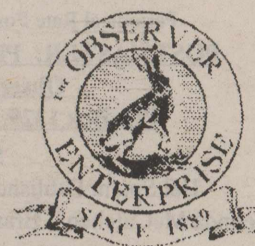

This will be a great opportunity to replace or add new plants to your garden after last year's hot summer and this year's cold winter.

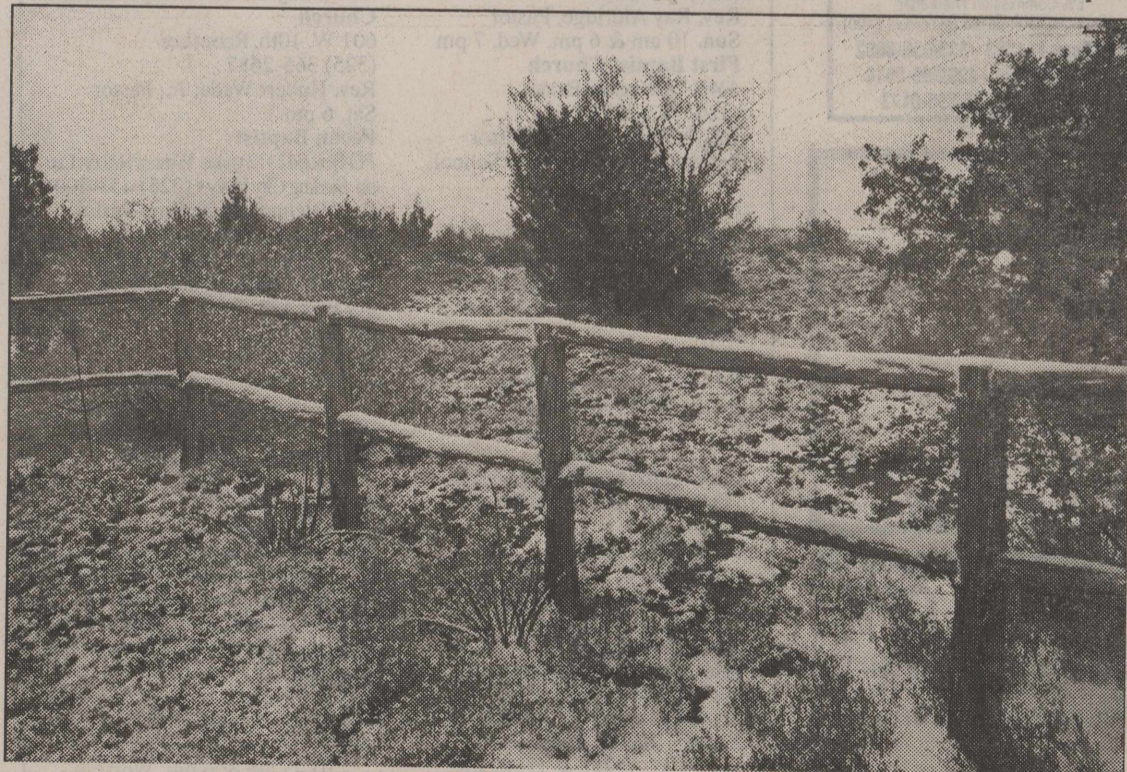

These permanent records help members select and mate the best animals in their herds to produce high quality, efficient breeding cattle, which are then recorded with the American Angus Association. Most of these registered Angus are used by the U.S. farmers and

ranchers who raise high quality beef for U.S. consumption.

As The Wind Blows...

On March 29 a standing room only crowd was at the Coke County Courthouse for an informational meeting concerning the impact of Wind Energy development on our local area. The keynote speaker was Greg Wortham, Executive Director of the West Texas Wind Energy Consortium located in Sweetwater. The topics discussed covered the current state of the Wind Energy Industry, the role the Industry is playing in our region, and the effects on the communities where the projects are located.

For those who have made a trip to Abilene, Sweetwater or to Big Spring from Sterling City you are aware of the projects in our area, what you may not know is that this development is part of what has made Texas the Western Hemisphere's leader in wind energy production, generating enough to power nearly 600,000 homes. This summer, the state surpassed California to become the largest producer of wind energy in the nation and fifth largest wind producer in the world. The recently completed 735 Megawatt project known as "Horse Hollow" located south of Sweetwater between Texas Highway 70 and US Highway 277 is the largest single project in the World. A 1 Megawatt (Mw) generator produces 2.4 to 3 Million Kilowatt Hours annually, enough to electrify 250 - 300 homes. Horse Hollow consists of 421 turbines covering 47,000 acres with an average generator output of 1.5 Mw. Located within 150 miles of Coke County are the 600 Mw "Sweetwater" project, the 400 Mw "Lone Star Wind Farm", and the 160 Mw "Green Mountain Wind Park on the Brazos" as well as many others. With this much power being generated it is not surprising to learn that Dyess Air Force Base recently announced it is the first federal installation to use 100 percent wind generated electricity. Another recent announcement that an educational partnership was formed between FP&L Energy and Texas State Technical College in Sweetwater providing a two-year degree developed by TSTC faculty in collaboration with program advisory group members of the industry, including the West Texas Wind Energy Consortium, FP&L Energy and other wind energy companies, further illustrates that West Texas is fast becoming the center of the Wind Energy World.

So you ask what does this mean for us? With the recent projects completed and new ones beginning in Sterling County and projects set to begin soon in Runnels County, Coke County is surrounded by a booming industry and with the recent upswing in the oilfield there is ample opportunity for jobs both short and long term. For existing business it is a time for increased patronage or expansion, in some cases there is a need for services or products not currently provided. Some services needed immediately are HOUSING, in the form of rental property, both houses and apartments as well as lots to place travel trailers or even vacant lots to build new homes, FOOD SERVICES, and LAUNDRY facilities. Companies that can move or repair tractors and other heavy equipment will and are benefiting. In communities like Roscoe and Fluvanna long vacant buildings are now the local offices for world-wide companies like General Electric and Mitsubishi. Not all needs are economic, our new neighbors will also need Fellowship from our Churches and as in other communities they will look to support our schools, athletic and academic endeavors. Those of you who were here when the dam was built for Lake Spence will remember the services and support the workers needed then and there are many similarities today. Some of you have skills and abilities that have not been used in a while, as others have ideas for small or not so small business just waiting for the chance to launch.

Landowners in Coke County interested in being part of a wind project should contact Judge Roy Blair to have your information placed on a "development map", those in Robert Lee and West Coke County with homes or other spaces for housing available

for rent or purchase should contact Robert Lee City Hall. Those interested in The West Texas Wind Energy Consortium may contact them by phone 325-236-9499 or on the internet at westtexaswind.us.

Important Election dates

April 12 was the last day to register to vote for the May 12 elections. April 30 is the first day to vote early in person. May 4 is the last day an application for a ballot by mail can be accepted. May 8 is the last day to vote early by personal appearance. May 12 is Election Day. Polls will be open from 7 am to 7 pm.

Early voting for the Constitutional Amendment, City of Robert Lee, Robert Lee ISD, and West Coke County Hospital District will be conducted in the Clerk's office, Monday through Thursday from 8 am to 5 pm and Friday from 8 am to 1 pm. The City of Robert Lee will have 2 extended days, May 1 and May 8. Their hours will be extended to 8 pm. The Bronte ISD will conduct early voting at the school, Monday through Friday from 8 am to 4 pm.

On election day all County precincts for the Constitutional Amendment will be held in their regular polling locations. The City of Robert Lee, Robert Lee ISD, and West Coke County Hospital District will be held with Precinct 3 at the Courthouse and the Bronte ISD will be held with Precinct 4 at the Bronte City Hall.

Please remember to bring your voter registration card when voting. If you have any election questions, please feel free to call the Clerk's office at 453-2631. We will be glad to help you.

3. Social Security Card
4. Immunization Record
5. Food Stamp Case Number (if applicable)
6. Proof of Medicaid, Chips, or Private health insurance (if applicable)

RLHS Golf advances to regional tourney

On April 9, the Robert Lee High School Boys and Girls golf teams won the District 9-A tournament at Big Spring.

The Robert Lee Steers qualified for the Regional Tournament, to be held in Abilene on April 23-24. The Steers shot a 320 - 331 - 651 to top the 10 team field. Johnathan Pagan led the Steers with a 75 - 77 - 152 total. Other scores were : Clay Antilly 79 - 86 - 165; Brody Dillard 85 - 81 - 166; Mason Ross 81 - 87 - 168; and Taylor Percifull 87 - 91 - 178. Kaden Duncan took top medalist honors in the JV division with a 82 - 88 - 170. Cody Brosh was second in the JV with a 90 - 91 - 181. Blake Millican shot a 105 - 95 to finish eighth.

The Lady Steers also qualified for the Regional

Tournament by winning the 9-A District tournament. The Lady Steers shot a 378 - 387 - 765 to take the win. Kelsy Duncan took medalist honors with a 93 - 85 - 178 total. Sarah Philley was second with her 92 - 96 - 188. Other scores were Becca Skinner 91 - 102 - 193; Jaden Alexander 102 - 104 - 206; and Brettanie Reed 102 - 119 - 218.

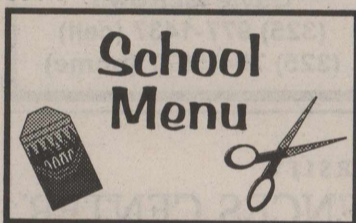

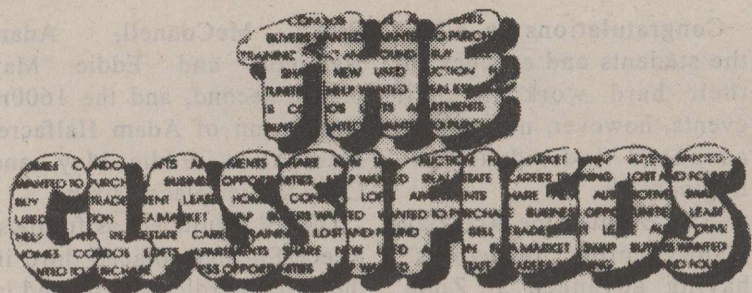
The Number to Call, When You Don't Know Who To Call
