Retired Maj. Newman Coley Dendy, 72, passed away at 9:30 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 13, in the Baptist Hospital in Gadsden, Ala.

Graveside service was conducted at 2 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 17, in the Robert Lee Cemetery in Robert Lee with the Rev. Fred Campbell, pastor of St. Paul Presbyterian Church, officiating. Services were under the direction of Robert Massie Funeral Home.





Former grad chairs leadership group

Melinda Wright compares the energy input of Leadership Odessa with a roller coaster.

"I'd like it to become the strongest group with the most energetic excitement in Odessa."

Wright, the assistant director of fiscal services for the city of Odessa, graduated from the 1985-1986 class of leadership training.

Now, chairman of Odessa Leadership Alumni, Wright is working with alumnae Bobbye Harper to develop an advanced Leadership Odessa program for graduates that would be more of a statewide program.

Wright, who has lived in Odessa for 10 years, said her goals for the program would be to develop more advanced networking, educational opportunities and workshop sessions for alumni. But first she wants to get more of the graduates into the association.

"If we can get the advanced training off the ground, it will help out a lot," Wright said. "It's an extraordinary pool of talent - there's no telling what the group could do."

The graduates don't walk out the door and take over the community, Wright said.

"When they first come out they're still not the core group of leaders in Odessa, but they have the potential."

Although not all of the graduates will stay in Odessa and become leaders here, Wright said they can still be a part of Odessa's future. They will be a part of the network that now reaches as far as Florida.






Askins recovers from surgery

Holiday Recipe

Toasted Pecans

1 lb. pecan halves

1/2 C. sugar

1/4 tsp: salt

2 stiffly beaten egg whites 1/2 C. butter or margarine

Toast nuts in 325 degree F. oven until light brown. Fold sugar and salt into egg whites, beat until stiff peaks form. Fold in pecans. Melt butter in 10x15-inch jelly roll pan. Spread nut mixture over butter. Bake at 325 degrees F., stirring every 10 minutes, about 30 minutes or until nuts are brown and no butter remains in pan. Cool.

Champagne corks rocketing to the ceiling may seem festive, but bubbles and wine are lost. To prevent that, there is an easy way to open a bottle of sparkling wine. Here are some tips from Domaine Chandon, the Nape Valley sparkling winery and sister vintner to France's Moet & Chandon.



opening champagne bottles.

• Place a napkin or towel over the bottle to prevent unplanned cork departures. • Unwind and remove the

wire hood. • Grasp the cork (still cov-

ered with a napkin) in one hand and the bottle in the other. Tilting the bottle away from yourself and others at a 45 degree angle, and holding it close to your body, twist the bottle-NOT the cork.

• As you turn the bottle, the pressure of the bubbles will start pushing the cork out. Keep a firm grip on the cork and gently let it ease itself out. If you keep resisting the pressure you won't get a loud popping sound, nor will you lose bubbles. The cork should come out with a discreet sigh, not a boisterous bang.



Helpful Hints On Christmas Lighting

The shimmering lights of Christmas: They seem to symbolize the happiness and hope of this special season. For many, the season is officially ushered in with the lighting of the national Christmas tree in Washington.

Your Christmas tree may not be quite as magnificent as the tree that stands outside the White House, but choosing the right kind of lighting can certainly add to its beauty. Take these tips from an expert—Frank LaGiusa of the General Electric Com-- who custom designs pany the lighting and decorations for the national Christmas tree each year:

• Plan ahead so you will have on hand the materials needed. To estimate how many standard lights your tree will require, multiply the height of the tree by the width by three. For instance a 6' by 4' tree x 3 = 72, requiring three sets of 25 lights.

• Always begin decorating a tree with lights and then add ornaments. Placing lights on the tree in a random pattern works well, but remember to step back from your work occasionally for a perspective view.

 Use a coordinated color scheme for a sophisticated look. Use complimentary colors such as red and gold, or blue and green.

 Multi-colored lights are among the most popular choices for home Christmas

tree lighting. Glow Bright from GE, for instance, gives a muted, soft effect while Cool Bright has a crisper, brighter look. Each uses five-watt bulbs. A more visually animated look is available with String-A-Long Sparkling Lights—a 35-light set featur-Sparkling ing 17 miniature bulbs twinkling in random patterns, alternating with 18 steady burning bulbs to soften the effect.

• For the very creative, lights can be used to fashion personalized holiday items. Try wrapping an old cane with red and white stripes of lights to transform it into a candy cane. Another idea is to make large stylized holly leaves with green lights, using red ones for berries.

• To prevent light sets from becoming unplugged from each other, tie a simple overhand knot at each connection to securely hold sets together.

Origins of holiday customs

The yule log is always lit with a piece from last year's log, and in many countries, wine is poured on it as a blessing.

We can thank St. Francis of Assisi for the custom of placing manger scenes under the Christmas tree. Wanting to bring the spirit of that first Christmas to his parishioners, the good saint brought animals into his church, where he placed a manger. He scattered hay about the altar, where a mother and her baby represented Mary and the Infant Jesus. The villagers loved this tableau and soon the custom of creating nativity scenes evolved from that reenactment.

The wassail bowl, where holiday toasts are customary, goes back in tradition to hundreds of years. The

The yule log has been daughter of a Germanic chieftain is said to have offered a gold cup filled with wine to her host, with the words "Waes hael hlaford Cyning," or "Be of health, Lord King." As the pracspread, those who could not afford wine used a mixture of hot oil, sugar, nutmeg and ginger, topped with toasted bread. That is how drinking to one's health became known as a toast!

The custom of gifting children at Christmas time probably originated with St. Nicholas, a bishop of Asia Minor in the 4th century. Because of his reputation for being generous - it seems the saint gave bags of gold to a poor man for his daughter's dowries - St. Nicholas was looked upon by children as the dispenser of goodies. This stately figure gradually evolved through the years into our own Santa Claus.

The practice of exchanging gifts is attributed both to an ancient Roman custom on New Year's Day, and the bringing of gifts to the Christ Child by the Magi.

Deck the halls with boughs of holly! The lively carol describes one of the oldest customs of the season. Where did it originate?

Most holiday customs have a rationale behind them, as does the practice of hanging holly.

The ancient Druids believed that holly branches protected them from evil spirits. When placed in the home, these branches provided a warm haven for the sylvan spirits. In time, the practice became associated with the holiday season.

We can also thank the Druids for the custom of kissing under the mistletoe. The ancient priests of Ireland, Britain, and Gaul regarded mistletoe as the soul of the oak, which was their sacred tree. Because the plant never touched the earth, the Druids believed it represented pure spirits. As it was a symbol of peace and good will, Druid enemies would drop their weapons under the mistletoe and embrace. This practice evolved into today's holiday custom.







'Hank' noted in magazine

following article is reprinted from the Cherokee Heritage Center's magazine. The Center is located in Oklahoma.]

Volunteers are often the forgotten heroes that make the programs of an institution work. They fill needs by providing badly needed services and skills that otherwise could not be afforded. This is the first of a series in which we will spotlight some of those who give so freely of their time and energy.

Nature provides us with many ways to mark the passing of time. The sun rises daily in the east, swallows return to San Juan Capistrano every year on the same date, Yel-lowstone's "Old Faithful" geyser erupts on regular intervals. The Cherokee Heritage Center (CHC) has its own, albeit lesser known way of noting time. At the CHC you can be sure the month of May has arrived when Henry Baker arrives. This silverhaired man, known to everyone as "Hank", is a retiree from the Sun Oil Company where he spent thirty-eight years preforming a variety of tasks in the oil patch. He never thought of retirement as a time when one should quit working. Now his skills are used to help others.

Hank is a registered Cherokee through his mother's side of the family and has always been very proud of this ancestry. He joined the Cherokee National Historical Society in 1967, and has been a member ever since. His work as a volunteer began in 1975, when the Society's Executive Director, M.A. Hagerstrand, sent out a letter asking people to contribute equipment. Hank telephoned Hagerstrand and asked if he could use free labor instead. That offer was readily accepted and soon Hank arrived with his own tools, ready to work. Besides furnishing free labor, he paid his own travel and living expenses. As a worker he can out-perform those nearly sixty years his junior. He loves to "tinker and fiddle" and searches for bad pumps, clogged sewers, leaking gas lines, and carpentry projects with the same enthusiam as a child on an Easter egg hunt.

[Editor's Note: The vided over the years cannot be measured in dollars and cents. His presence has often eliminated the need for plumbers, carpenters, painters, etc. Still, there is only so much that one man can be expected to do and the summmer season involves a great deal of preparation. Hank realizes this and recruited his own helpers. Now, a crew from east Texas joins him each spring. Finally, to complete the cycle of service, Hank has contributed artifacts to the museum's collections.

He is also very popular with the CHC staff. As a resident of the West Texas town of Robert Lee, Hank is familiar with "Tex-Mex" cooking. Each year he displays his culinary skills by preparing an echilada dinner. There are seldom any leftovers. As he prepares for departure, he tells everyone goodbye, swears that age has finally gotten the better of him and that he will not be back. So far, the only thing that ever kept him away was one year when he had two major operations. We look forward to seeing Hank next May.
