EVERYDAY RELIGION ARE WE SPIRITUALLY TIDY?

By Rev. E. B. Thompson

The writer of the little Epistle General, Ist Peter, admonishes the members of the early church to "Gird up the loins of your minds-". A later translation broadens that into "Gird up your spiritual loins."

The reference is to the loose robes which were worn for clothing. The girdle was simply a rope or cord about the waist to hold the robe neatly in place on the body. The writer had evidently seen people who were careless about that little detail of their appearance. He then drew an anology between that sight, and people he knew who were careless about the matter of their spiritual appearance! He was concerned about good-looking souls as well as goodlooking bodies!

Now there is great concern today about how we lookas well there should be. None of us can hope to be too charming at best, and any aid in that matter is needed. We have however, noticed people who were very careful about that matter, but very careless about the matter of their soul appearance! An ugly untidy spirit can do much to off-set the best in beauty culture.

This spiritual slovenliness can manifest itself in a hundred little ways, lack of consideration for the feelings and rights of others, inconsistency between our ideals and our lives, unwillingness to admit wrong acts and attitudes, lack of courage to carry our share of a common burden, being too lazy to study into moral and spiritual values-there are at least ninety-five more! If one or more of these little loose ends, these little shabby spots is clinging to our souls we would do well to heed the ancient admonition to "Gird up our spiritual loins."






