Longhorns finish basketball season at State Tournament

The Bronte Longhorns finished their season at the State Tournament yet again!

The Longhorns earned the State Runner-up Title for Class 1A Division II. The Texas Association of Basketball Coaches honored Dakota and Kerwin Rawls by naming them to the Class 1A Division II All State Tournament Team.

The Longhorns played Roxton in the semi-final game Friday evening, March 11. Shooting at over 70%, they came away the big winner in this contest, 80-60.

As in the regional championship game against Ira, Kerwin Rawls stepped up to lead the team. He put in 30 points, and had 10 rebounds and seven assists. He wasn't alone on the floor though as the other starters added to the point total. Dakota Rawls put in 14 points, Creed Coalson had 12 points - all 3 point shots, Terron Charles shot for 10 points, and Heath Richey added 7 points. Caleb Rosson came off the bench to put in 5 points and Jordan Baumann topped it off with 2 points.

The Longhorns then faced Paducah for the State Championship. The 70+% shooting of the night before couldn't be tapped into for this game. The Horns shot only 20% in this game and fell 30-45 in the heartbreaking final. In this contest, they faced two defenders who towered at 6'5" each.

Also at 6'5", Dakota led the Bronte scoring with 13 points and 13 rebounds. Creed Coalson added three 3 pointers for a total of 9 points. Kerwin put in 6 points and Heath Richey fought to the net for 2 points.

This championship loss was the second time in two years that the Longhorns played in the State Final and fell just short of their ultimate goal. However, these young men fought their way through deeper benches with taller, quicker, and tougher teams. They played with "heart", overcoming what some would call disadvantages.

Being ranked first in the

ratings almost from the first of the season, put a target on their backs and raised expectations that can be hard to live up to. These players showed character and dignity throughout the season.

They gave the community of Bronte a team to cheer for, travel with and one in which to be proud. Let's hope they don't remember the last game of the season most, but that they remember the journey to that game.

You can't talk about the Longhorn basketball program without mentioning Rocky Rawls. As Bronte's head coach, he's taken the Longhorns to the state tournament's final game four times. He's done more than that for Bronte. He has taken what might be average athletes in someone else's program and moulded them into outstanding teams. He's taught them not only basketball, but also discipline, character, honor, and integrity.

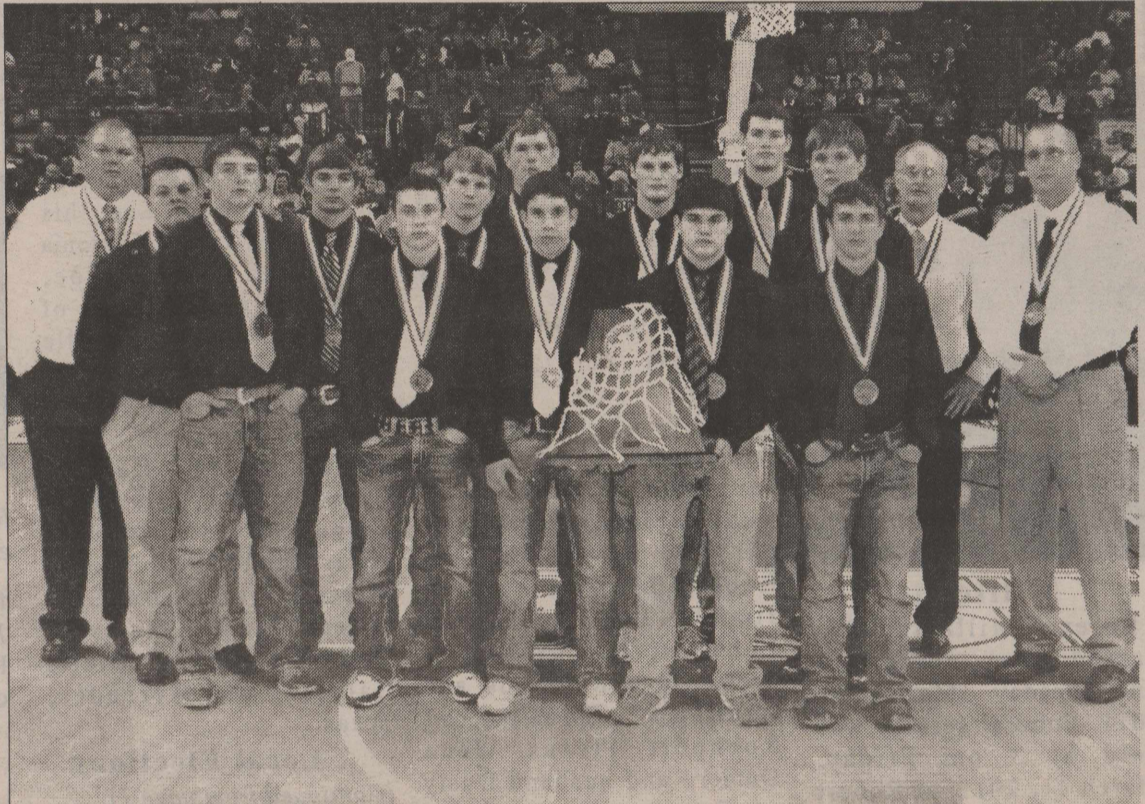
Dakota, Kerwin, Heath and Terron are all seniors and will not play for Bronte next year. However, Creed Coalson and his 3-pointers and Caleb Rosson with his rebounding skills give Bronte a good foundation on which to build.

of the tree. Addresses may determine what day(s) a customer may be allowed to water. During a time of drought, the entire state is facing new water restrictions. Water restrictions are happening all over West Texas. The Colorado River Municipal Water District (CRMWD) is requiring member cities that include Midland, Odessa, Big Spring, Snyder, and Stanton to cut water use by 10 percent.

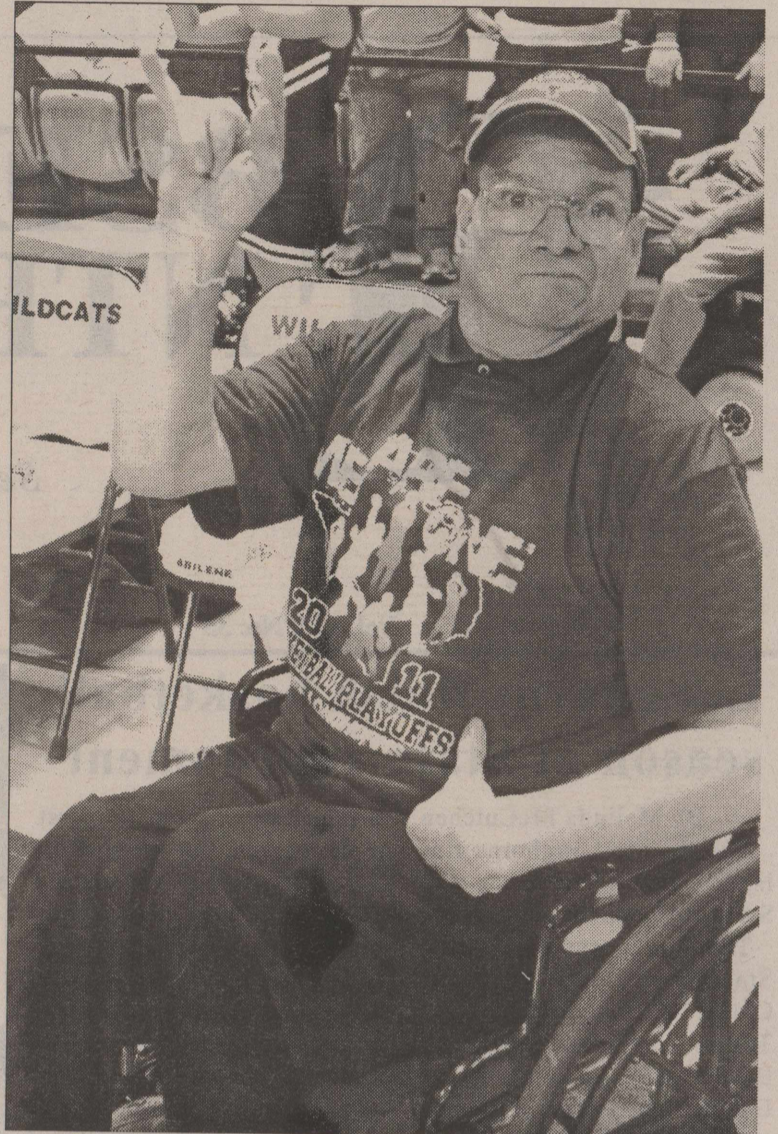

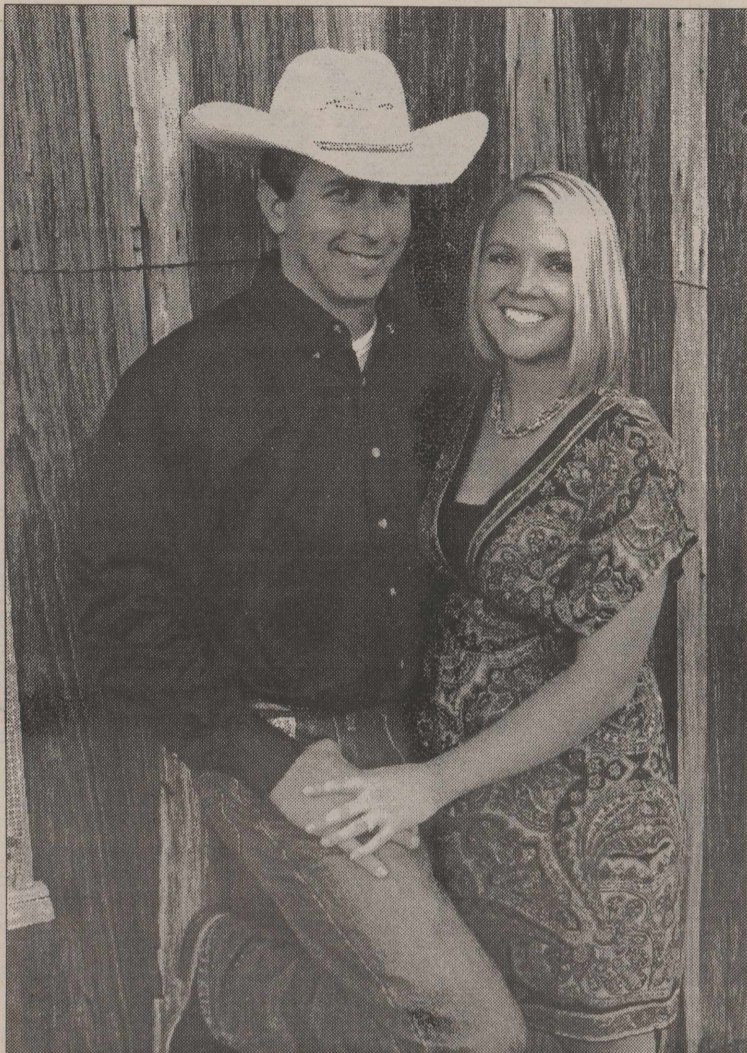

A presentation was made to Bobbie Allen for her voluntary guardianship of one of Coke County's most historic buildings, the Old Jail.

The newspaper project is on hold with the West Texas Collection until such time as a student employee can begin transferring the Coke County newspapers to microfilm. The hope that a set of Bronte Enterprise papers will surface holds out. The only Enterprises cataloged are from 1950-57. If any one knows of

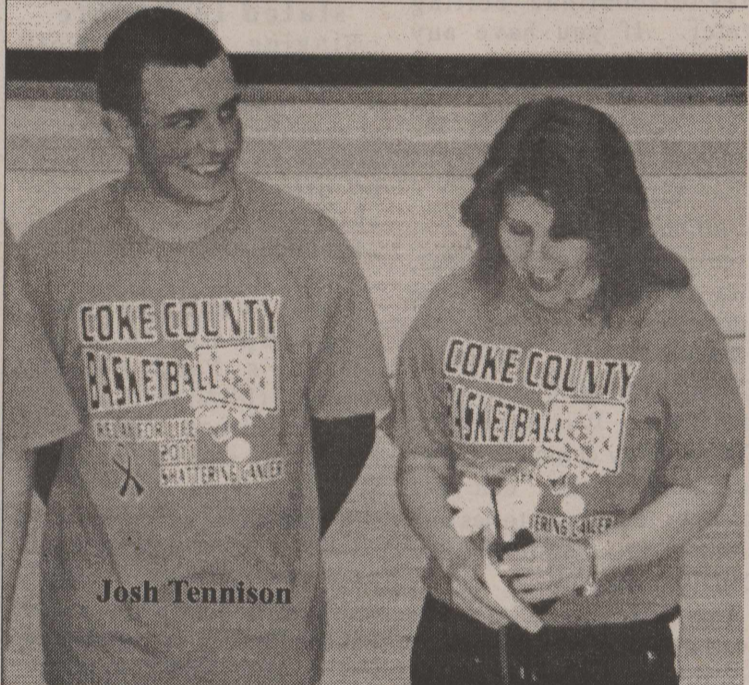

Logan Philley led the Steers with 78-66-144 total, taking medalists honors by 5 shots. His 6-under 66 was a tournament course record. Tournament play and records began in 1970. The Steers team score of 344-298-642 total was only bested by
