The first 1945 model civilian pas-senger car built in the East rolled from an assembly line of the Edge-water, N. J., plant of the Ford Mo-tor Company August 14, according to word received here by Neil Rock-ey, Muleshoe Ford dealer.

Ford's Edgewater plant, which has been turning out war goods since 1942 - building and shipping trucks, jeeps and bomber service truckg - reverted from war to peace time production without resorting to mass layoff of employes.

In producing for war, Edgewater built, box-1 and shipped more than 130,000 trucks, jeeps and other mili-tary vehicles, besides boxing and shipping more than an estimated 2,750,000 boxes of spare parts.

Before the war, the Edgewater plant produced approximately 400 passenger cars a day. Plans are unpassenger cars a day. Plans are underway to increase production over this figue once restrictions are removed.






