegal emigration, but also to join the Chinese reactionaries in direct provocations," Nhan Dan said.

The newspaper said the Carter administration, "under public pressure," was making believe that it was willing to contact Vietnam to normalize relations.

"This is just a farce. No positive measure has been taken in this direction so far," Nhan Dan said in a commentary carried by the Vietnam News Agency and monitored in Bangkok.

The newspaper said the new Cambodian regime was tracking down remnants of the Pol Pot army who were still in hiding and receiving food and weapons from international "reactionaries."

It also said "a local famine is being held in check" and that the Phnom Penh administration was doing everything possible to restore normal conditions in the country. Independent observers have reported widespread starvation and disease in Cambodia.

## Brezhnev Vows To Limit Arms In Central Europe

BERLIN (UPI) — East Germany rolled out its latest weapons for celebrations marking 30 years as a communist-ruled state and Soviet President Leonid Brezhnev used the occasion to announce a reduction in manpower and arms in central Europe.

The unilateral cutback of ground forces planned by Brezhnev drew cautious reactions from NATO and White House officials, who noted it comes with conditions and may not be all it seems.

The East German military units paraded Sunday on Karl Marx Allee in central Berlin past Brezhnev, East German President Erich Honecker and other communist bloc leaders who viewed new weapons, including the guided missile-carrying helicopter and an armored personnel carrier.

Brezhnev in a Saturday night speech announced he planned to withdraw about 20,000 of the half-million Soviet soldiers and about 1,000 of the 6,000 Soviet tanks now in East Germany within 12 months.

At the same time, he said he would reduce the number of medium-range nuclear carriers deployed in the western regions of the Soviet Union.

## American Models In Paris Discover Glamour, Fortune

PARIS (UPI) — Sandie Bass, a 27-year-old beauty from Nashville, Tenn., has walked down the aisle in a wedding dress more times than she can remember, wearing gowns that cost tens of thousands of dollars.  
Mrs. Bass is one of a growing number of United States models who have come to Paris to expand their careers in a country that considers Americans among the prettiest and hardest working women in the grueling work of parading clothes under hot lights.  
Her latest trip down the aisle was special for Mrs. Bass as her own wedding day five years ago. Her mother flew to Paris for the first time to see her daughter model in a high fashion showing.  
Work is hard and tiring for the many American models in Paris.  
Hundreds come to Paris each year

seeking glamor, fame and money. There are good reasons to seek jobs in the French capital instead of such cities as New York and Los Angeles, where Mrs. Bass began her career.  
"Prestige-wise it's a good move," said a model agency spokeswoman. "The French are willing to take risks, to use beginners. Most of the models who come here do so to get their 'book' together and then go back home with solid experience."  
"For those interested in photographic work, the magazines here are much more artistic, the quality of the pictures much better."  
"But modeling rates in the States are much higher. In the U.S. a model can make from \$1,000 to \$2,000 a day. Here they are usually paid from \$600 to \$1,100."  
Even so, models can do very nicely — especially those like Mrs. Bass who join "cabines," permanent staff at high fashion houses.  
Cabine models' fixed salaries vary according to experience. They can accept other jobs, even on days when they are needed at the salon, if they find a replacement and pay her out of their own pockets.  
"I like working in a cabine because I can get out and do other things," said Michele Demby, a 22-year-old model from Chicago. She, like Mrs. Bass, belongs to Givenchy's cabine.  
Four Givenchy models recently went to Italy, where each earned \$1,000 for a day's work. Another advantage to cabine work is the chance to own top designer clothes.  
"Givenchy gives us the dresses we model if no one else wants them or if no

one else fits into them," said Mrs. Bass. She is 5 feet, 8 1/2 inches and 100 pounds, not exactly average size.  
"At the end of the show, the dresses go on sale for half price. The cheapest is usually \$1,000 to \$2,000. If no one wants the original, we can get them," she added.  
Givenchy's seven-model cabine is among Paris' largest. Six of the models are Americans — and black. They range from 5-foot-6 1/2-inch, 102-pound Diane Washington, of Chicago, to 5-foot-11-inch, 128-pound Carol Miles, of Texas, Texas.  
"Givenchy looks for a special look — a fluidity of figure, a girl who can move," said Arlette Thebault, the designer's spokeswoman.  
"Clothes look good on black models when they are under the bright lights during a show," said a model named Reggie, who works for Hanae Mori.  
"There are finally some people who appreciate us," said Miss Demby. "All the black models here are good, but we work hard."

Some success stories are dramatic.  
Less than two years ago, says Nancy Clark, 25, of Detroit, she was about to be evicted from her apartment in New York, her phone was cut off, and wearing high fashion dresses was the farthest thing from her mind.  
While still in New York, she received an offer to join the Givenchy cabine. Two months later she moved to Dior.

# New York City Radio Station Cashes In On Disco Music Craze

NEW YORK (AP) — A radio station that was sold for \$7,500 in 1951 today is New York City's top-rated WKTU, which jumped from No. 20 to No. 1 after switching to a format of all-disco music.

The station has a 30-year history of changes and innovation, but only the last revamping, the change to all-disco format, brought success.

The station broadcasts on 92.3 FM. Not satisfied with being No. 20 in New York City, WKTU introduced its all-disco format, without fanfare or announcements, in the summer of 1978.

In just one rating period, the FM station jumped from 20th to the No. 1 spot in Arbitron's rating book for last September-October.

WKTU, leading all stations in both AM and FM, thus became the first music station to beat the long-dominant WABC in more than a decade.

The station went on the air on Christmas Day in 1948 as WMCA-FM and, like most other FM stations then, it duplicated the programs of its AM sister, WMCA 570.

The FM station was sold for \$7,500 in 1951 after Nathan Straus, who then was WMCA's president, determined that almost no one was listening.

At the time, he said that to gauge its audience, his FM station had signed off the air at night in the middle of baseball games for several summer weeks. He said this had provoked only two complaining telephone calls.

Straus sold the station to WHOM-FM, an ethnic station, which decided to introduce innovative programming on its new FM station, which became WHOM-FM.

Instead of duplicating the AM programs as other FM stations did, WHOM-FM introduced an all-Chinese format and distributed FM radios in public gathering places in Manhattan's Chinatown.

But this was before the golden era of FM radio, and the idea did not succeed.

In the mid-1950s the station introduced a so-called "Storecast" format, broadcasting tunes that served as background music for supermarkets.

Then in 1959, the station introduced its "Heritage" format of classical music. There were many other classical music stations on the dial then, and most of them were not making money.

So, starting in 1962 and continuing through the early 1970s, WHOM-FM began duplicating the all-Spanish format of its AM station. In doing this, the station was again being different, since it was during this period that most other FM stations owned by AM stations stopped the duplicating practice and began offering separate programming.

In 1971, the station began offering a program of background Latin music known as "The Continental Sound," but again the station failed to attract a significant audience.

In 1975, WHOM was sold. The AM call letters became WJIT and the broadcasting remained all-Spanish.

But the FM station became WKTU and introduced a new format of music on the New York dial, soft rock, or mellow music.

The mellow music format attracted a very loyal audience among young peo-

ple, but the station seldom rose above No. 20 in the ratings.

Then last summer, the switch was

made to all-disco, and WKTU-FM co-founded the local broadcast industry by zooming to No. 1.

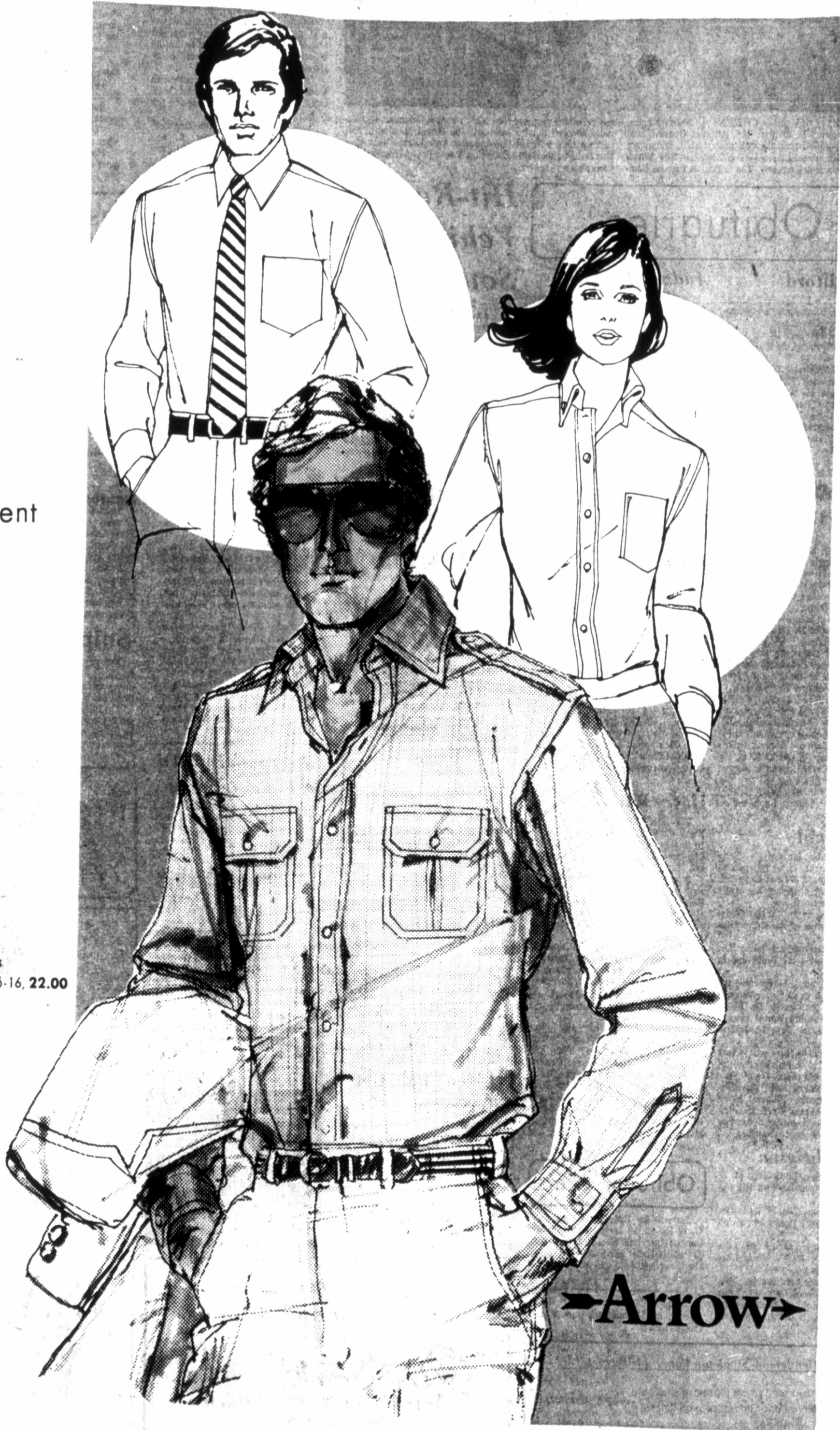

# Crime Line Hailed After Six Months Of Operation

After six months, the city's Crime Line program is an "outstanding success," according to Mayor Dirk West, one of its founders.

"At the end of six months' operation, it is very apparent that this program will be a permanent fixture in fighting crime," West said. "Seventy-one felony crimes have been cleared as a result of informants calling Crime Line, 51 criminals have been taken off our city streets, and \$152,955 in stolen property has been recovered."

More than \$8,000 in reward money has been paid out to persons calling Crime Line during its first half year. Persons with information concerning felony crimes are urged to call the number. Callers will remain anonymous. Persons wishing to make tax-

deductible donations to the Crime Line reward fund should mail them to Box 2,000, Lubbock.

This week, Crime Line is posting rewards of \$1,200 in connection with a possible case of arson and three burglaries.

About 4:45 a.m. Oct. 1, a fire in the B&M Liquor Store on FM 400, seven miles south of Dalwor, destroyed the building and all inventory, together worth about \$125,000.

This is the third possible case of arson at the store, said Lubbock police, who added the fire revealed suspicious burn patterns similar to those that would be created by flammable liquids. There also was evidence of rapid acceleration of the fire, said police.

Authorities are currently conducting numerous interviews and

following several leads, but public help could very likely speed the solution of the matter, said police.

Crime Line is offering \$300 reward for information on the alleged arson of the store, and \$300 in each of three burglaries listed this week.

Police said they discovered a burglary at the Needles Tire Co. at 1502 Ave. H, the morning of Oct. 2. The intruders apparently gained entry by prying open a wooden door with a large screwdriver or tire tool. Once inside the burglars ransacked the building and attempted to break open a safe.

They took four G78-15 Pharis brand white sidewall tires; two LR78-15 Delta brand white sidewall tires; four HR78-15 Delta brand white sidewall tires; four HR78-14 King tires; two JR78-15 PR6 brand white sidewall tires; two LR78-15 PR6 brand white sidewall tires; two LR78-15 Steelex brand white sidewall tires; and six GR78-15 PR6 white sidewall tires. Total loss is estimated at about \$1,800.

In another case, Lubbock County Sheriff's deputies got a call in reference to a burglary of a house at Rt. 1, Box 146 Shallowater at 1 p.m. Sept. 14. The deputies said someone had cut through a screen door and forced open a wooden door and taken \$3,494.95 in property.

Taken were: a portable Curtis Mathes 19-inch TV; a Corningware coffee pot; a GE two-slice toaster; two sets of silverware; three glass candles trimmed in gold; a Waltham electric clock; a Curtis Mathes 21-inch color TV; a wooden bank with \$100 in it; an antique wooden digital clock; a Skil electric saw; a Craftsman 1/4-inch electric drill; and some jewelry.

And, sheriff's deputies are

seeking information on a burglary that occurred Sept. 25 at a house at Rt. 1, Box 194, Lubbock in which \$2,540 in property was taken after burglars entered through a back door. Missing from the house are: a Zenith sound system and speakers, model 154080, serial no. 0182072; a Zenith 19-inch color TV with remote control; a black and white AC/DC portable TV; and a gold ring with chain containing a 2 1/2 dollar gold piece mounted in gold and a 14K gold chain 20 inches in length.

Anyone with information concerning any of these crimes is urged to call the Crime Line telephone number, 741-1000.

Should that information lead to the solution of the crime, the caller will receive \$300.

## Salvation Army Receives UW Funds

(EDITOR'S NOTE: This is another in a series of articles dealing with the United Way of Lubbock. Except for officials of United Way agencies involved, the names used are fictitious to protect the identities of those served. However, the stories reflect actual case histories here.)

The material luxuries of life don't mean much when one loses good health. One day you're on top of the world, a home, food, a nice car and money in the bank. A year later, it's gone to pay medical bills of a debilitating illness.

This was the case of Thomas Stone when the Salvation Army of Lubbock heard of his plight.

The Salvation Army of Lubbock, a United Way agency, will receive \$104,125 from the United Way's 1980 goal of \$1,803,752.

According to Louise Stanger, employee of the Salvation Army, the organization was contacted by a friend of Stone's who was caring for him at the time. The friend explained that Stone had had numerous operations, affecting several organs of his body, which proved to be quite expensive for the previously financially comfortable citizen.

Also, Stone would have to have constant treatment for his entire life and needed at least \$150 worth of prescriptions per week. The operations and the treatments depleted the life savings of Stone, Mrs. Stanger said, and when he was released from the hospital he had no where to go for money for the prescriptions.

It was the Salvation Army that helped Stone obtain the much needed medicine. Mrs. Stanger said the Salvation Army helped Stone, who will never be able to work again because of illness, obtain the initial medication. Since then, she said, he has been helped by other

agencies and church groups and is now getting back on his feet through Social Security benefits.

Mrs. Stanger said many of the persons aided by this United Way agency do not respond after being helped, but "we had a really sweet letter from Mr. Stone. He was very appreciative of our help," she said.

The assistance given to Stone is part

of the social services program of the Salvation Army. The program includes emergency assistance in the form of counseling, food orders, clothing, prescriptions, utility bills, rent, transportation and emergency lodging.

According to Major James Waller, director of the Salvation Army of Lubbock, the purpose of the organization and its social service program is "to bring people into a right relationship with God. Social service is one of the vehicles to bring them to their Creator."

### Record Crowd Sees Texas Prison Rodeo

HUNTSVILLE (UPI) — A record opening day crowd gave two convict contestants a standing ovation for their performances Sunday at the 48th annual Texas Prison Rodeo.

Prison officials reported 13,172 paid admission with a total estimated attendance of 15,500 including several inmates from surrounding prisons.

Sharing honors were Daniel Estranda, who removed a tobacco sack from the horns of a charging wild bull in less than five minutes, and veteran Willie Craig, 59, whose prison rodeo career dates back to 1943.

Estranda, serving 18 years from San Antonio, bested 39 other redshirt contestants to earn a cash prize of \$350, including \$100 from country and western singing star Johnny Rodriguez.

Craig, serving 30 years from Dallas, was the championship cowboy of the 1976 prison rodeo series and this year was first place winner in the bareback bronc riding event.

The major cited many other programs of the army which help to achieve this goal. The army has an assistance service for transient persons who are stranded or without a home. The services provided in this type of situation are lodging, food, clothing and counseling. In its emergency lodging program a total of 4,742 persons were aided with 13,111 needs served.

Waller said this service is important to the army because it gives them a chance to relate to the persons on an individual basis. Waller said that persons staying with the army on an emergency basis are required to attend some type of church service on Sunday. He said this program helps to fulfill the Army's obligation "to put man into an environment where he can, and maybe will, change his whole life." Although some rebel against the spiritual aspects of the army's procedure, Waller said it is the backbone of the army's work. He said that in each person is sin.

"If you can get the sin problem straightened out, you can solve the other problems in life. Unless we bring an awareness of God into people's lives here, we're not helping them. God is a vital part of changing motivation. We're not just here to feed and clothe people but to bring them into a good environment."

Other programs of the Salvation Ar-

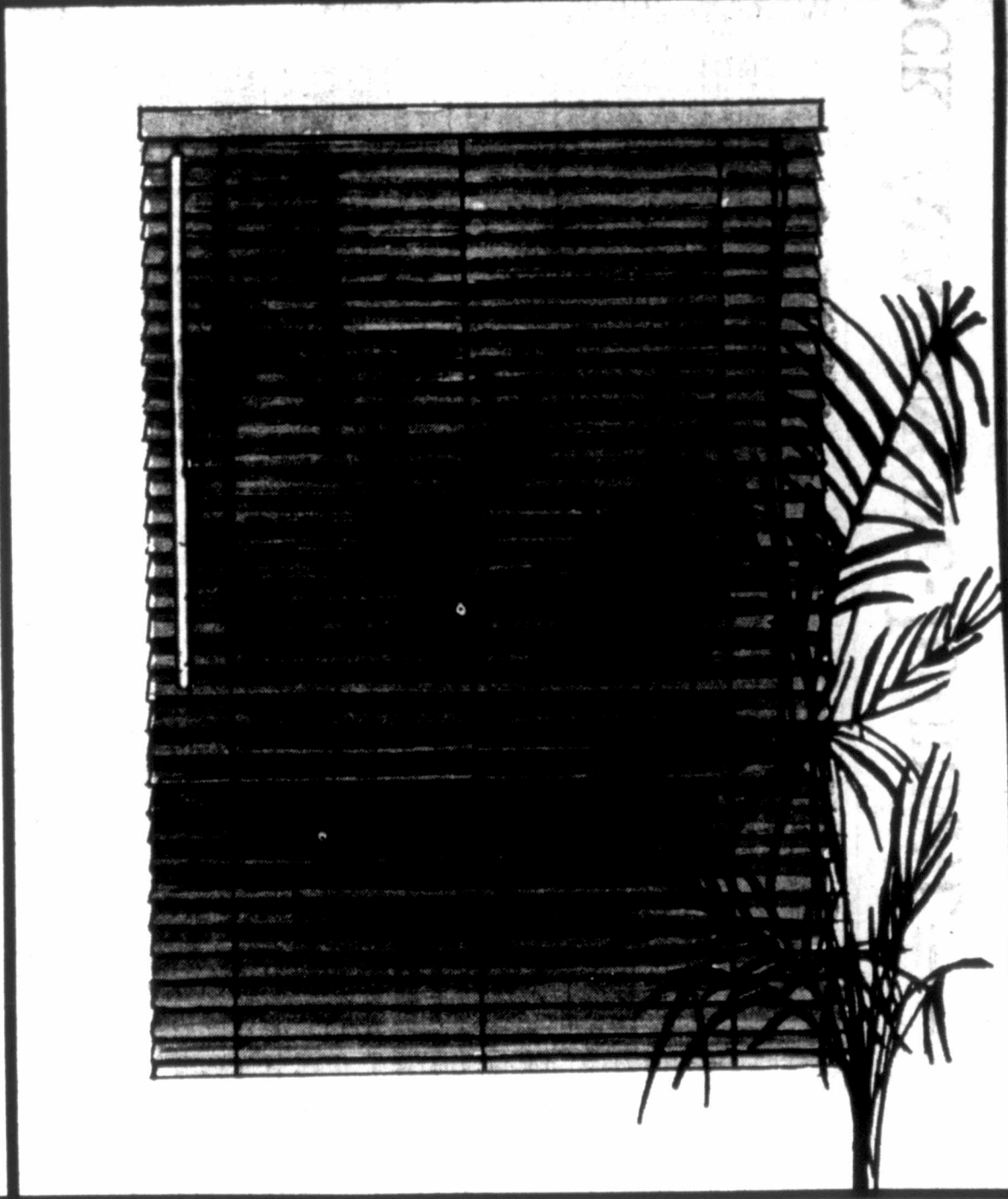
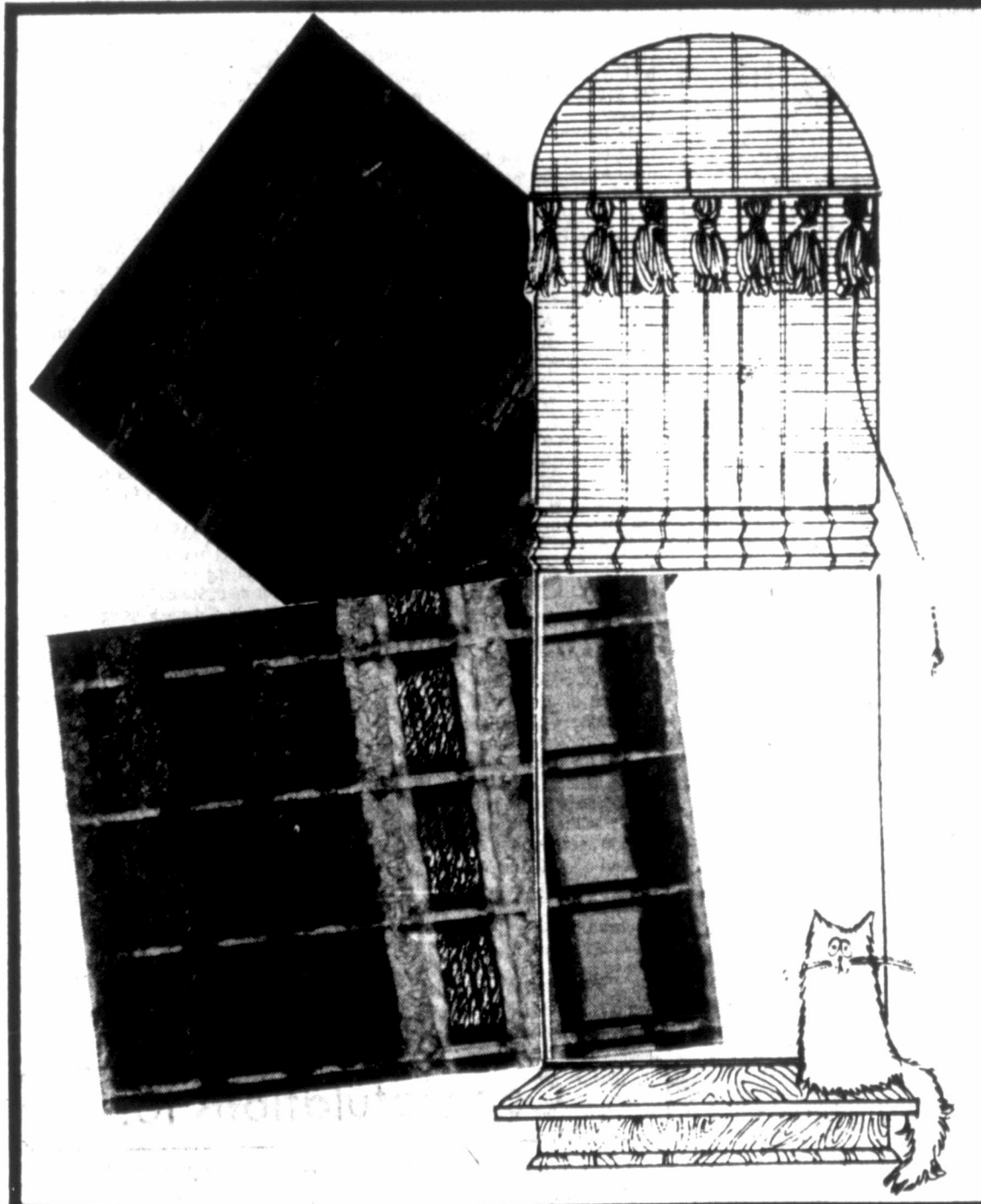
my include assistance to parolees, providing them with a stopping point, assisting in finding work and supplying them with basic needs if there are no loved ones here to provide; the league of mercy, which is a service group, providing visitations to convalescent homes and gifts during holiday seasons; a missing persons service, which attempts to find loved one who are gone from home; and many adult and youth organizations are sponsored through the Salvation Army.

Waller said all of these programs are administered with spirituality; however, he said it is not forced on people. He said the staff has a special way of relating to its clients. "The staff we have relates to the people. They see God in them, in their kindness and concern. This is one of the most significant ways we do our ministry. It's not so much what you say but the attitude you put forth. A bit of kindness is like a cup of cool water to a thirsty man," he said.

The Salvation Army of Lubbock is among 34 United Way agencies.

# Blood Pressure Machines



**By LAWRENCE LAMB, M.D.**  
**DEAR DR. LAMB** — What is your opinion on the blood pressure machines that are in the stores and public places today? My husband has had his taken several times that way from different machines and got three different readings. They were as follows: 146/99, 212/200 and 140/202.

He's a long distance truck driver and 42 years of age. He's 5 foot 8 and weighs 155 pounds and doesn't take any medication. Each one of these readings was after he had stopped and rested for at least an hour.

He had a physical by our family doctor and another one by a company doctor and both said the readings were normal but they wouldn't tell him what they actually were. He does not drink but he does smoke two packs of cigarettes a day. On his last physical the doctors said he couldn't be healthier for his age.

We are wondering if we should get alarmed about the readings from these machines and if we should consult our doctor, especially on the high readings.

**DEAR READER** — The best way to regard those do-it-yourself machines is that they are screening devices. They'll usually identify borderline, moderately elevated or higher readings. If you have such a reading, you should see your doctor and let him check it in the usual manner.

Blood pressure readings aren't nearly as accurate or as consistent as most people think. They are influenced by your emotions at the time. They can be influenced by reflex action. In some people just as soon as the blood pressure cuff is placed around their arm, their blood pressure reading will go up.

That's why experienced doctors insist on having a number of readings before they decide the real blood pressure is too high. If a person has intermittent normal readings, it's not considered high blood pressure as a disease. These people are called vascular hyperreactors and we know their blood pressure goes up and down in response to stresses and that the blood pressure responds reflexly.

Most heart specialists don't feel that individuals who have fluctuating blood pressure with frequent normal readings should be taking medicine to lower their blood pressure. Why? If your blood pressure on its own will drop to 120 over 70 and you add to it the blood pressure lowering effect of some medicines, you might have readings that are far too low and can contribute to serious medical problems.

To help you have a better understanding of the many factors that control blood pressure, I am sending you The Health Letter number 1-8, Blood Pressure. Other readers who want this issue can send 75 cents in check or coin with a long, stamped, self-addressed envelope for it. Send your request to me, in care of this newspaper, P.O. Box 1551, Radio City Station, New York, NY 10019. As this issue explains, the reflex rise in blood pressure can be as sudden as the reflex action dilating or constricting of the pupil of your eye.


You might be interested to know that a high percentage of individuals who report to a hospital emergency room with high blood pressure turn out on later examinations to have perfectly normal readings.

## Future Teachers Not Intimidated By School Problems

Sherry Duncan isn't intimidated by the stories of student violence and physical and verbal assaults against teachers. She knows the stories are true, but she's not going to let them frighten her away from her goal.

"I'm just totally turned on to teaching," said Miss Duncan, 21, an education major at the University of Tennessee at Martin. "I started in high school working with third-graders below first-grade reading level.

"The kids are why I'm going into it," she continued. "There's a lot of violence... but most kids are so great. And at the age I work with, they still want to learn."

Miss Duncan's comments are echoed by many teachers-to-be, who say they won't be deterred by the problems confronting the profession — including violence, low pay and public criticism casting them as villains in the "Why Can't Johnny Read?" saga.

Many education students interviewed said matter-of-factly that the problems went with the territory, while others expressed optimism that the difficulties could be remedied.

"Every profession has its problems," notes Jose Plata, 24, vice president of the National Education Association's student affiliate. "It's just something we have to cope with."

But many teachers who were among the 110,000 educators physically assaulted in the nation's schools last year are no longer willing to cope.

Thousands of teachers are dropping out of the schools each year, reports the NEA, the nation's largest teacher organization. Some of those calling it quits are relatively young and want a less punishing career; others are taking early retirement.

Of 1,777 veteran teachers questioned in an NEA poll last year, nearly a third said they would not become teachers again if they could go back to college and start over.

In addition, despite the Jose Plata and Sherry Duncan, the number of college students pursuing teaching degrees declined by more than 40,000 last year — the sixth consecutive year the number of teacher graduates dropped.

Many young people still eager to teach shrug off the dropout statistics, saying they are less likely to become discouraged than are current teachers because they are entering the field knowing what to expect.

Elisa Della Rose, 22, a graduate student at California State University's Los Angeles campus, says many of the current teachers spent decades in classrooms without the serious discipline problems that are a fact of life in schools of the 1970s. And they are simply unprepared to handle such crises.

"For a long time, the thing for a woman to do was go into teaching," said Miss Rose, who teaches industrial studies, or "shop."

"You became either a housewife or elementary school teacher — a 'babysitter,' really," she continued. "Those are the people out there now. But the people going into teaching now do it because they really want to teach."


Joanne Barnes, 31, a student at Glassboro State College in New Jersey, agrees that many teachers who started in the classrooms 10 or more years ago are encountering trouble now because they have not been able to adapt to the needs of students in the 1970s.

"Society is changing very fast and the kids don't know how to adjust," she said. "I think they want someone to talk to, who would stay after school with them."

Students respect their teachers and want them to be that someone, she says, but many teachers either don't know how to begin or aren't willing to spend
