

Coke County folks couldn't have been prouder if the kids had brought home OLYMPIC gold medals. It was talked over the weekend at the post offices, cafes, churches and at homes in the respective towns. EVERY qualifying athlete from Robert Lee and Bronte who competed in the State Class A UIL Track and Field Meet and the State Golf Tournament brought home a 1st place award.

The last three consecutive rears, the Steers had been a


RL Methodist Revival set


The First United Methodist Church in Robert Lee will host a revival beginning Wednesday, May 23 through Friday, May 25.


