62nd edition of the County Stock Show begins today


opening show day of the 62nd edition of the Coke County Junior Livestock Show held at the Sterling Lindsey Memorial Exhibition Building in Robert Lee. This year's show will feature more than 220 animals in the Market Lamb, Market Goat, Market Swine, and Market Steer shows, but more importantly, more than 88 youth exhibitors from around the county.

The county stock show offers the youth of Coke County an opportunity to exhibit their livestock projects which they have worked with for more than 11 months, in many cases. Besides being a worthwhile educational activity for our youth in teaching them responsibility, working with others and numerous lifeskills, it is an important economic endeavor when you consider the animals purchased from county produc-ers, feed purchased locally and the premium sale monies that come in from county and other areas. The total monies generated by these exhibitors amounts to over \$120,000 per year that is circulated in the county.

A trench was cut down the middle of the log to hold the salt. The fresno leaning against the cabin was used to build tanks in the early days. Teams of mules or horses pulled the implement.

Under the Texas Education Code, veterans who are eligible are those who: a) were an honorably discharged member of the armed forces of the United States; b) were scheduled to graduate from high school after 1940 and before 1951; and c) left high school before graduation to serve in World

Eligible veterans or a person acting on behalf of an eligible deceased WWII veteran must complete an application form and submit it to the school district where the veteran was enrolled along with a copy of the veteran's discharge notification.


