Budget Tactics Prove Need For 'Truth In Government'



Delaware who has uncovered many irregularities in Government-is a man of rare courage in politics. He now has undertaken in a speech to the Senate to prove that the Administration figures given to the public about the budget.

The Delaware Senator calls attention to the fact that President Johnson in his "State of the Union message asked for legislation to provide "touth in packaging" and "truth in lending." Mr. Williams says that what is even more necessary is "truth in Government

THE AMERICAN people perhaps do not understand as yet that the Federal Government is collecting this year from corporations much of what it would normally have collected next year, and that, under an accelerated program, the Government for at least three years will be collecting more than 100 per cent of the taxes actual-Is owed for a given calendar year by corpora-

The Senator says that the withholding tax ac coloration for individuals would bring in \$400 million in the next fiscal year. He adds. Stated otherwise, this is the same as borrow Ing on next week's salary to pay this week's grocers bills and that is exactly what it is

"I SAY THAT a program of truth in Government is needed. The American taxpayers have a right to know whether the labels being put on the Government's financial package are accurate, true descriptions, because based on the Treasury Department's own figures, the estimated deficit for fiscal 1967 is not \$1.8 billion, but \$9.2

"In the President's message a further acceleration of the corporate tax payments was recommended If Congress accedes to the President's request the Government will collect in fiscal 1967 an additional \$2.2 billion in taxes from the corporations. This is not counting increased taxes to be received from the reinstated telephone and automobile taxes. I am speaking new only of the accelerated corporation taxes under any extensive broadcasts on the air anywhere.

\$1 billion extra of the corporate taxes into fiscal 1966 and into fiscal 1967, another \$3.2 billion

The Delaware Senator also points out that the Government, by taking away a certain amount has resorted to sleight-of-hand tactics in the of the content of silver in coinage, will be able to credit itself with receipt of \$2.5 billion in the next fiscal year over and above what it would have received if the silver had not been commandeered by the Government. This extra money, he says, is of course a non-recurring revenue. but is being included as though it were additional or continuing revenue

Senator Williams also reveals that the Commodity Credit Corporation, which handles agricultural commodities owes the United States Government more than \$12 billion, but has assets much less and shows a deficit of \$5.9 billion. He argues that this actual loss "has not been faced by the Administration in its budgetary requests" and that "a truth-in-Government policy would correct this misleading information.

SUMMING UP the present financial status of the Federal Covernment, Mr. Williams declares The deficits of the past five years alone have exceeded the total cost of all Government expenditures during the five years between 1914 and 1919, a period which included the total cost

Senator Williams insists, moreover, that trustfund receipts "are in no way to be confused with the administrative budget," and that to quote such figures as an indication of a balanced budget "is misleading and does not represent truth in Government

SENATOR AIKEN of Vermont, one of the liberal Republicans, commented later that Senator Williams' speech would probably have been more effective as the Republican "state of the union message" than what was given other television on Monday, Jan. 17, as the party's response to the President's televised broadcast Strangely enough what was said by Senator Williams in his speech to the Senate got very little attention in the press and wasn't the subject of

Lady Bird, Of Karnack, Texas Would Enjoy Visit To Karnak

Johnson of Karnack, Texas, realizes her lifelong dream to visit this ancient village and temple (for which her hometown was named but misspelled) she will be able to turn back the clock 3,500 years in a day.

To reach this storied capital of the Pharaohs she can fly Pan American jet non-stop to Paris, switch to a United Arab Jet to Cairo and a prop-plane to Luxor; then ride a donkey, camel or horse-drawn carriage the remaining few miles

THE U. S. FIRST Lady should feel at home in this spot over which Ramses II and Queen Nefertari once reigned. The overflowing Nile and stark desert hills are oddly reminiscent of the rampaging Pedernales River, the cactus and caliche hills of the LBJ Ranch country.

Moreover, Karnak's great obelisk erected by Queen Hatshepsut 1,500 years before Jesus of Nazareth's day will remind her of the view from the White House, since the Washington Monu-

ment is a latter-day copy of it. An amateur archaeologist who has amassed a sizeable collection of artifacts, Lady Bird could have a field day at the vast temple dedicated to the sun god Amon-Re, watching the galabia-clad workmen dig in its recently discovered Avenue

REAUTIFICATION IS occupying today's Egyptians, just as it is Mrs. Johnson. When the Nile is harnessed by the High Aswan Dam later this year, it will no longer flood the countryside or feed the sacred pool at Karnak temple. The dam which the Russians helped finance after we declined will furnish much needed power. Thus, hydraulic pumps will maintain the water level

of the pool, and make the nearby desert bloom. There are other striking similarities between the United States and the United Arab Republic. Just as Cong. Lyndon B. Johnson once fought for rural electrification, so President Gamal Abdel Nasser is erecting vast power lines throughout the length of the verdant Nile Valley and across desert wastes that will soon produce three

Like LBJ. Nasser is encountering some headaches in his war on poverty. Across the Nile from Karnak in the Valley of the Kings, the Egyptian Government built spanking modern houses for the poor who live in miserable huts around the ancient tombs. The new houses stand vacant, however, because the local Arabs would rather stay in their archaic abodes, and carry water in jugs on their heads.

The once-rich landowners, now left with no more than a hundred acres each, are naturally disgruntled, but possibly not more so than the landed gentry of England who are on their uppers because of confiscatory taxes.

While America tries desperately to lure more foreign tourists to ease our balance-of-payments position, sunny Egypt surges with European tourists and new hotels are being completed at the rate of nearly one a month.

THESE NEW hostelries have up-to-date plumbing and breathtaking views of pyramids, pharaoic tombs, desert grandeur and the not-so-blue Nile. Egyptian express trains are cleaner and more comfortable than those which ply the Eastern United States, and Nile steamers are a boon to

The dignified reserve of Egyptian teen-agers is a welcome change from juvenile delinquents. The only beetle haircuts belong to tourists. Universities are booming, and U.S. Ambassador Lucius Battle is recommending that U.S. counterpart funds be used to expand American University in Cairo, which President Nasser's daughter

HERE AT THE site of ancient Thebes, where once a succession of Pharaohs ground a half-million subjects beneath their heels to build bigger and better tombs, it is possible to visualize a new Egypt one day arising from the arid sands.

Recent oil strikes by two American companies should boost the struggling economy, and completion of the high dam will increase the arable land by a third. Hope springs again in the valley to which Israelites once fled to escape famine.

Movers' recent patronizing remarks about Washington journalism perhaps come naturally to a still callow White House flack who has been reading his own press clippings. Moyers has bolstered reports that he may

depart his present post- probably to walk across the Atlantic Ocean- by these pot shots at his hitherto admiring Boswells. His utterances have the flavor of a man who has been promised better things by Lyndon Johnson and thus may safely unburden himself of churlish thoughts about those from whose attention he earns his

IF MOYERS has been quoted correctly, a circumstance he may deny, he has suggested that the press has made a "circus" out of Presidential press conferences. He is also reported to have complained that many of the questions asked are stupid, and that a lot of Washington reporters are "very poorly informed."

I must wrack my memory to recall what press conferences Moyers refers to. Johnson has had only one regularly scheduled meeting with the press since August and, given the state of the world, it seems longer. I admit that some reporters need only greasepaint to qualify as clowns, but the atmosphere at these meetings is provided by the White House and consists mostly of television lights, scaffoldings for cameramen and a general scurrying of Johnsonian flunk-

SURE, SOME of the questions asked are stupid-almost as stupid as some of the utterances of a gathering of politicians, from Lyndon Johnson down. And if the press is "very poorly informed," then it would seem the business of Bill Moyers' administration to dispel its ignorance. It is a day's work to get the answer to a simple question from a White House inmate, and Moyers and some of Johnson's other resident geniuses are derelict at returning phone

But, as I noted above, the press is at least partially to blame for this state of affairs. Ever since this boyish paragon took over as Johnson's press agent, he has been trumpeted in newspapers and assorted penny dreadfuls as the answer not only to good White House press relations but also as the kid who will stamp out cancer, acne and halitosis. Time magazine has called him "a quick, incisive analyst and brilliant administra-And the New York Times' Tom Wicker should want to bite off his tongue for committing a Harper's piece titled "Johnson's Good Angel," a mash note he wound up by describing Moyers as "a Texas-size man in his great talent." Reading those effusions, Johnson must have been tempted to set the dogs on Moyers to prevent a

AT ANY RATE, the job of a White House press secretary is to stay on reasonable good terms with his adversaries, the journalists, and recently there has been none of the "quick, incisive analyst" or "Texas-size-talent" in Moyers' smarty-pants cracks about them. Even Lyndon Johnson, whose skin is paper-thin, tries to be nice to these people, because they go to press so often.

Jim Hagerty, who was often irascible and sometimes pugnacious as Eisenhower's image keeper, once complained about a magazine piece that made him look too nice. "Hell," he growled,

"what if I started believing that stuff?" Hopefully, it is not too late for Bill Moyers to renounce the theory of divine right. He is a smart boy and basically a pleasant fellow, but he was not born in a manger.

today's Massachusetts Democratic party and the rising tide of the Republicans there.

THAT TIDE is strengthened by the fact that the Republican Senate nominee (to replace retiring Sen. Leverett Saltonstall) is certain to be Atty. Gen. Edward Brooke, a champion Massa-

chusetts vote-getter in two statewide races. Brooke, a liberal Republican who wants to be the first Negro in the U.S. Senate since Reconstruction days, is far ahead of tough, able Mayor John Collins of Boston, a lone wolf Democrat, in the polls. That's not all that worries the Democrats. Although Collins has been an exceptionally good Mayor, he has accumulated an exceptionally large number of enemies.

THE DEMOCRATIC position is even more cheerless in the important race for Governor (where the term has just been raised from two to four years). The polls give Republican Gov. John Volpe a towering lead over the probable Democratic nominee: Edward McCormack, nephew and pride-and-joy of Speaker John McCormack. Eddie McCormack's chief competitor for the nomination Kenneth P. O'Donnell-one of President Kennedy's top aides-is getting nowhere. O'Donnell's failure to break through for Governor makes it possible for O'Brien, a fellow member of the JFK Irish Mafia, to run for Sena-

The pros backing O'Brien are banking on the long-shot hope of organizing the convention for an O'Brien endorsement, without any active campaign on his part.

THEIR ARGUMENT for O'Brien: as a member of President Johnson's Cabinet and with a long, close association with the Kennedys, he would run much better against Brooke than

For Sen. Edward M. (Teddy) Kennedy, the Democratic party's tribulations today are beyond his control. A year ago, after his re-election by more than a million votes (a record), Kennedy let it be known that he planned a very active role in the state party (unlike John F .Kennedy, who avoided the intrigues of Massachusetts poli-

BUT TEDDY Kennedy still has not filled that role Every Democratic candidate wants a Kennedy endorsement, but any nod he gives would alienate large blocs of Democratic voters

McCormack poses a special problem. Having knocked off McCormack in his first Senate race in 1962. Kennedy is unwilling to make any anti-McCormack gesture this time even for old

Besides, Kennedy has established a close relationship in Washington with Speaker McCormack, who has helped him out in legislative fights. Senator Kennedy has similar inhibitions about

the Senate race. John F. Kennedy opposed Collins for Mayor in 1959, but Collins won anyway. Teddy Kennedy is naturally hesitant to take a public position against the Democrat opposed by his brother seven years ago.

IN GENERAL, despite potentially great political influence in Massachusetts, Kennedy has been unwilling to referee the intraparty dogfight. Even today, if Kennedy said the word, he probably could swing the Senate nomination for O'Brien. But like most politicians in Washington, he's finding it impossible to be an absentee

Thus the quiet missionary work for O'Brien is being planned by others and in an aura of desperation rather than confidence.

IRS Hours Need Look



WEST LAKE, La.-Now that President Johnson has approved an expansion of the nation's postal service, with the staggering of work shifts to provide an increase in hours and days when the windows stay open to serve the public, perhaps he will give some attention to the same problem in Internal Revenue Service offices throughout the land.

There is a great similarity in the two situa-

In May of 1964, the post office window hours and parcel post delivery service were cut back in thousands of post offices as an economy meas-

AS A RESULT, people who work for a living found themselves stymied when it came to picking up mail or packages at the post office window. It was only opened during the same hours and days when they were at work. How much money was saved by the economy

move has never been clearly established, but it works an incredible hardship on hundreds of thousands of people. And if it had not been that some of the postal employes blinked at the rules a little and worked overtime to help out their friends and neighbors, it would have been much

FINALLY AFTER the situation was reported by newsmen throughout the country, the President took action the other day. Service hours at the windows will be increased and parcel post delivery service will be restored to its former six-day-a-week status in thousands of cities.

This does not necessarily work any major hardship on the postal employes. It does mean that some of them may have to come to work an hour earlier and quit an hour earlier, while others will start work an hour later and stay an hour later. But most working people in other walks of life take that sort of routine for granted.

NOW THE question is: Will the President take a good look at the same problem in the IRS offices in thousands of cities?

Those offices publicize the fact that they are willing to assist and advise citizens in making out their income tax returns-and it is approach-

ing that time of year again. But the problem is how do you get that assistance and advice if you are working on the job the same hours that the offices are open?

A WORKER in one of the many petro-chemicals plants in this area put it in these words the

"I want to get my income tax return out of the way early, but I need some help on it. And I The office is only open the same hours and

days when I have to be at work. That means I have to take a day off and lose a day's wages to get their help. The only other choice I have is to go to a private tax expert at night or on the weekends

"Either way, it costs me money that I can't afford to lose. It seems to me they could arrange it so I could go in to see them before work or after work.

ACTUALLY, A little investigation showed the situation was even worse than he thought. Some of the Internal Revenue offices only have their assistance service available as little as one day a week. It is difficult to find out how general this practice is, but certainly the assistance program is not serving the purpose for which it presumably was intended.

Perhaps the President would like to check into that situation.

Early Sowing

REP. HENRY B. Gonzalez of San Antonio has introduced his own "right to work" legislation Gonzalez' bill is an amendment to the 1946 Employment Act, which officially elevated full employment as a national goal and created the Council of Economic Advisers. It would add a congressional declaration that the federal government should insure every member of the labor; force a job, whether the job be in private industry or government.

The congressman explains that such insurance is necessary because "if a man is not economically free he's really not free at all." Few of us taxpayers would argue this point.

Questionable is the congressman's contention that the federal government has the responsibility indeed, the ability-to "insure" a job for every American that wants one. We had always thought Washington was under a constitutional directive to insure men that they would be free from undue government restriction so they could seek their own private economic freedom.

Government is a political creature of the people. The people can guarantee its existence, but it can guarantee nothing more than their freedom

Government can insure other freedoms for a portion of its citizens, but to do this it must restrict the freedoms of the rest. If the state insures a man's right to a job by hiring the jobless. it must restrict others by taxing them to pay the salaries of those it hires. The only way for Washington effectively to

insure every member of the labor force a job is to work toward freeing free enterprise from restrictive legislation that discourages individual Only those who work in athe atmosphere of a

free market can provide jobs for all who want them. Congressional decrees in January are nothing more than early sowing by men who are planning on a heap of political hay baling at harvest time.—(Dallas Morning News)

Disquieting Audit


FIGURES ON church attendance are doubtless just as tricky as any other statistics. One must exercise caution when seeking to read trends into such figures, especially when variations of only a few percentage points are involved.

Even with this caveat in mind, the Gallup Poll's 1965 audit of U.S. church attendance appears to have considerable significance as an indication of change in our national life. The most noteworthy point is that during the decade since 1955, churchgoing by American adults has appreciably declined. In 1955 and again in 1958, it was found in successive population samplings that 49 per cent of those over 21 years of age, had attended worship services in the previousseven days. The comparable figure for 1965 is

44 per cent. The import of this should not be exaggerated. Certainly it cannot yet be said that Americans, are turning away from religion. Even the 44 percent figure means that in a typical week some 50 million of us, out of an adult population of: about 113 million, go to church.

Clergymen and others most deeply concerned about the part religion plays in our national lifet will surely feel some disquiet, however, as they reflect on this apparent indication that Americans may be less interested in religion than they were as little as 10 years ago. It is evident that the churches have their work cut out for them. if they are to halt and perhaps reverse this

The quality of religious commitment is d greater importance, granted, than the statistics of churchgoing. Even so, the decline in attendance merits thoughtful attention among all who value religious belief as a central part of experience.—(Big Spring Herald)
