Bush meets with Shiite leader, says he's not satisfied with efforts to stop violence WASHINGTON (AP) - President Bush told a Shite political leader on Monday the United States is not
happy with progres in Irag and sought happ cleric's help to curb extremists and terrorists trying to undermine the struggling new democracy.
Abdul-Aziz al-Hakim said U.S. troops need to stay in Iraq to help deal with escalating violence. He also told Bush that Iraq welcomes help from ohher
nations, including those in the Middle nations, incluaing hose in the Midat
East, so long as they do not bypass rraq's political process.
"Iraq should be in a position to solve Iraqi problems," al-Hakim told Bush after they met in the Oval Office for more than an hour.
