

Four members of the Lady Longhorn track team competed at the State Track Meet this past weekend. Senior Misti Taylor, Sophomores Eboni Taylor, Angela Reyes, and Freshman Teresa Vaughn all turn in successful performances in heading Bronte to a 4th place finish in the team standings. (The top four teams in the state were all from our region - The second, third and fourth place teams in the state were all from our district.)

*Paying a tax of \$200.00 per firearm.

*Passing a complete FBI background check.

*Getting permission from local law enforcement. *Getting written permission from the

Secretary of the Treasury before taking the firearm out of state.

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE RULES AND REGULA-TIONS FOR THE OPERA-TION OF THE SANITARY LANDFILL NORTH OF THE CITY OF BRONTE, BRONTE, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT HEREOF AND FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND PRO-HIBITING UNLAWFUL USE OF THE SANITARY LAND-FILL AND TO COMPLY WITH THE RULES AND REGULA-TIONS AS REQUIRED BY THE STATE OF TEXAS HEALTH BOARD: AND RE-PEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDI-NANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND AUTHO-RIZING PUBLICATION OF THE DESCRIPTIVE CAPTAIN AND PENALTY CLAUSE HEREOF

Section 3: Penalties.


