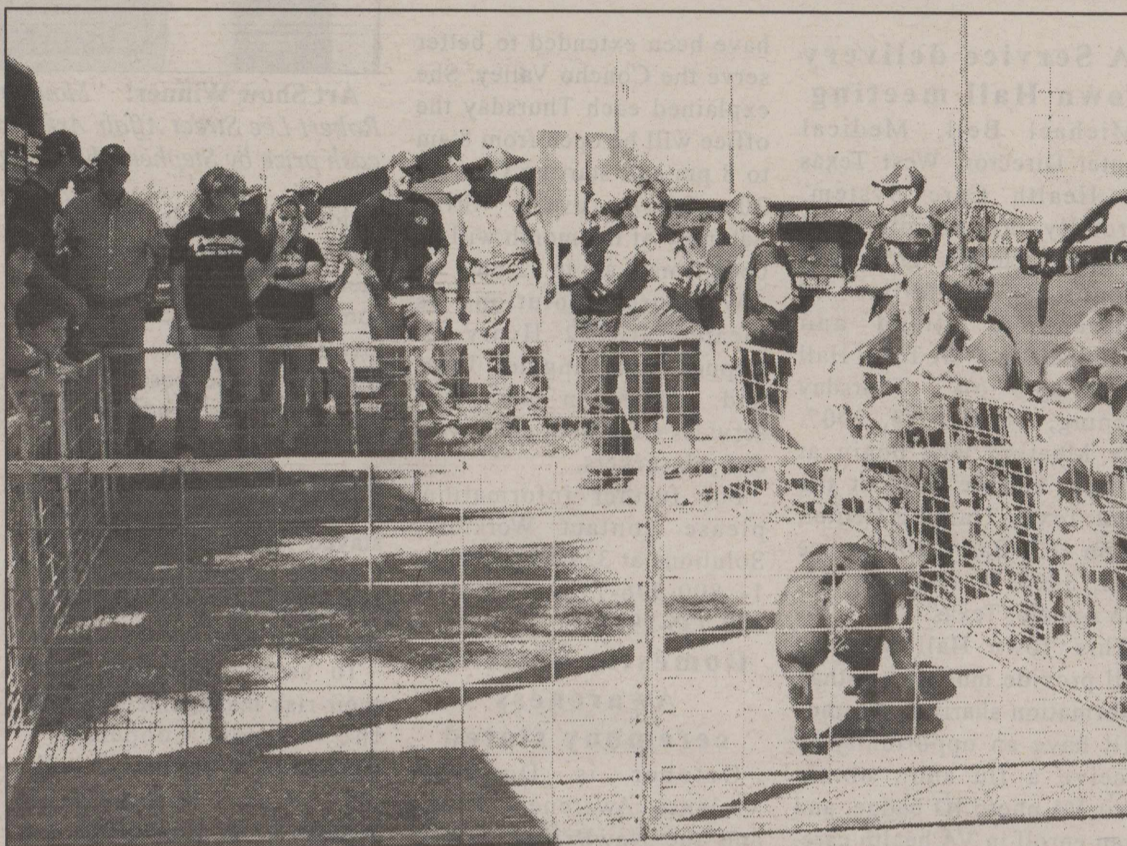



**Livestock Risk
Management
Workshops slated**

Texas cattle and forage producers have faced many frustrating conditions over the past ten years. Drought, bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE)

incidents, volatile markets, and rising input costs such as fuel and fertilizer have combined to increase risk levels in the cattle industry. Now, with the cost of corn and feedstuffs, producers are yet again faced with unparalleled input costs. Although cattle prices have stayed relatively high, never has the importance for risk management been higher in the cattle industry.

To assist cattlemen with their risk management skills, the Texas Cooperative Extension is partnering with the Risk Management Agency of the USDA and the National Cattlemen's Beef Association to offer two one-day Livestock Risk Management Workshops. The objective of these workshops is to provide cattlemen an overview of the risk management tools approved by the Risk Management Agency and that are available through local crop insurance agents as well as other risk management programs of Texas Cooperative Extension. The speakers for the workshops include specialists from both agencies and will cover the Pasture, Rangeland, and Forage Insurance, Livestock Risk Protection for Feeder Cattle and Fed Cattle, Livestock Gross Margin and the current market situation

and outlook. At the San Angelo program, there will be segments on the new Livestock Risk Protection-Lamb policies for lamb producers and an update on the Pasture, Rangeland and Forage Insurance coverage. Anyone involved in the livestock industry would benefit by attending this workshop.

The San Angelo workshop will be held on November 7, beginning at 8:30 am at the Management Instruction and Research Center of Angelo State University.

These workshops are provided through a partnership of the Texas Cooperative Extension, the Risk Management Agency of the USDA, and the National Cattlemen's Beef Association.

While there is no registration fee for these workshops, it is important to reserve a seat. Early registration will ensure you have a seat for this important workshop. Registration forms can be obtained in the Coke County Extension office, located in the county courthouse.

Old Coke County Jail receives 200 visitors

Some 200 visitors registered at the Old Jail for tours and a look at family photographs and memorabilia during the Robert Lee Street Affair on Saturday, October 13, 2007.

Members of pioneer Coke County families provided glimpses into the groundwork these families laid for future generations to build on. With pictures, drawings, and collected and preserved artifacts, the history of the county came into clearer view. The Bilbo family, Jo Nell and Tommy Blair family, Donna Jameson Ash family, Bill and Eula Fay (Smith) Blair families, Ava Lou Davis' family and John Quinten McCabe's story as well as a picture history of the Silver schools prepared by Donna Ash provided insight and appreciation.

Videos from the Ole Coke County Pageant that were preserved by Jeffie Roberts were turned into a CD by David Sheldon and the memories played throughout the day.

The third grade students of Mrs. Myers' music class provided a hand-clapping performance with Texas songs and a rousing rendition of "Ole Coke County." Their preparation and talent shown bright during the performance and their enthusiasm made the audience feel proud to be a part of the program.

Frankie Beth Williams read "Randolph and Kate" by Mike Prince to a standing room only group and drew laughs with the antics in the cowboy poem. The High Noon hanging fortunately took place on schedule as Charlotte and Wilburn Millican appeared at the door of the Old Jail right on time. Mr. Millican graciously served as an able hangman and he "hung" the framed certificate acknowledging the acceptance of the Old Jail into the National Register of Historic Places. A few people were disappointed that the hanging was so tame, but there was a round of applause for the honor bestowed by the US Department of the Interior.

The Old Jail is 100 years old this year and preservation plans are underway to stabilize the building so that it will be here another 100 years as a reminder that tomorrow begins today.

failing their physicals.

Parents across the Lone Star State, the Texas Department of Agriculture and our local schools must build on our partnership to answer the challenge to help children fight obesity. We all have heard of the three R's, now it's time for students to focus on the three E's as well; education, exercise and eating right. Our children are the future of Texas; we must guide them down a path of healthy lifestyles.

Here in Texas the school lunch and breakfast programs serve around 490 million lunches and 215 million breakfasts each year. Approximately 4.5 million Texas children have access to nutritious, balanced meals under the school lunch and breakfast programs.

TDA has created nutrition guidelines for schools to follow when preparing the meals in our cafeterias. The meals are healthy, fun to eat and give children a chance to try new food. But the meals are just a part of the equation. Education is the second ingredient of the plan.

We are teaching kids the importance of putting down the cookie and picking up the carrot. By educating our children early in life we can get them into the habit of eating a diet that is good for them and one they can enjoy for their entire life.

Teachers are also discovering when their students return home they are taking the knowledge home with them. When kids go with Mom or Dad to the grocery store they are requesting fruit and juice instead of candy and soda. These are the triumphs we must have to stem the tide of obesity.

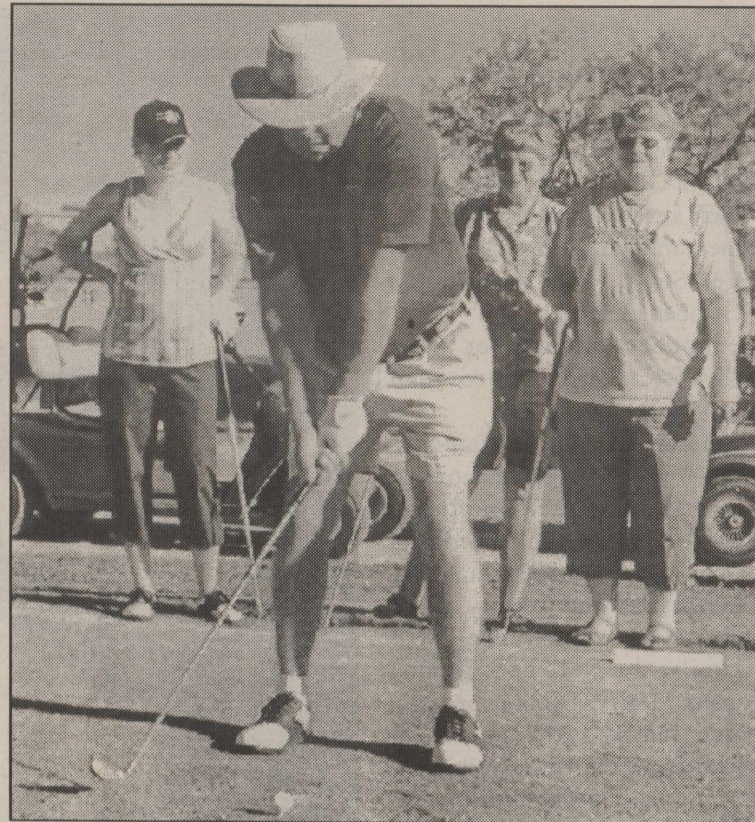
Euterpean Club meets in Blackwell

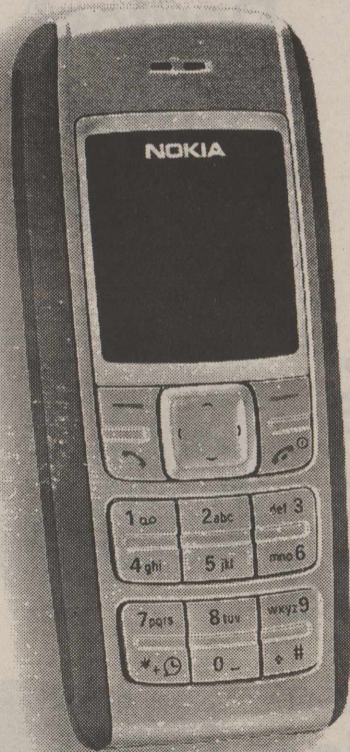

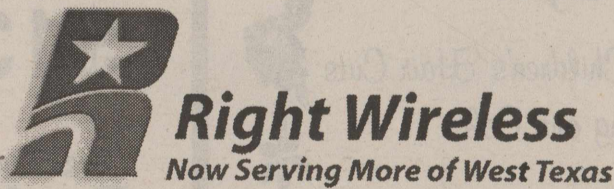

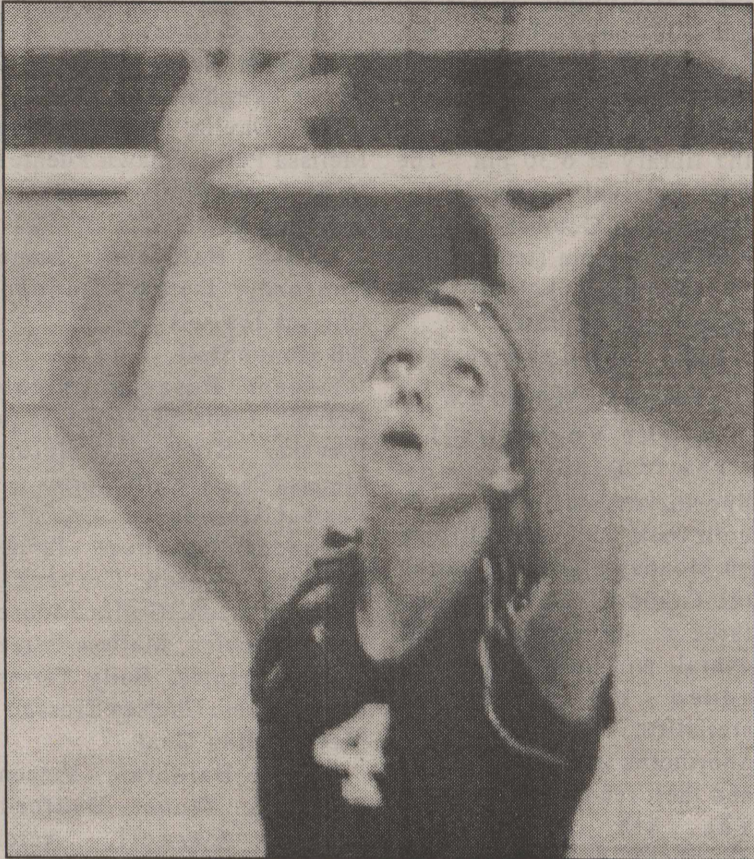

PUBLIC NOTICE

On September 20, 2007, Atmos Energy Corporation, Mid-Tex Division ("Atmos" or "the Company"), filed a Statement of Intent with each city within Atmos' service territory to increase its gas rates and implement a new schedule of rates and riders applicable to all customers within all incorporated cities served by the Mid-Tex Division. The proposed effective date of the requested rate changes is October 25, 2007. If approved, the proposed changes will affect approximately 1,428,700 residential, 122,600 commercial, and 960 industrial & transportation customers.

If approved, the proposed rates will increase the Company's annual revenues for the incorporated areas of its Mid-Tex Division by \$ \$50,946,000 or 3.5%, including gas costs, or 13.49% excluding gas cost. The proposed change in rates constitutes a "major change" as that term is defined by Section 104.101 of the Texas Utilities Code. In addition, the Company seeks to recover all of its rate case expenses and all city rate case expenses as allowed by law. The exact amount will not be known until the case is completed.

Based on the proposed rate design, the system-wide average monthly bill for each customer class within the incorporated areas of the Mid-Tex Division will increase by the amount and percent shown in the table below:

**The calculation of bill impacts assumes monthly consumption of 6 Mcf for residential, 30 Mcf for commercial, and 300 Mcf for industrial and transportation customers.

In addition to the rate revisions in Rate Schedules R, C, I, and T, other proposed tariff changes include changes to Rider GCR, Rider WNA and proposed Riders for a rate review mechanism and conservation & energy efficiency program. The Company proposes to revise its weather normalization adjustment ("WNA") mechanism to exclude non-weather sensitive commercial customers and to modify the WNA mechanism to calculate the WNA adjustment based on weather stations at a regional level rather than under the current practice of associating all towns with a single weather location for purposes of determining the WNA adjustment. The Company proposes a change to its Rider GCR to allow the recovery of the gas cost component of uncollectible expense through the Rider GCR instead of through base rates and to update the Upstream Allocation (Factor D) to reflect the factors as proposed in the Company's Class Cost of Service Study. In addition, the Company proposes a new Rate Review Mechanism ("RRM"), Rate Schedule RRM, to provide for an annual review by the cities of the Company's expenses, revenues and rate base investment and a corresponding adjustment to the Company's rates to reflect annual changes (increases or decreases) in these categories. The Company proposes a gas conservation & energy efficiency program and tariff to authorize the program. Finally, the Company is asking for authority to make future filings with the regulatory authority on an electronic basis, rather than by paper copy.
