





Security through strength is an idea which is easy to graep. The idea of security through sooperation, it appears, comes harder.

In spite of millitary and scientific experts, a recent Gallup poll showed that 49% of Americans think a defense will be developed. There are also still those who think that this is the only nation financially or industrially able to make bombs. There are those who find refuge in the prospecte of realilation.
