TO HELP SMASH THE SMUT PEDDLERS
The House of Representatives acted April 5 to protect American families from the forced intrusion into their homes of morally objectionable material. On your order, under the terms of this bill, the Postmaster General must require the sender to halt his mailings to you or your children of any mail matter you believe to be obscene, indecent, or vile.

The bill just passed by the House makes an end run around the problem of defining obscenity. Each person who receives mail is free to apply his own definition. It feels that unsolicited mail addressed to him—or to his children—is obscene, he may return such mail to the Postmaster General and require him to notify the sender not to send additional such mail. The Postmaster so advises the sender—who, if he fails to comply, can be hailed into Fed-

eral court and punished for contempt.

Enactment of this bill will go a long way to help curb the vile traffic in pornography. The mass mailers of filth will find that millions of American parents have suddenly come into the possession of a means to curtail their operations. Its enactment would be one more blow aimed at what some have called the "pornography industry"—a business web "earning" its unscrupulous practitioners millions each year. Last year, according to Post Office Department estimates, more than a million American school children were sent material soliciting their purchase of smut disguised as "art" or "literature," or "culture" or "education."

Ginzburg's publications, for which he was convicted in Philadelphia, were being sent to teenage children. When this came to my attention I immediately embarked upon a course to help put a stop to this entire venture. The offensive magazine was Eros Magazine, Inc. It was only after a heated exchange of correspondence that I was able to find out that this corporation (?) was nothing more than a protective front. It had been incorporated by Ginzburg, his wife Susan, and a Mrs. Celia Abelson. All of the stock

was owned by Ginzburg. In his own words, he wrote, "I am the only stockholder in Eros Magazine and the Board of Directors consist of myself, my wife Susan and Mrs. Celia Abelson." The people of this country can draw their own conclusions as to why these peddlers of filth think they need some kind of semi-false front behind which to hide. It might be well to remember that their first defense is always, "My Constitutional rights of freedom of speech and freedom of the press." It has been my opinion for many years that the entire procedure is nothing more than a sinister attempt to create legal entanglements that will defeat the very purpose of the laws and the Constitution behind which they are trying to hide. The Communists have been using this method for a long time—for example, their constant plea of the Fifth Amendment.

The time has come in this country to recognize the fact that words can be as offensive as physical blows. The written word can be more offensive many times than the spoken word, and much more widespread. It is time to stop begging the question and to face the fact that obscenity, filth, and pornography, whether spoken, written, portrayed on

the screens of movie houses, or shown on television, can produce nothing more than an immorality and corruption of morals than can and will destroy this nation as surely as Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed. Let us hope the Supreme Court meets this challenge.
