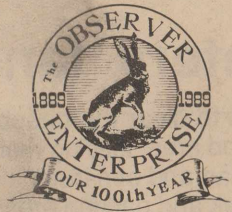

Junior Angela Reyes,

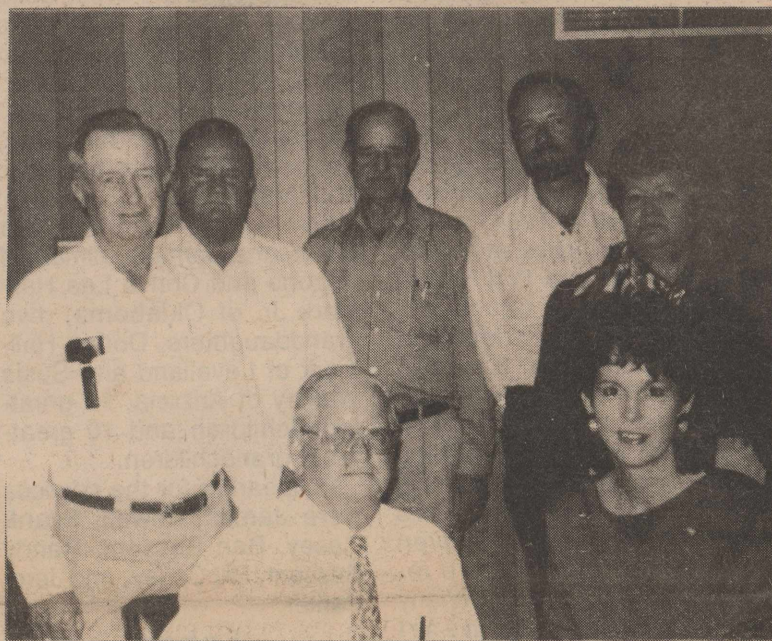
daughter of Robert & Mary Reyes, is the 1989 Football Sweetheart.

This honor was shared with Mr. Clifford Clark upon the request of Mr. Henry. Mr. Clark was informally presented his 50 year pin at an earlier date.

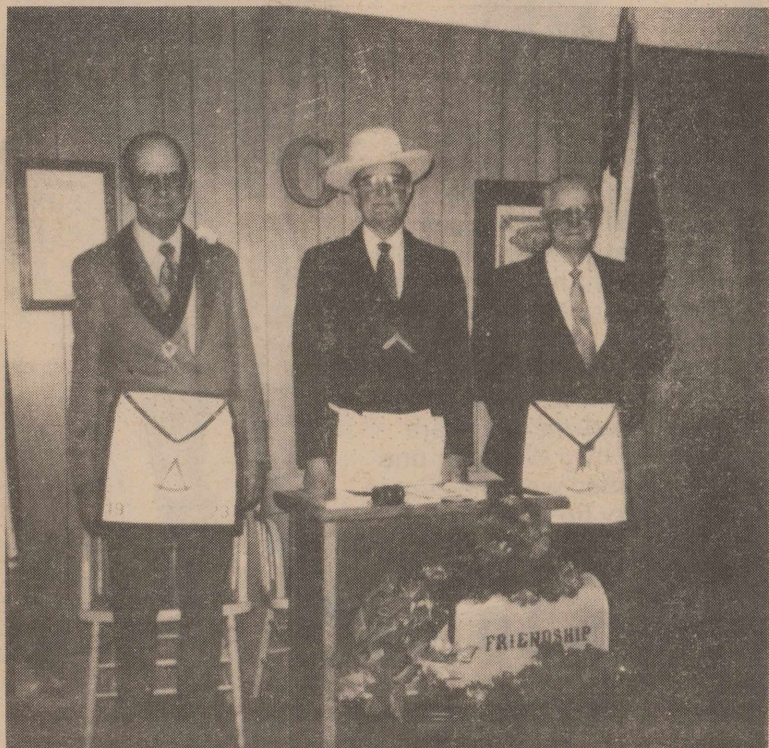
Mary Belle Hilliard presented the special music.

Carl Burton Bewick, 72, of Robert Lee died at his home Tuesday, Oct. 10. Graveside service was Wednesday, Oct. 11, in Valley View Cemetery directed by Shaffer Funeral Home. The Rev. Pamela Kilpatrick officiated the rites.

Born in San Angelo Aug. 15, 1917, Mr. Bewick graduated from Reagan County High School in 1934, where he was very active in Scouting. He was the first Eagle Scout in Reagan County. He attended John Tarleton at Stephenville for 2 years, Draughan's Business College in Abilene for 1 year, and served in the United States Navy for 4 years during World War II. He spent 35 years working overseas in seven different countries before retiring from Mobil Oil Company in 1982 following heart surgery.

Mr. Bewick married Hilda Dominguez from Barrinquilla, Colombia. Their three children, Jose, 18, and 14 year-old twins, Carla and Carlene, were born in Maracaibo, Venezuela and are now attending Robert Lee High School. Other survivors include one sister, Dorothea Wright of Robert Lee; two nieces, Dorothea Wright and Edna Lou Wright, both of Robert Lee; two nephews, Charles Wright of San Angelo and Billy Wright of California.

Chamber transfers land

The transfer of 8.12 acres of land from the Bronte Chamber of Commerce to Coke County was formally completed Tuesday night. Attending the presentation were Judge Aubrey Denman, Commissioner Billy Joe Luckett, and Chamber Directors Chester Wilson, Royce Lee, Gary Shaffer, Pat Martindale, Earlene Alexander and Susan Arrott.

The transfer of the acreage is the culmination of a long wait and much hard work by local citizens and Chamber and County officials. Funding for the purchase came from Chamber bass tournaments and a Labor Day cookout, including many hours of volunteer time and effort as well as merchant donations.


The eight acres lie to the south of the current baseball field, bounded on east by the creek. Work has already be-

gun to clear the baseball diamond area, leaving many large pecan and elm trees along the creek and parking areas.

Due to the fact that the current park bridge has been designated as historically significant but unsafe, the State will be building a new bridge entrance into the park. Approximately 1/2 acre of the newly purchased land must be used for a new approach to the bridge to be constructed. Long range plans include using the old bridge as a foot-bridge and walking exercise area, and adding additional recreational vehicle hook-ups.

Accepting on behalf of the county, Judge Denman stated, "We are pleased to be able to add this space to our county park, and we are looking forward to the opportunities it creates for recreation for our youth."

Jason Cooper and Gary Bilbrey had an outstanding defensive game.

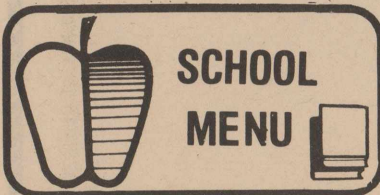
The Shorthorns have a 2-1 record and are coached by Rocky Rawls and David Tandy.
