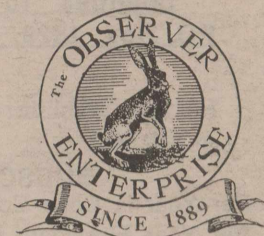

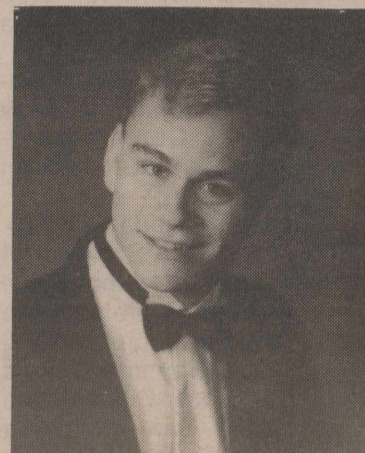

County athletes bring home gold medals

Robert Lee and Bronte tracksters brought home a bevy of medals from the state track meet last weekend, with four of them being gold.

Bronte's Jill Johnson repeated her performance of last year, bringing home the gold in the 100 meter hurdles. She bettered her third place performance of last year in the 300 meter hurdles by taking the gold medal in this event, also.

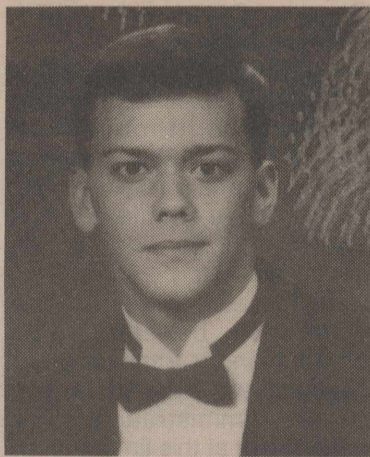
Seldom can a team take two high school athletes to the State 1-A Track and Field Meet and come away with 2nd place in the state team championship. The Steers did. They were second with 40 points to Roscoe's first place 60, only by being outgunned in depth.

Adam Morgan, Steer junior vaulter, took third place with a 13-9, a personal best and will hopefully get a rematch next year.

In a Herculean effort senior multi-sports athlete Lee McCown was entered in four events, back to back on two days. On Friday, the 12th, he grabbed first place in the discus with a 165.5. He took third in the high jump with a 6-7 leap, the same height as #1 and #2 but the difference was misses.

In Saturday's action, Lee was 2nd in the 110 meter hurdles at 15.38 and won the shot put with a 53-9 1/4 toss.

Calhoun improving

Freddie Calhoun, Jr. of Robert Lee was in improved

condition Tuesday in Shannon Medical Center in San Angelo. Mr. Calhoun, 38, was seriously injured in an accident on Highway 158 West near Calhoun's County Store the night of May 6.

According to DPS trooper Richard Fernandez of San Angelo, Calhoun was east-bound on foot on the south white stripe of the pavement. He was struck by the passenger side of a 1987 GMC pickup belonging to and driven by Ronnie Waggoner of Robert Lee, who was also east-bound.

Waggoner rendered aid, called 911 and the local EMS responded. The injured man was airlifted by helicopter to San Angelo. He suffered from loss of blood from a head wound and underwent exploratory surgery at Shannon.

The Eighth Grade promotional exercises will be held at 6:00 pm on Thursday, May 25th in the auditorium.

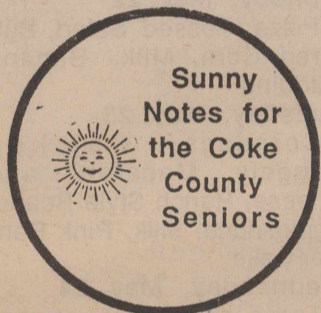

Son-in-law excels on Navy Destroyer

As a fire controlman in the Navy, Petty Officer Third Class Billy Reed is quick to point out the irony in his job title. "At first, most people think I fight fires. Actually, I'm the guy who pulls the trigger to launch missiles from USS Mississippi," said the son-in-law of Jerry and Wanda Parker of Bronte, Texas.

Nuclear-powered guided missile cruisers, such as Mississippi, are multi-mission warships capable of supporting carrier battlegroups, amphibious forces or operating independently.

Guided missile cruisers like Mississippi are forward deployed around the world to maintain a U. S. presence and provide rapid response in times of crisis. Sailors and Marines like Reed are often the first to arrive in situations ranging from humanitarian relief efforts to combat operations.

These ships have weapons and sensors that allow them to effectively protect themselves and other vessels in the battle group from aircraft, surface ships, or submarine attacks. "I work on the weapons direction system, the system that fires the standard missiles, not the Tomahawks or Harpoons," Reed said.

Reed deployed with the ship to the Mediterranean as part of the USS Theodore Roosevelt Battle Group in March. In addition to Mississippi, the battle group is equipped with tactical jet aircraft, helicopters, ships and submarines. It offers theater commanders a formidable force that is mobile, flexible and able to remain on station for long periods.

Reed, 27, had been anxiously awaiting the deployment. "I've only been on some short, five-week training cruises. I haven't been on a full-length deployment. The Mediterranean cruise will be my first and I'm looking forward to the port visits," he said.

In fact, the chance to visit foreign countries was one reason Reed enlisted in the Navy. "My father, who retired from the Navy as an engineer chief petty officer, told me about intriguing foreign countries he had visited during his time in the Navy," said the 1986 graduate of Bronte High School. "I also wanted to learn a trade."

During the deployment

Reed will have the opportunity to visit several countries in Europe and the Mediterranean. He is especially looking forward to visiting Naples, Italy and Greece, although he isn't looking forward to the separation from his family.

Reed is married to the former Melinda Parker of Bronte, Texas. They met in high school and dated on and off for nine years before they were married. They now reside in Virginia Beach, Virginia, where his wife is working on a bachelor's degree in biology.

Reed reported to USS Mississippi in August 1994 after nearly a year-and-a-half of high tech training in Navy learning the complex computer, electronic and hydraulic systems used to launch guided missiles.

During the two-and-a-half years he has spent in the Navy, he said the most important thing he has learned is to trust your leaders and maintain good working relations with everyone.

While he says the Navy has been a good experience for him, he doesn't intend to stay in long enough to retire. "I would like to return to Texas with my wife and start a family."

HEALTH NOTES

Walker Danger

Despite a voluntary safety standard for baby walkers started in 1986, the number of injuries involving baby walkers has continued to increase. The latest year for which figures are available from the Consumer Product Safety Commission National Electronic Injury Surveillance System is 1993, when more than twenty-five thousand injuries to young children were reported.

The numbers had not changed much from a year earlier when ninety-two percent of the injuries were to the head and face, and eighty-one percent were caused when the child fell down stairs while in a walker.

The purpose of our report is to point out that despite safety improvements in the design of walkers, babies are still being hurt. It would be a stretch to blame walkers for stairway falls, thus we can only caution parents and other caregivers of babies to arrange protection to make certain that the first effort at mobility does not result in trauma to the baby - or to the parents.

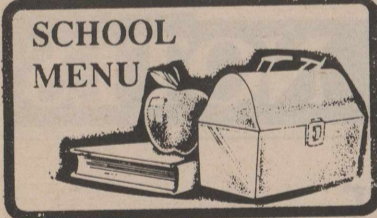

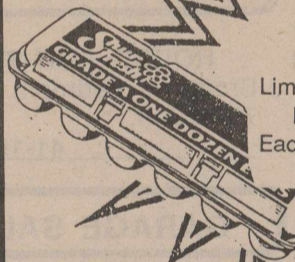

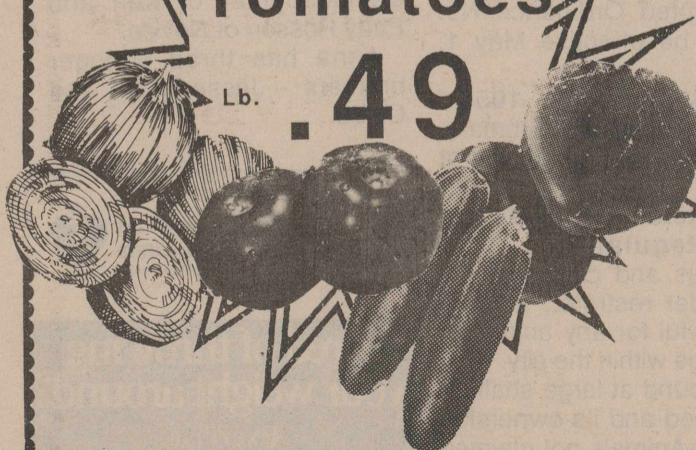

**Article 1: Animal
Regulations**
All dogs and cats shall be
kept under restraint. It shall
be unlawful for any animal to
be at large within the city. Any
animal found at large shall be
impounded and its ownership
verified. Animals not claimed

by their owner within 3 days
shall become the property of

exercise the option of serving

any dog or cat over four
months of age within the city

Personal info safe with SS

During your lifetime, Social Security collects a great deal of information about you. Are you concerned that other people may be able to get this information? Don't be - it's all confidential and protected by law. Unless you specifically permit it, Social Security cannot give information about you to anyone without your permission.

If you receive a letter from Social Security and have questions about the information in the letter, call us; we are here to help you with those questions. But the call we receive must be from you. If you ask someone else to make the call on your behalf, the Social Security representative is prohibited by law from discussing your personal business with that person unless you authorize it.

When Social Security began keeping records, we decided to use a numerical identifier, your Social Security number. The number assigned to each person is different. This allows us to keep information about you separate from any other information. The public was told that information kept by Social Security would be regarded as confidential.

Although we can't prevent others from asking for your number, you should know that giving it to them does not give them access to your Social Security records. The privacy of your records is guaranteed unless the law requires us to give it to another government agency or the information is needed to conduct Social Security or other government health or welfare programs.

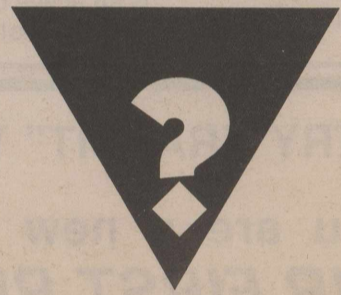
If a business asks you for your Social Security number, you can refuse to give it to them. However, they may not let you make the purchase or give you the service you are requesting without the number. Be careful with your Social Security number and keep it confidential whenever possible.
