Bronte named 'Independence Community'

A momentous occasion took place at City Hall in Bronte on Tuesday afternoon, September 4, when Bronte was designated a Texas Independence Community in preparation for Sesquicentennial celebrations in 1986.

J.T. Henry, newly appointed Mayor of Bronte, opened the ceremonies by welcoming Mr. Lee Storey, program officer of the Texas Sesquicentennial Commission in Austin, to Bronte, "the mini-metropolis of Coke County." Mayor Henry extended a welcome to all persons in attendance, including students in the fourth and fifth grade classes who were in the audience. Special guests were County Judge Aubrey Denman, County Commissioners James Tidwell and Billy Joe Luckett, city council members and Sesquicentennial committee members.

City chairman Ronnie Lee spoke on various activities in the planning for the Sesquicentennial year. Under consideration are a community wide observance of the beginning of the Sesquicentennial year in January of 1986, followed by the Coke County Fair, a 150th Texas birthday party in March, Memorial Day picnic, Coke County rodeo and fireworks presentation, Labor Day picnic, Fall Festival and Homecoming, Community Thanksgiving services, Merchants Christmas festivities and other celebrations to commem-

orate the Sesquicentennial year of 1986.

Brenda Hines, Coke County Sesquicentennial chairman, and chairman of the Coke County Historical Commission, spoke on the sister city of Bronte; Le Hunte, Australia, who is also involved in their one-hundred-and fiftieth-year celebration. Bronte has been matched with Le Hunte since it is a city in many ways matching our own. Some of the exchanges to be made between the two cities include newspapers, data and information swapping, pen-pals between school children, and the Historical Commission has purchased a Coke County history book now being published to send to Le Hunte.

Lee Storey was introduced at this point in the program, and he presented a plaque to the city containing the official seal of the State of Texas and signed by Governor Mark White, officially sanctioning Bronte. This was accepted by the mayor on behalf of the citizens of Bronte. Mr. Storey then presented Brenda Hines and Ronnie Lee with a Sesquicentennial lapel pin. An impressive flag raising ceremony followed as the Sesquicentennial Flag was raised on the flag pole at City Hall.

Although actual Sesquicentennial celebrations are more than one year away, 1984 and 1985 will serve as planning years to coordinate Sesquicentennial activities for the year 1986.

Commissioners set tax rate

Coke County Commissioners met in a special session Monday morning, Sept. 4 to work on county business.

The meeting opened with Finis Millican leading the pledge to the flag.

Minutes from the last meeting were approved as read.

Roy Blair, DPS met with the court to request the county purchase a transcriber at the cost of \$179.88 to be used by the county personnel. The request was approved by the commissioners. Blair, also, requested an air-conditioner for the county jail at Bronte. This was tabled until a later date.

A discussion was held on the legislature passed which prohibits the recovery of

monetary damages, both treble and actual, but maintains injunctive relief as the only remedy in antitrust actions against local government. The court sent a letter to Senator Bill Sims stating their support of it.

An order was passed to combine the Coke County Museum Committee and the Historical Committee.

Approved the request to purchase new curtains for the Old Rec Hall which is used by the senior citizens. The money for purchase will come from the park fund.

Approved the salary of \$26,322.00 court reporter of which the county's part will be \$1,649.52.

Set the tax rate as: general fund-27c; farm to market-10c; road bond-2c. The only

increase is to the general fund which had a 2c increase.

Adopted the county budget as presented.

Approved bills for payment and adjourned.

Commission approves application

The Texas 1986 Sesquicentennial Commission has informed the Robert Lee Sesquicentennial Committee that their application was officially approved by the Commission on August 8 to be a Texas Independence Community.

The committee was commended on the excellent groundwork it has laid for Robert Lee's Sesquicentennial celebration, and for the master plan of activities that will take place.

The Robert Lee committee was appointed by Mayor Robert Vaughan. The City Council approved the commit-

tee's master plan for activities to include the entire Robert Lee community during 1986 when Texas will celebrate its 150th anniversary as a Republic.

The Robert Lee Sesquicentennial committee met last week to plan a celebration ceremony. The ceremony will be held on October 10. Lee Storey, Program Officer for the West Texas Region, will be present to make the presentation that will officially make Robert Lee a Texas Independence Community. Robert Lee will join several hundred other officially-sanc-

tioned communities and counties and nearly 200 preliminary committees that are presently working on their participation in the statewide celebration. The local committee has planned not only celebrations and events, but projects of a permanent nature.

Alice Beaty is chairman of the local committee, Don Fields is vice chairman, and Edna Havins is secretary. Other committee members are Wm. Bill Allen, Sterling Lindsey, Reba Tabor, and Thomas Gloria. Plans are being made for at least two members of the committee to attend a Regional Workshop in Odessa on September 8.

In their second controlled scrimmage, the Steers battled an aggressive Roby squad on local soil last Friday night. The players faced a different defense with lots of

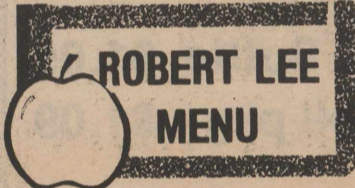

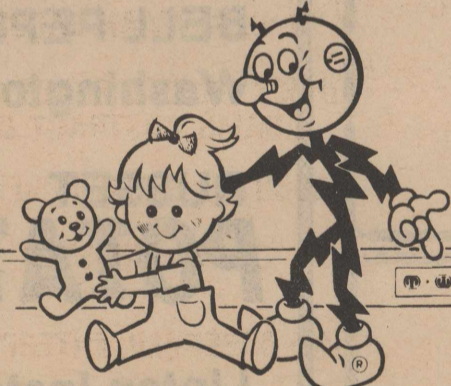
DON'T SHOOT AT POWER LINES!

Here are a few other tips on how to live more safely — electrically:

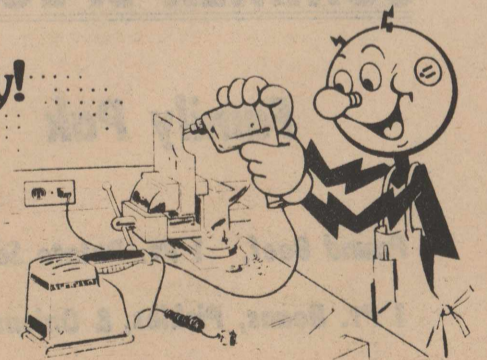
Keep Children Away from Outlets!

Volleyball team wins consolation

Thursday night, Aug. 30, was the beginning of what would prove to be a long, hot weekend for the volleyball team of Bronte High School. The Lady Longhorns met Odessa Permian in a two-team match-off. Although the game was late getting started, the Longhorns wasted no time in determining the outset of the contest. In two games, Bronte quickly dominated their opponents, finishing them at 15-5, 15-3.

The next morning it was on to the San Angelo Tournament of Super Stars. Of course, San Angelo Central was host to teams such as Snyder, Monahans, Ft. Stockton, Amarillo Tascosa, Amarillo Caprock, Seminole,

Pecos and many others.

Play began for the Lady Longhorns at 8:30 Friday morning at Lakeview gym, where they met the Lakeview Maidens. Although the Longhorns managed a win in two games, the efforts of the Longhorns seemed slow and unresponsive.

In the second round of play, the Bronte Longhorns met Lubbock Monterey. Again, Bronte pulled off a two-game win while trying to work off the rough edges. This win pitted them against the Loboettes of Monahans who managed to get past Bronte in two games, 15-5, 15-10, sending them to the consolation bracket.

This loss matched the Lady Longhorns against Lamesa's Tornados Saturday morning. At 11:00, Bronte blasted by Lamesa in an impressive two-game win allowing Lamesa only 5 points in the first game, and 4 in the second.

Finally, the Lady Longhorns had reached the trophy game, playing Midland Lee for the consolation prize. It had been a long weekend spent in hot gyms. At 3 p.m., the consolation match began and when the match was over Bronte had, for the second time this season, beaten Midland Lee for consolation honors.

School Board cuts tax rate

Refreshing news to Bronte citizens in this day of rising costs is the recent tax cut handed them by the Bronte School Board of Trustees, decreasing the rate from \$1.15 to \$1.09. This saving was done above all of the remodeling and upgrading of school facilities that took place over the summer months, as well as current and future projects in the making.

Some of the work that has enhanced the school's appearance and utility is the renovation of the band hall and repainting of the buildings, both exterior and interior. The sports facilities have not been overlooked, as fencing and parking lot expansion

has been done at the football field. The district has purchased two new vans for bus routes, and will purchase 15-20 new computers for student use.

The central office was remodeled to accommodate the business computer, and plans are underway to expand the high school library to house student computer services. A new bus parking lot for loading and unloading buses will be built on property located behind the school.

Other imminent projects will be to enclose all north windows for energy savings and re-do the elementary play ground completely.

Playground remodeling underway

Preparation work has begun on the Bronte Elementary School playground. Workmen this week are removing playground equipment and doing some dirt work to enable community volunteers to get down to serious work on workdays, September 21, 22, and 23.

Manpower and equipment of all sorts are urgently needed on the workdays. If you have any equipment to lend or can operate yourself, please contact the elementary school office. Items needed are heavy equipment such as backhoe, dump trucks or welding machines,

or any type of small equipment or hand tools. Donations of new or used lumber, any size tires (not steel belted), wooden cable spools, paint, old car/truck body, cargo net, steering wheels, 1/2 inch or larger rope and chain, large nuts, bolts, washers, nails and S-hooks will be useful. If you can furnish carpenter tools and yard tools of all sorts, please bring them to the work day.

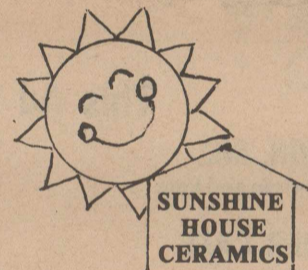
