Board unanimously approves promotion of former San Jacinto leader to replace Patrick Jones

Donned in the appropriate maroon business suit, Stephanie Howard was named principal of Lee High School during a special Midland ISD board meeting Thursday.

Howard, 34, previously was principal at San Jacinto Junior High. She replaces Patrick Jones, who was promoted to executive director of secondary education. Lee has 1,946 students, compared to San Jacinto's 700.

Howard is starting her ninth year with MISD. Previously, she taught and coached at Stanton and Big Spring.

"I'm very excited. It's a great opportunity," Howard said. "I was there two or three years ago as instructional services director."

"I'm honored," the Robert Lee native said of getting the job. "It's nice to know the superintendent has the confidence in me and the board as well."

She intends to continue building on Lee High School traditions and plans to work on getting students ready for college and continuing to work with higher education to align high school and college curriculum to help

make the transition easier for kids.

Funeral service was held at 2 pm, Wednesday, August 1, 2007, at the First United Methodist Church, officiated by the Reverend Steve Rowe. Burial followed in Fairview Cemetery in Bronte. Services were under direction of Shaffer Funeral Home.

Patricia Pruitt Ivey was born on October 6, 1926, in Paris, Texas, to Carl and Nell Austin Pruitt. She married Cumbie Ivey, Jr in 1952. The day before Mr. Ivey was discharged from the Air Force their only daughter, Patricia Lynn Ivey was born. The family moved to Robert Lee to become involved in the Ford business. Being involved for many years in the Texas Democratic Party, Patti Ivey has served many terms as Precinct Judge, Coke County Democratic Chairman and served three terms on the State Democratic Executive Committee. As Committeewoman from the 25th Senatorial District she represented 35 counties in West Texas. Mrs. Ivey served as one of the Hostesses when Vice-President Johnson visited San Angelo and later when Mrs. Johnson and the Cabinet Wives visited San Angelo. During the Carter Administration she accepted two invitations to the White House. Also she hosted President Carter's "Aunt Sissy" (Mrs. Dolvin) when she visited Coke County.

In 1986, she was commis-

sioned a member of the Texas Board of Directors of Private Investigators and Private Security Agencies by Governor Mark White. In 1987 she was commissioned a Yellow Rose of Texas by Mark White. In 1991, she was commissioned a member of the Board of Directors of the Upper Colorado River Authority by Governor Ann Richards. She served on this board through 1998, serving as its Chairman for three years.

Mrs. Ivey belonged to three State Federations - Texas Federation of Democratic Women, Texas Federation of Study Clubs, and Federation of Texas Garden Clubs, Inc. She was a Master Flower Show Judge and an accredited State Speaker on "Table Arrangements" and has given a program at the State Convention. She was still active and traveled all over Texas judging flower shows.

She was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Robert Lee and the

64 Study Club in Robert Lee. She is preceded in death by her parents, Carl and Nell Pruitt and her husband, Cumbie Ivey, Jr.

Patti is survived by her daughter, Patti Lynn Ivey Petersen and husband, Terry of Dallas and her beloved dog, Sparky of the home.

**Church to  
Celebrate  
100th Year**

In 1907, the Northside Church of Christ began serving the Lord in a building located at what is currently the corner of Chadbourne and 9th Streets in Robert Lee. August 17, 18, and 19, 2007, the church will be celebrating with a weekend meeting of worship and praise to observe their 100th year.

Some of the early members who served as leaders and

helped to establish the church were Merritt Stroud and G.C. McCraw. These two men purchased the building that was on the site where the present building now stands. The first building was destroyed by the same tornado that destroyed other churches and properties in Robert Lee in the late 1920's, and immediately, the present building was erected, with many improvements having been made over the years.

During the following years membership fluctuated, with many families contributing to the continuation of the church. At the end of the war, some families returned after having moved elsewhere for wartime jobs, others returned from military, and now families moved to Robert Lee as jobs opened in the oil fields. During these years, teaching and preaching were done by visiting ministers and local brethren.

In 1958, Gene Shelburne, grandson of D.P. Keys, became full time minister for the summer months, and was followed by Delbert Smith from fall of 1958 to 1961; Douglas Wilks, 1961 to 1966; Leo Copeland, 1966 to 1968. In 1972, Kenneth Green came as full time minister until June 1974. From then until August 1975, Clyde Dukes, a teacher in the Robert Lee school system served as minister. In August 1975, Tommy Williams moved to Robert Lee and worked with the church two years, and then Clyde once again stepped in until August 1983.

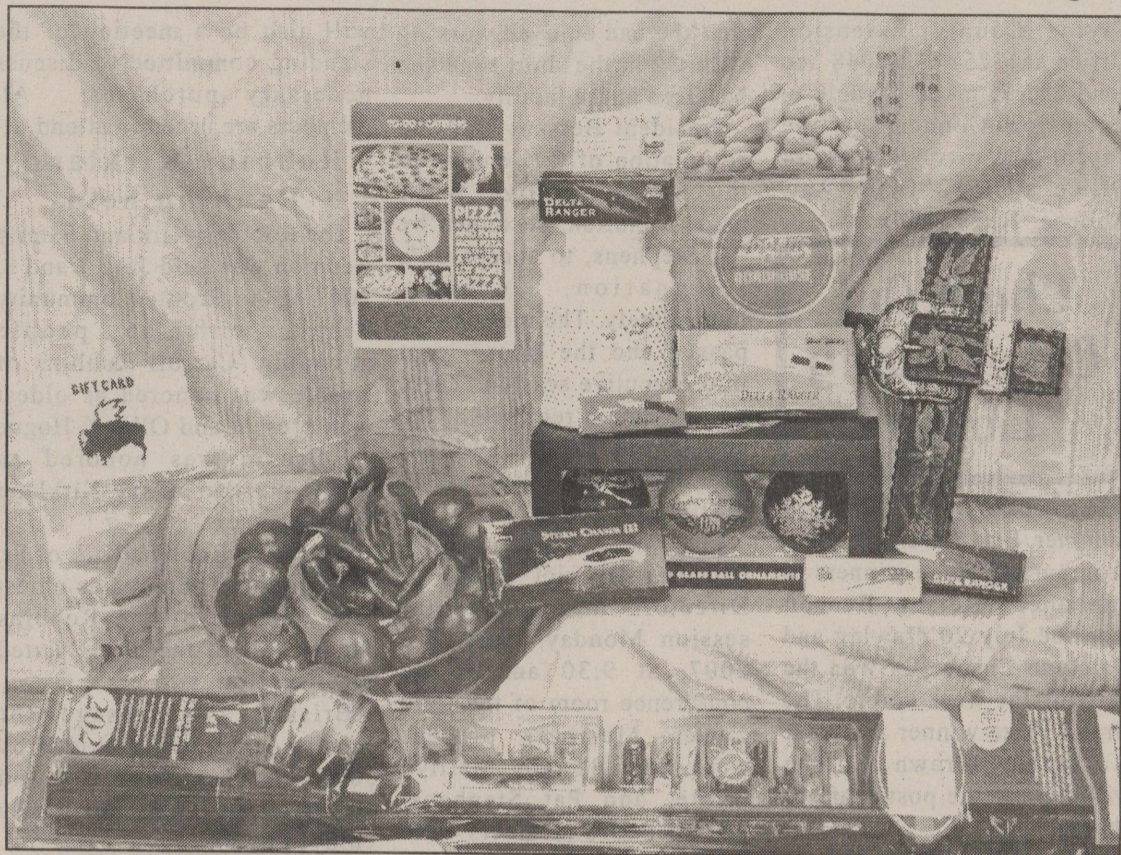

### A&M Beef Cattle Short Course Set for Aug. 6-8

The 53rd annual Texas A&M Beef Cattle Short Course will be held Aug. 6-8 at Texas A&M University in College Station. "Planning committee members from around the state have met with us and helped us put together another outstanding program," said Dr. Jason Cleere, Texas Cooperative Extension beef cattle specialist and conference coordinator.

"This year's short course will address cost increases in fertilizer, fuel, equipment and grain and how they affect a rancher's profits," Cleere said. "Increasing feed and fertilizer costs continue to put a lot of pressure on beef cattle producers to look for new ways to produce a pound of beef more economically," he said. "In the near future, economics may override traditional ranch practices." The short course, sponsored by Texas Cooperative Extension, will address these issues as well as other topics during the three-day event, providing information for the novice rancher as well as for the most seasoned one.

"The 2007 short course will be one of the most important programs of the year for today's beef producers looking to the future," said Dr. Larry Boleman, assistant deputy vice chancellor and conference director.

"Previous participants always comment on the variety of topics that are offered during the Beef Cattle Short Course," he said. "One of the most popular features of the short course is the 'Cattleman's College', where participants can choose workshops and topics from a field of approximately 17 different subjects on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The concurrent workshops will feature information on ranch management, nutrition, reproduction, genetics, pastures, carcass evaluation, record keeping, organic and natural beef production." In addition to the Cattleman's College sessions, a key general session will be offered on Monday afternoon. The Wednesday "Cattleman's College" sessions are designed to offer a more hands-on approach to calf working,

cattle handling, cattle selection, carcass evaluation and record keeping. Participants will also have an opportunity to obtain a Private Applicators License that day.

In addition to the Cattleman's College sessions, a key general session will be offered on Monday afternoon. "The goal of the Beef Cattle Short Course each year is to provide the most cutting-edge information that is vital to beef cattle producers," said Cleere. "Changing Dynamics of the U.S. Beef Industry" will be the theme of the general session this year, and we have already lined up some of the nation's top speakers.

Participants can earn numerous pesticide continuing education units (CEUs) if already licensed. The trade show will feature more than 100 agricultural businesses and service exhibits, Cleere said. Registration information and tentative schedule can be found on the short course web site. Producers may register online at <http://beef.tamu.edu> or contact Cleere's office at 979-845-6931.

### Big Country Beef Conference set

Texas Cooperative Extension's Big Country Beef Conference has been set for August 9. The biennial conference starts with registration at 8 am in the Big Country Hall adjacent to the Extension offices at the Taylor County Expo Center grounds.

This year's event will cover everything from effects of ethanol production to agroterrorism. The conference is the largest and most comprehensive educational beef program in the Big Country. We typically draw speakers and participants from across Texas and Oklahoma.

The conference will be conducted by the Extension offices in Callahan, Shackelford and Taylor counties. Two Texas Department of Agriculture continuing education units will be available for private pesticide applicator license-holders. Individual registration is \$5 if you pre-register by August 3, and \$15 thereafter. Registration includes entire program and noon meal.
