#### ORDERS BEING PLACED FOR WINDBREAK TREES

Several local people have recently placed their orders for windbreak trees from the Colorado State Forest Service through the Hall-Childress Soil and Water Conservation District, according to Charles Wade, range conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service in Memphis.

Evergreens are the most popular trees being ordered. Some of the evergreens being ordered include Rocky Mountain Juniper, Eastern Red Cedar, Ponderosa Pine and Austrian Pine. Ever-

greens are used almost exclusively now for windbreaks because of the year around protection they offer.

The trees will be two-year-old potted seedlings. Through proper management these trees will grow rapidly during their early years of establishment and will begin offering protection from wind erosion in as little as four or five years, depending on the species involved.

These trees will not only help protect the land from wind erosion, but will serve as year around cover for upland game birds such as dove, blue and bobwhite quail, and turkey.

The economics behind the establishment of windbreaks is surprising to most people. The total expense is quite minimal. The evergreen trees cost about \$50 per 100 trees.

The Hall-Childress Soil and Water Conservation District will take applications from farmers who are interested in ordering these trees from Colorado State University until February 9. Those who are interested can come by the Soil Conservation Service office in Memphis to get more information concerning the price of trees and the number of trees that need to be ordered.
