Hurricane watches issued in Mexico, US

in effect Monday for a stretch in effect Monday for a stretch
of Gulf coast in southern Texas and northern Mexico as Tropical Storm Alex gained strength and appeared on track to become a
Category 3 huri Category 3 hurricane before it makes landfall later this week.
Forecasters said the storm's Forecasters said the storm's
path could push oil from the path could push oil from the
massive Gulf oil spill farther inland.
Alex was swirling through the Gulf of Mexico with winds of $60 \mathrm{mph}(95 \mathrm{kph}$ ) on a path that would take it very near the
Mexico-U.S. border sometime Mexico-U.S. border sometime
Thursday, said the National Thursday, said the National
Hurricane Center in Miami, Hurricane Center in Miam,
Florida. The storm is expected to become a hurricane Tuesday, and could build winds as high as 120 mph ( 193 kilometers) by
Wednesday. Tropical storm-force winds
extended up to 70 miles ( 110 kiextended up to 70 miles ( 110 ki -
lometers) from the storm's center Monday, and Alex was moving slowly to the northwest.

inland and hinder operations in the area, Stewart said early Monday.

Alex caused flooding and mudslides that left at least four people dead in Central America over the weekend, though Belize
and Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula and Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula

It made landfall in Bel on Saturday night as a tropical the Yucatan Peninsula. Mexico's northern Gulf coast braced for heavy rains, and
forecasters said precipitation from Alex will keep falling on southern Mexico and Guatemal until Tuesday, raising the pos sibility of life-threatening flood and mudslides.
"It is a fact we are going to
