Museum opening planned for first

Coke County Historical Committee met in its regular third Monday meeting Nov. 18 with 12 members attending. The County Commissioners met with them for part of the meeting.

Plans were discussed concerning readying the museum for regular opening days by the first of the year, or as soon thereafter as possible. Each downstairs room is to be furnished so as to display articles appropriate for pioneer living quarters.

Brenda Hines, chairman of the Historical Committee, volunteered to head up a group to furnish a dining room. Cynthia Turner and assistants will arrange a kitchen. Bobbie Allen's group will prepare a bedroom, and Jeffie Roberts will have help in arranging the lobby. Volunteers are needed to form these committees. Upstairs rooms will be arranged after the first floor is completed.

Those families having items appropriate for the rooms mentioned are invited to loan or donate them for display. Accurate records of items and donors and lenders are kept. Articles can be returned upon request from families involved.

The Committee is still in need of volunteers to take the job of cleaning the backyard and preparing it to house farm and ranch equipment which is too large to put inside the building.

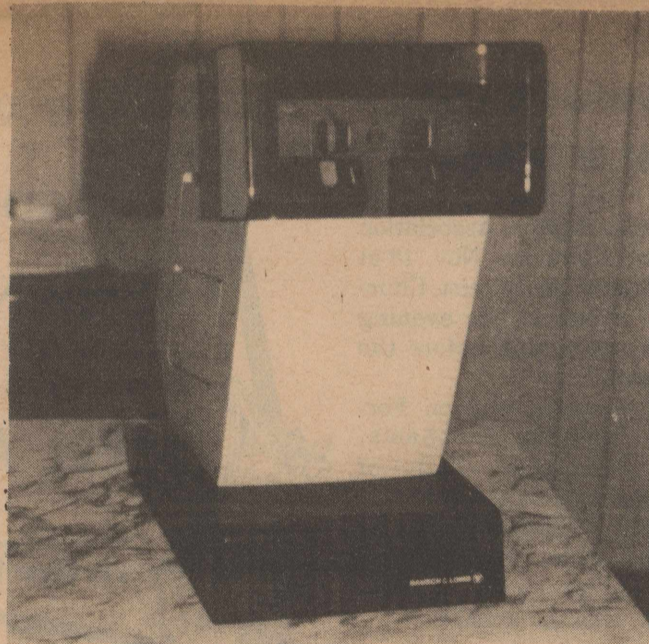
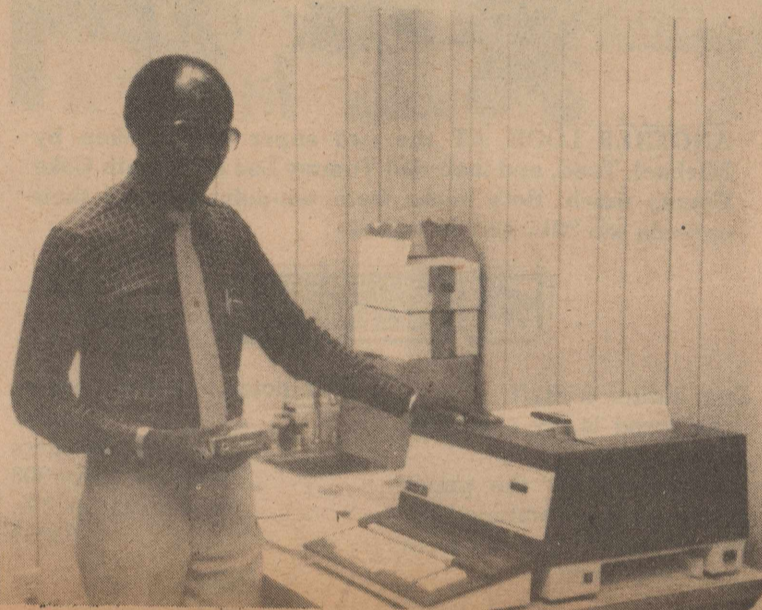
Cash donations and memorials will be appreciated. Coke County Museum can be an asset worth County-wide effort.

Western Musical

Mark your calendars now! Thursday, Dec. 5, will be the date for the monthly Country-Western Musical. It is held the first Thursday of each month at the new Rec Hall in Robert Lee at 7:00 p.m. and features area musicians.

Come to the community gathering, (admission is free) and visit with your neighbors who enjoy homemade country music, too.

COKE COUNTY RESIDENTS are very fortunate in that the West Coke County Hospital, along with Drs. Pulse and Hamamcy, have teamed up to provide county residents the most advanced technology available in the field of medicine. In the top photo, McDonald Pinder, field representative with International Medical Corporation, displays the latest in cardiac technology. The instrument on the right is an ambulatory ECG Analyzer, which is used in conjunction with the ambulatory recorder, held by Pinder. The way this new piece of equipment works is that the patient straps the recorder to his body for a period of 24 hours. The recorder contains a cassette tape which monitors all cardiac activity during this 24 hour period. At the end of the time period, the patient brings the recorder back in to the doctor's office, and the analyzer takes the information from the cassette, and prints a complete record of all the activities of the patient's heart during this time period. According to Dr. Hamamcy, the new equipment is particularly useful in diagnosing patients with intermittent cardiac symptoms, and if a patient has specific symptoms such as chest pains, discomfort, etc., the patient can make a notation of the time this occurs, and the results of the ECG printout may be monitored for this specific time period. In the bottom photo, the new vision tester is displayed. This new piece of equipment was purchased with funds left over from those raised for the new fetal cardiac monitor. This piece of equipment, as the name implies is a complete eye examination, diagnosing diseases of the eye, including visual activity, color-blindness, squint, depth perception, and visual fields. It is an important piece of equipment for all county residents, but it is especially useful for students who may have unknown vision problems, and for those who lose vision due to age/or disease factors. Drs. Pulse and Hamamcy invite your questions and discussion concerning these new medical tools, and urge you to take full advantage of their usefulness to your good health.

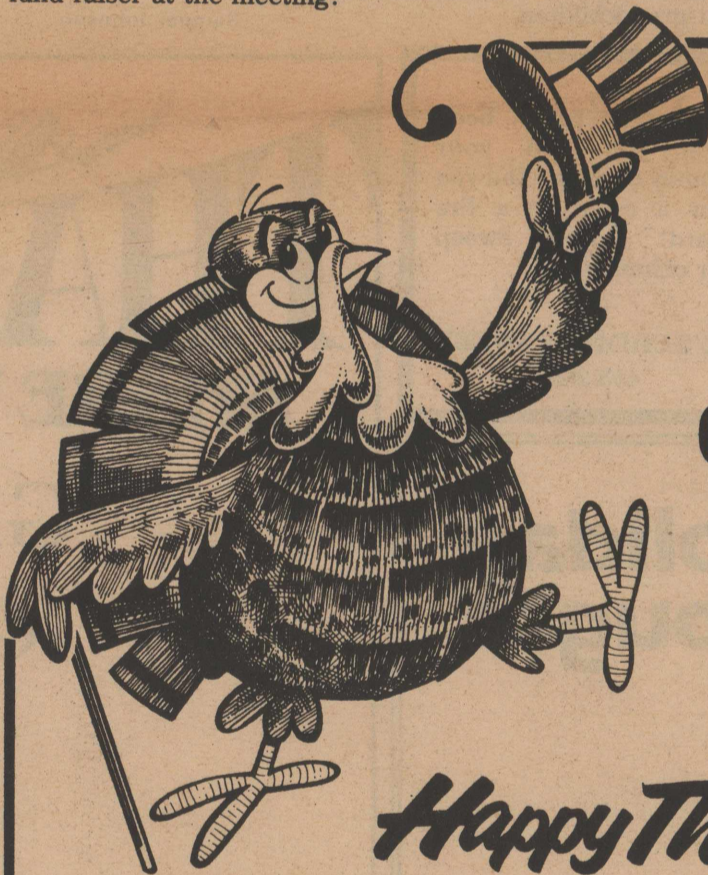

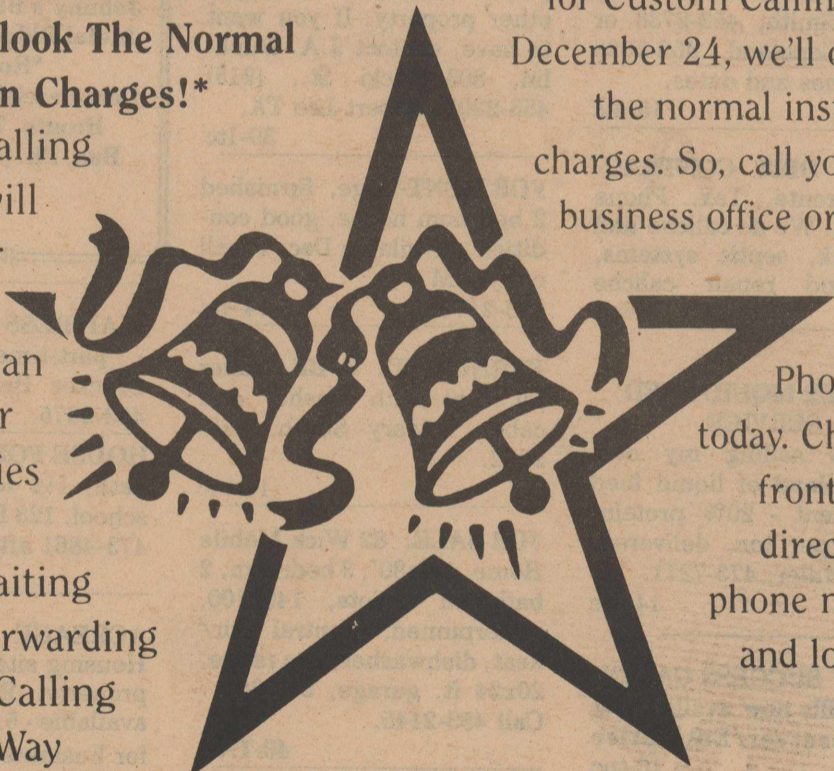
