Voters go to polls on Tuesday, November 4

Coke County voters will join the rest of the nation in going to the polls on Tuesday, November 4, to elect a new president, U.S. senator and representative, state senator and representative, and numerous state justices, along with other district and county elective positions.

In the most publicized national election ever, republicans John McCain and Sarah Palin will be matched up against democrats Barack Obama and Joe Biden for the office of president and vice president of the United States. There are Libertarian candidates in each and every race; however, in nearly every case, they are not expected to influence the outcome of any race. Their names will appear on your ballot, although in most cases due to lack of space, their names will not appear in this discussion.

Incumbent Republican Senator John Cornyn will be matched against Democrat Richard J. (Rick) Noriega. Incumbent Republican U.S. Representative, District 11 Mike Conaway will appear on the ballot, with Libertarian candidate John R. Strohm opposing Conaway in his bid for reelection. Republican Michael L. Williams will vie for state Railroad Commissioner against Democrat Mark Thompson. Incumbent Republican State Senator Robert Duncan will be

opposed by Libertarian M. J. (Smitty) Smith. A host of state supreme court and appeals court justices will appear on the ballot for the general election.

Incumbent State Representative, District 72, Drew Darby will be opposed by Libertarian candidate Dennis Higgins. District Judge Barbara Walther and District Attorney Stephen Lupton are unopposed on the ballot.

Locally, County Attorney Nancy Arthur is unopposed on the ballot, as is County Tax Assessor-Collector Josie Dean, County Commissioner Pct. 1 Gene Montgomery, and County Commissioner Pct. 3 Gaylon Pitcock.

The only contested local race is that of county sheriff. County Sheriff Rick Styles was defeated in the primary election, making it a three-way race between George Brickey, Randall Jacks, and write-in candidate Wayne McCutchen.

The only other local candidates are County Constable, Pct. 1 Marshall Millican, and County Constable, Pct. 2 Marty Boyd. Both are unopposed for the general election.

Polling locations in Coke County are as follows: Pct. 1 - Senior Citizen's Building, 225 County Park Road, Robert Lee; Pct. 2 - Senior Citizen's Building, 613 E. Oliver Ave., Bronte; Pct. 3 - Coke County Courthouse, 13 E. 7th St., Robert Lee; and

Pct. 4 - Bronte City Hall, 114 S. Washington, Bronte.

Polls will be open from 7 am until 7 pm on election day.

A special note for voters who live in Pct. 3 and are in the Water Valley school district: These voters will also have Water Valley ISD board candidates Craig Demere, Lara White, Jeff Lisson, Brian Marschall, Ricki Gochenauer, and Wes Sutton on their ballots, with these six candidates vying for four full terms. Mike Young and Tim Teagarden will also be on their ballots to select one trustee to an unexpired term. These residents will also be voting for or against the ratification of a new tax rate for the Water Valley ISD.

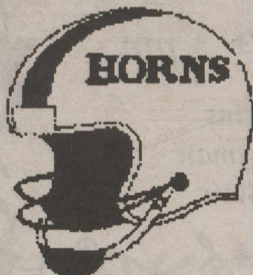

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the

Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District invite the public and any agencies with an interest in conservation issues to participate in a Local Work Group meeting to be held at the County Courtroom in Robert Lee, Texas. This meeting will be on November 6, at 9:30 am.

The purpose of this meeting is to receive input from a broad range of local agencies, organizations, businesses, and individuals that have an interest in natural resource conditions and needs in Coke County.

Input received will allow the Local Work Group to make recommendations on resource concerns to be addressed for county-based funding.

These recommendations will be used in implementing the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) and other conservation programs offered by NRCS.

The 2008 Farm Bill stipulates that conservation programs must continue to be locally led. Through stakeholder meetings, the public is given an opportunity to help local conservation leaders set program priorities. These meetings are open to the public.

FSA accepting applications

The Farm Service Agency (FSA) is now accepting applications for Emergency Farm Loans resulting from damages and losses caused by high winds, hail, lightning, and a tornado on June 5, 2008 through June 17, 2008 and also caused by drought that occurred on January 1, 2008 and continuing.

Coke County has been named a contiguous county where eligible farmers may qualify for FSA EM loan assistance. Farm Loan Manager, Justin B. Holland, asks farmers who want to apply for emergency loans to submit their applications as soon as possible. The deadline for applications is 6/10/2009, but if farmers wait too long, a backlog will develop and cause delays.

Generally, farmers who have lost 30 percent of their production due to designated disaster are eligible for emergency loans. The FSA office is located at 103 W. Florida Avenue in Sweetwater, Texas.

Fall hunting season is upon us

Every year as we come to another hunting season, I take a look at last year's weather to get a start on this year's hunting outlook.

With me, the weather is always the right place to start, because that is the single most determining factor whether or not we have success in our hunting endeavors. Last year at this time, I was bragging about our record rainfall of between thirty and forty inches (through the third quarter of the year).

Well, Mother Nature threw us a curve, we had a six month dry spell, and it didn't rain any at all hardly until April of 2008. Now that will get your attention. Since that time we have sort'a caught up; in that this year's third quarter rainfall totals for most parts of the county are somewhere over 18 to 20

inches, which is our annual average.

Concerning our hunting outlook, I would have to say that we should have an above average deer and turkey hunting year. Most of the bucks I have seen have been pretty young yet, but their horns look bigger and better than last year. I have seen groups of six and little eight point bucks that are probably three years old. What they need to do is get at least one or two years older to have a really nice rack, but sometimes that's kind of hard to get done in Coke County. We are gradually working our way out of the drought, and the antler size and spread is beginning to show that. What matters now is if those nice young bucks are allowed to reach four or five years old, and show their genetic potential.

I don't think we raised too many turkeys this year, but they don't have to raise every year for us to have a successful season. We should have enough left over from the past two seasons to make plenty of fried turkey breast.

As to our quail population, that is a great big question mark. At this time last year, we were really expecting an exceptional season. By December, even the guides in the so-called hot spots for quail in the Rolling Plains and in South Texas had put up their dogs and weren't booking any more hunts.

Overall, I think we may have a few more birds (quail) than last year, but in most places there are not going to be enough to hunt. An added note: I haven't seen a covey of blues around in our area

yet this year.

Archery season for deer and turkey will close on October 31, 2008, with no antlerless permit required except on MLD properties. The general deer season will run from November 1, 2008 through January 4, 2009. The special late general season will run from Jan. 5 - 18, 2009, for antlerless and spike bucks only. The bag limit for deer is 5, with no more than 2 bucks, all seasons combined.

Turkey season will run concurrently with deer season, Nov. 1 through Jan. 4. Spring turkey season will be April 4 through May 17, 2009, gobblers only, with a bag limit of 4 (all seasons combined).

Quail season will run statewide Oct. 25, 2008 through Feb. 22, 2009, with a daily limit of 15 and a possession limit of 45.

Legal shooting hours for all game animals and nonmigratory game birds are from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

Hunting stamp endorsements which are required are an archery stamp - \$7; migratory game birds - \$7; upland game birds - \$7; and a federal migratory game bird (duck stamp) - \$17.

Hunting Lease License (Types 132, 133, and 134)

Required of a landowner or landowner's agent who leases hunting rights to another person on property they own or control for pay or other consideration. The license must be displayed on the property.

License fee: \$75 for 1 through 499 acres; \$140 for 500 through 999 acres; or \$240 for 1,000 acres or more: Note: Recordbook no longer required.

Have a wonderful time during your stay in our area. Please remember that you are ambassadors for all of us involved in the hunting and outdoor industry. Don't forget to think SAFETY every time you handle a firearm, and make proper gun handling and safe shooting a part of your everyday life at home or in the field. Have a safe and successful season.

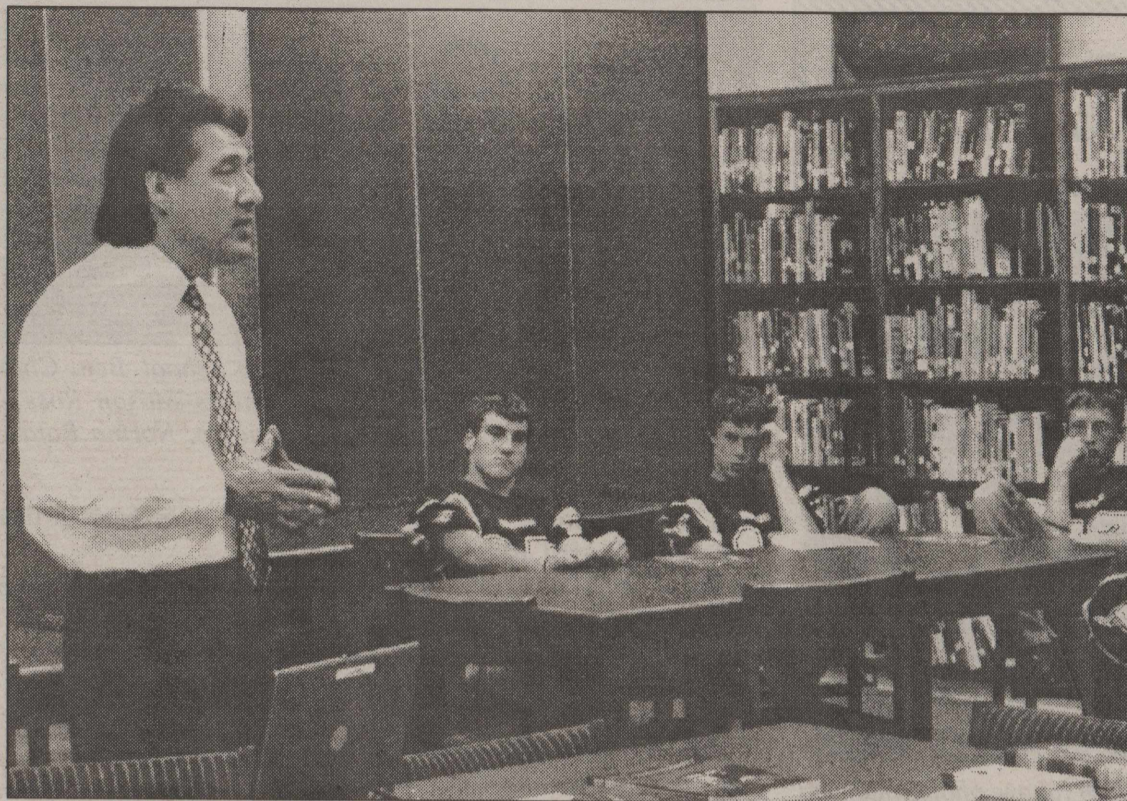

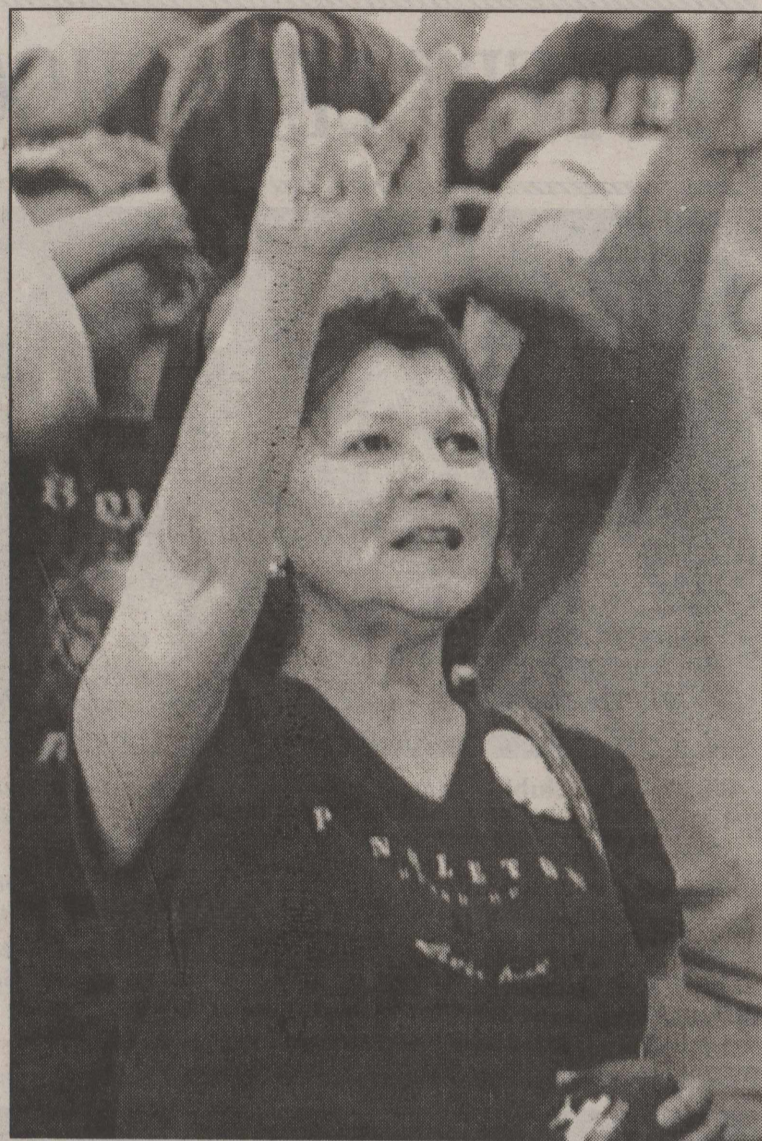
**WCCHD Board

iThumb - I Don't Think So

The iPhone recently launched to much fanfare around the globe, further highlighting our desire for constant electronic communication, at least for the younger generation. But with text messaging, instant messaging and email all at your fingertips, should you worry about getting "Blackberry thumb?"

"Doubtful," said Jerome Congleton, Ph.D., professor at the Texas A&M Health Science Center School of Rural Public Health and an expert in ergonomics and occupational health.

"Moderation in life and ergonomics is the key. If you are going to do a lot of keying, an external mouse and keyboard is the answer along with raising your flat screen. The likelihood of repetitive motion injury (from cell phones) is not likely because of the recovery period between usages."

While you may worry about your children, parents or even grandparents "texting" too much, a bigger concern is sending and reading messages

while driving, which is not an uncommon occurrence. Since phones have been in cars, experts have said the safest way to talk is to pull off the road and park. The same advice holds true for reading and sending messages.

Change the channel on TV medication commercials

The next time you see a pharmaceutical commercial on your television, the best thing for your health is to change the channel.

"Once a patient believes a medication causes certain side effects, it is very hard for physicians to prescribe it to the patient," said Juan Castro, M.D., assistant professor of pharmacy practice at the Texas A&M Health Science Center Irma Lerma Rangel College of Pharmacy. "You have to do a lot of talking and hope they decide to take the prescription as part of their treatment."

Some patients will even begin to experience the side effects they hear during the commercials psychologically, Dr. Castro said.

"There are patients who

hear something and then come down with those side effects," Dr. Castro said.

On the opposite end of the spectrum are the patients who hear

about the medications from high-profile actors or doctors on television and decide those are the medicines they need to get better.

"Remember, it is a sales

pitch," Dr. Castro said. "If you have a question, call your pharmacist or physician, and that health professional will direct you to do what is best for your health."
