'New' Communities To Surprise **Grow Unchecked** On City Outskirts

NOW COMES the era of the "instant slum."
Even as taxpayers support a \$9 million urban renewal project inside Lubbock, ramshackle neighborhoods spring up on the outskirts.

Shacks and houses from in and near the urban nenewal area, in fact, help form these satellite com-

Sooner or later, the city will inherit them — and taxpayers will be stuck with still another enormous

Pig Pens, Privies, Junked Cars

Featuring pig pens, outdoor privies and junked cars, one embryonic commuity is thriving within one mile of the Lub-

bock city limits—just outside the reach of effective controls over sanitation, building standards, health or fire hazards. Old houses also have been moved from Inside the city to Carlisle and other points

After County Atty. Fred West, informed of the situation by The Avalanche-Journal, stepped forward with an offer to help. the City-County Health Unit finally is making a limited move toward control.

City and county officials throw up their hands, however, and say little can be done

City, County Wink At Problem

NEW LEGISLATION is needed, they argue, but to date they have closed their eyes or winked at the situation and have taken no steps in that direction. They just sit back and moan, "It's a mess.

Representatives of the Texas Research League, a privetely financed organization, have taken note of the problem, however, in a study now underway of difficulties facing Texas cities and of what the Legislature

Giving cities public health and welfare control over fringe areas or empowering counties to act might provide an answer. Cities now can act by annexing contiguous populous areas, but this often comes too late and, as in the case of Carlisle, is put off indefinitely.

Shacks Moved From Inside City

One commuity just northeast of the Lubbock city limits has grown to more than 60 houses, most of them shacks moved from inside the city, within the last year.

Residents of the Roosevelt School District are concerned about the load this is throwing on them. They have to provide classrooms and help pay teachers for the children. Supt Marvin Williams says 43 students already are enrolled from the neighborhood, which provides practically no tax revenue to the 900-student district.

Although no subdivision plat was filed for the neighborhood, County Commissioner Les Derrick used county equipment to "drag" the dirt streets for its development. Even though saying "It is really a mess out there," Derrick explains he did so at the request of a constituent.

Land and buildings in the neighborhood have been sold by metes and bounds descriptions, some on sales contracts without warranty deeds being filed. Other shacks are rented. One family of seven pays \$6 weekly for a one-bedroom abode.

No Checks On Safety, Sanitation

SEVERAL OF the residents came from the urban renewal area, which was designed as a means of providing lowincome families a decent environment—at taxpayer expense. Untested water wells, septic tanks and privies are interspersed among the houses, hog pens and junked cars.

Small cases and other businesses have sprung up in buildings which, like those used for homes, pass no tests for structural or fire safety.

Seven owners of property in the neighborhood are being given 90 days to clean up alleged unsanitary conditions. In letters being sent out by the City-County Health Unit, the owners are requested to correct "all violations of the state sanitation code." West said he will file suit if violations are

WASHINGTON—President Johnson, nearing the major decision of whether to resume bombing of North Viet Nam, called in Democratic and Republican congressional leaders Tuesday for a highly secret discussion of the war.

Senators who are opposed to and in favor of a resumption of the raids were asked to express their views. It was not disclosed whether Johnson told them what he planned to do in this politically and diplomatically explosive situation.

Allies Told Results Are Necessary One source said the lawmakers were told mainly what allied governments had been told earlier in the day - that the U. S. could not allow the suspension of bombing to run indefinitely



LBJ Proposes Negro Woman As U.S. Judge

WASHINGTON (UPI) -President Johnson, who long has advocated more women in government, Tuesday selected the first Negro woman ever to be proposed as a U.S. district

The White House said the President will nominate Constance Baker Motley, Manhattan borough president, to succeed the late Archie O. Dawson on the bench of the U.S. District Court for the southern District of New York.

Mrs. Motley, a 44-year-old Democrat, is an attorney who has handled various civil rights

In Meredith Case Among the most notable cases she handled were suits that led to admission of James Meredith as the first Negro student at the University of Mississippi in 1962 and Harvey Gantt as the first Negro student at Clemson University

She was the second prominent civil rights leader to be nominated for a federal post by Johnson. Last fall he named Thurgood Marshall, former NAACP legal counsel, to be solicitor general.

Mrs. Motley's nomination was warmly received by civil rights leaders.

As a federal judge, upon confirmation by the Senate, Mrs. Motley would receive a salary of \$30,000 a year. She is the wife of Joel Wilson Motley of New York City, and he mother of one son.



American People Need More Power To Express Their Will

formal message to Congress, has recommended to an instant ouster by the people a basic change in the Constitution. But it is a step in the wrong direction away from the fundamentals of democracy and toward the doctrines of autocracy in government. There's nothing wrong with that part of his proposal for a constitutional amendment which would permit four-year terms for members of the House of Representatives, but it's the elimination of any Congressional election in the interim which is

For this would deprive the American people of their most important check against an arbitrary or misguided set of policies adopted either by Congress or by a President who has managed to get control of the legislative body and make it a rubber-stamp machine

AGAIN AND again, attempts have been made to do away with the American system of checks and balances. Back in 1913, the Democratic party in Congress sought to carry out its platform pledge of a six-year term for Presidents. But Woodrow Wilson, then President-elect and perhaps the most progressive of the Democratic Presidents of this century objected. In a letter to the Democratic leader, Rep. A. Mitchell Palmer, he made the same point that can be made now against a four-year term for members of the House. Mr. Wilson wrote

'Four years is too long a term for a President who is not the true spokesman of the people, who is imposed upon and does not lead. It is too short a term for a President who is doing, or attempting a great work of reform, and who has not had time to finish it.

Sooner or later, it would seem, he must be made answerable to opinion in a somewhat more informal and intimate fashion answerable, it may be, to the houses whom he seeks to lead, either personally or through a cabinet, as well as to the people for whom they speak. But that is a matter to be worked out—as it inevitably will be-in some natural American way which we cannot yet even predict."

MR. WILSON was arguing, of course, in favor of the parliamentary system which has long been in effect in Great Britain and Canada and other free countries. Elections of members of Parliament often are deferred for as much as five years, but at any time within this interval members of the majority party have been subject,

The argument made by Mr. Johnson that Congress deals with "increasingly complex problems that generate this flood of legislation, requiring members to be familiar with an immense range of fact and opinion" or that there are increased costs in campaigning is a superficial one. National legislation has always been "complex." As for the time spent by those members who frequently go back to their districts to appear before their constituents, this is not as relevant today as it used to be. The airplane makes it possible for members of Congress to spend weekends in their own districts and yet not miss any sessions in Washington.

Nor is it persuasive to belittle, as Mr. Johnson seeks to do, the value of "off-year elections" just because they sometimes attract "as much as 15 per cent fewer voters than Presidential elections." might be noted that in Presidential-election years the ballots are so confusing that the actual number of votes cast for members of Congress usually below what the totals are for Presidential and Vice-Presidential nominees. In 1964. for example, 6.5 per cent of those who voted for a Presidential candidate didn't vote for members the House of Representatives.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON overlooks the most important influence of "off-year elections." The fact that a majority in both houses of Congress can be elected from the opposite party during a Presidential term is a constant reminder to every Chief Executive that he cannot assume dictatorial powers for long and ignore the true wishes

The American people need more and not less power to express their will promptly and effectively with respect not merely to both houses of Congress but to the Presidency itself.

SOME DAY real liberals and progressives will emerge who will persuade the voters of the United States to adopt a constitutional amendment to make not only both houses of Congress but also the President immediately responsive to the wishof the people.

Four years is much too long to wait, especially when any subservient Congress and any spendthrift President can be joined together while the people remain helpless to remove from office anyone in either the Executive or the Legislative Branch of the Government.

THE STRANGEST coincidence to hit the White House in a long time was the completion on Jan. 12 of a detailed boxscore on White House security prepared by Maryin Watson, de facto White House efficiency expert.

Two memorandums, dated Jan. 12, were handed by Watson to the President last week. And Jan. 12 happened to be just one day after Press Secretary Bill Moyers sparred with reporters over our disclosure of Watson's surveillance system. The name of anybody telephoning the White House was systematically recorded by the switchboard and the logs of White House

WHAT HASN'T been reported is that Watson informed President Johnson the day after our column appeared that the telephone check was a "temporary and limited surveillance." This surveillance. Watson claimed, was necessary to tighten "security" and assure more "privacy" of communication from outside to inside the White House

Watson did not explain how taking down names of callers could ferret out security risks Nevertheless, he reported to the President that during 1965, 12,740 "suspicious" calls were referred to the Secret Service. In view of the fact that the telephone monitoring system was ordered to start in mid-October, the question arises why the recording of names of incoming callers was necessary in screening out "suspicious" calls.

AS FOR THOSE White House limousines, Watson reported that his scrutiny of the daily logs resulted in a reduction from an average of 83 daily trips to 70 daily trips, permitting a budget

savings of \$227,700 a year. With the writing of the Watson memo, the

surveillance abruptly ended. Now that a citizen can once again call friends in the White House without having his name recorded. Presidential assistants are breathing easier. They deeply though silently resented the atmosphere of suspicion created by Watson.

THE WHITE HOUSE unwittingly came within a hair of taking public sides in the rugged Democratic primary for Governor in Wisconsin between Lt. Gov. Patrick Lucey and National Committeeman David Carley.

LUCEY, THE state's highest elected Democrat and likely winner over Carley, was properly outraged. The Lawrence visit would be interpreted as a White House blessing for Carley. Lucey protested to Washington. Lawrence cancelled his visit.

The substitute for Lawrence is Sen. Eugene McCarthy of Minnesota. In 1960 McCarthy battled for Hubert Humphrey against Lucey, a key strategist in John F. Kennedy's Wisconsin primary campaign. Sen. Robert F. Kennedy of New York has already spoken on behalf of Lucey.

Dope Gets By Parents



HOUSTON-It is doubtful if 10 per cent of the parents in this country have the faintest idea how many of their children in school have been exposed to narcotics and how many of them may already be dope addicts.

Dope addiction used to be only an adult problem. Then, a few years back, it started showing up on the college campuses. Now it has descended to the high-school level, and there is no assurance that it won't eventually work its way down into the grade school.

AND NARCOTICS agents across the southern border of the land from Florida to California are frankly frustrated. Understaffed and underpaid as they are, it is trouble enough to try to stop the flow of dope traffic across those coast

But their big problem is trying to get the parents to pay attention.

Recently there have been a batch of stories about dope addiction popping up in colleges across the land. Almost without exception these stories have emanated from states far to the north of the Southern coastal and border lines where the dope actually is smuggled into the country.

THERE HAVE been cases in Oklahoma, Ohio, Michigan, New York, Massachusetts and the District of Columbia, just to name a few.

This long-distance distribution of the dope might seem senseless at first glance, but there is method to the madness. If the dope were peddled on the campuses of California, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama or Florida, for example, it would be much easier for the narcotics agents to backtrack it to

THE TRAIL would have been so short that one good tip could have told them from where it came. Then it would simply have been a matter of turning the case over to their international colleagues in the country involved.

But by the time the dope hits a Northern college campus, it may have passed through a dozen hands, and that is a long and devious trail to backtrack

THAT IS ONE of the chief frustrations of the narcotics agents. But an equally big one is the problem of parents who don't seem to know what

"They think if they keep their kids out of the bars, everything is fine," one agent said. "Actually, very little dope is pushed in the bars. For one thing, the pushers know they are liable to be recognized, and, if they are, somebody is going to blow the whistle on them-because the bar owner is not going to risk losing his license and maybe going to jail over some deal that doesn't bring him in one penny profit. Besides, in all fairness, most of them hate the dope traffic any-

THE AGENT said that the big problem is offcampus soft-drink joints and parties in the various student quarters. The dope peddlers can move fairly freely in such places.

Where are the parents at fault? Well, they give their kids far more money than they need, send them off to school and then forget about them. And even when they're home, during the holidays or Summer vacation, they let them stay out most of the night and don't even bother finding out what they have been doing until it is too late."

That's what the man said. Take it or leave it



Few Laws, No Enforcement

Even so, there apparently is no provision in Texas for controlling building standards, land use or other factors which might affect the public health and welfare on a city's

There is a law requiring land owners to plat land on which they plan outlying subdivisions — but there is no penalty clause. The same law empowers county commissioners courts to adopt an order requiring adequate rights of way, drainage, etc., but such an order has not been adopted here -and enforcement would be another matter even if it were.

Last year, the Legislature empowered any two or more local governmental units to form a "regional planning com-

mission" to make recommendations on major thoroughfares, streets, land use, water supplies, sanitation facilities and other factors "to guide the unified, far-reaching development of the area.

Here again, however, no one would have authority to enforce the recommendations outside the city limits even if such a commission were organized.

Problem Not Solved, Just Shifted

THUS, EVEN as taxpayers foot the \$9 million bill for eradicating one alum area inside Lubhock, others can spring up just outside the city—without even having to go through the process of deterioration. The problem isn't solved, just shifted.

'A substandard area just outside the city might retard the city's growth in that direction," Bob Burr, city director of planning, says. "Then, when the area eventually is annexed, the city's taxpayers have to pay the cost for helping bring it up to standard ... There should be legislation giving cities land use, health and structural controls over areas on their perimeters."

"Existing regulations limit our authority in unincorporated areas," according to Walter Breedlove of the City-County Health Unit. "We need stronger laws."

Few Laws-Fewer Suggestions

"A very few of the houses in these outlying areas came from within the urban renewal area," H. O. Alderson, UR director, concedes, "but most were moved from elsewhere in the city. We'd like to see the development of new slums stopped but we have no authority outside the bounds of our

Houses condemned in the urban renewal area are demolished. Alderson says. Some structures nonetheless have shown up later in the outlying communities.

"We don't have the authority to control public health, safety or welfare in such areas," County Judge Rod Shaw "There ought to be some way for someone to keep slums from being developed but I don't know of any."
