TDRA presents \$200,000 check to City of Robert Lee

The Texas Department of Rural Affairs (TDRA) recently presented the City of Robert Lee with an oversized, ceremonial check to recognize the community for its hard work in securing a grant from the agency's Texas Community Development Block Grant (TxCDBG) program. Agency staff presented the checks on June 10, 2010 in San Angelo, Texas.

"We are very pleased to present this ceremonial check to the community," said Charles S. (Charlie) Stone, executive director of TDRA. "Community development grants such as this help Texans in rural communities improve their quality of life significantly."

The City of Robert Lee will use the \$200,000 grant to make water system improvements to comply with a Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Agreed Order. Construction shall consist of replacing two filter medias, replacing the main water supply line, and related appurtenances. Construction shall take place at the water treatment plant located in the northeastern part of town and the elevated storage tank on 15th Street.

The agency awarded \$1,429,900 to eight Concho Valley communities including: Big Lake, Brady, Concho County, Eden, Irion County, Mason, Robert Lee, and Sonora. TDRA awarded more than \$88 million to rural communities in Texas for the 2009 funding cycle.

"Texas CDBG is a competitive grant program; so the community is to be commended for their hard work and diligence in pursuing this grant," said Mark Wyatt, director of TDRA's community development division.

The grant comes from the Texas Community Development Block Grant program, the largest CDBG program in the nation. Rural cities with populations less than 50,000 and counties that have a non-metropolitan population under 200,000 and are not eligible for direct funding from HUD may apply for the agency's TxCDBG program. This program serves approximately 1,017 eligible rural communities, 245 rural counties, and provides services to over 375,000 low to moderate income beneficiaries each year.

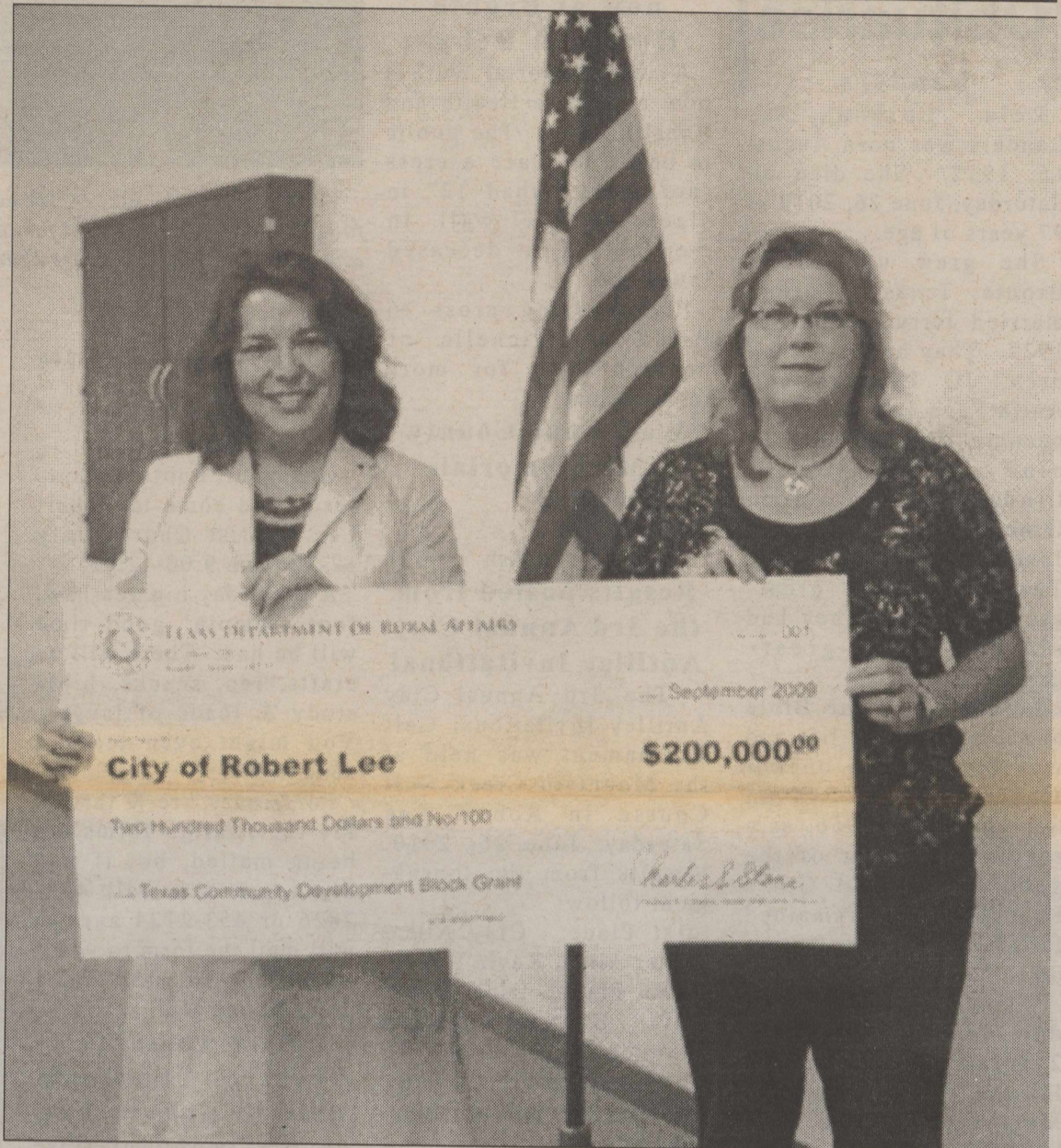
Cub Scouts meeting set for today

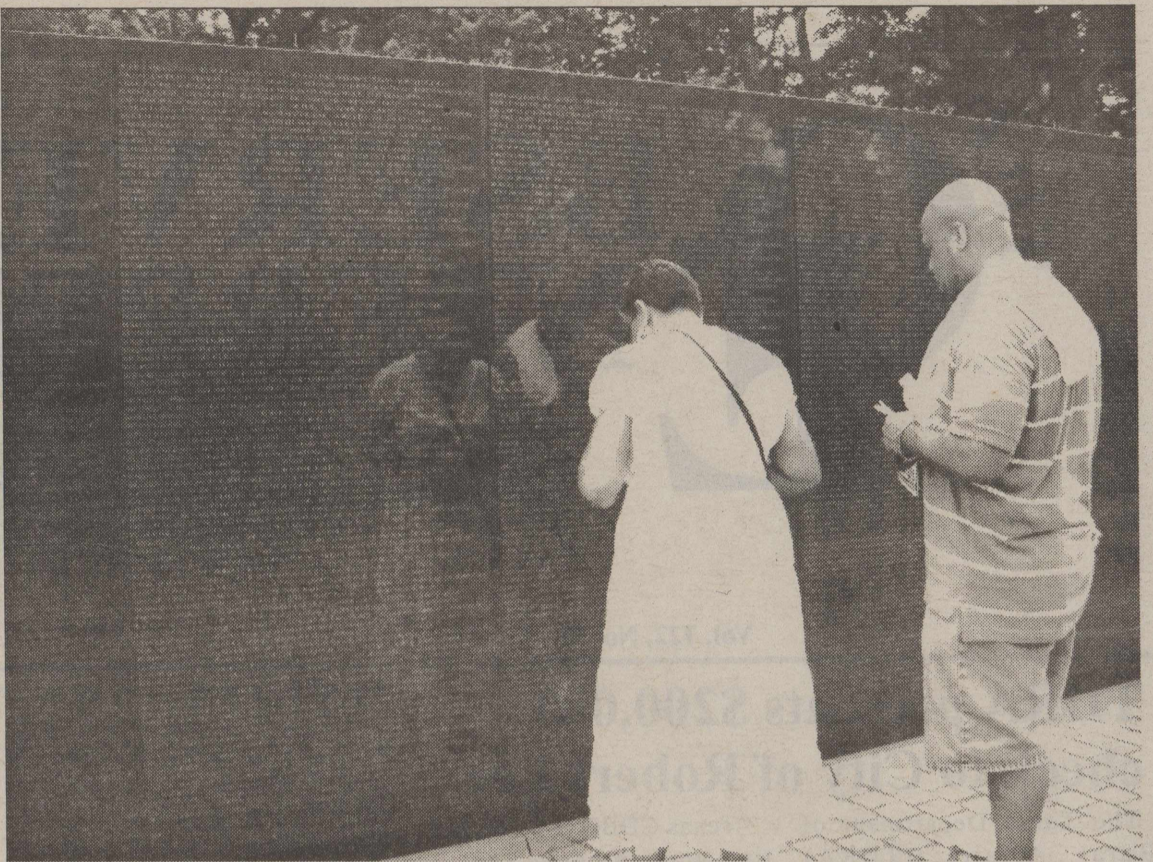

Bronte ISD board holds special meeting

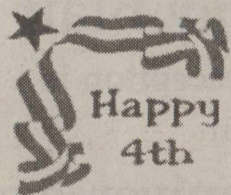

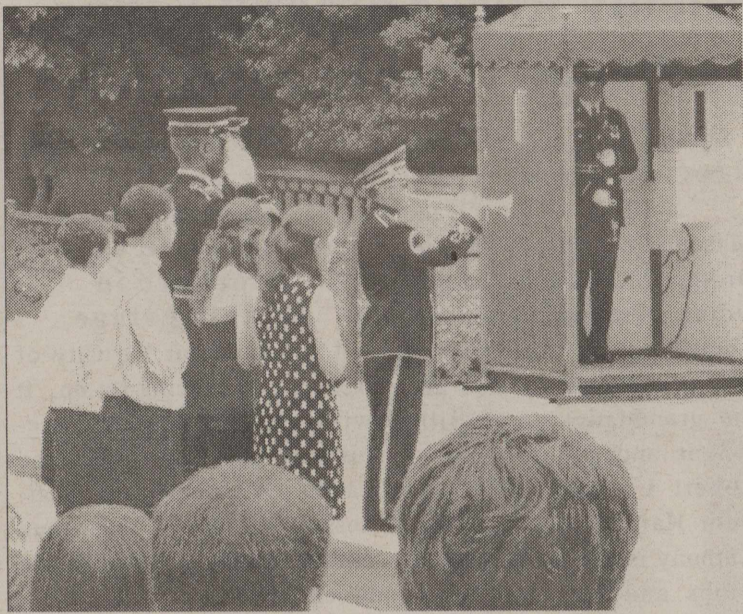

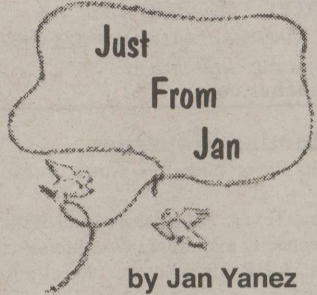

Texas Melon Mania

Melon Mania always comes to the summertime menu with the arrival of sweet, succulent Texas cantaloupe, Honeydew melons and watermelon. So savory are Texas melons, they will add a unique new flavor to any of the usual summer fare. And just as a colorful rainbow after a summer rain is awesome, consumers will be amazed at all the wonderful nutrients found in these colorful fruits of summer. The Produce for Better Health Foundation encourages consumers to choose fruits and vegetables with the colors of the rainbow as researchers say they can possibly prevent certain cancers and heart disease.

Growers have perfected Texas Melons over the years so that consumers have now come to expect an exceptional quality cantaloupe, Honeydew melon and watermelon with a high natural sugar content and smaller seed cavity. The smaller the seed cavity, the more edible fruit there is to enjoy.

Each type of Texas Melon brings its own bright "color of goodness", sweet aroma, and distinctive taste to the palate.

*Texas Cantaloupes, have a firm bright orange aromatic interior. Sweet tasting, each serving of a Texas Cantaloupe is loaded with Vitamin A and Vitamin C, 100% and 110% respectively of the recommended daily allowance.

*Texas Honeydew Melons, have a green interior color and smooth outer peel. An excellent source of Vitamin C, Texas Honeydew Melons have 50% of the recommended daily allowance.

Texas Cantaloupe, Honeydew and Watermelons are wonderful to eat anytime. They have NO Fat and No Cholesterol, and are low in sodium, so enjoy these delectable tastes without any of the guilt!

So whether sliced up and eaten "au natural", scooped out and filled with chicken salad, cut up and tossed into salads, or chopped up and added to salsas, it is a sure bet that Melon Mania will be a hit on the summertime menu with Texas Melons!

Watermelon are available via Texas year-round, however, the peak for Texas Watermelon is June to August. Texas grows Watermelon with and without seeds.

Selection

Whole watermelon should:

- *Be firm and symmetrical in shape
- *Be heavy for its size.
- *Have a healthy sheen on the rind.

*Have a yellowish underside from sitting on the ground while ripening

Cut watermelon should:

- *Have a fresh, firm texture.
- *Have a bright color with a minimum of white streaks.
- *Have fully mature and hard seeds.

Storage

*Watermelon will keep at room temperature, but it's best if they are refrigerated to preserve the sweetness.

*Watermelon chunks and slices can be stored in an airtight container in the refrigerator for about a week.

*Cover cut surface loosely with plastic wrap to prevent flesh from becoming mushy.

Texas Honeydew Melons are available from April to July.

Selection

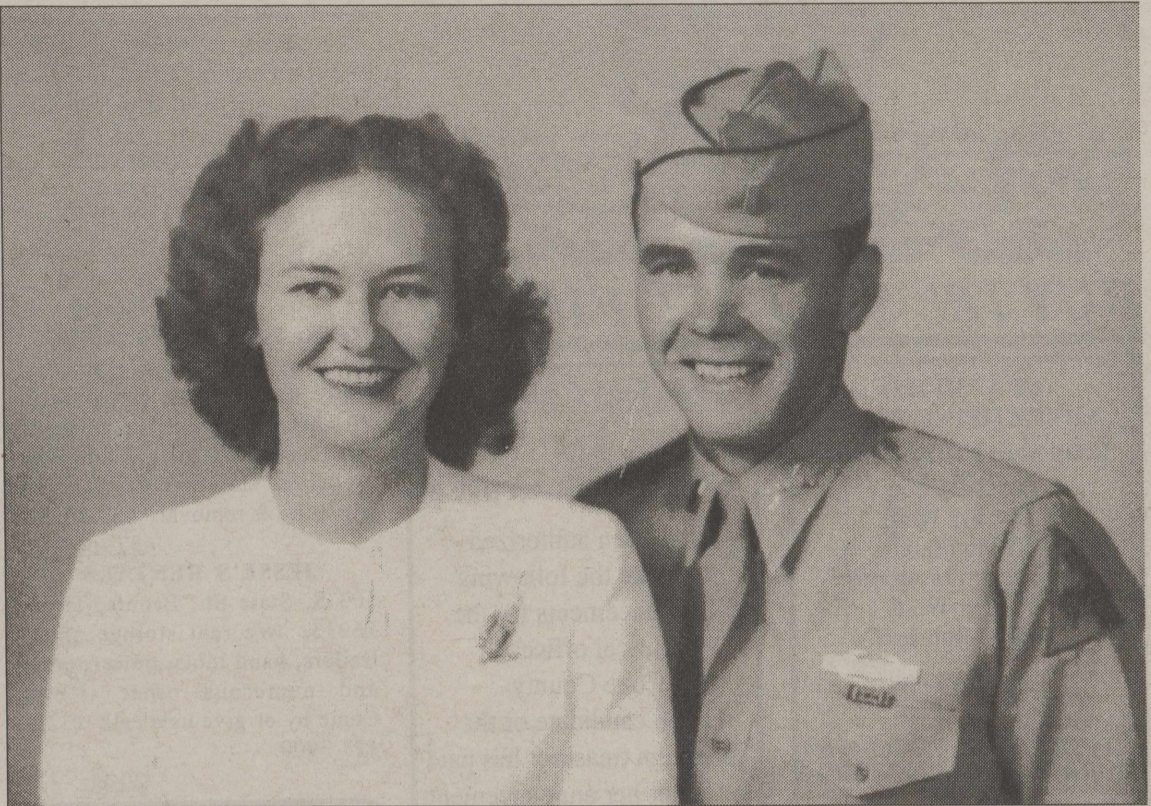
Whole Texas Honeydew Melons should:

- *Have a creamy yellow or white outer color.
- *Should be smooth with a slightly waxy surface.
- *Give off a delicate aromatic fragrance from the blossom end.

Cut Texas Honeydew Melons should:

- *Have a fresh, firm sparkling green flesh.
- A slightly soft blossom end and good color are indicators of a ripe Texas Honeydew Melon.

A sweet aroma emitting from the stem end is not always a good indicator of ripeness due to variety differences. If you shake a honeydew melon and the seeds and juice slosh around

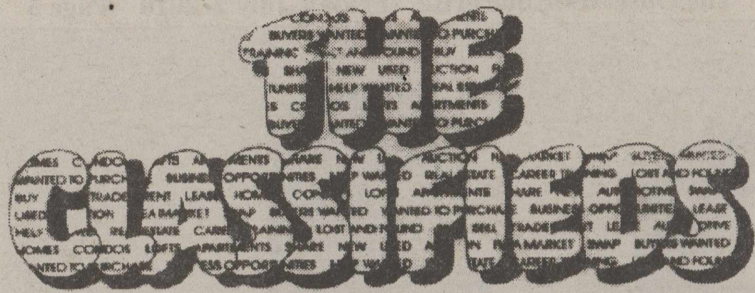

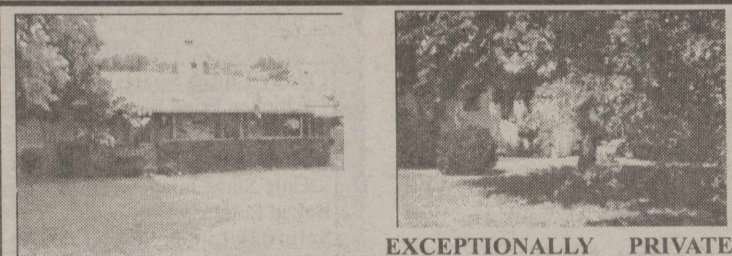

Heat Index

It's a blistering hot afternoon, you step outside and the thick, still air surrounds you in heat. It is at this point you look over at your trusty thermometer and expect to see a temperature well above 100 degrees, but much to your confusion it reads 95.

Assuming there is nothing mechanically wrong with the thermometer, what you are experiencing is the influence of higher moisture content in the air. By calculating the relationship between temperature and dew point, we can arrive at what is known as the Heat Index. Heat Index is the temperature the body feels on a hot, humid summer day.

Our bodies sweat in order to cool down. In dry climates this procedure, called evapotranspiration, can work very efficiently. What occurs during evapotranspiration is the sweat on your skin is evaporated by the dry air around you and because evaporation removes heat, your body cools down. However, when greater amounts of moisture move into the area and relative humidities increase, the air can no longer evaporate the sweat from your skin and your body does not cool down as efficiently. For this reason, relative humidity is the major player when it comes to calculating a heat index.

In an environment where your body cannot cool down easily, air temperature will adversely affect you. This is why when relative humidities increase, the heat index increases and can exceed the measured air temperature by several degrees. Conversely, when relative humidities are very low air can cool down your body very efficiently, so efficiently in fact that the heat index can actually be less than the measured air temperature.

Let's look at a couple of examples; It's the middle of the afternoon and the outside air temperature is 95 degrees. You go to weather.gov/sanangelo and discover the relative humidity to be 45 percent. The thermometer may read 95 but it really feels like it's 102! The next day a dry line moves east through the

region and the relative humidity drops to 20 percent. The temperature is still 95 but with much dryer air it actually feels like it's 91.

During summer months the National Weather Service monitors the severity of the heat and humidity and issues heat advisories when conditions become extreme. In West Central Texas a heat advisory will be issued when the heat index reaches 105 degrees on two consecutive days and the overnight low temperature between those days does not drop below 75 degrees. Some symptoms of heat exhaustion include heavy sweating, nausea, headaches and dizziness. To avoid being a victim of heat exhaustion stay out of the sun as much as possible, drink plenty of non-alcoholic beverages (water is best) and wear clothing appropriate for current weather conditions.

Reunion set for Eldorado

The second annual West Texas Thinclad Geezer Reunion is set for July 24 in Eldorado. This event was inaugurated last year as a way for West Texas High School athletes from days gone by, to gather and reminisce about track meets in the area in the mid-twentieth century. Originally conceived for track athletes from the 1960's, it quickly evolved to include runners, etc. all the way from the 1940's to the 1980's. In 2009 fifty former tracksters showed up at the T 9 C Ranch just west of Eldorado for the first informal meal and lots of chatting. Seventeen area towns were represented and the visiting continued until midnight. Harriers from Abilene, Andrews, Brady, Christoval, Corpus Christi, Eden, Eldorado, Fort Stockton, Gainesville, Junction, Lewisville, McCamey, Melvin, Mertzon, Ozona, Robert Lee, San Angelo, Sanderson, Sonora, Vernon and Wall count themselves as members of

this diverse group and often attend various track events around the state together, even today.

The group would like to invite any interested persons to attend this year's gathering and enjoy this unique camaraderie. In addition to actual track meet participants, those who were fans of West Texas track are also invited to attend and meet some of these former athletes. Gates open at 1 PM and a meal is served at approximately 7 PM. Attendees are encouraged to bring appetizers, desserts, drinks, salads, etc. to help supplement the meal and for snacking throughout the day. There is no charge but a hat is passed around at the end of the day for those wishing to help with expenses. There is a small fireworks show as soon as it gets dark.

Emergency farm loan applications being accepted

Applications for emergency farm loans for losses due to damages and losses caused by drought, above normal tem-

peratures, and associated wildfires on January 01, 2009-December 31, 2009.

Coke County has recently been named a primary county by the Secretary of Agriculture and may be eligible for loans to cover part of actual production and physical losses resulting from each of the disaster designations.

Justin B. Holland, Frm Loan Manager, said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 100% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue the agricultural business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest rate is 3.75 percent.

As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to consider proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until December 13, 2010 but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing, with possible delays into the new farming season.

The FSA office in Sweetwater is open from 7:30 to 5:00, Monday through Friday.

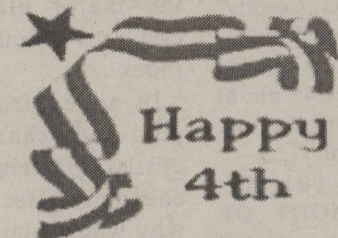

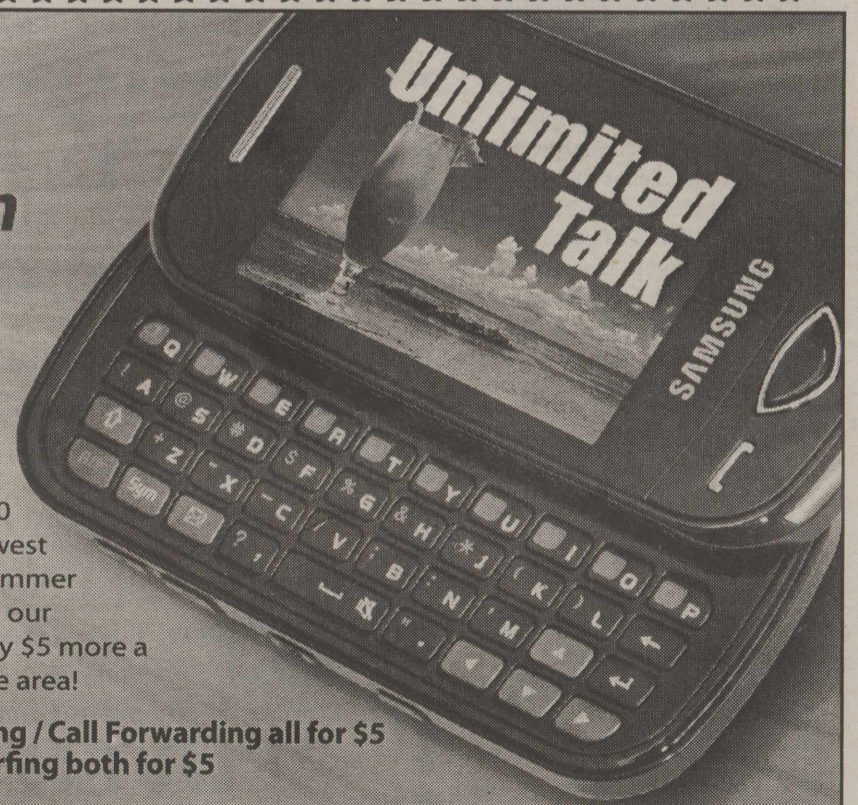
