



43rd Annual Pecan Show slated

The 43rd Annual Concho Valley Pecan Show will be held on Friday, December 7, from 12 noon until 6 pm at the main entrance to the Tom Green County Library in Judge Edd B. Keyes Building. Any pecan grower in the area may submit entries to the show. This includes Tom Green, Coke, Concho, Irion, McCulloch, Schleicher, and Sterling Counties. No entry limit per exhibitor is made, but participants are limited to one entry of each named variety they grow. The grower may enter as many seedlings, known hybrids or natives as he wishes. The exhibitor must be grower. Entries must be received by 12 noon on Wednesday, December 5, in the Tom Green County Extension Office on the second floor of the Judge Edd B. Keyes Building or any participating County Extension Office.

A minimum of 42 pecans are necessary for each entry. This sample of 42 should represent the variety or individual seedling tree and be uniform in size and shell color. Mixed samples - more than one variety in considered for entering in the an entry - are disqualified.

nuts. This will eliminate poorly filled pecans, but certainly isn't an entry requirement.

A varietal entry may be composed of nuts from more than one tree. For example, if the grower has 10 Choctaw trees, each tree could contribute nuts to the grower's one Choctaw entry.

Nuts should be free of dust, dirt, and shuck remnants. They should not be buffed to the extent that shape or color is altered. Discolored shells and kernels may result from peeling pecans from the shucks too early. Pecans must be from the 2007 crop. Judging is based on the size of the pecans, appearance, and kernel quality which includes color, percent kernel (as relative to shell) and percent edible kernel.

Final judging will begin at 9 am on December 7, 2007. Decisions and placings by the judges will be final. Pecans will be left on display from 11 am to 4 pm, Friday December 7, in the Tom-Green County Library foyer in the Judge Edd Keyes Building, 113 W. Beauregard. Alcohol-Impaired **Driving Over Holidays** Can **Destroy Dreams for Texas Families**

The holiday season is a great time to visit family, but few adult gatherings are alcohol-free. This means that more people may be driving impaired than other times of the year.

A study of information from the National Center for Statistics and Analysis shows the days immediately preceding Christmas are among the top deadliest vehicle fatality days of the year. The Thanksgiving holidays supply another surge upward in traffic deaths.

In Texas, the risk may be higher than in other states, based on the state's past record. According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, Texas ranked number one in alcohol-related crashes in 2006. More than 1,500 Texans who lost their lives in traffic crashes in 2005 had alcohol in their blood at the time of the accident.

Central Texas counties lost more than 219 citizens to alcohol-related traffic accidents in 2006. Travis County has the highest number of alcoholrelated crashes of the central region, at 64 in 2006. The Texas counties with the highest rates per 100,000 are Wheeler County (103), Roberts County (120)



NOTICES **ORDER RESTRICTING**

OUTDOOR BURNING

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Coke County that outdoor burning is restricted in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code §352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural Resources Commission for: (1) firefighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under

The purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

1. Outdoor welding shall be allowed under the following circumstances:

a. Welding and cutting and grinding associated with welding activities shall not take place when the wind is over 15 mph;

b. The welder must notify the Coke County Sheriff's Department before any welding, cutting or grinding begins; c. All grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared within a fifty (50) feet radius surrounding the area where the activity is to take place before any






