mer chief financial officer of Patterson-UTI Energy Inc. Patterson-UTI said in a filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission Tuesday, the former executive allegedly embezzled $\$ 70$ million from the company. In the lawsuit, the SEC alleged that Nels

UTI to pay millions of dollars to XIT, a
company he secretly owned. "He stole millions of dollars from the shareholders of Patterson-UTI," said Kathrine Addleman, lawyer for SEC. Addleman said she does not represent Patterson-UTI; she represents the company's
shareholders. "Since Patterson-UTI is a publicly-owned said company, I work in the best interest of the shareholders who lost millions because of Nelson's's dishonesty," she said. The SEC complaint alleged that Nelson transferred the emberzled funds fro

Military recalls more than 18,000 body armor vests WASHINGTON (AP) - The
military is recaling mon protective vests because they did no meet ballistic test standards when the body armor was made up to five
years ago. It is the second recall in about six months.
Some vests in the latest recall may have been used in Iraq or Afghanistan. Made between 1999 and 2001, they were green or woodland camouflage, making it less likely they were used in the Gulf, where troops use the newer
desert-colored camouflage vests. desert-colored camounage vests.
Marine Corps spokesman Maj Douglas Powell and Army spokesman Paul Boyce said no Marines or soldiers were at risk because the vest met field test requirements.
The vests did not meet the higher manufacturing standards. Officials disThe recall affects only the outer actical vest and its soff inserts, made by Florida-based Point Blank Body Armor Inc., and not the ceramic inert that also is used in the armor. Because, troops may have moved of the older green vests to a newer desert-colored vest, soldiers and Marines need to check all parts of their body armor for the recall numbers, body armor
officials said.

that "of all the justices with whom he served, Bill Rehnquist is the bright est." He performed his judicial duties with such alacrity and efficiency that he was able to manage the court effectively while still finding time to
write four highly acclaimed books on issues as diverse as the 1876 election and civil liberties in wartime.
