## Candidates for elections set as filing deadline passes

The filing deadline for Coke County city councils, school districts, hospital districts, and the Coke County Underground Water Conservation District candidates passed on Wednesday, March 17, for the May 1 elections.
Four candidates will appear on the City of Robert Lee's ballot for the city council for the three openings. Council members whose terms will expire are C.O. (Joe) Brazier, Sparks Burdett, and Beth Prather. Brazier and Burdett did not file for re-election. Joining Prather on the ballot are Manuel Abalos, Jeff Eubanks, and Garland Davis.

Write-in candidates for city offices must declare and file an application with the City Secretary before 5 pm , April 1. No write-in votes will be counted unless cast for a declared cartdidate.
Two vacancies exist on the West Coke County Hospital District board of directors. Panel members Joy Bagwell and Kenneth Green chose not to re-enter the race. Declared candidates are Olene Sims, Elaine Lee, and Mary Bessent.

The May 1 election will fill two positions on the board of directors for the Coke County Underground Water Conservation District. Expiring are the terms of Fred H. McCabe,

Jr. in Precinct 3 and R. S. (Bud) Johnson of Precinct 4. One director will be elected from each of the above precincts McCabe and Johnson, the incumbents, are the lone candidates for those positions.
Candidates for the Robert Lee ISD board of trustees include Kim Hodge, incumbent Bill Burns, Steve Whiteker, and Mark Riley. They will vie for the two places on the governing panel. The term of Burns and an opening created by an earlier resignation are up for grabs.
Three candidates have filed for the two full three year term positions for Bronte ISD trustee election set for May 1. They are Ray Barnett and Wayne Coalson, incumbents, and Harold Dunn.
Also filing for a one year unexpired term are Martin DeLaGarza and Linda Tampke.
Candidates filing for Bronte City Council for two open positions are Gerald Sandusky and Pete Percifull, incum bents, Loy Wrinkle and Donald O'Banon. Also filing for a one year unexpired term is Sheri Jordan.

Two incumbents Jane Cumbie and R. W. Blackmon have filed for the two places on the ballots for directors of East Coke County Hospital District.
Elections are set for May 1.

## HOUSE FIRES

Three-fourths of all deaths related to fire in this country are from house fires. House fire deaths in Baltimore were analyzed by researchers at John Hopkins Injury Prevention Center to determine impor tant contributing factors and possible preventative measures. Researcher Susan Baker says of the fifty-five deaths in house fires in Baltimore during a three-year period, more than half resulted from fires blamed on smoldering cigarettes

Even more tragic is that thirty-nine percent of the people who died in fires blamed on smoking were not cigarette smokers. Nationally smoldering cigarettes are also the leading ignition source of house fires Ways to make cigarettes less likely to ignite a fire are being tested in order to comply with a 1990 federal law. That law requires develop ment of a standard test to determine the propensity of cigarettes to ignite fires.
