**JUDY MITCHELL WINS**  
**BETTY CROCKER**  
**HOMEMAKING AWARD**

Judy Mitchell has been named Flomot's 1965 Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow. She scored highest in a written

homemaking examination taken in December, and is now eligible for state and national honors.

Test papers of all school Homemakers of Tomorrow in the state are currently being judged. The State's highest ranking girl will receive a \$1,500 scholarship from General Mills. Each State runner-up will receive a \$500 educational grant. The school of the State Homemaker of Tomorrow will receive a complete set of the Encyclopedia Britannica.

Flomot High School has increased in enrollment during the last three years to such an extent that it can qualify for at least one-half unit in Vocational Homemaking for the 1965-66 school year. The Flomot School Curriculum has been increased during the last three years until the students have a choice of 30 subjects during their four years in high school. The Flomot community and the Board of Education are to be commended for the fine improvements.

**FLOMOT SCHOOL HAS TWO**  
**NEW CONCRETE TENNIS COURTS**

The Flomot Board of Education has accepted control of the tennis courts which were constructed during the summer. The backstops were completed during the Christmas vacations. All lines have been painted, nets in place, and children playing. The costs of the courts was met by the Flomot Activity Fund, the Annual Fund, and help and donations made by a large number of people.

The Flomot Board of Education thanks the following groups and individuals: Hub Swearingen and the highway crew from Matador for the materials in leveling the ground; Commissioner Malcolm Turner and his road maintenance crew for grading the area and filling after the concrete was poured, and the hauling of sand and rocks for the concrete; the H & H Gin for the use of a tractor and blade, and for cutting out boiler flues for backstops; Flomot Gin and Memphis Compress for the boiler flues; Jack

Pigg for hauling cement from Fort Worth; J. W. Wells for the extra hours of work he spent on the court; Memphis Compress for the use of their concrete mixer; Herb Martin for running the transit; to all the men and superintendent who helped pour the concrete. The Board of Education feels that someone may have been overlooked, and in that case the children who enjoy playing on the courts wants to thank them, too.

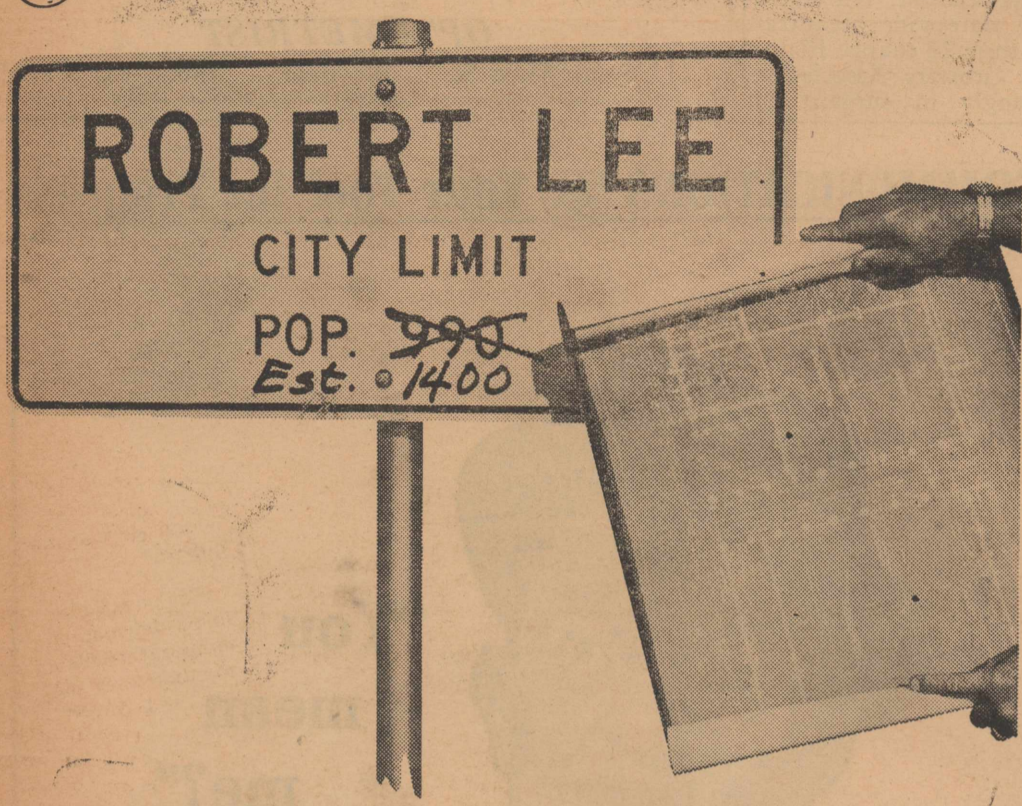

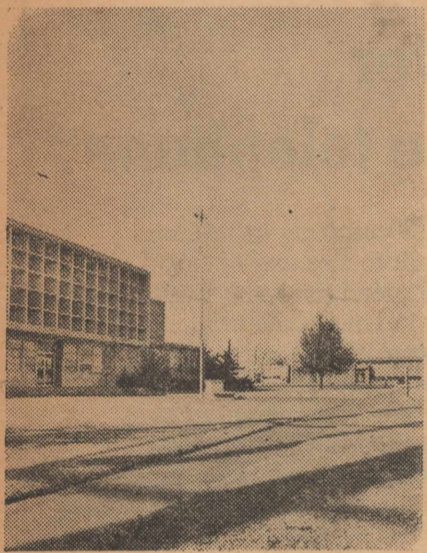

**PROPOSED LEGISLATION RECEIVES FAVORABLE ACTION**

Austin — Proposed legislation increasing the gross weight load limit on cotton trailers received favorable action in the House Committee on Highways and Roads (February 9). Chairman Fritz Thompson referred the bill (House Bill 11) to a sub-committee composed of Chairman Don Hefton, Vernon; Jesse George, Levelland; and Ed Carpenter of Coahoma. Representative Ralph Wayne of Plainview, sponsor of the bill, stated that he was very pleased with the action of the committee and hopes to have the bill on the floor of the House in the near future.

House Bill 11 was introduced by Wayne to increase the gross weight load limit on cotton trailers from 10,000 to 15,000 pounds. This would make many of our present farm trailers legal on our State highways and the larger trailers which many farmers have would speed up our annual cotton harvest.

The reason for this lies in the fact that you can send more cotton from the field to the gin each trip. Thus, making it possible to strip your cotton in a shorter period of time. In order to prevent possible field deterioration of cotton, it is imperative that we get our cotton out of the fields as soon as possible. Wayne told the committee, that with termination of the Bracero Program, we must utilize every possible savings in labor that we can.

Also testifying before the committee were Mr. Don Smith of the Texas Independent Ginners Association; Mr. Charlie Huff, Texas Farm Bureau; Mr. Hearol Veteto, Farmers Union of Texas; Mr. Bruno Schoeder, Texas Co-op Ginners and Mr. Chick Walker of Texas Cotton Ginners Association. All stated that their state-wide organizations and their 22 county Plains Cotton Growers Association were strongly in support of

Wayne's bill. They said that House Bill 11 is a feasible, logical approach to the present cotton trailer gross weight problem.
