Easter egg hunt set Tuesday

The Coke County Easter Egg Hunt has become a joyful annual event. Last year, over 200 children searched for 3,000 eggs on the courthouse lawn. It will again be held on the courthouse lawn in Robert Lee.

Biologists predict a good hunt this spring - best perhaps in four years. A number of season carry-over mature birds exist with late fall and early year rains filling watering spots and furnishing green forage. A good spring hatch possibilities.

Spring turkey season opens Saturday

Saturday, April 7, will mark the opening of Spring Turkey Season and will run through May 13. The gobblers only season bag limit will depend on how many turkey tags are left on hunters' licenses. Four turkeys per license year are allowed, and most hunters manage tags to be able to take gobblers in the spring. Hens (with or without beards) are not legal game.

The same regulations and laws apply to spring hunting looks really promising, too.

Strategy meeting slated on economic development

The Robert Lee City Council will be sponsoring an economic development strategy meeting on Thursday, April 26, to discuss economic development and to set priorities for projects which were suggested in the economic survey recently conducted.

The meeting will begin at 7:00 pm in the courthouse courtroom. Rural economic development also is the topic of an article which appeared in County, March/April issue written by Dr. R. Knutson of the Agriculture and Food Policy Center at A&M, and brought to the attention of the council by Joan Davis. The magazine is available at the library.

Dr. Knutson states that Texas is an urban state with more than 80 percent of the population living in cities. While living in the country has its good aspects, it imposes higher costs of providing almost all governmental services. Most people believe equity is achieved by equal spending per capita, but more services can be provided with less money when it is done on a bigger scale. In other words, it cost more to provide services in the country than it does in the city.


Dr. Knutson also points out that rural areas draw from a smaller leadership pool, requiring local leaders to assume major roles in several organizations.

The four areas of economic development in the federal funding area include: Early Settlement, New Deal, Great Society, New Federation, and the 1990's in which unfunded mandates diverted funds from local issues to address social services, prisons, waste disposal and water quality. Little was left for roads, health care, and education, Dr. Knutson reported.

Texas initiatives, Dr. Knutson states, have been di-

rected by autonomous agencies with no central administrative leadership, or coordination, or thrust.


Dr. Knutson says, "Solving the problems of rural communities require a broad comprehensive strategy. The problems of Texas are so complex that the current patchwork of state and federal programs directed at agriculture, social services, health care, and economic development have not been adequate."

The article names five priority areas for economic policies for the future: (1) creating a central administrative office of rural development; (2) updating rural infrastructure; (3) increasing rural managers' decision-making capacity; (4) building on the existing natural resources and (5) recognizing that it costs more to provide government services in rural areas.



Outstanding students honored


