# **Challenger defeats incumbent** sheriff in primary election

Coke County Sheriff's years. City Officials terms defeated incumbent Sheriff White; Rick Styles in the Democratic Primary on Tuesday by a 490 to 408 margin. This was the only Democratic Primary.

Arthur received 634 votes; County Tax Assessor/Collector Josie Dean received 735 votes; Troy Montgomery, Pct. 1 Commissioner - 240 votes; Gaylon Pitcock, Pct. 3 Commissioner - 169 votes; Marshall Millican, Constable - 421; and Marty Boyd, Constable - 314.

A total of 921 county Democrats went to the polls in the primary election. Concerning the race for president, Coke County agreed with the rest of the state, with Hillary Clinton receiving 405 votes locally, compared to 226 for Barack Obama.

The only local entry in the Republican Primary was George Brickey for County Sheriff, with Brickey receiving 76 votes of the total 137 Republicans who voted in the county primary.

It is also interesting to note that John McCain got the nod from county Republicans, receiving 65 votes to Mike Huckabee's 57.

A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 30 days from this notice, the executive director may approve the application. A contested case hearing will only be granted based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decisions on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues raised by you or others during the public comment period and not withdrawn.

A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. If a hearing request is timely filed, additional notice may be provided. granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact relating to relevant and material air quality concerns raised during the comment period.
