## EMS announces course graduates

The West Coke County E.M.S. is pleased to announce the graduation of the Special Skills-EMT course held in Robert Lee from February 19th to June 4th, 1985. The course prepared the students to start intravenous lines on patients, to intubate (place advanced airway equipment) and to use MAST (medical anti-shock trousers). Students completed over sixty hours of

classroom work, fifty hours of ambulance internship and fifty hours of in-hospital time learning these skills. Dr. Terry Pulse, Medical Director for the local ambulance service, also served as clinical coordinator for this class. Marcia Johnson, RN, Director of Nurses at the West Coke County Hospital and Rod Gardner, RN also served as instructors. Course Coordinator was Lou

Wright, Paramedic-EMT. The Region 4 office of the Texas Department of Health tested the group on June 4th and Miss Wright was notified this week that the entire class passed the exam and will be certified as EMT-Specially Skilled or as they will sign reports EMT-SS. 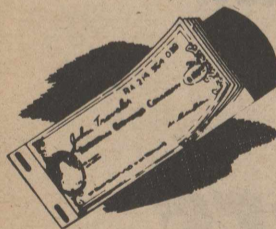
