The class members will receive their diplomas in Commencement ceremonies on Friday evening, May 26, at 8 pm. The exercises will also be

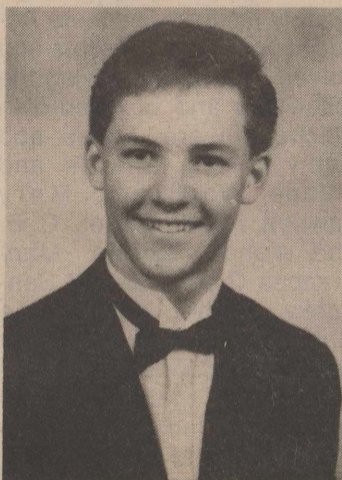

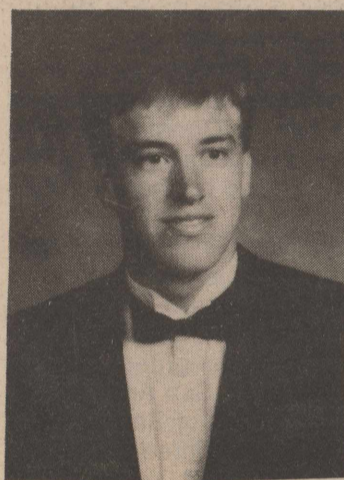

## Honor graduates posted for Class of '89

Scott Loren Ray, son of Dr. and Mrs. Philip C. Ray, has been named the valedictorian of the 1989 graduating class at Robert Lee High School. He maintained a grade average of 94.63. Scott has been active in both academic and athletic activities during his

high school years. Last year he served as a Congressional House Page in Washington and has been Student Council President as a senior, as well as other honors.

Michael Craig Lee, with a grade average of 93.85, is salutatorian of the graduating class. He has been an outstanding athlete, including last week's play on the runner-up Class A golf team at State;

High-ranking girl of the Class of '89 is Lisa Kaye Bower, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Jerry Bower. Her grade average is 93.83. A cheerleader for 4 years, she has been active in sports and U.I.L. literary events.

## Taylor brings home gold in state track

Four members of the Lady Longhorn track team competed at the State Track Meet this past weekend. Senior Misti Taylor, Sophomores Eboni Taylor, Angela Reyes, and Freshman Teresa Vaughn all turn in successful performances in heading Bronte to a 4th place finish in the team standings. (The top four teams in the state were all from our region - The second, third and fourth place teams in the state were all from our district.)

Teresa finished in 4th place in the high jump with a jump of 5'0". Teresa is still credited with the highest jump in Class A this year with a jump of 5'7".

The 1600 meter relay team of Angela, Eboni, Teresa, and Misti finished in 4th place with a time of 4:07.8.

Eboni went into the State Track Meet with the 5th best 3200 time, but knocked 18 seconds off her personal best time to earn the bronze medal. Her time of 12:02 at the state meet is also a new

school record.

Misti ran a 5:21 to earn her the title of "STATE CHAMPION" in the 1600. Her time was her personal best and it also broke her old school record that she set last year at the State Track Meet. This was Misti's third straight year to run at the State Meet. Her sophomore year she received the silver medal in the 800 and last year she was 4th place in the 1600. While Misti competed at Bronte, she was involved in setting 4 new school records (800, 1600, 800 relay 1600 relay).

Coach Tandy said he will miss Misti's leadership, hard-work and dedication but with the returning girls wanting to go back to Austin and a few girls coming up from the Junior High, look out for continued success in the years to come.

The State Track meet capped off an outstanding year for the Lady Longhorn Track team. Five new school records were set, (1600 relay, 200, 600, 3200, high jump) as well as the ladies' finishing as the runner-up team at the Regional Track Meet.

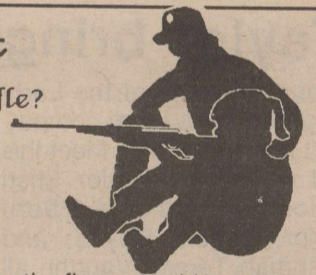

- \* Any centerfire semiautomatic firearm with a detachable magazine.
- \* Any magazine which holds ten or more centerfire or rimfire rounds.
- \* Any rimfire firearm with a tubular magazine that holds six rounds.
- \* Any shotgun which holds seven rounds.

That covers firearms owned by about 20 million Americans. If the final law passed allows you to keep any of them you will have to register by:

- \*Paying a tax of \$200.00 per firearm.
- \*Passing a complete FBI background check.
- \*Getting permission from local law enforcement.
- \*Getting written permission from the Secretary of the Treasury before taking the firearm out of state.

You should still be against this law, because it's distracting.

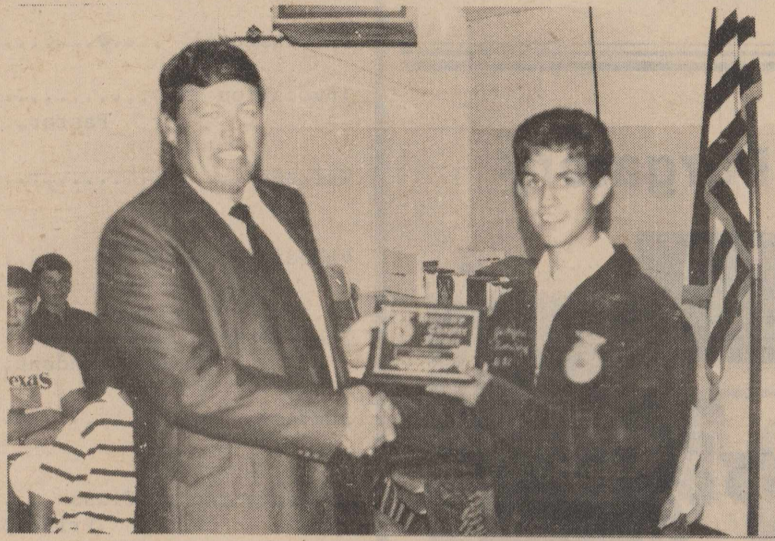

Coach Ed Poehls reported individual scoring in the State tourney as: Smith 178, Epperson 178, Tavarez 184, Lee 185, Herring 194.

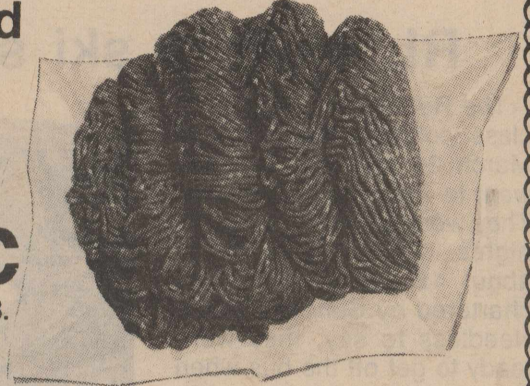

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE SANITARY LANDFILL NORTH OF THE CITY OF BRONTE, BRONTE, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT HEREOF AND FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND PROHIBITING UNLAWFUL USE OF THE SANITARY LANDFILL AND TO COMPLY WITH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS AS REQUIRED BY THE STATE OF TEXAS HEALTH BOARD; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith AND AUTHORIZING PUBLICATION OF THE DESCRIPTIVE CAPTION AND PENALTY CLAUSE HEREOF.

**Section 3: Penalties.**

Any corporation, firm, agent or person violating this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not less than \$25.00 and no more than \$300.00 Each violation shall constitute a separate offense.

**Section 4: Rates.**

  4. Pickup -- \$8.00

  7. Tires -- \$1.00 each
- NO TRANSPORT TRUCKS WILL BE ALLOWED.**

Any resident presenting a current water and/or sewer bill on which he is being charged for refuse collection who wants to dump grass, leaves, tree trimmings, and other household trash may do so twice per month at no charge.

All charges shall be collected at the entry way of gate to the Sanitary Landfill.

**Section 9: Emergency Action.**

Whereas, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation or order, good government and public safety that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore, upon passage of this ordinance it shall be effective from and after the date of this passage as made and provided by the charter of the City of Bronte, **SAVE AND EXCEPT, rate schedule which**
