The Dow Jones industrial average, which plunged 15.44 points Friday, was off 14.08 to 800.60 at 2 p.m. An 82.93 loser since Oct. 5, the closely watched Dow has skidded to its lowest level in eight

Declines were routing advances, 1,-437 to 80, among the 1,743 issues crossing the New York Stock Exchange tape. The breadth of the market's slide the past two weeks has been unprecedented.

NYSE volume at the two-hour mark amounted to about 21,000,000 shares, compared with 15,790,000 traded during the same period Friday.

The market is being clobbered by rising money rates and speculation that interest rates are headed even higher than the historic levels they've achieved already. There was speculation the Federal Reserve will raise the discount rate it charges member banks for loans and this in turn will lead to a surge in other

Several banks already have raised the rate they charge brokers for loans to a record 15 percent, making it painful for smaller investors to buy stocks on credit. Prices were lower in active trading of

American Stock Exchange issues. On the Big Board, Westinghouse Electric was the most active issue, off % to 191/2. IBM, a 7-point loser the past two weeks since reporting lower thirdquarter earnings, was second, off % to

Bally Manufacturing, one of the numerous gambling issues that attracted speculator attention this year, was the third most active issue, off 1% to 24%. Caesar's World, another gaming issue, was off 3/4 to 133/4.

Exxon was off % to 56% even though the nation's largest oil company reported its third-quarter earnings climbed to \$2.60 a share from \$1.18 a year ago.

On the Amex, Resorts International A was the most active issue, off 1 to 24%. Dome Petroleum followed, off 1% to 40%. Damson Oil was third, off 1/2 to 154. All three stocks were speculator favorites the past year.

In Europe, gold prices jumped by \$4 an ounce in early trading today as the dollar bounced back in Tokyo and edged higher in Europe

Gold, which closed at \$392 an ounce in London on Friday, opened today at \$394.25 and quickly jumped to \$396. In Zurich, gold opened at \$394 and climbed

Clark County District Judge Paul Goldman, who sentenced Bishop to die and later visited him in prison, said the inmate told him about other murders. He said he sent a policeman to interview Bishop and the officer "came back with figures about 18 other homicides ... 12 in California and six in other places.' Asked about the report, Bishop's older brother said, "I can't believe it. But he told me a couple of months ago there was a lot I didn't know about

The brother, who asked not to be identified, said he understood Bishop had mentioned "being a hit man for the mob." But the brother said "if he was doing that he would have had to be totally insane. And he didn't seem like

Wolff had offered Bishop a chance to appeal shortly before the inmate was taken into the gas chamber.

Moments later, he was strapped in a freshly painted death seat and green curtains went up in the gas chamber. Bishop smiled at a reporter among the 14 witnesses - 13 men and a woman standing on an adjacent room.

"He looked each of us in the eye, I think," said Tad Dunbar of KOLO-TV in Reno, one of those who watched the 46year-old ex-paratrooper die for the murder of a Maryland man.

Bishop shook his head and said nothing. Cyanide pellets fell into an acid bath, unleashing deadly gas. Bishop made what appeared to be a thumbsdown sign, wrinkled his nose, seemed to search the room and breathed deeply

on his chest and then snapped back. He took another deep breath and closed his eyes. After a series of convulsive jerks,

it was over. Wolff had offered Bishop, 46, a chance to appeal even up to the point at which the inmate, clad in blue denim pants, a white shirt and white socks, was brought into the chamber and strapped into a freshly painted death chair.

But the feisty prisoner said no, just as he earlier spurned offers to see a minister before going to his death.

Twisters Dip In Midwest, **Gulf Region**

Tornadoes spawned by storm systems moving through the central portion of the nation ripped into the Midwest and Gulf Coast regions today, causing at least one death and a dozen injuries. Property damage was heavy in some of

A tornado ripped through two residential sections of Beaumont early today, damaging several homes but causing no injuries, police said.

The twister struck the northwest section during heavy rains and knocked out power in some areas. Seven homes and a mini-storage warehouse were hit. Street flooding was reported in Beaumont and nearby Orange.

Tornadoes also skipped over southwestern Louisiana today, causing extensive demage at an elementary school and an adjacent trailer park in Sulphur, authorities said. No fatalities were reported, but several children reportedly suffered minor injuries.

Teachers said there was extensive damage at the Hennings Elementary but police said damage was worse at the trailer park.

"A trailer was blown to the road. There was major, extensive damage," said a police spokeswoman who asked not to be identified.

"It happened fast," she said. "We got the word it hit the Carlyss Cafe - down Louisiana 27 toward Cameron - and right after that it moved into Sulphur. We had just put out the alert when we got the report it hit the school."

Other tornadoes were reported in Cameron, where some roofs were torn off, and at Holly Beach. Another was spotted over the Lake Charles Country Club, but it did not touch down.

A spoksman at the elementary school said the cafeteria was badly damaged. Most of the injured were pupils in a spe-

cial education class, he said. 'It was really a miracle (no one was seriously hurt)," said Jackie Kenny, a spokeswoman for the hospital. "From what one teacher said, her classroom was all messed up, but none of the pup-

Joan Sale, teacher of the special education class, said, "The suction was so bad it almost whisked the kids right

sure at all what was going on."

She said she took six pupils to the hospital, where they were treated and released.

Elsewhere, tornadoes and severe thunderstorms battered much of the nation's midsection today.

An elderly woman died and at least seven persons were injured by a tornado and severe windstorm that slammed into mobile homes at two locations near Joplin, Mo., early today.

Killed in the tornado 14 miles north of Joplin was Alma T. Heims, 77, of Oonogo. Her two sons, Donald and Ar-thur Helms, received minor injuries. The tornado struck at 12:10 a.m. CDT.

About 20 minutes earlier, five persons were injured when two trailer homes were overturned during a severe storm that authorities said probably was

a tornado. Baseball size hail fell in Wichita Kan., and high winds downed tree limbs and power lines.

Less severe storms struck in a wide belt stretching from Lake Superior through Central Texas. Funnel clouds al-so were sighted near Heraldton, Okla., and Glena, Kan., Sunday night, but See TORNADOES Page 14

Police Hunt Sniper In Oklahoma

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) - A sniper who killed a couple in a crowded shop-ping center parking lot escaped and left police with few clues to his identity or

Jesse Eugene Taylor, 42, and Marion Vira Bresette, 31, were killed in the attack Sunday, police said. Investigators said they had lived at the same Oklahoma City address for about two

Sgt. Tom Mundy said detectives uestioned the dead woman's three children and about six other witnesses to

The victims had just left a supermar ket and were loading grocery sacks into a car shortly before 5 p.m. when someone opened fire with a high-powered rifle from across the street.

"I just turned around and saw a man fall. He was catching bullets. I couldn't see where they were coming from," said Vince Allen, an employee of the store

the victims had just left. "The ... man was shot first," said Charles Hopkins, 16, another store employee. "He was yelling 'No! No! No!" He went up against the car, and he got

shot again. He said the woman began screaming, walked from behind the car and was approaching Taylor's prone body when

she, too, was felled. Investigators said Taylor was hit in the abdomen and chest. The woman was shot once in the torso, they said.

The Bresette children, who police said are 12, 10 and 9, were in the auto at the time of the shootings. "Those kids were just hanging out

the windows when it happened," Hopkins said. The children were unharmed and no

other injuries were reported. Several unoccupied autos were damaged by the gunfire, police said.

"It appears as though these were his intended victims. He obviously was wellversed in the use of a high-powered rifle

because of the distance," Mundy said. "The random aspect simply doesn't seem to be there.

The sniper fired four or five shots from a hiding place in a grove of cedar and evergreen trees on the north side of the Oklahoma State Fairgrounds about

two miles west of downtown, investigators said. Police said they recovered three pro-

jectiles from the shopping center parking lot and shell casings among the trees about 75 yards away. Detectives questioned witnesses who

said they saw a blond man leave the area in a dark sedan. Investigators said they believe the man may be the sniper.



The boy was taken into protective custody by Texas welfare officials at Liberty, on Oct. 12 after a motorist told sheriff's deputies a teen-age girl tried to sell the child to him for \$100.

But it wasn't until late Friday night that the child, who welfare officials said had bite marks and bruises when taken into custody, was identified as the miss-

Clapton, whose career began back in 1963, was voted top British musician by readers of the Melody Maker music weekly when he, Jack Bruce and Ginger Baker made up the hit-making group

It will be Clapton's first appearance in Eastern Europe, as well as in Austria, Israel, Thailand, the Philippines and Hong Kong. He also will play in Ger-

CHICAGO (AP) - Investigators say it could take six months for a report on the cause of the switching foulup that resulted in the Oct. 12 Amtrak train crash near here

Two persons were killed and 44 others were injured when the Amtrak passenger train crashed head-on with a parked Illinois Central Gulf freight in the suburb of Harvey.

"There was indeed an ICG employee who opened that switch ... moments before the arrival of the passenger train," said William Pugh, an investigator for the National Transportation Safety Board. We're trying to find out why."

TODAY'S EDITORIAL: Synfuel Hopes Evaporate

THE DEVELOPMENT of synthetic fuels holds the promise of adding considerably to U.S. energy resource potential without dumping a corresponding burden on the tax-

But first, the twin camels of governmental red tape and resulting inefficiencies have to get their noses out from under the tent of private industry research and development.

"The problems which exist tend to be more institutional than logistical or technological," writes Heritage Foundation energy analyst Milton Copulos in a study published this week by the nonpartisan public policy organization.

Environmental regulations, siting and licenting red tape, and the lack of rational incentives," he concludes, "are the 'real' bar-riers to the development of domestic energy

EIQUID OR GASEOUS fuels derived from coal, oil shale and petroleum-laced tar sands, or synfuels, have received considerable attention as a result of the U.S.'s increasing dependence on imported oil and related political problems with oil-producing na-

Copulos argues that though President Carter instituted a new government agency the Energy Security Corporation-to deal

government corporations is hardly encouraging and that some form of private development approach would be most feasible.


"What this all means," he says, "is that given a relatively modest range of incentives...it is entirely possible that our nation's industrial sector would develop a synthetic fuels industry on its own."

LEFT TO ITS own devices, coupled with some improvements in the siting and permitting process, private industry doubtless could make significant strides forwardwithout burdening the taxpayer with yet another bureaucracy and almost certain cost

Copulos doubts that the President's target of some 2.5 million barrels a day of synthetic fuel capacity can be attained by 1990. However, a capacity more likely in the range of 500,000 to 1 million barrels a day could be on line by that time, "provided that the proper policy environment exists."

It should be pointed out that even if the government were to decide to develop the snythetics industry on its own, it would still have to turn to industry for the technical expertise, and manpower, to do so.

THE SCHOOL BOARD and the City Council have a special responsibility to help residents of an area who want to upgrade their environment.

Their attitude is a far cry from that too often seen in which neighborhood residents sit on their rotting front porches until it's too late and then wail because the City is neglecting them.

Overton South residents need to be flexible in dealing with owners of commercial properties on their fringes, but they have every right to expect cooperation in return-and, especially, to expect full-fledged support from the City and the school

Odds On Carter-Kennedy Ticket

WASHINGTON-President Carter and several of his key political advisers now see the possibility of a Carter-Kennedy ticket in 1980.

In their private backstage political strategy dis-cussions at the White House, the President has speculated that this could be the surprise outcome of next August's Democratic party convention in New York.

While the President still publicly favors Vice President Walter Mondale as his running mate, he believes the convention might nominate Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., if the liberal lawmaker makes a close run for the number one spot-as now expected.

Kennedy's nomination for the second spot, according to Carter's thinking, might be pushed as a means of uniting the party.

THE PRESIDENT ALSO believes that Kennedy would accept the Vice Presidential nomination since it would put him in a strong position to capture the Democratic Presidential nomination

Noting that he was able to capture the party's

nomination in 1976 with less than 30 percent of the party's vote, Carter in private talks with White House visitors says frankly he can do the same in 1900

An effective argument, which Carter' political operators used in Florida, is that Kennedy's candidacy will aid the GOP in the South and Midwest because of his big spending proposals.

Several southern senators that normally would be expected to support Kennedy already have indicated that they are sticking with Carter in 1980

Sen. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., the 1962 campaign manager in that state for John F. Kennedy, says he would rather have Carter at the head of the ticket than Kennedy.

HOLLINGS IS CONCERNED that the "lovehate relationship" of voters with the Kennedys could bring out a tide of "Kennedy haters," who might also vote against the senator. Rep. John Jenrette, D-S.C., echoes the same fears.

The two lawmakers believe the likelihood of southern defections, if Kennedy is on the top of the ticket, will keep a lot of southern democratic leaders from backing the Massachusetts senator.

They don't see that problem if Kennedy is on the bottom of the ticket The challenge by Sen. Kennedy has energized

the Carter forces throughout the South and Midwest. Defections to the Massachusetts liberal are still not serious and Mondale is working hard to head them off or keep them under control.

Hundreds of state and local officials will come to Washington Oct. 24 for a major Carter rally to

be followed by his formal announcement on Dec.

Aides of President Carter believe his recent Florida showing is an indicator that he still has a 50-50 chance of winning renomination but that Kennedy will be needed on the ticket to win re-

Only that ticket can keep together the Demo cratic coalition-blacks, catholics, jews-which backed Kennedy in Florida and the protestants, middle-aged, and elderly Democrats that favored

It is still more than eight months before the Democratic National Convention but don't write off the possibility of a Carter-Kennedy ticket.

If they don't end up knocking each other out of the political arena, this could be the ticket. Whether it could win in 1980 is another story.

'Last Embrace' Worth Hospice Cost Per Day

WASHINGTON-In October of 1978, the newly founded National Hospice Organization (NHO) held its first annual meeting in Washington, D.C. So humble about the strength of the movement were the NHO's leaders that they prepared for only 200 participants.

More than 1,000 showed up. When, in his keynote speech, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., declared that, "Hospice is understanding and accepting death, but most of all, it is the humanization of our health-care system," the emotional response of the audience of experts was overwhelming.

SOME POLITICIANS, representing a cross-section of views, believe in fact that the hospice is a grass-roots movement comparable in many ways to the great drives for civil rights and against the Vietnam War in the U.S.

Others hail its recent, almost perpendicular rise as a belated recognition by this nation of a profound need in all of us-a need to have faith that when our time comes, we will be free of pain, surrounded by people who care and will offer us that last embrace that no machine in intensive But even if we are eligible, are accepted as pa-

tients in a hospice, can we afford the costs?

A PILOT CONTRACT issued by a private health association reimbursed a new hospice unit in a Washington home for \$130-\$140 a day.

A Rochester, N.Y., Blue Cross study last year found average home care at \$87.75 a day against a daily hospital rate of \$200:

* One hospice reported the average cost for all

home services per patient (excluding institution-alization) at \$750 to \$1,000 for three months—including 15 to 20 visits at \$29 per visit. A May 1978 study in New York by the Genes-

see Region home care association covering 33 discharged cancer patients indicated they spent an average of 39 days within the program at a daily cost of \$26.19.

Q. WHEN YOU USE the care, do you have to go into a hospice?

A. You must enter the hospice program but not

a medical facility. A goal is to keep the patient at home in normal surroundings. Q. Who pays for hospice care?

A. The patient carries the primary responsibili-ty for the bill. But depending on the patient's age or financial circumstances, Medicare will reimburse for some of the medical services and Medi-caid for some of the medical and related suppor-

Under current federal law and rules, though, many services provided by hospices are not reim-bursable and must be paid by the patient or the

A. Physicians refer 66 percent; friends 10 per-cent; nurses 9 percent; social workers 8 percent; other sources 7 percent.

Q. What's the current federal involvement in

A. Although Medicare, Medicaid, social services and programs authorized under the Older Americans Act do not cover hospice care as such, they do pay for some of the hospice services.

All of these programs are under the Department of Health, Education & Welfare, which is also involved medically in the hospice movement through the National Institutes of Health.

Q. HOW DOES HEW view hospices?

A. Cautiously and with the current objective of further investigation. The questions being asked How can we guarantee that federal assistance

will not weaken private and voluntary support? How can we foster quality and prevent abuses without over-regulation and the building of unneeded new facilities that will drive up costs? Q. Where can you get more information about

WASHINGTON—The Soviet Union is wailing and screening and gnashing its teeth, accusing President Carter at using "gunboat diplomacy" to deal with its combat troops in Cuba. But a more apt description of the steps taken by the President might be "poppun diplomacy." Carter and Soviet President Leonid Brezhnev have stobd eyeball to eyeball, and this time—unlike the 1962 Cuban missile crisis—the U.S. President has been the one who has blinked.

Pirst, both at the Soviet statements our President is referring to attraightfacedly as "significant." The Soviets are assuring us that their combat tousp unit is a training center, nothing more, and it can do nothing more. In what sense is this assertion "significant"?

IS IS STONEWALLING, plain and simp All along, the President and our secretary of state have said that what is in Cuba is a combat and that the preservation of the status que is

Soviets have listened to our charge and us to stick it in our ear. This is

be Soviets have assured us that their "training for" will not change its function or status. So President "understands" this to mean that Soviets do not intend to enlarge their combat p unit or give it additional capabilities. In, this is merely a reaffirmation of the status. This is "mentioned"?

The Soviets have told us that their personnel in Cuba "are not and will not be a threat to the U.S. or any other nation," Carter says.

But, regardless of what the Soviets say, their

combat troops pose just such a threat capability.
So what's the President going to do about the
Soviet combat troops in Cube? The answer: very FIRST. HE SAYS we'll increase the surveill-

ance of Cubs. This probably mesas resuming the spy flights which he foolishly suspended as a goodwill gesture shortly after assuming the presi-Secondly, Carter says the United States will "assure" that no Soviet combet unit in Cube can be used to threaten the United States or any oth-er nation in the hemisphere.

er nation in the hemisphere.

As to how this will be "assured," the President doesn't say. Third, about 60 to 160 persons will establish a permanent, full-time Caribbean Joint Task Force in Key West, Fla., to monitor what's going on in Cuba. This should really terrify Castro.

The President also says that the United States will expand military maneuvers in the region and "of course" will keep our forces in Guantanamo.

FINALLY, WB WILL increase our economic nistance (no mention of more military sid) in se Caribbean region "to resist social termoli and posible communication."

Incredibly, our government refuses to say if the Soviets were asked to remove their combat troops from Cuba.

When asked this question, a senior administra-tion official replies only that the United States sent forward "a number of suggestions and proposals" and that, at the end of the discussions, assurances, statements" and "clarifications" vere laid out "very clearly."

When asked if the Soviet combat troop presence in Cuba constitutes a military "base"—the kind of "base" which Secretary of State Vance has told Sen. Richard Stone, D-Fla., it is the policy of the United States to oppose—this senior of-ficial says:

"WE HAVE NOT come to the conclusion that this constitutes a 'base.' We will continue to review the matter, but we have not come to that

When a reporter asks this senior official how the status quo in Cuba has been changed—a status quo which the administration had repeatedly labeled as macceptable—he answers that one way is that the Soviets have made "certain statements" about the future which are "significant" and thus "the status quo has been altered."

this month, railroad officials said. Three of the injured required hospitalization, authorities said.

The 11-cat, three-engine train was entering the city limits of Offerle when the final three cars, all sleepers, went off the tracks about 1:10 a.m., authorities

Offerle is a village of about 300 persons, 30 miles east of Dodge City The train was en route to Chicago from Los

Two persons were listed in stable condition at the Spearville District Hospital, about 11 miles west of Offerle. while another was taken to Dodge City Regional Hospital. The extent of their

injuries was not immediately disclosed. Some 21 other persons were treated for minor injuries, including cuts and bruises, at area hospitals and released, authorities said.

Brian Duff, an Amtrak spokesman in Washington, said the derailment occurred on a straight stretch of the main Santa Fe track, which is flanked in Offerle by two side tracks.



sneakers. It all set the stage for a classic kickback accident that will mutilate wood cutters often this fall.

George's cutting chain became pinched in the wood, but the engine kept running. When he tried to lift the saw, it jumped and ripped through his sneaker and toe.

"I was lucky," he said after surgeons sewed his toe back together. "Last surmer, one man in my district cut his jaw away, and another was killed when he cut his stomach."

Last year, an estimated 51,000 per-sons were slashed in chainsaw accidents, more than twice as many as in 1975, ac-

more than twice as many as in 1975, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. Chainsaws have killed 73 persons since 1973.



says pollster Daniel Yankelovich. "We've gone almost overnight from a nation of optimists to a nation of pessimists," Yankelovich said at a recent conference in Philadelphia on "Coping with Economy Uncertainty.'

Yankelovich, head of the firm of Yankelovich, Skelly & White, cited these signs of gloom:

-Almost half of all Americans - 48 percent - say they are having trouble



paying for housing. Five years ago, only 23 percent complained of problems in

buying and keeping up a home.

-Nearly three people in four - 72
percent - agree with the statement: "We are fast coming to a turning point in our history where the land of plenty is becoming the land of want." Sixty-two percent think the United States is enter-

ing an era of permanent shortages.

—There is widespread distillusionment with government. Seventy-seven percent of the public thinks government wastes money; 60 percent say it doesn't care about the people; 65 percent say it is run in a way that benefits special interest rather than the population as a

-More than four people in five say that the individual who works hard and plays by the rules of society goes unre-

Meanwhile, an Associated Press-NBC
News poll showed that most Americans
say President Carter isn't doing all he
can to fight inflation despite his endorsement of the Federal Reserve Board's re-

cent credit-tightening moves. The poll also found in interviews Oct. 15 and 16 that almost two-thirds of the public said inflation has already chopped their standard of living.

In the AP-NBC News poll, only 40 percent of those questioned said they think Carter is doing all he can to fight inflation, 53 percent said he is not doing all he can and 7 percent were not sure.

Yankelovich told the conference co-sponsored by the Wharton School and the John Hancock Mutual Life Insurance Co.: "The American personality is not changing, but changes in the environ-ment are posing an almost unique prob-lem of adaptation."

He said the changes have come not only in the economic situation where inflation is eroding incomes and hopes, but also in the areas of culture and politics. In the cultural area, for example, Yankelovich noted that the so-called typical family — a male breadwinner, non-working wife and two small children is rapidly disappearing. Fewer than 20 percent of the families in the country fit that pattern today, he said.

Census Report Reveals Rise In Tax Collections

WASHINGTON (AP) - Taxes are going the way of prices and wages, the Census Bureau reports. Not surprisingly, that way is up.

In the five years between fiscal years 1971-72 and 1976-77, taxes collected by ail forms of government in the nation went up 59.4 percent, according to the bureau's new 643-page "Compendium of Government Finances," released Sun-

Collections from income taxes - in-dividual and corporate - climbed 70.6 percent during that period, the study The increase in income tax co

tions can be attributed primarily to the 78 percent increase in Americans' per-sonal income during that five-year peri-

And Americans not only paid taxes on more money — they also moved into higher tax brackets that required a larger percentage of their earnings.

During the same period, the Consumer Price Index, which measures the

price of goods and services, increased 45.4 percent. Sales tax receipts increased 45.5 percent and property tax income went up 45.8 percent.

In the past two years, the inflation rate has increased sharply and now

stands at more than 13 percent a year.

Comprehensive tax figures after 1977 are not yet available, so the report does not reflect impact of the "tax revolt" that began in June 1978 when California voters approved a proposition limiting local property taxes. Since then, several states and localities have adopted measures to limit taxation or spend

Overall, income taxes in 1977 contributed \$250 billion toward govern erations, compared to \$146.5 billion

The total income of all governments was \$657.5 billion in the fiscal year 1976-77, up 72 percent from the \$382.8 billion

of five years earlier. During the same period, expendi-tures of all governments in the United States grew 71 percent, from \$399.1 bil-lion to \$682.5 billion. Government debt jumped 61 percent, from \$602.4 billion

to \$968.8 billion. Two of the most costly areas of state spending were public welfare and educa-

tion, the study says. The eight states with the lowest rates of spending for welfare programs, less than \$15 for every \$1,000 of personal income, were Alaska, Nevada, Arizona, Wyoming, Nebraska, Indiana, North Carolina and Florida.

Spending more than \$25 on welfare for every \$1,000 of personal income were California, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Michigan, Illinois, Kentucky, the District of Columbia, Pennsylvania, New York, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Maine. The rest of the states fell in

between those two figures. Turning to education, states spending more than \$90 for every \$1,000 of personal income were Alaska, Oregon, Montana, Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, Arizo-

na, New Mexico and Vermont. Spending less than \$70 on education for every \$1,000 of personal income were Nevada, Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Connecticut, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, the District of Columbia, Virginia, Georgia and Florida.

Foreign Relations Committee voted 14-0 ay to state that the SALT II treaty does not prevent the United States from supplying its European allies with con-ventional and nuclear weapons.

1962, when "The Strip" of liquor stores south of Lubbock was authorized. There was quite a bit of controversy and a lot of pros and cons," she said. We didn't have the space then that we do now, and we had so many people come to vote absentee that they were

lined up outside the door." Miss Matthews has served under five county clerks: Ed Allen, Louie and Grace Moore, Flo Swenson through the 1960s and Frank Guess since 1969.

The office did all of its recording by typewriter in the 1940s, began making photostats in the early 1950s and went to microfilm a few years ago. Real estate indexing once was done by hand but now is handled on the county computer system. Another significant change in the office has been the advent of punchcard ballots in place of the old-style pap-

"The workload has increased, and of course laws change every time the legislature meets," Miss Matthews said.

A new Lubbock County was built during her tenure.

The old stood on the same block as the present one, and part of the new one, including a new county clerk's office, was finished in 1950. A portion of the old building continued to be used until eventually all of it was torn down and replaced with the present structure in downtown Lubbock.

The county clerk's office keeps records for two county courts-at-law and county probate court, records marriage licenses and birth certificates, registers warranty deeds and deeds of trust and keeps records of the commissioners

"I'll miss the work and miss everyone, but I'm looking forward to some things I have missed by having to work, Miss Matthews said.

Smokers' Premium Hike Urged By Firm company that pioneered discounts to non-smokers said today its experience

shows that cigarette smokers have markedly higher death rates and should be charged higher premiums.

The differences in life expectancy "are too large to be ignored... in individual life insurance underwriting and pricing." State Mutual Life Assurance

Co. said in a study.

Release of the study marks the first time an insurance company has made public the death rates of policy-holders

who smoked cigarettes. The study suggests that because two-thirds of adults do not smoke, the standard life insurance tables should be revised to make non-smoking the norm and cigarette smokers should be placed

in a "substandard" risk category.

That may not be practical yet because of sales considerations, said the study by actuaries Michael J. Cowell and Brian L. Hirst. But it predicted, "The insurance industry may eventually decide to adopt a substandard classification for

William Kloepfer, vice president of the Tobacco Institute, an industry group, said that while he had not examined the study, State Mutual's measurement "is based on a single factor and doesn't take into account other possible factors."

Kleopfer said a number of things may contribute to mortality rates in terms of lifestyles, personal customs, environmental exposures, occupational hazards, smoking, gender, drinking, diet we could go on and on."

ing \$2.7 billion, or 40 percent of its \$6.6 billion in policies. It gives discounts to customers who sign a statement that they have not smaked a cigarette in the past 12 months. Users of cigare and pipes are eligible for the discount.

"Censure has a strong historical meaning for major acts of misconduct,"

John Snyder, a member of the Citizens Committee for the Right to Keep and Bear Arms, had complained the letterhead used in a gun control fund-rabing campaign included a line at the bettom stating "not printed or mailed at government expense," but had "United States Senate" printed on top.

The committee decided it was impro-per for a senator to allow outsiders to make use of a Senate letterhead, and Kennedy bowed to the ruling.

Violence Subsiding In Boston Schools

BOSTON (AP) - About two dozer white and black students scuffled briefly at Charlestown High School today, but classes in Boston's other desegregated high schools opened peacefully today under increased security, officials said.

Authorities intensified security measures to try to prevent recurrences of the student walkouts and fights last week stemming from tensions over de-

School officials said about a dozen black students were sent home after the fight at Charlestown High, located in a neighborhood where resistance to courtordered busing has turned to violence in

It was in Charlestown that 15-yearold Darryl Williams, a black football player, was shot during a scrimmage last month. He remains paralyzed as a result

Some white students at several high schools marched out of their classrooms at various times last week, some calling for more protection in the schools. There also were several fights between blacks and whites, and school buses carrying black students were stoned.

School officials warned that beginning today they would suspend any students who leave classes.



ter Menachem Begin's government was reeling today under two surprise blows — the resignation of Foreign Minister Mosbe Dayan and a Supreme Court order that Jews must give up a controver-sial West Bank settlement.

The court order, handed down today, said the government's seizure of private-ly owned Arab land for the Elon Moreh settlement near the Arab city of Nablus was illegal. It gave the settlers 30 days to

The Arab landowners had challenged the government's claim that the settlement was essential for Israel's security. an argument the high court had accepted in all previous cases involving Jewish enclaves in occupied territory.

Cabinet Secretary Arieh Naor said the government would abide by the court decision. "There is a verdict and the government has nothing to do but to obey it and carry it out. This is a government of law," he told reporters.

Dayan had cited his opposition to the

sons for his resignation Sunday. But his chief gripe was his lack of influence over the four-month-old negotiations with Egypt and the United States on autonomy for Palestinians on the occupied West Bank of the Jordan River and in the Gaza Strip.

Begin and other leading members of his Cabinet said the resignation won't change their tough stand in the autonomy talks. But Israeli newspapers today predicted Dayan's departure would

weaken a government already staggered by a domestic political crisis.

Opposition Labor Party chief Shimon Peres, reacting to the resignation, called on the government to schedule new elections, a call Begin was not likely to

Even before Dayan resigned, several opposition parties raised motions of no confidence in the Begin government, primarily challenging its handling of the inflation-warped economy. Those motions come up for debate Tuesday,

Begin was expected to survive the noconfidence votes, but a spokesman said Defense Minister Ezer Weizman had been recalled from a visit to Egypt to bolster government ranks during the voting. A Weizman aide said the defense chief would return Tuesday.

Dayan, who played a key role in hammering out the peace treaty with Egypt and is considered by many to be Israel's most creative negotiator, told reporters he quit because "I was relegated to doing what I didn't want to do, attending cocktail parties and ceremonies.

Although he was the chief architect the original proposal for autonomy for the 1.2 million Palestinians on the West Bank and in Gaza, his home-rule concepts were blunted by Cabinet hardliners who demanded Israel retain firm control of the territories.

In recent weeks, he spoke out repeatedly against government proposals that would have forced autonomous Palestinians to rely on Israel for everything from water to use of public land. Dayan also traveled around the West Bank and Gaza meeting with Arabs closely identified with the Palestine Liberation Organization, which drew sharp criticism.

One of the few doves in Begin's government Davan sought far-reaching concessions to draw Palestinians into the negotiations. In a television interview last week, he suggested that Israel turn over administration of the occupied territories to local Arabs

In his letter of resignation, Dayan described Israel's relations with the Palestinians of the West Bank and Gaza as 'the key question in our lives over the years, one which can be solved."

"Last week I expressed my reservations on the way in which negotiations on autonomy are being conducted," Dayan wrote. "I believe that the foreign minister cannot perform his function properly as long as he is not personally involved, informed and among the determiners of Israel's policy on the ques-

Dayan, who is 64, said he would retain his seat in Parliament, but gave no hint of other plans for the future. The hero of the first three Arab-Israeli wars, he was drummed out of the government after Israel's initial losses in the 1973 war. He bounced back by bolting the Labor Party to join Begin's Likud Bloc after it took power in 1977. But Dayan now is beset by uncertain health, having had operations this year for cancerous intestinal tumor and to repair vocal cords

Avalanche-Journal Staff Calling President Jimmy Carter a weak leader, the wife of Republican presidential candidate George Bush said if her husband is nominated, he will win the 1980 election because of his "fantastic grassroots organization.'

Barbara Bush, speaking at a news conference at the Lubbock International Airport this morning, said Bush is emphasizing inflation, energy and strategic defense in his campaign and outlined his plan in a five-point program. Program measures, she said, include

imiting growth of federal spending, developing a strong energy program, enacting sunset laws, cutting government regulations, and finally, cutting taxes through an incentive plan rather than an across-the-board move.

Should Sen. Edward Kennedy land the Democratic nomination for the presidential seat, Mrs. Bush said she still feels confident her husband of 35 years would come out on top. She pointed out that Bush has served in five governmental and party offices, all of which she feels were left better by Bush's reputation of total integrity.

Bush served as U.S. congressman from Houston (where he now lives), ambassador to the United Nations, national chairman of the Republican party and director of the CIA. He was also chosen by then-President Gerald Ford to be the U.S. envoy to the People's Republic of China while serving as a foreign ambas-



Accident Stuns Crowd At Fair

DALLAS (AP) - Stunned thousands who jammed the midway on the last day of the State Fair of Texas watched in horror Sunday as two cable cars on a midway-spanning ride collided and plunged about 100 feet, killing one man and injuring at least 15 others.

Fred Millard, 41, of Dallas died at 8:05 p.m. in surgery at Parkland Hospi-

Officials believe Millard, his wife and three daughters were playing a bowling ball-type carnival game at the time of the 4:45 p.m. accident. It was not known how many of the injured were aboard the fallen cars, but Millard's wife and two of his daughters also were hurt.

Donna Aydelott, 19, of Wichita Falls suffered head injuries when the sky car she was in fell onto the awning of a carnival booth. The car that collided with hers fell all

the way through an adjacent booth, smashing into the left half of a game the Millards were believed to be at. Miss Aydelott said the wind had been blowing the car "pretty hard" and the

car had struck a pole just before the accident occurred. She said she and two other women in her car, Deborah Hammonds, 23, of Wichita Falls and Terri Kenes, 19, of Dallas, noticed two cars in front of them stuck together. When they saw sparks

Discovery Of Eisenhower Tapes Prompts Debat

former President Dwight D. Eisenhower secretly recorded conversations in his Oval Office elicited opposing views on the propriety of such practices from two of the principals in the Watergate scan-

In a copyright article published in its Sunday editions, the Houston Chronicle said newly disclosed records at the Eisenhower Library in Abilene, Kan., revealed that he began recording meetings in the Oval Office in October 1953 and continued at least until December 1958.

Former Watergate prosecutor Leon Jaworski, now a Houston attorney who served under Eisenhower during World War II, believes no president should secretly record his conversations.

But John Ehrlichman, former President Richard Nixon's White House adviser for domestic affairs, says there are many reasons why a president would use

Jaworski said he had never heard any rumors about recordings by Eisenhower.
"There was no suspicion that was voiced along that line, much less a

charge," he said. "I would just regret that it had been done. I don't think it should be done.

Jaworski, whose Watergate probe contributed to Nixon's resignation as president in 1974, said the Eisenhower tapes did not change his attitude about

"It was what was on the (Nixon) tape recordings, the subject matter," Jaworski said. "He dug his own grave with the tape recordings."

Ehrlichman said from his home in Santa Fe. N.M., that he also was sur-

Santa Fe, N.M., that he also was sur-prised by the Eisenhower taping system, but he didn't see anything wrong with it. "It's what he (the president) does with the tapes," he said. "I think he owes his people a certain obligation to make sure they are not published or used in a way that will breach the confidentiality of the relationship. The Chronicle story said the taping

system was a well-kept secret, but its existence was known by several top offi-cials, including former Secretary of State John Foster Dulles.

Transcripts of the tapes generally

were prepared by the president's trusted secretary, Mrs. Ann C. Whitman, who had problems in understanding the tapes, the article said.

Nixon, who was forced to resign as president largely because of his own se-cret tapes, was criticized by Eisenhower in one of the transcribed conversations on June 29, 1954.

Eisenhower started by telling Nixon, then vice president, that he wanted to talk with him about what the president

called Nixon's "castigation" of Demo-cratic handling of foreign policy.

Dulles had been trying to obtain bi-partisan support for his policies, Eisen-nower said, and Nixon's speeches clearly endangered those efforts.

In his defense, Nixon said he hadn't attacked Democrats in general, only for-mer Secretary of State Dean Acheson, but Eisenhower said, "They (the Democrats) feel that any criticism of him re-

flects in some degree on them."

Nixon said he would be "perfectly willing to delete such references" from future speeches'

Student's 'Monster' Act Disrupted By Attacker

A Texas Tech University student, playing monster Sunday at a fraternity playing monster Sunday at a traternity haunted house project, apparently spooked someone so badly that he at-tacked the "monster" with a knife. William John Moulton, 21, of 4823 52nd St. was treated at Methodist Hospi-

tal for a cut finger and later released. He described his attacker as a young Mexican-American male wearing a beige shirt

and blue pants.

The Matthews Junior High School student, who was treated and released at Methodist Hospital, told police a young Mexican-American male jumped out of a car, pushed him to the ground and be-gan kicking him in the mouth.

The victim's brother, also at the scene, said he pulled a knife in an attempt to get the assailant off the youth, but that the attacker displayed a pistol and demanded the knife.



Efforts To Exhume Oswald At Standstill

DALLAS (AP) - Official and unoffi- Medical Examiner Charles Petty to comcial efforts to exhume the body in Lee Harvey Oswald's Fort Worth grave were at a stalemate today. Meanwhile, Oswald's mother said in

Fort Worth that such efforts are "asi-Oswald is the man the Warren Commission said acted alone in shooting

President John Kennedy to death from a sniper's perch in Dallas' Dealey Plaza on Nov. 22, 1963. The man buried in the grave was shot

to death two days after the assassination by Dallas police character Jack Ruby. Ruby died of cancer while in jail.

Recently, a congressional investigation resulted in a pronouncement that Kennedy's assassination "probably" was the result of a conspiracy

Skeptical British author Michael Eddowes represents the unofficial attempt to dig up the body that lies in a grave at Rose Hill Cemetery.

Eddowes wrote a book in which he contends that after Oswald defected to the Soviet Union, he was murdered and replaced with a Russian spy who returned to the United States and killed

He filed a suit seeking exhumation, but it was denied. The case is on appeal. Eddowes' research led Dallas County pare Oswald's U.S. Marine Corps medical records with the autopsy report on

Last Friday, Petty revealed that the comparison showed enough discrepancies to cause him to ask the Tarrant County (Fort Worth) medical examiner to exhume the body for tests.

Tarrant County officials have not responded officially to Petty, but said they would order the exhumation only if told to do so by a court with the proper jurisdiction.

Thus far, Petty has not filed such a suit. He said he is "sitting tight" in the

Petty did seek an informal opinion from the Dallas County district attorney to see if he had jurisdiction to order an

District Attorney Henry Wade said he did not feel the Dallas County medical examiner had authority to order an exhumation in Tarrant County, about 15

miles from Dallas' western edge.
Oswald's mother, Marguerite, 72, told Columbus, Ohio, radio station WCOL Saturday the exhumation efforts are a "waste of time."

She said she has not cooperated with Eddowes' efforts, but did not say how she felt about Petty's inquiries

Police Search For Escapees, Accomplices

BOWIE (AP) - Police in three states spent the early morning hours today looking for an escaped prisoner and the couple who helped him and two others break out of the Montague County jail in north central Texas.

Authorities in Bowie County captured two of the prisoners Sunday after-David Bowman and Jeffrey Lamb

surrendered without incident to police who spotted the pair as they tried to leap a fence into a field behind a house about two miles north of Bowie.

'We spotted them (Bowman and Lamb) running across a field," said Bowie police officer Tom Pelton. He said the pair ran from a house where they had hidden to avoid capture.

Oklahoma police set up road blocks Sunday in an effort to capture Jerry Stevens and the two outside accomplices that helped him escape.

Justice of the Peace Robert Fenoglio of Nocona issued arrest warrants for the unidentified man and for Cheryl Northcutt. The warrants allege aiding an es-

The unidentified man reportedly fled in one car, while a woman and the three escapees left in another car that bore Kansas license plates.

Police said a man and woman surprised jailer Ed Langham when they pulled a pistol and demanded he free Stevens, who then forced the failer to release Bowman and Lamb. The group also took an automatic weapon and a shotgun from the jail.

It was the second escape in a week for Bowman and Lamb, who climbed an exercise yard fence Oct. 14 to break out

of the Young County jail, where they were being held on burglary charges. Langham fought with Stevens during the escape. He managed to stab Stevens severly while the two battled on the stairs, police said. Langham was treated for minor injuries at a Bowie hospital.

Police said the jailer was aroused about 3 a.m. by the unidentified man banging at the jail door and saying there had been a traffic accident nearby and that people were hurt. When Langham opened the door, the

man pulled a pistol and he and the wornan forced Langham to release Stevens. Langham pushed Stevens through a security door as they battled on the stairs - locking himself inside the jail

and the others outside.

Police said the amount of blood in vidence probably meant Stevens suffered a severe wound.

Some of the Marines were able to walk into the hospital under their own power after being shuttled to Brooke, but others had to be airlifted by helicopter the eight miles from Kelly.

Two Marines died in Japan and two hers were "too critical" to be airlifted to Brooke. One of the dead Marines was identified as Lance Cpl. L.C. Malveaux of Beaumont but military officials did not identify the other.

Thirty-one of the burned Marines and two Japanese were treated and released. A Japanese woman remained hospital-

"This is the largest number of pa-tients to be admitted at one time at Brooke since Vietnam," said Brooke spokeswoman Audrey Urbanczyk.

The victims filled the regular burn

treatment ward, forcing hospital offi-cials to press another ward into service. Brooke, known worldwide for its burn research and treatment, takes in about 300 severely burned patients per year. Brooke's burn teams treated

hundreds of cases during the Vietnam War. A crack 18-person burn team from Brooke was dispatched Friday afternoon to Japan to stabilize the victims and treat them during the grueling 20-hour

"But our work was easy compared to what they had to do over there. They stripped staffs from three hospitals and really got things together in a hurry," said Spec. 6 Richard Hodge, one of the burn team members.

Pass Rush Ruins Cards

IRVING (AP) — Despite only a mediocre day by the offense, the Dallas Cowboys put another win on the books Sunday and took over first place all by themselves in the Eastern Division of the National Football Conference.

Thomas Henderson and Randy White sacked St. Louis quarterback Jim Hart three times each in a 22-13 victory over St. Louis that raised the Cowboys' record to 7-1, a game ahead of Washington and Philadelphia.

Good Days And Bad

DALLAS COWBOY STARS of yesteryear were guests of honor Sunday afternoon at Texas Stadium, as the 'Pokes celebrated their 20 years in the National Football League by scrambling past the St. Louis Cardinals. And those old-timers felt right at home, with all the fumbling, dropped passes and sloppy tackling. It was like 1960 or '61 all over again!

A lot of the scribblers in the press box thought it was a ragged game, which just shows you how much the typewriter-pounders really know. Because when Coach Tom Landry held his usual session with the media types following the tussle, he thrust out his jaw defiantly and vowed it wasn't all that bad.

"This was a great defensive game," Landry declared as he looked around the room in search of dissent. "We played well and kept a good rush on (Jim) Hart all day." Again he waited for a possible challenge, but the usually brash writers were silent. This was not the time to test Tom's patience, obviously.

"It was not one of our better offensive days," Landry conceded, "but the defense picked us up and that was enough. We had no consistency on our offense and the kicking game was not good. But you can't expect to play strong games back-to-back over a 16-game schedule.

"We were emotionally up last week; and this week you just hope you play good enought to win. We have a long way to go yet."

No one disputed that, either.

DESPITE A LITTLE QUIBBLING around the edges, Landry was essentially correct in his evaluation. There was no way the Cowboys could duplicate that almost flawless performance against the Rams a week ago, especially against a foe they had already beaten in the season opener. The Dallas defense did perform with enthusiasm that produced some big plays and frequent sacks of the Cardinal quarterback.

Some observers thought the 'Pokes yielded too much yardage to the St. Looey rushers. Even club president Tex Schramm, who takes these things seriously, was heard to shout, "Stop 'em, you guys!" on several crucial plays.

But, as Landry emphasized in his post-game analysis, the Cards' Ottis Analysis.

But, as Landry emphasized in his post-game analysis, the Cards Ottis Anderson is big, strong and fast. That is a most difficult combination for a defense to stop.

Hart's passing was no surprise to the 'Pokes. Big Jim always shoots them full of holes. Only the fact that his receivers were off their usual form kept him from doing even more damage to the Cowboys Sunday.

ON THE NEGATIVE SIDE, Landry admitted that the 'Poke kicking team got a bit careless in letting St. Louis' Roy Green return a kickoff 108 yards for a couchdown. Coming just before halftime as it did, with the Cowboys holding a 17-6 lead and threatening to turn the tilt into a laugher, it was the biggest play of the game for the Cards. It put them right back into contention.

Although Landry sounded somewhat critical of the 'Pokes involved, assistant coach Mike Ditka, who handles the special teams, had a slightly different version of the run.

"When our team makes a return like that, we say 'great job, guys!' But when an opponent does the same thing, we blame our players. I think St. Louis just did a heckuva job on that return."

As a coach, though, Ditka wonders about the wisdom of running out a kick that goes eight yards deep into the end zone.

"It isn't sound football, but what can you say to the guy when he goes all the way?" Ditka asked.

WHATEVER, THE COWBOYS chalked up another division win on a day when arch-rival Philadelphia stumbled. That leaves Dallas alone at the top in the NFC East and with the best record in the NFL at the halfway mark.

That edge in the won-lost column may come in handy next weekend when the Pokes travel to Pittsburgh for a duel with the ogres of the AFC Central. The Steelers have not played like Super Bowl champs this season, because of injuries, but anyone want to bet that Terry Bradshaw and Lynn Swann will not be flying high against Dallas?

Landry doubts that the Cowboys will need much motivation by the mentors in their workouts this week. Except for those pesky Steelers, there probably would be four Super Bowl trophies instead of two in Landry's office.

"If you cannot get ready for a game like this (Pittsburgh), then you are in the wrong business," Landry barked as he marched out of the interview room. The writers were willing to drink to that.

Rafael Septien kicked field goals of 51 and 29 yards for the Cowboys, matched by field goals of 51 and 41 yards by St. Louis' Steve Little. The 51-yard kicks were personal records for both kickers in the NFL.

Dallas' other points came on a safety in the third quarter when the ball was snapped over Little's head on a punt.

"We've got a much better record than I thought we would in the first half of the season," said Landry, noting that the Cowboys traditionally are a slowstarting team.

"I'd take 7-1 right now for the last half. We've got the toughest part of our schedule still ahead of us," Landry said. Told of Washington's 17-7 victory

over Philadelphia, Landry said, "That's good news, but it's a long way to go." On the heels of taking over first place, the Cowboys must journey to

Pittsburgh Sunday to play the defending world champions.

Cardinal coach Bud Wilkinson said he didn't want to take anything away from the Dallas defense but said injuries in

the Dallas defense but said injuries in St. Louis offensive line hurt his team. When you don't get the protection,

you're not effective passing," Wilkinson said.

Harvey Martin added one sack of

Hart and the Dallas defense dumped him seven times for 58 yards in losses. "The accolades were so much on the offense last week, that the defense was really mentally prepared to play," said

O.J. Anderson gained 105 yards for St. Louis, becoming the third back to gain more than 100 yards twice against the Cowboys. He also took five of Hart's passes for 39 yards.

"They did everything to try to stop me," said Anderson, whho gained 193 yards against Dallas earlier in the year. "There were a lot of remarks all week about me. Even Dorsett said I'd never have another 100-yard game against Dallas. Well, we lost this game, but we proved I could get me another 100."

Green, a first-year player from Henderson (Ark.) State, took Septien's kickoff deep in the end zone, hesitated and then headed down the left sideline despite a teammate's urging that he down the ball.

"I didn't know until after the game it was an NFL record. Everybody was in good position, especially the first two blocks by Willie Harrell and John Barefield," Green said.

"The kick was deep but not too hot, and the Cowboys' coverage didn't have any time to get downfield. That opened it up for me."

"It was just great," Wilkinson said.
"A well-blocked play, and everybody did what they were supposed to do. He's returned some long ones for us, but not as long as today."

Rod Phillips knocked out Septien near midfield for the final clearing block.

Septien said he "was just plowed under. Someone really blocked me. We have a tendency to relax a bit on such a deep kick. No one thought he was going to run it out."

Otherwise, Dallas contained the St. Louis offense. Hart completed 16 of 38 passes for 156 yards.

Asked why the Cardinals never got untracked offensively, Hart replied: "Their defense. It's frustrating, sure," he said of the history of St. Louis losses to the Cowboys in his 14-year career.



CARSON CITY, Nev. (AP) - A famispokesman said Jesse Bishop died like man, and the governor said he had paid his debt to society. But those who fought his execution said Bishop was a victim - like the Maryland man he mur-

"We suffer like any other family," the family spokesman, who asked not to be identified, said early today after Bishop was put to death in the Nevada gas chamber.

"What else can I say," the spokesman continued, "He was a man to the end."

Bishop, 46, was twice married and the father of two children. He was a decorated Korean War paratrooper, a heroin addict and a repeat criminal. His pulled his first robbery at age 15 and spent more than 20 years in jall.

"The sentence of the law has been carried out and Mr. Bishop has paid his debt to society," said Gov. Bob List, who had rejected appeals for mercy made by others on Bishop's behalf.

There was no immediate comment from the family of David Ballard, the Baltimore, Md., man who Bishop gunned down during a Las Vegas casino robbery. Ballard was on his honeymoon when he was slain in 1977

Bishop spurned efforts to block his execution made by the American Civil Liberties Union and the NAACP Legal Defense Fund.

Members of the American Friends Service Committee joined about 50 perair late Sunday and early today outside the Nevada Maximum Security Prison where Bishop was put to death.

"We have nothing we can offer by way of a 'No' to the awful deed except our simple physical presence," said spokesman Eric Moon.

But Henry Schwarzchild, director of the ACLU's Capital Punishment Project which pressed appeals to the U.S. Su-preme Court, said List and other state officials "were accessories to official murder."

"Bishop was high on drugs when he committed his killing; the state officials were high on power and bad law and arrogant self-righteousness," Schwarzchild

He termed the refusal by the Supreme Court and others to hear constitional challenges to the execution "an outrageous pettifogging basis on which to take a human life.'

Meanwhile, there were prayers for Rishop.

The Rev. Louis Vitale, an Oakland. Calif., minister who led the demonstrators in a march to the prison, said he hoped that "somehow God would take

Representatives of Amnesty International, the Nobel Prize-winning human rights organizaton, were present because Amnesty opposes capital punishment

The National Council of Churches declared today a day of mourning to protest Bishop's execution.

Newsman Tells Story Of Bishop's Death

By BRENDAN RILEY CARSON CITY, Nev. (AP) - It was 11:45 p.m. when we entered the witness

Dr. Richard Grundy walked into the room and warned us that this was a "dangerous procedure."

If there were any problems such as leakage of the gas, "you should hold your breath and move out" in an orderly fashion, Grundy told us. Seven of the nine small windows in

the witness room were left open as a precaution. The cold night air swept into the room and a ventilating fan whirred in a corner. There were no chairs in the tan-co-

lored room. Two bright light bulbs in plain opaque fixtures hung above. A plastic-lined garbage can and a roll of toilet paper sat in a corner for anyone who became sick. Some of the witnesses talked to each other. One asked another if he had ever

been to an execution before. Another asked if he had played any basketball lately. Others asked what time it was. I stood next to one of the two woman reporters serving as witnesses. At about 12:10 a.m. the guards rolled

up the green shades on the outside of the death chamber. Bishop was brought into the charn-ber. He was strapped in one of the two

death chairs that are side by side. He was wearing a starched white shirt, blue denim pants, white socks and

The only person he acknowledged in

any way was reporter Mike Donahue of the Las Vegas Sun, who had become a trusted friend.

Bishop stared at the guards who were about to turn the toggle switches to re-lease the gas rather than look at the wit-

He showed no sign of being nervous. The cyanide pellets were lowered into an acid bath. Bishop made what appeared to be a thumbs down motion at the moment the pellets were lowered.

One of the reporters apparently be-came faint. He fell to one knee but then brought himself back up to witness the execution.

Bishop wrinkled his nose; he seemed to search the room and breathed deeply several times.

His eyes rolled upward. His head fell on his chest. Then his head snapped back. He took another deep breath and closed his eyes. His face reddened, saliva ran from his mouth and his body shuddered in a series of convulsive jerks.

Twice while Bishop was being executed I thought I could smell the gas faintly.

Then a guard came into the room and read the official announcement. Jesse Walter Bishop had died at 12:21

Before we were allowed to leave the room we had to sign witness sheets. The prison superintendent then signalled for the guards to lead us outside the room, past the door of the still-locked death chamber and downstairs to a bank of tel-

As I and the other reporters sprinted for the phones, I heard an inmate shout from his cell, "I hope you trip."

Population Of Nation's Death Row Totals 564

In Georgia, convicted murderer James Lee Spencer had been officially scheduled to be executed Tuesday, but prison officials said today they had received unofficial notification it would be put off. They said they had gotten similar notification for two other executions scheduled for this week and two for next

William Lowe, deputy commissioner of the state Department of Offender Rehabilitation, said he did not expect an execution in Georgia for at least a year. Few persons on Death Row have had execution dates set and prison officials say all of those dates are likely to be

stayed by court appeals and stays.

An Associated Press check of the 50 states shows that about four-fifths of the men and women under death sentence are in states in the Deep South. Thirty-five states have the death pen-

alty, but besides Bishop, only two other men have been executed in the last 12 years, during which time the U.S. Supreme Court first ruled against the death penalty and then ruled favorably on rewritten state death penalty laws.

John Spenkelink, a convicted killer, died in Florida's electric chair last May

25, and Gary Gilmore, a convicted mur-derer, faced a firing squad in Utah on Jan. 17, 1977. The nation's largest Death Row population is in Florida: 139 men and one woman. Texas follows with 119 men and one woman, Georgia with 71 men and one woman, Georgia with 11 men and one woman, Alabama with 45 men and one woman, Arizona with 34 men, Cali-fornia with 23 men, and Oklahorna with

Other states with persons on Death Row include: Mississippi, 13 men; Tennessee and Illinois, 11 men each; South Carolina, 10 men; North Carolina, eight men and Iwo women; Arkansas nine men; Virginia and Utah, seven men each; Nevada, six men; Indiana, Dela-

ware, Nebraska and Washington, four men each; Kentucky and Montana, three men each; and Louisiana, Idaho, Pennsylvania and Wyoming, one man each.

is the electric chair. State's Lethal Gas Method Claims 32

CARSON CITY, Nev. (AP) - A method of execution pioneered in Nevada 58 years ago claimed its 32nd life in the state early today after Jesse Bishop walked quietly to the gas chamber.

The drab, tan cell — harshly illuminated by bare light bulbs — was made

possible by a governor who strongly op-posed capital punishment. Gov. Emmett Boyle signed the bill calling for death by lethal gas in 1921,

believing it would be found unconstitu-tional, leaving the state with no way to execute its murderers. The bill stood up, and three years lat-er, a convicted Chinese tong war assa-sin from San Francisco became the first

person to die in a deadly cloud of hydrocyanic gas. Since then, 26 white men, two blacks and two Mexicans have died of lethal gas in the state — some of them gassed in their cells without knowing when the final moments would come.

The two-seated chamber on the third floor of the prison has seen one double execution. The last time the death cell

was used was in 1964.



CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. (AP) - The gasoline shortage is making it an uphill climb for the Incline Railway, a line which has hauled spellbound riders up steep Lookout Mountain since 1895.

The railway, advertised as "America's Most Amazing Mile," has suffered sharp ridership losses in recent months. Officials blame the problem on decreased tourist travel.

People just didn't travel, like they this summer," Bob Ronka said. "It's nationwide, not just in Chattanoo-

Ronka is general manager of the Chattanooga Area Regional Transportation Authority, a publicly funded agency which operates the Incline Railway and buses in the city and surrounding areas.

The railway averages 500,000 riders annually and Ronka said he could not recall a year in which it had lost money He projected that it would at least break even this year.

CARTA figures show the Incline's ridership was down 26.8 percent in June from the same month in 1978. In July it was down 47.5 percent and off 10.8 percent in August. At last count, in Septem-ber, ridership was lagging about 20 per-

If the railway does lose money this year, Ronka said, CARTA would try remedies such as reducing fares. Selling railway would be a last resort, he

of a mile up the historic mountainside, which straddles the Tennessee-Georgia border at Chattanooga. At the steepest portion near the station at the top, the tracks are inclined more than 72 degrees. Railway officials say that, to their knowledge, this is the country's steepest

Two 40-seat, steel-and-glass cars, weighing 7.5 tons each, move up and down on the parallel rails at eight mph, affording passengers a panoramic view of Chattanooga near the top.

Two cables are attached to each car and a pair of 100-horsepower electric motors in the station provide the pulling

Arden Blaylock, CARTA assistant general manager who has worked with the railway since 1939, said the operation was much like an elevator's upward and downward motion with a counter-

on its cables, it helps pull the other uphill, he said. Blaylock said no cable had ever broken and there had been no serious acci-

dents in the railway's history. John T. Crass originated the railway idea and was one of the investors who backed it, Blaylock said.

Blaylock also attributes the Incline's ridership troubles to the effect of tighter gasoline supplies on tourist travel.

Fibrillating Heart

By LAWRENCE LAMB, M.D. DEAR DR. LAMB - My husband

is 45 years old and for the last eight years he has had a heart condition the doctors call atrial fibrillation. He's only had about three attacks in eight years and the last one was very recent. The doctors have done all kinds of blood tests, sugar tests, elec-trocardiograms and the study of his arteries and everything is normal. They don't seem to be able to find out what's causing it since he's never had a heart attack.

Lately he's started to worry about himself and it is acting up about every three days. He was told not to smoke and he's trying to stop. Is there any answer to this and is there any known cause? Is it at all common and can it be cured?

DEAR READER - Atrial fibrillation is more common than you might think and it does occur with and without heart disease. It was even found in one of the astronauts. He was apparently a healthy, robust individual who was first found to have atrial fibrillation when his heart tracing was being recorded while he was on the human centrifuge used

for space flight training. A review of the records showed that he was fibrillating even before the run started.

I saw a number of young healthy people in the Air Force flying population over a period of about 10 years who had attacks of atrial fibrillation without heart disease.

Atrial fibrillation means that the two top collecting chambers of the heart merely twitch or fibrillate rather than contracting in a rhythmic fashion to aid the normal pumping mechanism of the heart. The atria can twitch as rapidly as 500 times a minute while the lower part of the heart that pumps blood beats much

It follows that some patients have a very rapid heart rate in the presence of atrial fibrillation and still others have a relatively slow almost regular pulse rate. Atrial fibrillation can be from

heart disease caused by fatty-cholesterol deposits in the arteries and heart attacks or by such non-heart problems as an overactive thyroid. It may occur when there is a chemical imbalance of the body, such as after too much alcohol or a severe bout of diarrhea. It may be a complication of

an infectious process such as acute pneumonia and it can occur in individuals apparently during variations in blood sugar levels.

Certainly anyone who has such a problem should eliminate coffee, tea colas and caffeine-containing drinks. And, as your doctor has advised your husband, he should eliminate cigarettes. Alcohol should probably be prohibited and if there's any triggering factor in lifestyle that's been found to be associated with the problem, it should be eliminated or con-

Physician Cites Possible Uranium Waste Hazards The data compiled by McCaffrey,

DURANGO, Colo. (UPI) - Dr. Scott McCaffrey, a physician who spends his spare time checking health records, wants to know if a 1.5 million-ton pile of uranium mill waste that has stood at the south edge of town for more than 20 years is a health hazard.

McCaffrey said he became worried about the dark mass of sand-like leftovers, located along tracks of the touristpopular Silverton-Durango narrow gauge railroad line, after he began looking into patient records at Mercy Medical Cen-

Though McCaffrey admits the data he assembled was "very raw" - and other officials say he made some outright errors - the doctor said it appears the community has a cancer rate about four times above the national average.

McCaffrey now wants to know if the mountain of uranium waste, the last visual symbol of a uranium boom era, might be causing the problem. Radon gas emissions near the pile have radiation levels four to six times higher than



working in his spare time and using whatever volunteers were available showed 237 cases of lung cancer in the past 15 years, while a city of Durango's size should have only 60. Hospital officials say McCaffrey has misinterpreted the statistics, compiling

the total number of cancer treatments rather than the actual number of cases. State officials say the figures are at least worth looking into. Stan Ferguson, director of the Dis-

ease Control and Epidemiology Division of the Colorado Health Department, said he believed enough information had been received to warrant a study.



Drugs and booze. They've been a
headache to educators ever since they crept into schoolyards during the "permissive" days of the 1960s.

But these days the disciplinarians say they've got better remedies, and they're not panicky or afraid to use them.

"The panic that used to surround it (drugs and drinking) is not there any more," says Robert Delulio, chairman of the counseling department at Newton North High School in Newton, Mass.

"It's one of the many developmental problems facing children. It's just one more problem we have to deal with," Delulio says. Newton police say marijuana use at the suburban Boston high school is as

'big or bigger" than ever, but school authorities are less nervous because they have found ways to deal with "toking" teens — ways that weren't always available in the '60s.

The remedies range from counseling programs to police surveillance and fre-quent suspensions. And teachers and ad-ministrators say they're not opposed to

To deal with the marijuana problem, some New England school authorities have called on police to stake out schoolyards and to film students between or after class. After the camera catches students believed to be selling, buying or

Police say they're interested only in arresting the heavy pushers and frequent users. The idea of the film is to stress the seriousness of the situation, however, and not to make arrests.

Most authorities agree a film would not hold up as evidence in a courtroom because it would be hard to prove the substance being used was marijuana. In Warwick, R.I., a city of about 90,-

000, police also occasionally pose as students — "mostly to get to the people who sell it (drugs)," says Police Capt.

Camera surveillance also was tried last year in Portland, Maine, in the small western Massachusetts town of Lenox, and in Marshfield, Mass., on Boston's South Shore,
The movie method is controversial

because some say it is an invasion of privacy. Advocates say it can be hand confidentially. It works, they say - at least temporarily.


