Early voting continues until March 8 in primary elections

If early voting totals are any indicator, voter turnout for the upcoming March 12 primary elections will exceed those from the past several primaries. According to County/District Clerk Mary Grim, a total of approximately 75 early voting ballots (as of presstime Wednesday) had already been cast in the upcoming primary elections. Ms. Grim was expecting to pick up some more early ballots on Wednesday, February 27, at the Coke County Annex (Ratliff Building) in Bronte. Another early branch polling opportunity has been set for the same location from 9:00 until 12:00 noon next Wednesday, March 6th.

You can also vote early in person at the Coke County Clerk's office Monday - Friday from 8:00-12:00 and 1:00-5:00, from now until March 8th. Both Democratic and Republican primary balloting

will be conducted at these locations. **Please remember to bring your voter registration card with you when you come to vote.**

If you have misplaced your card, the voter registration office will be glad to issue you another. Their office is located at the Courthouse in the Tax Assessor/Collector's office.

Primary election day for both parties is March 12, 2002. Polls will be open from 7:00 am until 7:00 pm at the following locations. In the Democratic primary election, Precinct 1 residents will vote at the Old Rec Hall in Robert Lee. Precinct 2 will vote at the Senior Citizen's Building in Bronte. Precinct 3 will vote at the Courthouse in Robert Lee. Precinct 4 will vote at the Old Depot in Bronte.

As for the Republican primary, Precincts 1 & 3 will vote

year's \$4,000 reward begins on March 8, 2002 and runs through March 7, 2003. The only requirements for the contest are a current driver's license, valid fishing license, plus a Lake Spence fishing permit. The big fish must be caught (on a rod and reel, no trotlines), from Lake Spence. Potential winners will also be required to sign a statement concerning how and where the big fish was caught. DNA

All of the other local races are uncontested.

Area and state political races find an uncontested race for Charles Stenholm in the Democratic primary as he will undoubtedly be the Democratic nominee for US Representative, District 17. Stenholm will face a challenge in the general election from Republican Rob Beckham.

Incumbent Governor Rick Perry, like Stenholm, will face no opponents in the primary; however, a host of Democrats are on the primary ballot, and they include: Bill Lyon, Tony Sanchez, Dan Morales, and

West Texas to get two new area codes

West Texas will get two new area codes next year to handle continued regional growth and the added demand for more phone lines.

The Public Utility Commission (PUC) issued an order recently to create a geographic split of the 915 area code into three individual area code regions. The decision comes after a series of public meetings and comment on several proposals to accommodate the increased demand.

Current estimates predict that the 915 area code will run out of numbers in early 2004. The three-way split approved by the PUC will prevent the need for additional area codes in the three regions for an estimated 17 to 20 years.

While approximately two-thirds of customers in the current 915 region will have to change their area code, the PUC determined the three-way split is the best way to preserve local interests. For example, the three-way split allows the Midland-Odessa metropolitan area to continue sharing a common area code. The three-way split also allows customers to keep seven-digit dialing for local calls. The approved plan received overwhelming support from both residential and business customers during the public comment period.

The Commission desig-

nated the El Paso area to retain the 915 area code because of its concentrated population, extensive bilingual network and well-developed international commerce. The rest of the current 915 area code will be divided by two north-south boundaries.

The current schedule calls for the two new area codes to be introduced in April 2003 followed by a recorded reminder to dial a new area code in October 2003. Mandatory dialing using the new area codes is scheduled to begin December 2003. An extensive customer education program to introduce customers to the new area codes will begin in early 2003.

The PUC encourages competition and customer choice while ensuring electric and telephone operations, services and rates are fair and reasonable.

Lady Steers make All-District

Three Lady Steers were named to the District 6-A, Division I All District team for the 2001-2002 year, and two more recorded honorable mentions. All five honored players were seniors and have helped Robert Lee High School compile a 97-22 record over the past four years, including 8 tournament Championships, three District Championships, Four Bi-District titles, and two Area titles. This year the Lady Steers finished with a 25-4 record and an Area Championship.

Jodee Helwig for the fourth year in a row was named to the All-District team. She had been the district's MVP for the past three years and has been named to the San Angelo's Standard Times All-West Texas team twice. This year she led the Lady Steers in scoring and rebounding, averaging 17.4 points per game and 7.5 rebounds per game. RLISD calls for superintendent applicants

The Robert Lee ISD Board of Trustees held its regular monthly meeting on Thursday, February 21 at 6:30 pm in the high school library. Among items on the agenda was the search for a new superintendent to replace Weldon Koepf, who is retiring in June. Trustees voted to call for applications from among current district employees, setting a deadline of March 8. The board will meet on that day to screen any applications received.

In other business, the board approved contracts of administrative personnel for the 2002-2003 school year. Teacher contracts will be acted upon in March. Board members also approved several updated board policies recommended by the Texas Association of School Boards.

Trustees also approved the Elementary Campus Improvement as presented by Principal Janet Wallace. They also approved an addition to the High School Campus Improvement Plan. They also designated April 26 as Take Our Daughters to Work Day.

In other action, board members nominated Gaylon Pitcock to a vacant position on the Coke County Appraisal District Board of Directors. They also approved a waiver application asking the Texas Education Agency to reimburse the district for the cost of textbooks used in teaching college courses to Robert

Lee students. Some Robert Lee seniors are presently taking courses from Howard College via a distance learning video hookup. This is the first year for these classes to be offered at Robert Lee.

The board set the school board trustee election for May 4. Three positions will be up for election this year. Two positions for full three-year terms will be available. Jim Gray and Mark Riley currently hold those positions. One position for a one-year unexpired term currently held by Jess Williamson will also be available. All three of the current members in those positions were appointed to serve last year to fill vacancies created by resignations.

High School Principal Lindsey Wallace and Elementary Principal Janet Wallace made their monthly reports on attendance, student activities, curriculum and student achievement. Superintendent Weldon Koepf updated the board on changes in the Small Schools Special Education Cooperative, UIL football and basketball district realignments, a TEA audit of special program funds, and changes in property insurance across the state.

He also reported on the State Comptrollers Property Tax Study, which has valued district properties higher than the local appraisal district. Supt. Koepf emphasized that if these state values are not adjusted, it will mean a loss of state funding for the district. If the state does not adjust the values, Robert Lee ISD is prepared to submit an appeal to the Property Tax Division and has already secured the services of a legal firm to handle the appeal if necessary. The deadline for submitting the appeal is March 12.

Supt. Koepf also presented board members with copies of the newly revised district emergency plan. The district Safety Committee has worked on the new plan over the past few months. The plan details evacuation procedures and other emergency procedures which school personnel and students will use in the event of a natural or man-made disaster.

The board set a special meeting for March 8 to screen superintendent applications and its next regular meeting for March 28.

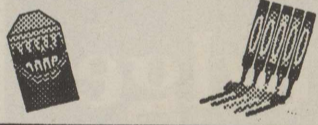

Lacy - Lange exchange vows

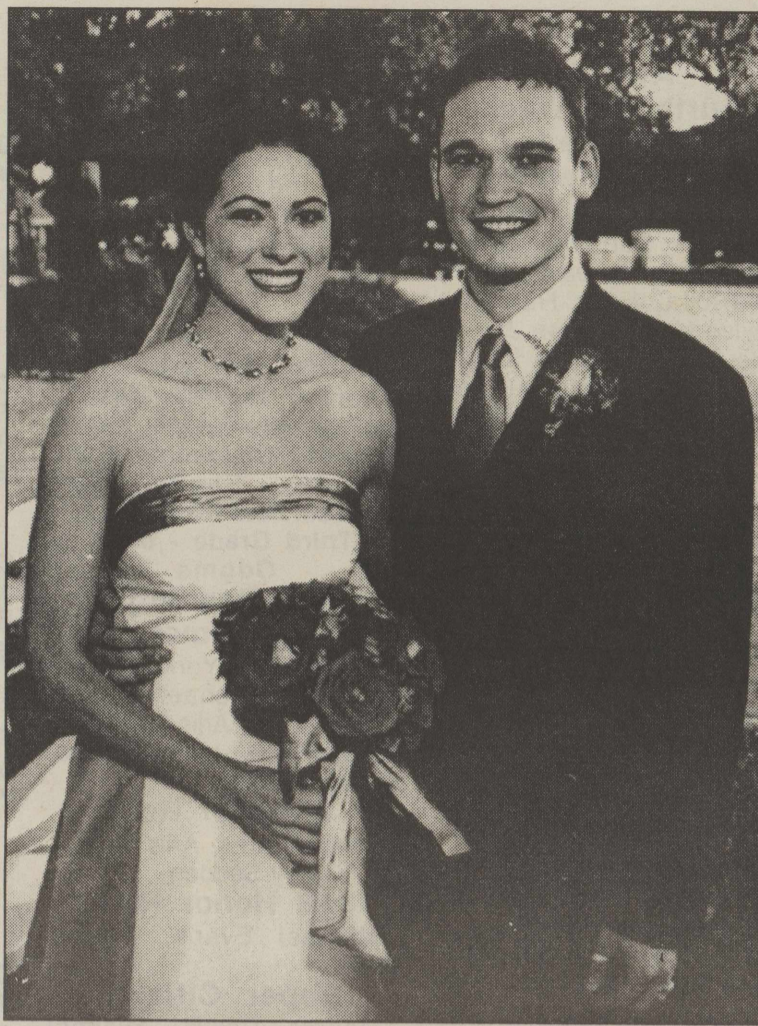

The groom received a bachelor of arts degree in government at The University of Texas at Austin in December 1999. He is currently employed at Computer Helpers.

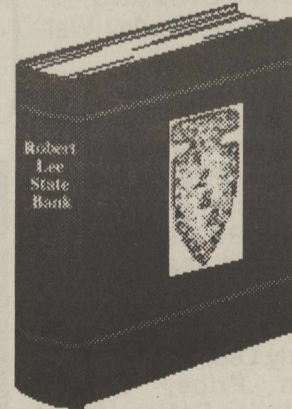

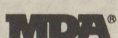



A message from your National Weather Service

Each spring severe weather threatens Texas, and too often the threat turns deadly. Over the past few years, our ability to warn Texans of impending hazardous weather has improved dramatically. Our most valuable warning tool is our state-of-the-art Doppler weather radar. However, our early warnings won't protect your life or your property, unless you know how to respond appropriately.

As part of this year's Texas Severe Weather Awareness Week, I urge you to participate in our West Central Texas tornado drill. We will conduct our weekly NOAA Weather Radio test on Wednesday, March 6th from 9:00 am to 9:30 am. When we begin our test, we ask you, and any others participating, to begin your tornado drill.

I strongly recommend schools and day-care centers participate in our tornado drill. Additionally, families, businesses, and any other organizations entrusted with public safety may also wish to participate. We will designate Thursday, March 7th as an alternate day for our drill should severe weather threaten us on Wednesday.

Please contact us (915-944-9445) with your questions about severe weather safety or our role in helping you prepare. We're here to help.

All of us at your National Weather Service office in San Angelo are working hard around the clock to protect you and yours; we urge you to prepare now for severe weather. Please don't wait until it is too late!

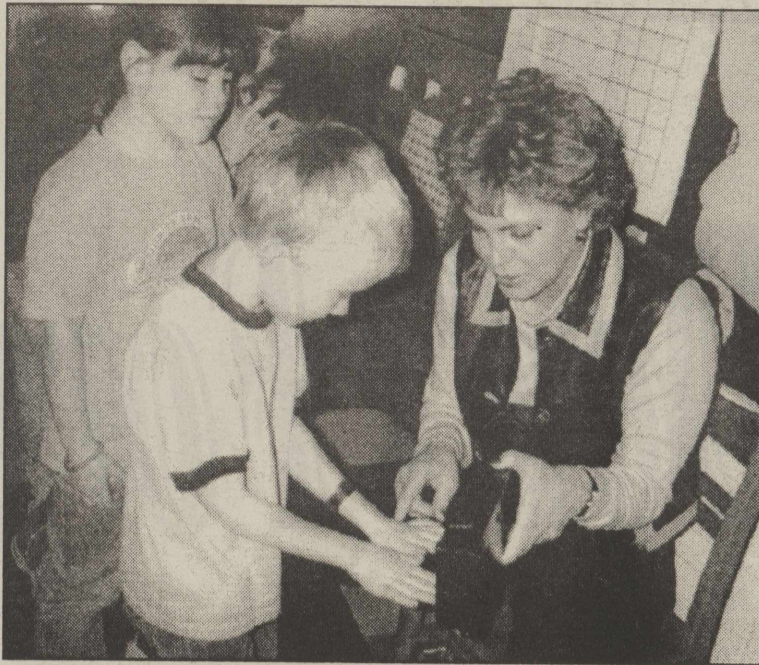

*Move students quickly into interior rooms or hallways on the lowest floor. Have them assume the tornado protection position - kneeling on the floor with arms and hands protecting their heads.

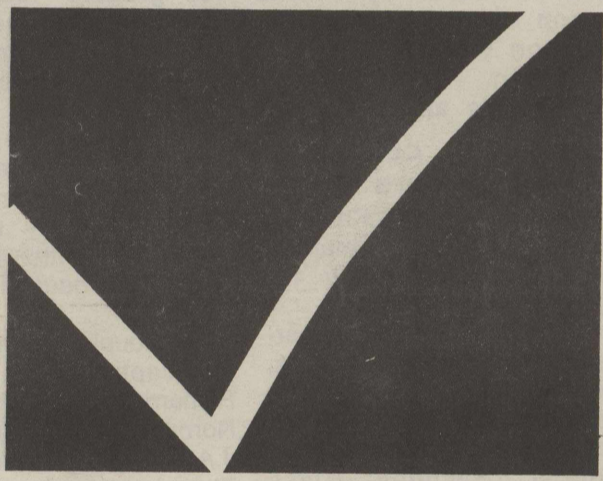
