## Super Tuesday voter turnout nets over 50%

Super Tuesday in Coke County netted over a 50% voter turnout, estimated county clerk Ettie Hubbard. A total of 1101 voters from the Democratic Party went to the polls, while 80 Republicans voted. County voting strength numbers 2, 073 Registered voters.

Local interests ran high in county races, overshadowing Texas and national races. County Commissioners match-ups went: Precinct I, George Newby, incumbent 205 to Paul Burns 153; Precinct III, Tim Millican 179, Roy Tinkler 166. Kristeen Roe was elected Tax Asses-sor/Collector over opponent Patsy Dunn 707 to 376. Unopposed were Constables Bob Fields, Precinct I, 546; Wayne Arrott, Precinct II, 285; Sheriff Marshall Millican, 942; County Attorney Bill Helwig, 836; and County Democratic Chairman Pattie Ivey, 803.

Coke County gave the nod to Democratic Presidential candidates Al Gore, 269; Mike Dukakis, 266; and Dick Gephardt, 240. Lloyd Bentsen received an overwhelming 830 votes to 174

for Joe Sullivan in the U.S. senatorial race. Rob Junell, with a county total of 736, advanced to the General Election in the state representative, Dist. 68 race. The county awarded 833 votes to popular U.S. representative of 17th district, Charles Stenholm.

Republican voters favored Presidential hopeful George

Bush with 50 votes and Pat Robertson garnered 17, with 8 for Bob Dole. In the U.S. Senate race, Wes Gilbreath had 27, Boulter 17, Fox 11, and Snead 6. Burt Terrill, candidate for State Representative, Dist. 66, gained 54 county votes. He will face Democrat Rob Junell in the November General Election.

## Chamber activities slated


Bronte's Chamber of Commerce is boosting and co-ordinating several events this spring.



## PO closing times noted

Congress has imposed budget constraints upon the Postal Service. You have seen articles and heard TV reports of the effects it is having on the larger post offices in the area such as San Angelo and Abilene. Now it is time for the smaller Post Offices to do their part. Effective Monday, March 14th, Robert Lee Post Office will be closed for lunch from 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Bronte Post Office will close each day at 4:30 p.m. instead of 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The Federal Budget Reconcilliation act requires that all Federal agencies cut their operating budgets and reduce spending. Although the Postal Service has not been a part of the Federal budget

Most of you are aware that since 1971, it has been included in these cutbacks. Keep in mind, the Postal service receives NOTHING in Federal subsidies. It is completely independent and its operating funds are derived totally from stamp sales and other such services. The impending increase in postage rates was requested during the spring of 1987 and has nothing to do with the budget cuts. It is a result of increased operating, labor, and benefits costs.

> The customers of the area were of foremost concern when deciding how best to reduce local costs. For both Robert Lee and Bronte, the hours the Post Offices will close reflect the times of day when the least business is conducted.
