Skipworth, Kristi Ann Smith, Tracy Torres, Rickie Dale Wheat and Jason Matthew Wink.

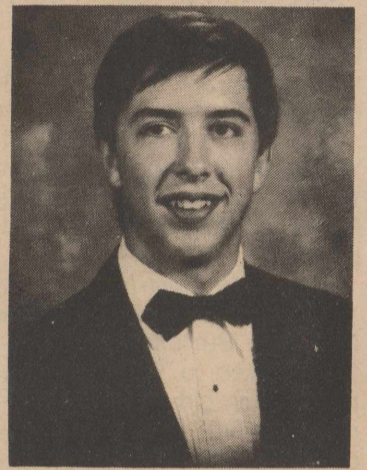

## County youth bring home GOLD!

Coke County folks couldn't have been prouder if the kids had brought home OLYMPIC gold medals. It was talked over the weekend at the post offices, cafes, churches and at homes in the respective towns. EVERY qualifying athlete from Robert Lee and Bronte who competed in the State Class A UIL Track and Field Meet and the State Golf Tournament brought home a 1st place award.

The last three consecutive years, the Steers had been a bridesmaid, but never a bride, at the state golf tourney. In a strong show of authority, Stephen Epperson, Jon Rogers, Jason Wink, Jody Tavarez and Scott Antilley changed all that when they finished at 700, 38 strokes ahead of 2nd place Lago Vista, last Friday. Thursday looked good, with the Steers in the lead by 17 strokes. Baird developed penalty trouble the first day and struggled to a 6th place finish on Friday. Wink and Rogers are the only seniors on the team; Epperson and Tavarez are juniors and Antilley is a sophomore.

Steer Lenny Jackson, a junior at RLHS, topped the Class A field when he pole vaulted 14 feet in a jump-off with the 2nd place finisher. No other vaulter from Robert Lee has ever competed at the

state level, although Robert Runnion qualified two years ago but opted to play on the state golf team instead.

Ron McCown rounded out the Steer state competitors by soaring to first place in the high jump at 6' 8" on Saturday in Austin. In doing so, he jumped his personal best and tied the school record. Only a junior, he hopes to best that next year. He literally follows in the footsteps of the co-owner of the school record, former Steer Bobby Boone. Boone is, in fact, doing his student teaching at RLHS and has offered valuable pointers to McCown.

The icing on the county's state qualifiers' cake came in the form of two Bronte athletes who had been to Austin previously. Teresa Vaughn, a sophomore high jumper, competed as a freshman last year at state and carried the high mark into competition last week. She won the event at 5' 4", then went on to compete in the 400 meter dash where she finished second at 59.1. Her personal high jump best last year as a freshman was 5' 7". Practicing in Robert Lee's high jump pit, she also benefited from Bobby Boone's experience.

Eboni Taylor, a junior at BHS, also was a repeater at the state meet. She ran last year on the 1600 meter relay

team and the 3200 meters. With her third place finish there she set the school record at 12:02 in the 3200. Last week in the grueling race, despite the terrific heat, she placed first with 12:08.9 in the 3200 meters. With only an hour elapsed, she finished 4th in the 800 meters in 2:28.3.

What gigantic efforts from these school representatives! The program will suffer losses with the exit of Robert Lee seniors Wink and Rogers, but the undergraduates have great expectations for next year.

This was the last meeting for the Diversity Club as the members voted to disband the club.

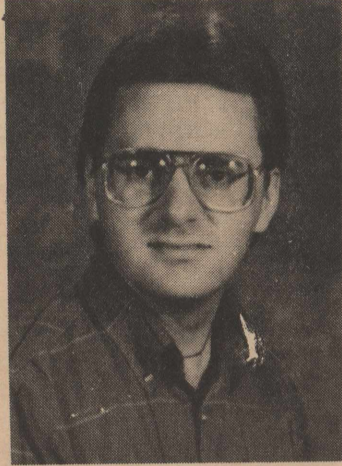

## Allen presents youth banking program

Typically, people have had to go to banks to learn about banking. However, the transition is being made. Now the banking representative assists the teacher with the technical aspects of banking.

This is evident in the VHS video cassette program, "Banking Is . . .", which the Robert Lee State Bank presented as a public service to the students at RLHS. Bill Allen, bank president, made the presentation on May 16. Receiving the unit at a presentation meeting at the bank was Sheri Millican, homemaking teacher for the school.

In making the presentation Allen said, "The program, 'BANKING IS', gives the students firsthand experience with the basic banking activities they will use throughout their lives."

"Writing a check, applying

for a loan, computing interest and using a bank's services are things most adults take for granted; we have done them all our lives. But these activities must be learned, and for many of today's students they can be foreign as any new endeavor", Mr. Allen said.

"Many adults learned banking by trial and error; but, in today's world of advancing technology, this is no longer a satisfactory solution. For instance, today check writing is as much a part of life as driving. Ninety percent of all financial transactions are made by check and the American public will write more than 37 billion checks this year. Yet, in spite of this, statistics show that less than 85% of the graduating high school seniors know how to write a check properly. So, it is easy to see that check writing is an

activity that students should understand if they are to take their places in the financial community."

"We hope our sponsorship of this program will help give students a more thorough and systematic understanding of these basic banking activities, the new services that are available, and help them in management of their personal financial affairs."

"We strongly believe that the more financially secure students become through knowledge and practice of good banking, the better citizens they become; and the better our young citizens, the better our tomorrow."

In addition, Mr. Allen, pointed out that as part of the program an officer of the bank is available for a follow-up classroom question-and-answer session and the students may be given a tour of the bank to see numerous financial operations at work.

## Davis to speak to Eighth

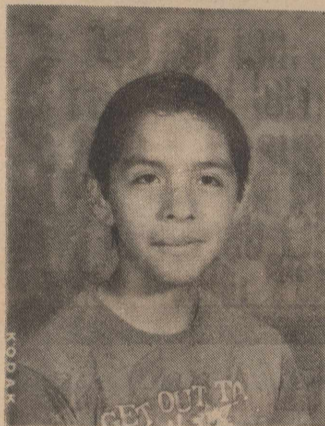

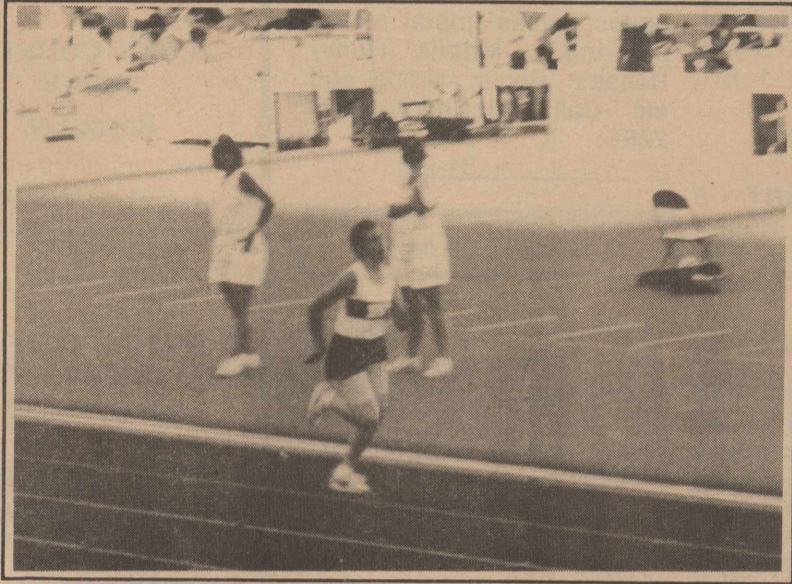

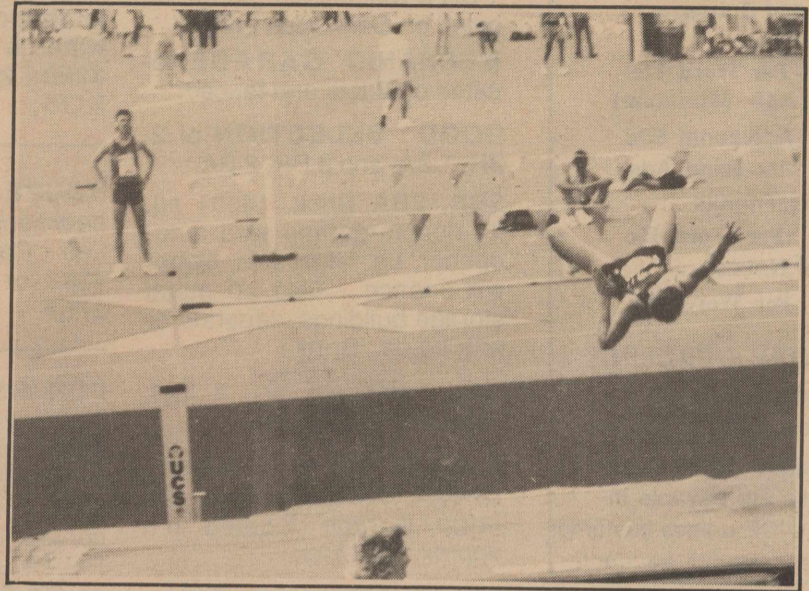
