Jesse Sims will fill the vacant seats on the East Coke County Hospital District Board of Directors.

Incumbents Wayne McCabe - Precinct 1, Wayne King - Precinct 2, and Joe Ash - Member At Large will retain their seats on the Coke County Underground Water District Board of Directors.

**Commissioners' Court Actions**

The Coke County Commissioners' Court met on April 26, 1999. The meeting was called to order with the pledge to the flag and a prayer led by Commissioner Rawlings.

The minutes were approved as presented.

Under open forum, Sid Eubanks made a request for repair to road. Commissioner McCutchen stated that he had plans to put in a tin horn.

Charles McDonald of White Buffalo Environmental Services made a presentation to the Court regarding the current rules and regulations of TNRC. Mr. McDonald would like to see the County rescind the 10-acre rule. Court tabled action for further review.

Court tabled the intent to apply for Public Road designation of Edith Estates No. 1 and No. 2 due to petition not being prepared.

They approved a line item increase for Sheriff's equipment expense. Income from the sale of confiscated items funded the increase.

The dedication of Bronte Park Pavilion will be held the 19th of May at 10 am.

Clean Up Day for the County was discussed. This will be addressed during the budget process.

Approval was given for the Eighth Grade class to have a swimming party at the Robert Lee Pool.

No action was taken on the expenses for the trip to Lufkin to pick up equipment for the

fire department, as Commissioner Percifull donated the expenses to the fire department.

The bills were approved. Judge Walker went over some of the budget before adjourning.

Mr. and Mrs. Scott were early pioneers in this area in the 1880's. They were parents of eight children, with one still living, and they have many descendants.

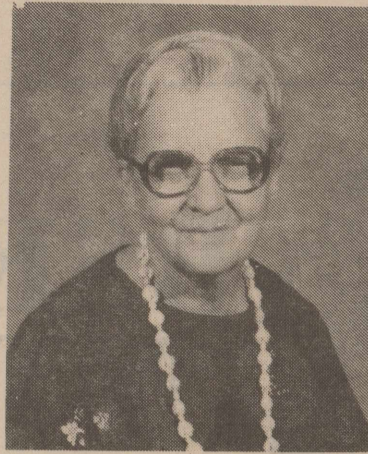

**Hatley**

Zola Altha Hatley, 93, died at 2 pm Thursday, April 22, 1999, in Robert Lee Care Center where she had been a resident since April 1998.

She was born January 3, 1906, to the late C.L. and Eva (Vestal) Hughes in Robert Lee and was a lifetime resident of Coke County.

She graduated from Robert Lee High School in 1924, and attended Nursing School at Scott and White Hospital in Temple from 1926 until 1928. She returned home and married Ell Hatley on January 14, 1928 at Robert Lee. They farmed and ranched in the Wildcat Community until moving to Robert Lee in 1947, where they operated the Coke County Co-op Cold Storage Locker Plant for ten years.

Zola became a Nurse's Aide at the Robert Lee Hospital and Nursing Home in 1958 where she worked for 15 years. She began working with the Green Thumb Program at Coke County Senior Citizens Center September 1978, completing almost 20 years in this program before having to retire early in 1998 because of ill health.

She was a longtime member of Northside Church of Christ and was a member of the Robert Lee Chapter of the Order of Eastern Star since 1953, where she served twice

as Worthy Matron, in 1957 and 1977.

Her hobbies included gardening, yard work, quilting, crocheting, and carpentry in her workshop.

Survivors include four grandchildren, Bob Hatley, Jr. of Goltry, Oklahoma, Tommie Hatley of Conroe, Kimmie Frady of Norcross, Georgia, and Billy Hatley of Enid, Oklahoma; eight great-grandchildren, three great-great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces and nephews.

Zola was preceded in death by her husband on January 23, 1975; her son, Bob Ell Hatley on September 4, 1995; and a grandson, Stevie Ray Hatley on December 22, 1992. Also preceding her in death were four brothers, Emery, A.V., David, and Bonner; and a sister, Ordie.

Services were at Northside Church of Christ Monday, April 26, 1999, at 10 am, with Tommy Williams officiating. Burial followed in Robert Lee Cemetery with Order of Eastern Star ceremonies at graveside.

**Sky Warn News**

Sunday evening the Skywarn Spotters of Robert Lee and Bronte, as well as the Sheriff's Department, were all mobile, watching the skies over Coke County.

First report from the National Weather Service was that two thunder storms were moving north east at about 30 miles per hour, which would put them over our area. The one headed for Robert Lee broke up before getting here. The one headed for Bronte passed to the south closer to Ballinger. No rotation was seen, but the spotters ob-

served cloud to cloud and heavy cloud to ground lightning. They described it as a light show.

At 2:17 am the National Weather Service called again, telling of a severe storm headed our way. This storm caused severe flooding in San Angelo. However, we just caught the edge of it. The biggest part of it hit the divide and turned and went around us. Bud Thompson, Sky Warn Leader, was on the divide and described the rain as falling sideways.

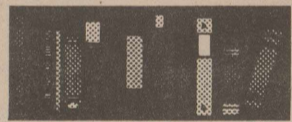
## Appreciation Dinner slated to honor coach

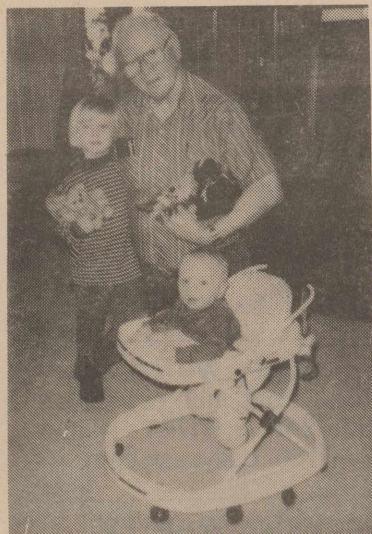

### Tax deferral available for elderly homeowners

Texans aged 65 or older may postpone paying delinquent and current property taxes on their homes. They may take advantage of a tax option called "over-65 deferral" by signing an affidavit at the Coke County Appraisal District office. Once a homeowner files an over-65 tax deferral affidavit, no taxing unit can start or continue a lawsuit for delinquent taxes as long as that person owns and lives in that home. Chief Appraiser Patsy Dunn stressed that the tax deferral for the elderly only postpones paying delinquent taxes on the home. It does not cancel them. During the deferral time, taxes and interest of 8 percent per year continue to add up.
