





THE POWER OF THE MIND

Admiral Richard E. Byrd related an experience on one of his expeditions to Antarctica which taught him one of life's great lessons. He found himself isolated in a shack not far from the South Pole where he spent seven long months alone. Most of this time he spent in a sleeping bag with nothing to do but think. Realizing that his thoughts would take charge of him unless he controlled them, he determined to master his thoughts. He said, "It was then I discovered how much a man's world can be a world of the mind. And that a man himself determines or makes his world, which to a degree is the reflection of his inner self."

Of course, this experience of the famed explorer corroborated the doctrine of the Bible relative to the thoughts of man. Solomon said, "As he thinketh in his heart, so is he." Proverbs 23:7. I cannot be more than the sum of my thoughts. If I would be better, in this new year of 1977, I must raise the level of my thinking. That I am capable of controlling my thoughts is plainly taught in the Bible. Paul said, "Casting down imaginations and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedi of Christ."
