Absentee voting continues thru May 2nd

Absentee balloting remains open through Tuesday, May 2 for the May 6 elections for the cities of Robert Lee and Bronte, West and East Coke County Hospital Districts, both school districts, and the Coke County Underground Water Conservation District.

Robert Lee

Robert Lee residents will vote to fill three city council seats. Candidates for the 2-year terms are incumbent Richard Johnson, Ruth Luna,

and C. O. (Joe) Brazier. The election will be held at city hall.

Remaining on the city council are Joe Barrett and A. L. (Speedy) Braswell. Declining to run again were aldermen J. A. (Jim) Dunklin and F. W. (Pete) Prentice.

Four candidates have filed for two seats on the Robert Lee Independent School District Board of Trustees. On the ballot are incumbent Ray Aldridge, Mary Grim, Roy Epperson and Tom Lee. Mrs.

Jeffie Roberts declined to be a candidate for the slot made available with the expiration of her 3-year term. Voting will be conducted in the high school lobby.

West Coke County Hospital District has two vacancies on its Board of Directors. Terms of Joy F. Bagwell and Roy Epperson expire next month. Joy F. Bagwell is a candidate for a position, along with newcomers Kenneth Green and Randy Bessent. Epperson made the decision not to be on the ballot. That election will be held in the Coke County Courthouse.

The Coke County Underground Water Conservation District is the only county-wide election on May 6. Elected will be two directors for Precincts 3 and 4. Incumbents Fred H. McCabe Jr. and Royce Stowe are candidates for these posts. Voters in Precinct 3 will vote in the Coke County Courthouse in Robert Lee and balloting for Precinct 4 will be held in the Old Railroad Depot in Bronte.

Bronte

Eligible voters will elect two city council members. Current members of the council whose terms expire are those of E. G. (Corkey) Collins and Sharon Gibbs. Both Collins and Gibbs have filed for re-election. City Hall will be the site of the election.

Two vacancies exist on the East Coke County Hospital Board with the expiration of the terms of R. W. Blackmon and Jane Cumbie. Blackmon and Cumbie have filed application as candidates for the governing board. Balloting will be conducted at the City Hall.

Bronte Independent School District will hold an election to select three school trustees. Expiring at this time are the three year terms of Steve Kelton and Lynn Phillips. Also vacant is a 2 year unexpired term made vacant when Mike White resigned. Candidates running on the new three year term ballot are Steve Kelton and Lynn Phillips, running on the 2 year unexpired term is Richard Hembree. The ISD election will also be held at Bronte City Hall.

All polls will remain open from 7 am to 7 pm.

County logo contest slated

Coke County Historical Commission is sponsoring a County Logo Contest. Any Coke County citizen is eligible to enter the contest by creating a design that represents the county as a whole.

The logo shall be the original work of the entrant, drawn on a background no larger than 8" x 10". Use no colors, - only black and white.

The artist shall not put his or her name on the drawing, but shall put the name on a card, with address and telephone number. Place these in an envelope large enough to accommodate the drawing without folding it. Take or mail the

envelope to the office of Judge Aubrey Denman, P. O. Box 52, Robert Lee, Tx. 76945.

Assistants will place a number on the card with name to correspond with the number placed on back of the logo. Judges will see no names before judging.

Deadline for entering contest will be May 24, by 12:00 o'clock noon. Winner will be announced before school is out in both Bronte and Robert Lee. ACT SOON.

Elementary and high school pupils are urged to enter, as well as adults.

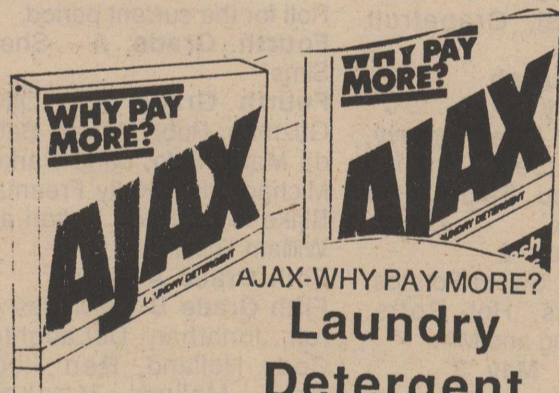

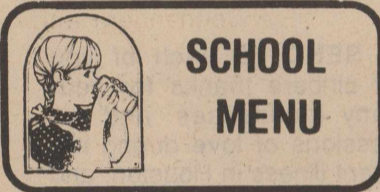

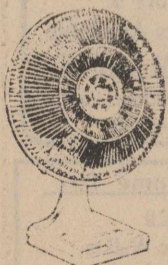

NOTICE OF ORDINANCE #243 GARBAGE-TRASH COLLECTION

Notice is hereby given pursuant to the terms and provisions of Section 52.01, Local Government Code, that the City of Bronte has adopted an ordinance, effective June 1, 1989, regarding the collection, by the City, of garbage and trash.

The ordinance defines separately, garbage and trash, and specifies containers required by residents and the general condition of such containers.

The ordinance further describes usage of disposable bags in lieu of garbage cans and the requirements regarding utilization of disposable bags in addition to or in lieu of garbage cans. The ordinance further specifies utilization of commercial containers for garbage and trash by commercial and business entities in the City of Bronte.

The specific provisions are described in the ordinance whereby the city is to designate pick up points in and about the city and further designates and specifies that the city is the only authorized agency to collect and haul garbage.

Specific charges, fees, and costs are described in the ordinance as to residential and commercial garbage collection charges and fees.

The ordinance contains specific prohibitions against burning of trash, leaves, and/or garbage in the city and specifies a fine of up to \$200 for violation of the ordinance.

Goat roping set

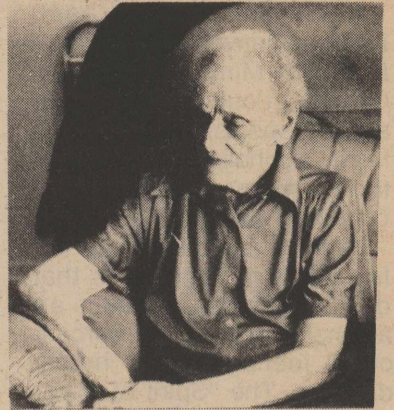

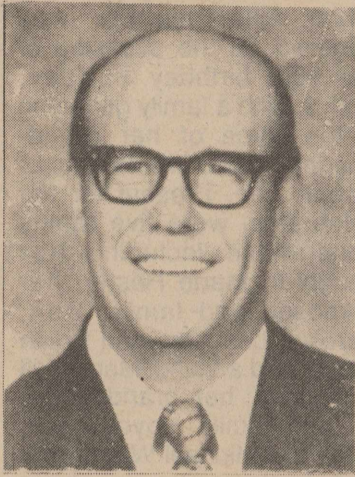
