Queen and Miss B.H.S.

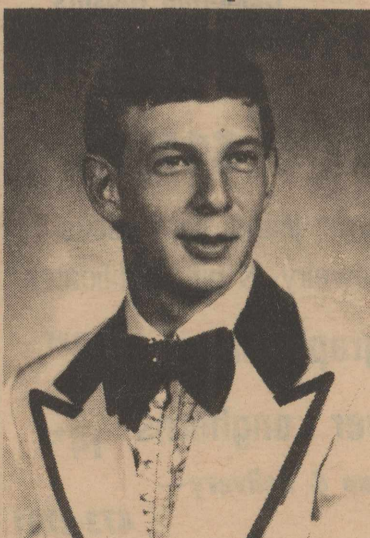

Mrs. Gilmore was born August 12, 1936 in Robert Lee. She was a graduate of Robert Lee High School and attended San Angelo College (now Angelo State University). Serving for 2 years as a deputy in the clerk's office in Coke County. She also held accounting and secretarial positions in San Angelo, Midland, and Abilene.

She moved to San Angelo in 1969 and was appointed to the San Angelo city secretary post in 1974, holding that position until her death. San Angelo city manager Stephen Brown attributed Mrs. Gilmore's success in her position to being endlessly efficient, her ability to work with people, and her cheerful outlook, an attitude which endured throughout her long bout with cancer.
