Nine days of intermittent rains have spoiled Coke County residents-- we expect it now! The benefits are endless; West Texas never turns down a rain. Although

some cotton is needing some sunny weather and milo is suffering, most folks don't mind fixing water gaps and getting muddy.

Bronte has reached about 15 inches with Blackwell counting about the same. Robert Lee and the western part of the county has measured about 12 inches.

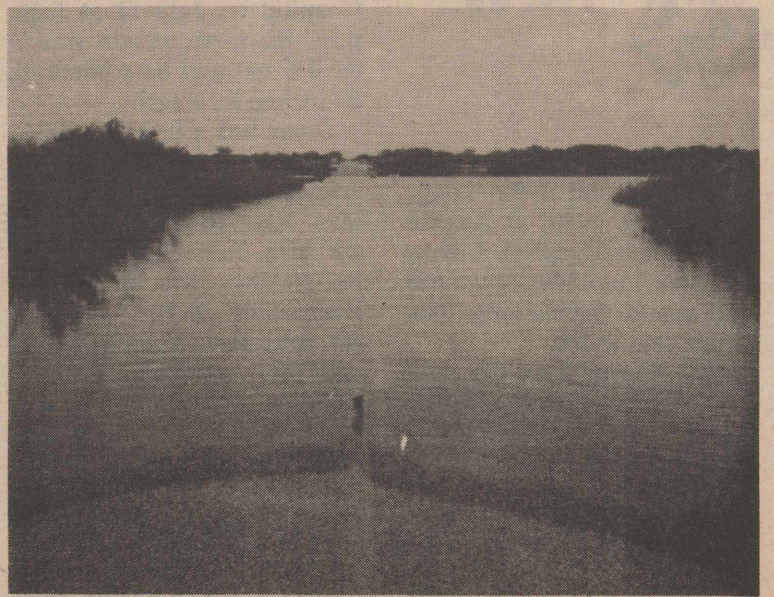
Lake Spence has gained over 3 feet of water and Oak Creek is running 1 foot over the spillway. Both are still catching water. Mountain Creek Lake has sent water over the spillway three different times during the rains.

Temperatures remain cool but plenty of warm weather remains for fall grazing to grow and farmers are anxious to finish their harvest and plant small grains, but no one wants to rush the end of the good rains.

Lightning ignites vent pipe

The morning of September 1, lightning set fire to an oil tank on the Willcockson ranch seven miles south of Robert Lee. The Robert Lee fire marshal was called but the department is not equipped to extinguish oil fires.

The San Angelo Fire Dept. was called and arrived within minutes, about 9:24 a.m. and extinguished the fire. There was no damage as the oil in the half-filled tank had not caught fire. Only the vent pipe (gas) on the top of the tank was blazing.
