Stenholm discusses current issues

U.S. Representative Charles Stenholm was greeted by what could only be termed as a sparse turn-out during his visit in Bronte and Robert Lee last week. The stops in Coke County were part of a larger tour of the 17th District, which included speaking engagements and question and answer sessions in Paint Rock, Ballinger, Bronte, Robert Lee, and Sterling City.

The sessions were very informative for those in attendance. The leader of the "boll weevils" (those conservative, democratic, primarily southern legislators who supported President Reagan's conservative economic policies, discussed the upcoming budget proposals, social security, veteran's benefits, and the two farm bills being considered by Congress.

Concerning the budget proposals, Stenholm stated that despite problems with the legislation, he would support the Gramm-Rudman-Hollings Balanced Budget Amendment, that is currently being formulated in the U.S. Congress. Stenholm did state that, "we are going to face some really difficult choices if we don't deal with the issues." He also said that there was about a 50/50 chance that President Reagan would veto the Gramm-Rudman legislation due to the proposed cuts in defense spending.

Regarding farm legislation, Stanholm stated, "My judgement is that we will have a farm bill. You are

going to see a more marketoriented program with lower-interest loans. Wheat farmers will be a little more competitive in the world market than we are today." He further stated, "You are going to see a very strong conservation section in this farm bill, a conservation reserve to take 20 to 30 million acres of less productive, more highly-erodible land out of production permanently and put in permanent grass and/or trees. That is going to be significant to us on our supply management part of the farm bill."

The representative also predicted a "complete reformation" of the farm credit system, which will become more of a regulatory-type agency, and more closely akin to an FDIC-type agency.

Concerning the summit conferenct between President Reagan and Soviet Premier Mikhail Gorbachev, the congressman indicated that "both houses (of Congress) agree that it is a good sign that both sides are talking to each other instead of at each other."

Stenholm related also that the 99th Congress will be in session until Dec. 13, deliberating on the budget deficit reduction amendment, and tax reform. President Reagan has indicated that the federal deficit is the top priority item in this session, and Representative Stenholm said this area would be one of the first to be dealt with by the legislators.






